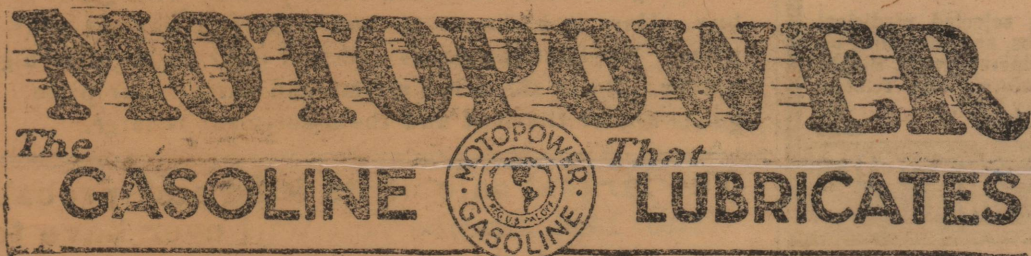

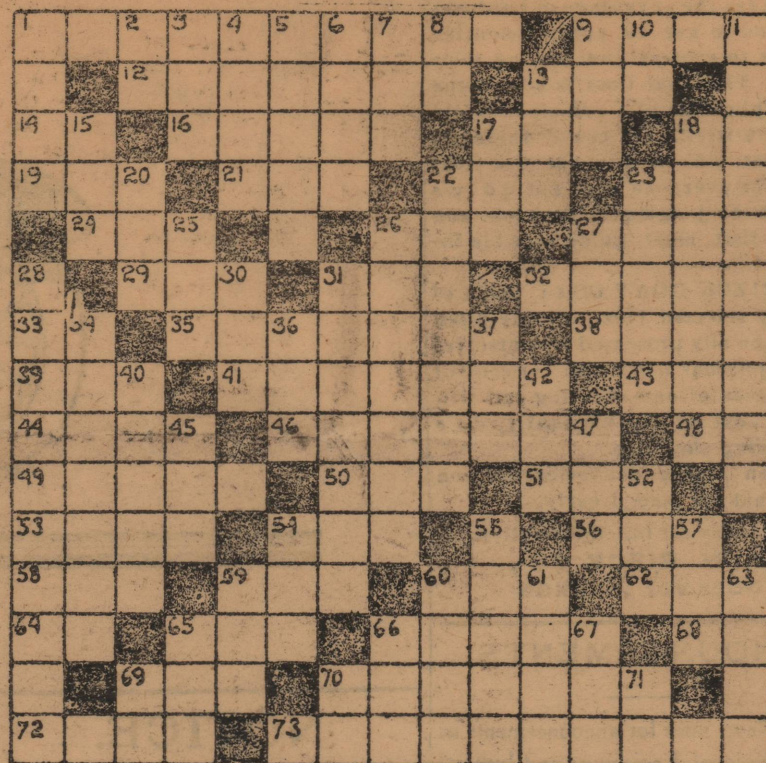

**FEAR** of snakes is a universal instinct. Ever since our common mother, Eve, met the snake in the Garden, the human race has feared and hated snakes.

This is not only foolish but actually harmful. Black snakes, bull snakes and all the grass snakes and garter snakes are not only harmless but are also friends of the farmer and gardener, as they destroy quantities of rats, field mice and other destructive animals.

There are 103 varieties of snakes in the United States, of which 17 varieties are poisonous. Venomous snakes all belong to one of four varieties: rattlesnakes, copperheads, water moccasins and coral snakes.

The coral snake is found almost exclusively in Florida. Water moccasins and copperheads are common in the Southern states. Rattlesnakes are distributed widely all over the country.

It is a common belief that whisky is an antidote for snake bites and that the only thing to do is to give the victim all the whisky that he can possibly drink. As much as five or six quarts of whisky have been given in a few hours. Such an enormous dose of alcohol is quite as dangerous as the snake poison.

In case of snake bite, tie a bandage around the arm or leg (the parts most usually bitten) above the bite. This may be made of a belt, garter, suspender, handkerchief or strip of underwear. Twist it with a stick, pencil or knife handle, until the flow of blood is shut off.

Then, with a sharp knife, cut through the bite, making two cuts at right angles to each other and going at least as deep as the bite. The freer the flow of blood the better.

Suck the wound thoroughly, being careful that there is no crack or raw place on the lips. Spit out the blood, rinsing the mouth each time with a weak solution of permanganate of potash.

Wash the wound out thoroughly with a strong solution of permanganate. Then loosen the bandage slowly.

Don't pour whisky into the patient. It may kill him even if the snake bite doesn't.

