

Railroad Believed to Have Steepest Grades

The Uintah railway, a narrowgauge railroad 30 miles long, passing over the Book Cliff mountains, in western Colorado, and running into the Uintah basin of Utah, is probably the most severe operation in the United States, if not in the world. In crossing the Book Cliff mountains, a branch of the Rockies, this railroad has six miles of 71/2 per cent grade and eight miles of 5 per cent grade, and in the 12 miles between Mile Post 28 and Mile Post 40 there are 233 curves ranging from 4 degrees to 80 degrees, an average degree of curvature fe 100 feet being 60 degrees. Special types of locomotives known as shays are required to baul freight over the mountain, this type of engine being propelled by gears, in contrast tothe rod-type locomotive used on all of the standard railways in the country, and, outside of this railread, used only on a few logging

Sweets That Fatten

Dr. Harvey Wiley says that honey and sugar in equivalent amounts have the same fattening properties. As honey contains about 20 per cent of water, or a little more, it would require 20 per cent more honey to have the same fattening properties as an equivalent amount of sugar.
