## Novel Railway Car

Carries Own Power Carrying its own private waterfall to run itself by a water turbine, a railway car utilizing a new type. of power transmission is attracting the attention of Swedish transportation engineers. The prime motive power consists of an internal combustion motor of the usual type, but instead of using gears or clectric transmission, the motor operates a centrifugal pump, which supplies water under pressure to a turbine directly geared to the driving axle. The speed of the car is governed by the height of the artificial "head" of water created by the pump. With a motor of 180 horse power the car has attained a speed of 50 miles per hour.

An especial advantage. claimed for the new transmission method is freedom from jerks in starting and stopping. Swedish railroads have already ordered the manufacture of new hydraulic drive.







RAMBOUILLET SHEEP SHEAR HEIVIGST FLEECE AT THELE TEARS.

Woul growers are accustomed to thick that yearlings shear the heaviest fl eces of any age group. Recent tests made by D. A. Spen cur, in charge of the sheep and wool investigations, U.S. Depart ment of Agriculture, do not bear out this popular belief. Averag ing the weight of floeces of 1,486 Rambouillet sheep ranging to a, e from 1 to 7 years old, he found that the 3 year old ewes sheared the boaviest flacces of clean woul produced by any group, their average being 13 per ceat greater than the average for the entire group.

The fieeces from ewes 7 years old or older averaged 15 per cent below the average and were the lighest flueces produced by any oge group. The yearlings' fleeces were nearly 8 per cent below the average, and with the exception of the 7 year old group they were the lightest, in spite of the fect COUSTY AND DESTRICT CLERK. that they had grown for about 13. or 14 honths, while all the fleeces from lowes older than yearlings; ha, i grown ex otly one year.

## Find Ancient Prison

at Richmond, Va. Relics that bear testimony to the existence of a subterranean prison have been unearthed in Richmond, Va. Excavators working at Twenty-second and Cary streets came upon the corridor into which a row of three dungeons opened.

Massive iron gates and windows came into the picture as the excavators plied picks and shovels. The metal fixtures of the prison had been buried probably two hundred years. later research into the history of the place disclosed, yet much of it was in a fairly good state of preservation.

The fastenings of gates and windows gave way as the earth about them was loosened by the diggers. and they were easily removed. The collection of relics unearthed included various pieces of metal which could not be identified as to the uses they had served. The cell windows were of crosswork iron pattern, simi lar to prison windows now in use, but notable for their thickness. The cell doors were of the same ponderous design.

Archives of the county show that the original courthouse and jail were built in 1752. It is clearly apparent, however, that the dungeons were constructed in the hillside many years carlier.


