



and her father, Louis, have been in constant attendance since that tragic day in Chicago 34 years ago when it was realized the girl would never again awaken. In early August 1941, Elaine, then 6, complained of stomach

diagnosed as appendicitis. "Routine," all thought, so the youngster was given an anesthetic and surgery was begun. During the operation,

the surgeon discovered the ap-pendix had ruptured. He drained the infected area and Elaine was returned to her hospital room to await what everyone assumed would

be an uneventful recovery. But hours and days passed and, although Elaine's eyes would open occasionally, she did not regain consciousness. At first, her condition was

described as a rare form of encephalitis, which produces sleeping sickness. After more than a year, however, electroence phalograph tests revealed Elaine was in a deep coma, the "sleep of death," and that her brain had been irreparably damaged as the result of a lack of oxygen

during the operation.

Doctors told the Espositos there was no hope. "Place Elaine in a nursing home," they counseled, "and don't endanger your own health trying to care for her." But to walk away from their

Espositos could not do. "We never thought about putting her anywhere else,"

GM says the potential prob-lem could affect 3.3 million of the cars built during the 1973 and 1974 model years, and 1975 models built before last Novemwhen the transmission fluid was changed.

Problems Reported So far, 5,500 of those car owners have reported transmission problems traced to rust prob-

GM said Tuesday it would pay for repairs, estimated at \$400 a car, even if the normal 12-month, 12,000-mile warranty

John C. Bates. GM service director, said the new formula fluid was tested for 8.9 million miles before it was used in mass production, and no problems were found.

Last summer, however, reports of problems started to come in from some Pontiac owners. By fall, owners of Chevrolets, Buicks, Oldsmobiles and Cadillacs also reported transmission troubles.

## 'An Unholy Mess'

mess," Rush Moody, a former Midland attorney, said in discussing the federal government in an address delivered last weekend at the annual convention of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce at El Paso.

"It is a mess, not in the sense of corruption or venality," Moody said, "but in the sense of a growing inability to serve its constituency. The federal government-and I speak here of both the executive bureauracy and the congressional bureauracy—is perilously close to losing touch with the country it purports to govern."

Moody, who left Midland in 1971 to accept a five-year term as a member of the Federal. Power Commission, resigned his commis-\*sion post the first of last month, citing the lack of congressional action to solve the nation's energy problems as his reason for resigning, now is serving in Washington as special counsel for energy affairs to Gov. Dolph Briscoe and the State of Texas. His experiences in Washington qualify him to speak on "Washington and the Federal Government.

"I am an optimist," he said. "I believe there is infinitely more that is right about the United States than there is wrong about this country. But I also believe that when lations," he said. something is wrong it should be faced head on and corrected."

He said that to understand federal government, one should consider six basic descriptive facts:

1. "The federal government is isolated from economic reality. In Washington, there is only one industry - that of government, and government is not run like a business is run. . . .

2. "The federal government perceives itself to be the center of the known universe. As a consequence, Washington truly believes that it knows what is best for you. Washington no longer listens and responds, it directs and requires.

3. "The federal government is an enormous self-perpetuating structure over which no one has real control. . . .

4. "It is an article of faith with many in Washington, particularly among career civil servants, poli-

## Three Ideas For Tax Reform Suggested

WASHINGTON (KFS) - A thought for income tax time. Of late, the President and others have been warning us of the appalling growth of the public sector. Federal, state and local government outlays, now almost 40 per cent of the Gross National Product, soon may rise to 50 per cent. One way or another, our taxes must rise with it. Federal income taxes may be cut, but Social Security levies and state taxes continue to go up.

Alas, critical political rhetoric is cheap - cheaper even than the shrinking dollars with which we pay our April tax bills. But in the event that our national leaders care to backstop routine oratory with actual legislation to stop the endlessly rising tax escalator, here are three suggestions:

First, limit the proportion of national (or state) income that can be taken by government in taxes. In other words, if we really are threatened by a trend that threatens to channel 50 per cent of our Gross National Product or National Income through official hands, then why not adopt legal limitations? Most important, we might prohibit the federal government from levying (except in war) taxes in excess of 30 per cent of the GNP. Next, states could be barred from taking in taxes more than, say, eight per cent of their individual "State Products." Each state would be allowed to set its own level. Municipalities would also set limitations. As a result, the various jurisdictions would face a reality

Ronald Reagan tried to put such a limitation into the California State Constitution, but his proposal - called Proposition 1 - received only 45 per cent support in a voter referendum. 'In part, Proposition 1 ran afoul of arguments that the state tax limitations would only have shifted the local government services burden to local property taxes. But the idea may still work with better coordination and division of burdens between jurisdictions.

