The port of London authorities during excavations in connection with dock extensions have been keenly watching for evidences of ancient and prehistoric London.

Though they did not find so much as they expected, they were gratified with several interesting discov-Charles decided that Cupid at his eries.

Distinct traces of a buried forest were found at the bottom of the South Albert dock, which is probably a part of that of which Pepys speaks in his diary as having been found at Blackwall.

A number of beautiful walkingsticks were made of some of the hard bog oak found in this buried forest. and visiting colonial premiers and other public men were only too eager to secure them as souvenirs.

It became necessary to remove the path known as Manor way, which traversed the lock of the dock, and evidence was found to show that this was the old Roman route between Esser and Kent. Some Roman potteries were discovered heresbouts.

All those relics of past ages are being collected with s view to establishing either a Port of London museum, or augmenting the other publie collections in London.





All voters favoring this proposed constitutional amendment shall erase the words, "against the amendment to Article 8, Section 9 of the Constitution," etc. and those opposing it shall erase the words "for the amendment to Article 8, Section 9, of the Constitution," etc. which erasure shall be made by make ing a mark with pencil or pen through said words. All ballots cast as above provided shall be counted as cast for or against this proposed amendment; and if a majority of the votes cast shall be for the amendment, it shall be declared adopted;, if a majority of the votes cast shall be against the amendment said amendment shall be lost. Sec. 3. The Governor of this State is hereby directed to issue the neces-Eary proclamation for said election and to have the same; published as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.

Sec. 4. The sum of Five Thousand (\$5000) Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby approspriated out of funds in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated to defray the expense of such publication and election.




