PLANS MADE TO RECEIVE SHIP AT LAKEHURST ON WEDNESDAY

By United News.

WASHINGTON, Oct., 14 .--The ZR-3 is sailing into favorable weather conditions accord-ing to a message received from the U. S. S. Milwaukee at 1:10 Tuesday morning by the navy department.
The message which was sent

at llo'clock eastern standard time Monday night was a special weather report broad-cast to the ZR-3.

CHATHAM, Mass, Oct., 14.— (Tuesday): The Zeppelin ZR-3 was

direct communication with radio station WCC at 1:10 Tuesday morn ing, at that time official messages were being exchanged and the dirigible had not stated her exact position. A few minutes later the dirigible messaged that she was about two hundred miles south-west of the Azores.

Unless a moderate storm which was brewing along her route from the Azores to Bermuda had slowed up her flight, the ZR-3 at hildnight was skimming above the Atlantic ocean at 56 miles an hour less than a thousand miles from Bermuda and approximately 1,500 miles from Lakehurst, N. J.

Station WCC at Chatham, Mass. picked up a message from the dirigible stating that she had passed over Flores Island in the Azores group at about 6:30 eastern standard time and was continuing her course at Bermuda using only three of her five motors.
