



Democrats bolting their party ticket to vote for Republican electors for the presidency and vice-presidency, but yet desirous of casting those same ballots for Democratic nominees for state officers were assured that such action would not make their votes illegal in a pronounced ssue Friday by Alvin S. Moody of Houston, state chairman for the anti-Smith Democrats of Texas from headquarters in the Southland Ho-

Moody's assurance is based on an opinion he received from Attorney General Claude Pollard, which was offered on the strength of a sample after Moody had marked it for Repub ballot submitted Pollard by Moody licans and for Democrats.

Pollard's letter reads in part: "If a voter desires to vote for the Republican presidential electors and at the same time vote for the Democratic nominees for state offices, it is legal for such a voter to run a line through the presidential electors on the Democratic ticket, leaving the presidential electors on the Republican ticket urmarked; and when he reaches nominees for state officesleave same unmarked on the Democratic ticket and run a line through the nominees for state offices on the Republican ticket. This, of course, would necessitate running a line through the entire ticket of any other party appearing on the balbt.

Moody announced in his connection that copies of sample ballots appropriately marked for the edification of anti-Smith voters would be distributed over the State within the next few weeks.—Dallas Nevs.

He says, "Many trees and orna menta shrubs have been treated, in most cases successfully, by incorporating a few pounds of iron sulphate in the soil around the base of the plants. This practice was originally based on a recommendation made by Doctor Taubenus in 1921 which had of Amarillo argue that iron sulphate is no fertilizer and will credit no recommendation to use it. An interesting sidelight is that in many instances they were applying and recommending the application o lime-notwithstanding the fact that the soils of Amarillo are well supplied with lime and that an excess of lime rendering the iron available is a probable cause of yellowing.

One pound of iron sulphate dissolved in five gallons of water, was sprinkled over 100 square feet of badly affected lawn. The distribution of the applicaion was poor and there was some burning of the foliage in small spots, however, the application was strikingly successful. Within 24 hours all the yellow color had disappeared and the lawn where treated had resumed the normal deep green color. This application was made in the evening after watering so that the solution remained on the foliage until the next evening when the spot was rewatered because some burning was evident. green color for the last month while more yellow. 