**EXOPHTHALMIC GOITER**

A LADY writes to me as follows: "Your articles in our local newspaper interest me very much, especially the one on goiter. I have had exophthalmic goiter for 12 years and during the last two years it has been troublesome, causing severe headaches and fainting spells. The doctor has told me that the only cure is operation. That I will not submit to. Would iodine do me any good and how should I take it?"

Exophthalmic goiter is an entirely different disease from simple goiter. In ordinary goiter the chief and generally the only symptom is enlargement of the thyroid gland.

Exophthalmic goiter is a disease which affects the entire body. It is characterized by slight enlargement of the thyroid, accompanied by protrusion of the eyes, rapid pulse, trembling of the fingers, extreme nervousness, muscular weakness, sleeplessness and loss of weight. While the popular name emphasizes the eye protrusion and the thyroid enlargement, there are cases of exophthalmic goiter in which the eyes do not protrude, as there are cases in which the gland is not enlarged.

Many theories have been suggested as to the cause of this disease; what it is we do not know. It may follow some sudden shock or fright. It is more common among women than men. Although most common in middle adult life, it may occur at any age. It has no relation to simple goiter.

Beside the loss of weight and strength, the most alarming feature is the rapid heart, which may run as high as 140 to 150 to the minute. This extremely rapid action, if not relieved, in time tires out and exhausts the heart.

In the belief that the disease was due primarily to a diseased thyroid, the favorite treatment in the past has been surgical removal of a part of the gland. Even under the best condition and in the hands of the most skillful surgeon, the number of recoveries following operation is small. Sajous puts the number of recoveries four years after the operation as low as 18 per cent, or less than one out of five cases operated on.

The non-surgical treatment consists of rest, diet, carefully regulated exercise, the use of X-rays and of iodine and a few carefully administered drugs. Iodine, in large doses, is in most cases dangerous. Given in small doses and carefully watched by a competent physician, it may be of benefit.

Rest and diet are most important. Tranquility of body and mind is more important than actual physical inactivity. The patient must be made contented, and as Crite says, "must hibernate like a bear in winter" so that the brain, the heart, the nerves, the whole body as well as the muscles rest.

The diet must be plentiful to make up for the lost weight, but must be of all kinds, as well as tea, coffee, alcohol and tobacco must be given up.

MR. DAVIS WRITES.

To A.A.G.B.A. Weekly  
Dear Sir:  
I read Mr. Halbert's letter in your paper in regard to chevons, also Mr. DeGroff's answer. Possibly I did not quite interpret Mr DeGroff's letter, but I could tell he tried to advance the idea that we could create a market for chevons by exhibiting angora goats at the Royal Stock Show at Kansas City, and the International at Chicago. He says that we got a fair price for our chevons back in 1904 and '05 when goats were exhibited at the Royal in K.C. I believe in exhibiting angoras and mohair everywhere but I don't believe the price we got for chevons a long back during the days of the goat shows in K.C. was created from the showing of the goats. During those days the chevons were shipped to Fort Worth and Kansas City and sold as mutton goats. The packers killed them and sold the flesh as mutton, and that is why the packers were able to pay us more for our chevons, and continued to pay us more until some of our goat men became nervous and wanted to do something for the industry. So they believed it would help the sale of mutton goats to force the meat to be branded goat meat instead of mutton. So they got the law passed and got goat meat stamped "Goat Mutton" and so that spoiled things and ruined the chevon market. And I am sure if the sheep men were unwise enough to have a law passed to stamp mutton "sheep mutton" they would not be able to sell their mutton sheep any better than the goat men could sell their product stamped "goat meat." Now mutton has been the trade name for meat since 1880 some thing and it is firmly established. A trade name means it all when it comes to marketing things. If two markets were in competition one sold it as "country pork" and the other as "country hog meat," I am sure the man with the pork would soon put the man with the hog meat out of business.

When the laws of our country forced goat meat on the market without a trade name the goat men woke up and found they were at sea without an oar. It was time to do something, they couldn't go back the route they came, as they had convicted themselves and passed a sentence, and are paying the penalty now, as they claimed it was a fraud to sell goat meat as mutton. Now after all this had happened and we were lost and scattered without a shepherd, Colonel Halbert, being alert and quick of action, and seeing the need of a trade name for the goat flesh, undertook to establish one, which he did, and it is here to stay. Some of us are set in our ways may be hard to learn to say chevons, but our children and our children's children will know and nothing but chevons.

The word chevons makes goat meat look, taste and smell 99 per cent better, and goat's flesh is the sweetest and best of all meat.