Secondly, we ought to borrow the Canadian federal government's system of indexed income taxation. When inflation pushes Canadian family earnings up, their tax obligation is adjusted to reflect real, not inflated income. As a result, Canadian officials do not have the same slapdash attitude towards inflation. They do not get higher revenues from it. In the United States, of course, inflation carries no tax adjustment but pushes families into higher brackets. Mounting federal revenues are an American bureaucrat's delight.

A third idea: Oblige the Internal Revenue Service to provide each taxpayer with a detailed two- or three-page breakdown of where his or her money is going. Back in 1968, Sen. Hubert Humphrey suggested that a simple booklet be sent out with each tax form indicating what proportion of every tax dollar goes for national defense, police services, government administration, programs, and the like. However, this idea turned out to be a hot potato. Humphrey desisted after administrators in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare told him that if the public learned how much of its money was being spent for welfare and kindred programs, the outcry would, 'set social progress back 50 years."

WASHINGTON - History will not likely forget Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, the tragic first lady of the 1960s and jet set queen of the 1970s, who is certainly one of the world's most fascinating

## Zarb Is Making His Mark On Capitol Hill

By ROWLAND EVANS And ROBERT NOVAK

WASHINGTON - In consecutive breakfast meetings Tuesday morning at the White House and on Capitol Hill, Federal Energy administrator Frank Zarb won a bloodless victory in a battle of wills with hardboiled Western Republican Senators which reinforces his stature as a rising force in a fading administration.

At 7:20 a.m., Zarb breakfasted in the west wing of the White House with Sen. James McClure of Idaho. A half hour later, they drove up Pennsylvania Avenue to join Sens. Paul Fannin of Arizona, Clifford Hansen Of Wyoming and Dewey Bartlett of Oklahoma in the Senate dining room. The upshot: all four quietly dropped their lethal opposition to Eric R. Zausner as a Zarb deputy at the Federal Energy Administration (FEA). For months, President Ford has been sitting on the proposed nomination to see how the wind would blow.

The resolution of a seemingly routine dispute is in fact a matter of importance. First, controversy over Zausner had lingered so long that he had come to symbolize fierce discontent with the Ford White House by Western conservatives. Second, Mr. Ford and his aides had characteristically washed their hands of Zausner, leaving his fate with Zarb.

Thus, winning agreement for Zausner is a formidable accomplishment by Zarb give up. which confirms him, far more than his three predecessors, as energy czar in fact as well as headline fancy. Though less publicized and televised than John Love, William Simon or John Sawhill,

- a 40-year-old New York investment banker with little governmental and no political experience - has exceeded them in quietly making his mark on Capitol Hill. As such, he is a Ford administration rarity.





## Forgotten Anniversary

America passed a milestone anniversary last month. But hardly anybody noticed.

On March 18, 1974, the Arabs lifted their oil embargo against the United States, and loosened their six-month stranglehold on America's lifestyle. Not since Colonial days had this country been so much at the mercy of foreign

When the embargo ended, Americans resolved, "never again." Great resolutions were heard in the land, and clarion calls like Project Independence were nurtured by mighty hyperbole.

Now, more than a year has gone by. Frankly, very little has been accomplished to reduce America's dependence on costly, insecure foreign oil.

In terms of good news and bad, the box score would look like this:

First, the good news-

 Congress and the Administration are at least talking-although wrangling might be a better word-about America's long-term energy needs. So are an assortment of foundations and study groups. Eventually, a consensus might emerge.

 The weather cooperated. The winter was mild. Even though the natural gas shortage got worse, America muddled through without any massive industrial shutdowns due to a lack of gas.

 Most people now recognize the importance of drilling offshore, in the Outer Continental Shelf, for a secure supply of domestic oil. The Supreme Court has clarified that the federal government, not the states, owns the Shelf. Now, the bad-

 America is still importing about six million barrels of oil a day, or almost 40 percent of our requirements.

 Congressional emphasis so far, in its energy discussions, has been almost exclusively on cutting demand. Measures to boost domestic supply largely have been neglected.

 There still isn't a single oil or gas well in the U.S. Atlantic, and the Interior Department's timetable for an Atlantic lease sale was delayed pending the Supreme Court ruling. Furthermore, Congress seems intent on mandating further delays, by extending the powers of the governors. And through schemes calling for exploration by the federal government before bids are requested from industry. There are even proposals to create a federal oil and gas company to work the choice offshore areas (when it gets around to them).

 In the face of the worsening natural gas shortage, Congress persists in retaining price controls on this fuel. It is considering tighter controls, even though present regulations have all but destroyed economic incentive to invest in gas exploration.

 Speaking of disincentive, Congress hacked away at the oil industry's ability to attract the massive amounts of capital it needs by increasing its tax burden. Just when profits were declining.

If you think the bad news outweighs the good, you're right. Isn't it time to remember the lesson of the boycott? And take a few sensible actions for a
