Poposing an amendement to the Constitution of the State of Texas amending Article VIII by the insertion of Section 1-a therein, authorizing the Legislature to provide for the separation of the objects of taxation for State purposes and for the support of the counties, districts and political subdivisions of the State and Counties, and authorizing the n ad vorlem tax or other form of egislature to provide for the levy of ax for State purposes only, and for local puposes only; authorizing the Legislature to provide for the classification of objects of taxation and providing the rates shall be equal n the same class of property, and fixing limitations upon taxation. Be it Resolved by the Legislature of

the State of Texas: Section 1. That Article 8 of the constitution of the State of Texas be amended by inserting therein Section

1-a as follows: Section 1-a. The Legislature may separate the objects of taxation for tate purposes from the objects of tax ation for the support of the counties, districts and political subdivis-ions of the State and counties; and may provide for the levy of an ad voriem tax, or other form of tax, on certain classes of taxable property, or other objects, for State purposes only (including school purposes); or upon certain classes of property, or other objects, for county or local purposes only (including school pur-In no event shall the race f such taxes exceed the sum of the imits of such taxes fixed by this Constitution for State, county and other local purposes. The Legislature may provide for the classification of obects of taxation. Taxation shall be equal and uniform.

Sec. 2 The foregoing Constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State, at an election to be held the first Monday in August, A. D. 1927, at which all ballots shall have printed thereon the following:



#### HOME MAKERS CLUB

The very interesting demonstration enjoyed by the Home Makers club on April 27 was lamp shades. A very pretty shade was made of ordinary wrapping paper unglazed. This paper was crumpled and dyed in rose rit (cold) allowed to dry and dipped in blue rit. After drying this time the paper was brushed with hot parafrin, and after the paraffin was dry it was brushed with hot paraffin. After the paraffin dryed it was put between blotters and pressed with a very hot iron. Rose sealing wax was next dissolved in alcohol and brushed over the paper. When this was dry the shade was made by gluing to circles of cardboard painted black. These circles were six inches in diameter and the paper was about thirteen inches long. This made a lantern shaped shade, which was finished at the bottom with a tassel made of many colors of beads. The shade was very pretty, and it imparted a beautiful rose glow to the light coming thru the shade.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO.32 Proposing an amendment to the Con-stitution of the State of Texas by adding thereto Section 60, Article 16 so as to provide that the Legislature may fix the compensation of certain county officers by salaries in lieu of fees, commissions and other prerequisites; providing for an election and making appropria-

an election and making appropriation to pay expenses.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto another section to be known as Section 60, Article 16, to read as follows to wit:

read as follows, to-wit: Section 60. The Legislature may provide compensations for certain district and county officers, to-wit: The District Attorney, County Judge, County Attorney, Sheriff, County Clerk, District Clerk County Tax Assessor and County Tax Collector, by prescribing their duties, and fixing salaries in lieu of fees,

commissions and other prerequisites as now provided by the Constitution.

Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at an election to be held on the first Monday in August, A. D. 1927, at which all ballots shall have printed thereon "For amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas giving the Legislature power to provide compensation for the District Attorney and county officers through salaries in lieu of fees, and commissio and prerequisites as now prescribed by the Constitution," and Against amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas giving the Legislatur power to provide compensation for the District Attorney and county of-ficers through salaries in lieu of fees, commissions and prerequisites as now prescribed by the Constitution," leaving the one expressing his vote on

the proposed amendment.
Sec. 3. There is hereby appropriated out of any money on hand in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars or as much thereof as may be necessary to defray the expenses of this election, including the expense of printing notices and

Sec. 4. The Governor shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.




