#### Fine Pictures Pack Local Play House

That the people of Sonora do appreciate the better type of film is well demonstrated here by the attendance figures a the local theatre.

The Big Parade and Ben Hur, to mention two of the outstanding films that have been shown here, have, in spite of advanced prices, been much more heavily attended than the ordinary run of films.

Three exhibitions here of Ben Hur, two night performances and one matinee, this week, saw long double lines of cars parked outside the theatre for a block in each direction. Many out-of-town people, including many from Eldorado and Ozona, drove to Sonoa to see this excellent film.

However, the picture that really "packs 'em in" to use a box office expression, proved to be those of the Dempsey-Tunney fight, and while the pugilistic art is not, perhaps, quite as elevating as the more refined and less violent type, the picture met with phenomenal success wherever shown. This, beyond doubt, is due to the remarkable interest taken in the fight, which surpassed in point of attendance and human interest, even the great Olympic games held by the ancient Greeks.

It is argued that the prize ring, with its bloody pounding, is a degrading spectacle. But, it can not, by any stretch of the imagination, be compared to the gladitorial combats engaged in by the Romans and Greeks in ancient times, which furnish the basis for many of our "great films" of which Ben Hur is a good example.
