Rogation Sunday Will Be Observed

Rogation Sunday will be observed at St. John's Episcopal Church May 23, when the Rev. Rollin Polk will speak on the conservation of natural resources and good stewardship of plants and animals.

The Rev. Mr. Polk explains that the term rogation is derived from the Latin rogare, meaning to ask, and Rogation Sunday is a time of prayer and supplication for the crops, the animals, and the workers at the beginning of the growing season. It is the time in the spring of the Christian calendar which complements the time of thanks for the autumn harvest, traditionally observed as Thanksgiving Day.

Summer 4-H Events To Be Discussed At Meeting May 26

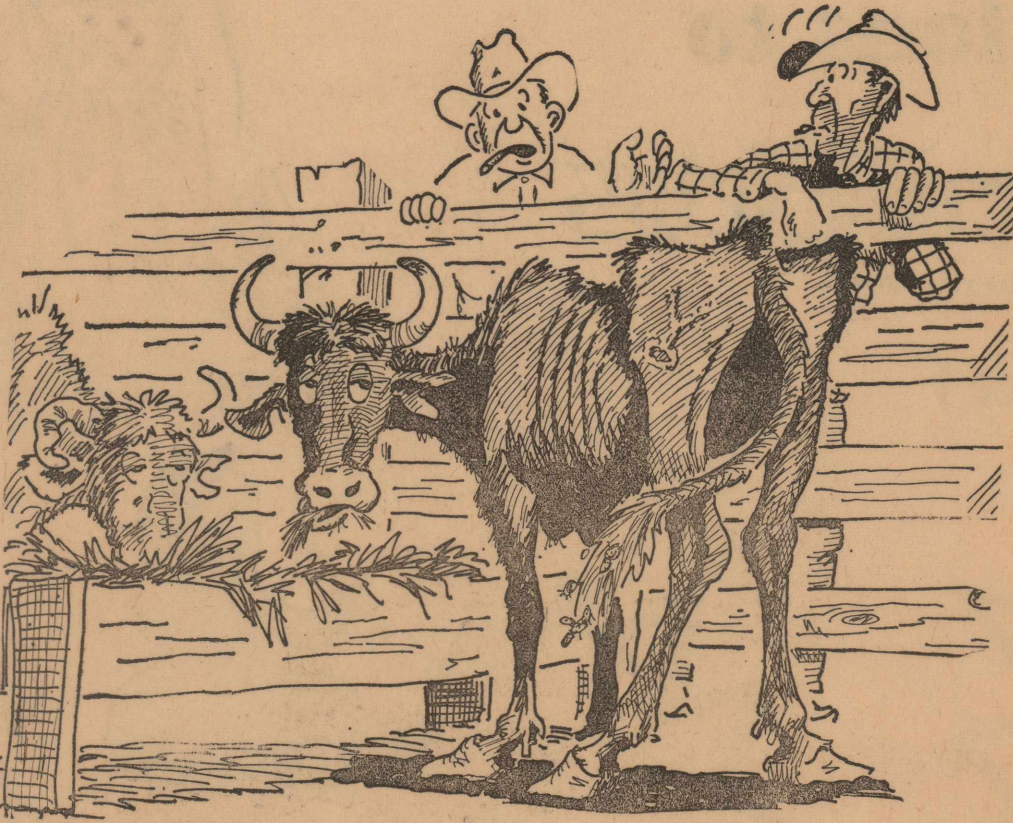

J. D. Ross To Speak At Annual Meeting

Dr. Joe David Ross, veterinarian here, has been selected as one of the speakers at Texas A&M University's College of Veterinary Medicine 18th annual Texas Conference for Veterinarians and Alumni Reunions May 26-28.

Ross will speak during the general program on the topic "Horse Practice".

Other talks will be given on "Equine Piroplasmiasis", "Swine Parasites", "Small Animal Problems", "Bovine Surgery", "New Development in Eye Diseases", "Heart Failure in the Dog", and other subjects.

Activities start at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday with a reception in the Memorial Student Center Assembly Room. Dr. A. A. Price, dean of the A&M College of Veterinary Medicine, will open the talks the next day at 9 a.m. with an address of welcome.

The classes of 1925, 1935, 1945, and 1955 are scheduled to have alumni reunions. They will hear A&M head football coach, Gene Stallings, during a luncheon on Friday.

R. E. Davis Promoted To First Lt. Rank, Earns E. I. B. Award

Rodney E. Davis, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. L. "Tom" Davis, has recently been promoted to the rank of first lieutenant in the U.S. Army after serving 18 months as a second lieutenant. Davis's wife, Beverly, and Battalion Commander, Lt. Col. R. W. Bertholf pinned the bars on Lt. Davis January 4.

In addition to the promotion, Davis has earned the expert infantryman's badge, E.I.B. To receive this award, an applicant must qualify as a sharp shooter on the M-14 rifle; pass proficiency tests in artillery adjustment, bayonet course, first aid, military intelligence, code of conduct, grenade throwing, weapons field stripping, cover and camouflage, and map and compass course; and walk 12 miles in three hours wearing field gear and weapon.

Lt. Davis has also been appointed the investigating officer on the "act of bravery" by two G.I.s who pulled Jerry Baldwin out of a submerged, wrecked car.

A graduate of Sonora High School and a 1963 graduate of Tarleton State College in Stephenville, Lt. Davis has served 22 months in the U.S. Army. He is now with the second battalion, 41st infantry, second armored division at Fort Hood.

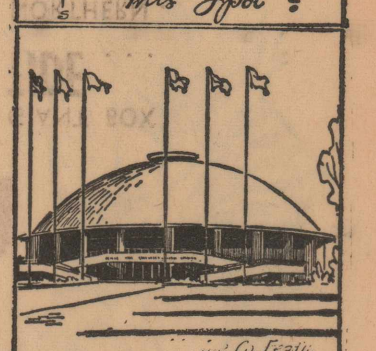

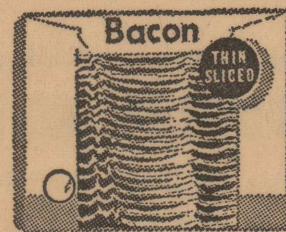
