"Tonight I go to Quebec," said Dupont. "I shall be aboard all day. I may not return."

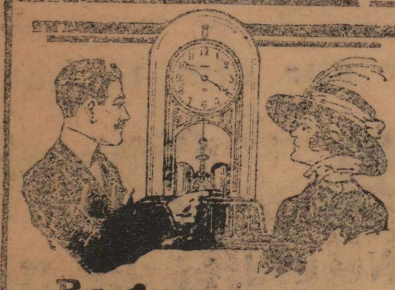

"You will come back," she stammered. "You will be back before the river closes. Then we shall be together here through the winter. We shall be happier than in the past. And we—"

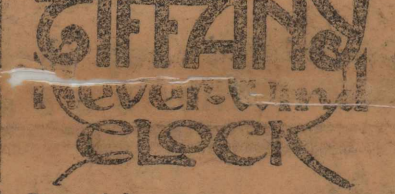
"The name!" he cried, seizing her by the shoulders. "Tell me now! I wait no longer!"

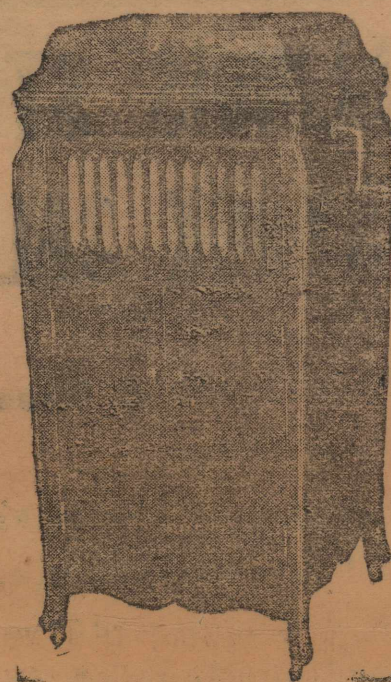

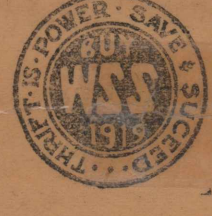

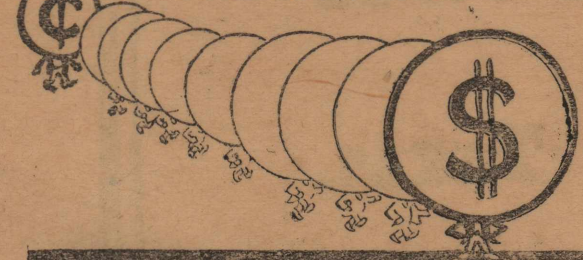

The Invocation was asked by Rev. S. C. Dunn and the program was devoid of frills and flowers and business like in arrangement. The graduates were Millard Bryson, Floyd Ogden, Joe Brown Ross, Justice Adams, Thelma Kelley and Bernice Glasscock. The novelty in this particular was that four boys and two girls comprised the class of 1920. Showing that if the boys are kept in school they are nearly as smart as the girls. Parents should endeavor to give the boys a chance.

The feature of the evening was the address by Dr. Frederick Eby, Dean of the Department of Education of the University of Texas. This was the first time the Sonora school has attracted sufficient attention to have the Dean of Texas' highest educational institution honor us in this manner. There is nothing too good for the Sonora school, yet there are some things necessary in equipment to put us in the first rank and these matters should be considered during the vacation.

Superintendent Jewel Matthews has done much to keep the Sonora school abreast the wave and considered the having of Dr. Eby to make the address one of his greatest achievements and in this we think the audience joined him after hearing the distinguished educator. Dr. Eby was also benefited by the trip to Sonora as it gave greater range to his vision of the possibilities of the undeveloped West, where 70 miles from a railroad he was able to find him self at home in a modern \$50,000 building in which the children of the community received instruction from a corps of teachers, all of whom are holders of first grade certificates and college graduates, the pupils alert and healthy in body and mind and the audience educated and refined.

Dr. Eby was impressive in his simplicity, entertaining in his methods and positive in his knowledge of the subject.

The diplomas were presented by the President of the School Board, T. B. Adams, who, when he had returned to the audience invited all the school as many others as wished to attend, to partake of a barbecue dinner at his ranch Sunday noon. Mr. Adams' evidently believing that actions speak louder than words. In this connection we feel justified in congratulating Mr. Adams on the fact that he has had the pleasure of seeing four of his children graduate at the Sonora school.

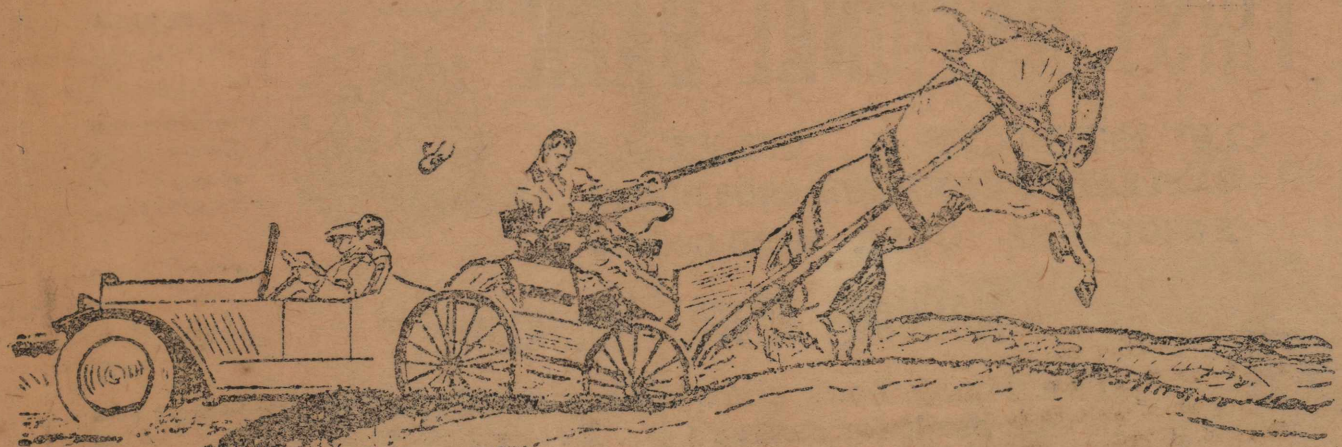
