Shortly after the death of General Lawton a subscription for his family was started and $\$ 100,000$ cash was rai．a and presented to his widow．She is now before Congress asking a pension．She could not have claimed a pension in her hus－ band＇s life time．In a purely
material sense，measured by dollars，she is better off with that amount in cash than she was when she had a husband to look to for a support．His salary was only $\$ 5,500$ per year，out of which he had to ＊upport himself in the dignity of his rank．At six per cent， $\$ 100,000$ will bring $\$ 6000$ without the expense of sup－ porting a general in the army．
