### 300,000 **New Jobs Possible**

WASHINGTON (AP) -President Ford will announce today that he will free \$2 billion in impounded highway funds-a move that will create an estimated 140,000 to 300,000 new jobs, sources said.

The sources said the President would make the announcement part of his address to the Kansas Legislature during his visit to the Midwest.

The President has been under pressure both from state officials and congressional leaders to free \$4.3 billion in highway funds for fiscal year 1975, which have been impounded by the Office of Management and Budget.

#### **Resolution In Senate**

A resolution currently is pending in the Senate which would overrule the President's deferral of the federal aid highway funds.

Sen. Jennings Randolph, D-W.Va., author of the resolution, said last week he had received information indicating that more than \$2 billion in highway work could be placed under contract by the end of June in addition to the \$2.3 billion already programmed for that pe-

#### **U.S. Court Judge Denies TDC Motion**

TYLER, Tex. (AP) - A mo tion by Texas Department of Corrections (TDC) officials to allow the U.S. Justice Depart ment to intervene in a lawsuit brought by seven convicts was denied Monday by U.S. District Court Judge William Wayne Justice.

The lawsuit, which name TDC Director W. J. Estelle, alleges violations of prisone rights at TDC's Eastham Coffield units.

Justice consolidated several prisoner complaints in April 1974 and designated them as a class action lawsuit against the TDC last December. No trial ite has been set.

The suit alleges prisoners were denied certain correspondence rights, had mail eensored and were harassed by prison personnel.

But before Mr. Ford revealed the horrendous \$52 billion deficit, this frightening picture was painted - mostly by Secretary of State Henry Kisssinger: the imminent collapse of, first, Cambodia and then South Vietnam; the danger of Portugal and Turkey leaving the North Atlantic Alliance (NATO); a United States unable to deliver on its commitments and, therefore, unable to negotiate with foreign powers, great or small.

Moreover, Kissinger clearly implied that the overwhelmingly Democratic Congress, seeking all powers of government including diplomacy, is largely responsible for this state of affairs. The inference: the Secretary of State, undercut by Congress, had lost his credibili-ty among fellow diplomats and, consequently, his ability to negotiate ef-



deadly serious national problem. With the lopsided Democratic majority in the new Congress oblivious to such problems, it oppresses the White House far worse than the highly publicized confrontation over energy policy.

The blue Monday breakfast started on the apparently hopeless request by Mr. Ford for \$300 million in emergency arms aid to save Indochina. Gen. George Brown, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, said flatly what previously had been whispered at the Pentagon: without additional arms, Cambodia will fall quickly. The situation in South Vietnam is better, Brown added, but extremely critical in view of ammunition and fuel shortages.

Kissinger moved on to Europe. The congressional cutoff of military aid to Turkey because of its Cyprus invasion, effective at midnight Tuesday, was described as an absolute disaster. Those present believed Kissinger saw Turkey disengaging from NATO, a greater danger to U.S. interest than the collapse of the Saigon regime.

What makes the possible Turkish disaffection in the east induced by Congress all the worse. Kissinger went on, is the imminent Communist takeover Portugal in the west - depriving the U.S. and NATO of the vital Azores bases. Here, too, congressional hands are unclean, Kissinger implied. The CIA can scarcely protect American interests in Portugal while under congressional scrutiny

Kissinger even related the dead hand of congressional diplomacy to relations between the super-powers. Contending that the Turkish aid cutoff endangers cooperation with China in the intricate three-cushioned relationship with the Soviet Union, Kissinger said Peking wonders how it can deal with a nation irrational enough to consciously alienate an ally so valuable as Turkey.

Dr. Kissinger's lecture, delivered in his mild tone without vituperation, honor. Yet the honorable men in generated few protests or affirmations Congress will tolerate the abuses that from the congressmen. The plea for Indochinese aid was greeted only by

Nor is much help expected from Capitol Hill. In an overwhelmingly Democratic Congress intent on forging its own way internationally without regard to old-fashioned bipartisanship, foreign policy is increasingly subject to constituent pressures.

# Mexico Oil Exports

MEXICO CITY - Mexico is now producing more oil than ever before and its petroleum exports are estimated to be worth almost a million dollars

But, says Francisco Javier Alejo, minister of government properties in President Luis Echeverria's cabinet, Mexico does not now plan to join the Arab-dominated Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC).

The reason is simple. Mexico's oil exports, important as would really qualify Mexico as a big-time

Reportedly, Mexico daily ships some 35,000 barrels of crude to Communist China and another 55,000 barrels to a variety of other countries, including the United States, Brazil, Uruguay and

By way of comparison, Venezuela,

to have inspired the Middle Eastern oil countries to organize OPEC, can export about three million barrels of crude a day, and Ecuador, the other Latin member of OPEC, has export capacity of some 200,000 barrels a day.

Mexico, nevertheless, is proud of what progress the nationalized oil company. Petroleos Mexicanos, is making.

Most of the 676,000 barrels of crude that Pemex produces each day is consumed within the country and only after domestic demand is satisfied is the surplus exported.

There has been some, presumably considerable, reduction in the consumption of gasoline in Mexico in recent months, since the government raised the price of the fuel that most modern cars require to the equivalent of about 90 cents a gallon.

In November, when Pemex's production was announced at 660,000 barrels a day, exports were reportedly around 35,000 barrels. Yet, by mid-January, with only a production increase of 16,000 barrels a day, Mexico was said to be able to ship an additional 55,000 barrels a day outside of the country.

To judge by what Pemex spokesmen say, the very real increase in Mexican oil production is coming from areas in southeastern Mexico, in the states of Chiapas and Tabasco. Pemex Director Gen. Antonio Dovali Jaime told newsmen recently that production in that area was averaging 276,000 barrels a

Neither he nor any other Mexican official has yet been able to estimate the size of the petroleum deposits being exploited there. So far as is known all the exploratory wells put down so far have been producers.
