City Of Muleshoe Shows Healthy Gain Of $\mathbf{1 4 0 0}$ Per Cent In Ten Years Official Map Shows

Bailey county has increased in population 902 per cent since 1920, according to census figures given out last Saturday. The total popu lation for the county as of April 1,1930 , is 5,181 . In 1920, the county had a citizenship of 517, and no farms were listed by the census bureau. There were 758 farms listed in the 1930 census report. The follow:
