After two hard fought losses to Denver City and Wall, who combined for 26 wins and 2 losses a year ago, the Broncos had a easy victory over the smaller 2A Harper Longhorns by a score of 36 to 7. The starters got a chance to pad their stats, and the reserves got lots of playing time.

The Broncos took the opening kickoff and scored the first touchdown one minute 50 seconds later. The drive started with a play action pass from Andres Acevedo to Hunter Hughes for a first down. Elijah Cross smashed his way through the Longhorns for

another first down. Acevedo got the touchdown as he raced untouched from 20 yards out. Hughes hit the kick and the Broncos led 7 to 0 with 10:10 left in the first quarter.

The smaller, slower, and weaker (not a dig as they are a smaller school) went three and out and punted. Gus Barrera caught a bullet pass from Acevedo. On the third play, Brian Garcia sprinted 65 yards for his longest varsity touchdown run. Hughes bisected the goal posts to make the score 14 to 0 with 7:34 left in the first.

The Longhorns ran seven plays before turning the ball

over to the Broncos. Acevedo mixed runs and passes on the next drive. Gabe Rollet caught his longest pass of the season setting up a touchdown run by Brett Castillo. He scored on the option play from 25 yards. The PAT battery of Noah SanMiguel and Hughes smoothly executed the successful kick to make the score 21 to 0 with 2:33 left in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Jonathan Gutierrez recovered a Longhorn fumble. But a low snap contributed to an Acevedo fumble that Harper recovered. The next Longhorn drive was extended by two Bronco penalties. When their drive stalled, they punted to the Broncos.

SanMiguel was able to return their punt for about 15 yards. Garcia added another long run. Sid Anderson broke through the line for his longest run of the season. Then he followed it with a 13-yard touchdown carry. As he was

Part of my duties involved staff studies on proposed new actions such as war plans, flying training regulations, and force structure proposals such as base closures. There were times where I had to present both sides of a pro-

posal and times where I had to research and present only one side. Many times we were ordered to present the option that we, as staff officers, were not in favor of. In either case, an emotional argument not based on facts was a sure way to lose credibility with the generals and possibly end one's career.

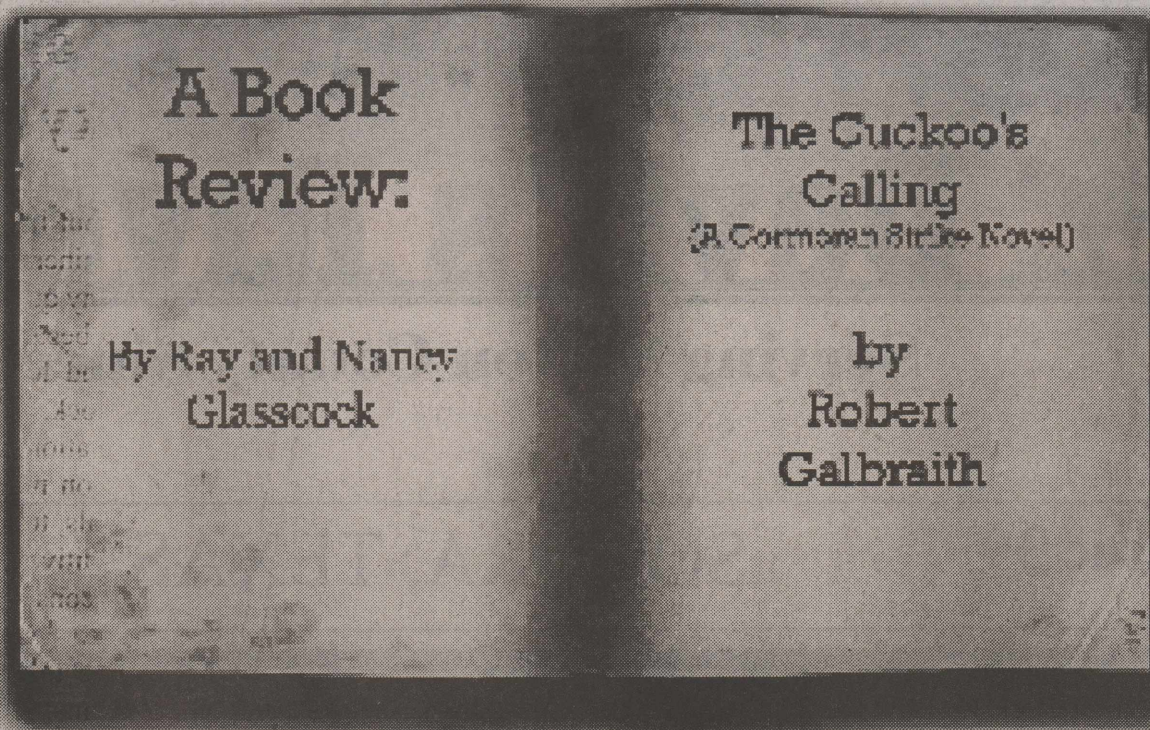


Wellness Ministry

Sonora ISD Teacher Highlight of the Week

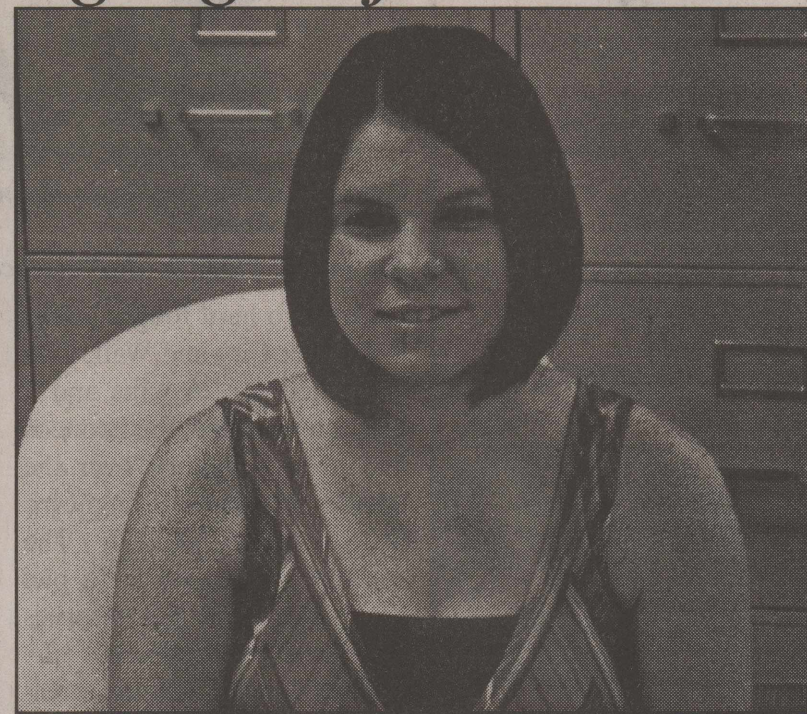


Deborah Ramon



Meeting Mineral Needs of Livestock Can Be Tricky

I was recently visiting with a 4-H family about livestock nutrition and the question came up regarding minerals. Well, mineral supplementation of livestock raises many questions that are sometimes difficult to answer. That's because mineral requirements depend on age, sex, stage and level of production and can vary across breeds of livestock. We discussed options for providing mineral supplementation of show animals, but that reminded me that deciding on mineral can be overwhelming. The tag lists major minerals, trace minerals, vitamins, percent, parts per million and additives. I thought it would be good to list some main points to consider regarding minerals.

Minerals are divided into categories relative to the amount thought to be required in the diet of ruminants. The seven major essential minerals are called macrominerals, while the nine minor essential minerals are called microminerals. The macrominerals are calcium, phosphorus, sodium, chlorine, magnesium, potassium, and sulfur. Microminerals are iron, iodine, copper, zinc, molybdenum, manganese, cobalt, selenium, and fluorine. Macromineral requirements are usually expressed as a percent of the diet while micromineral requirements are typically quoted in parts per million (ppm) of the diet.

Show animals or those in the feedlot can usually meet their mineral requirements without feeding a mineral supplement. That is because most commercially prepared feeds are balanced for the entire mineral profile and do not require mineral supplementation. Mineral is usually provided to show animals, however, as insurance in meeting the needs of individual animals. Mineral supplements are most often warranted when livestock are grazing, especially when forage is dormant, mature and/or weathered. So what factors affect mineral content on rangeland? Plant content of mineral depends on soil, plant species, stage of maturity, yield, pasture management and climate. Most naturally occurring mineral deficiencies in herbivores are associated with specific regions and are directly related to soil characteristics. Alkaline soils tend to be more abundant in most trace elements than more acid, coarse, sandy formations. Also, leaching and weathering of soils in heavy rainfall and high temperature areas accentuate mineral deficiencies.

Commercially prepared free-choice minerals are generally developed for specific geographical areas to meet 100-125% of the average herd's requirement for that region. However, for specific questions concerning mineral nutrition for livestock, it is best to consult a knowledgeable professional nutritionist.

Texas Seceding: Continued From Front Page

So, I was wondering what would I tell my general if he asked me to provide him with ideas on the impact of Texas seceding from the United States?

With that in mind, I will consider many of the things that would change and what impact it would have on Texas. When I discuss an issue, I will try to categorize it as what will happen, what might happen, or it will be an issue, but what the impact is, "is above my pay grade."

I can see three positions that the United States would take if Texas (or any state) wanted to secede.

1. The United States would do everything possible to make the state's transition to an independent country as smooth as possible.

2. The United States would not be happy, but would not do everything in its power to financially destroy the new country.

3. The United States would use everything possible (short of using military action as Russia would) to make the new country fail.

This analysis pre-supposes that the United States would choose the second option.

When Texas becomes an independent country, the issue of citizenship will have to be resolved. It is likely that Texans would lose their American citizenship. It is possible that Texans would be required passports to travel to the United States. Texas would have to establish embassies or consul-

ates in foreign countries to support Texans who wish to travel and/or conduct business abroad. Texas would have to replace the functions of the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines, Coast Guard, FBI, CIA, US Customs Service and the US Border Patrol. Texas would have to establish their own currency and financial system to replace the Federal Banks (i.e. any bank with the word National in their name) and the Federal Reserve System. The IRS would not collect taxes from Texans, and we would have to revise our tax laws to compensate.

All functions that were labeled "Federal" would cease. Some of the functions that would cease immediately are Medicare, Social Security, and all federal retirement pay (such as military and civil service). Replacing the Federal safety net for senior Texans would have to be a top priority of the New Texas Government. Federal funding for highways, airports, air traffic control, universities, independent school districts, and agricultural subsidies would cease. All military bases would close and their associated weapons systems and personnel would leave. It is possible, I suppose, that the United States and Texas could establish a military alliance where current the Texas National Guard and Texas Air National Guard assets could remain. That is definitely above my pay grade.

This pretty covers some of what "will happen" and the associated things that "would have to be done."

The issues that are definitely above my pay grade are the issues concerning the Texas economy. Most of the major corporations that employ a majority of Texans would be classified as foreign companies. Would they leave? Would they take advantage of the new country?

The most troubling of all issues is obvious. What would become of the Dallas Cowboys and Houston Texans since they are part of the National Football League? Would the Spurs, Rangers and Mavericks be forced to leave Texas? Would the Aggies be forced to leave the SEC? I suspect that this could be a show stopper!

tacked on the two points with the keeper into the end zone. Sonora 16 Harper 0.

Joe Angel Torres made the defensive play of the first half with an interception. He was rewarded by being on the receiving end of a Johnson half back pass. The speedy Torres then outran the defense for the Colts' third touchdown. The two-point play failed.

There was no score in the second half. The Colts won 22-0. On Thursday, they play the 7th grade Junction Eagles at 5 PM in Bronco Stadium.

The 8th grade Colts are now 2-0 after they defeated Harper 28-8 in a driving rainstorm.

Dutton took the ball into the end zone for the second Colt touchdown. Tight end Logan McDonald caught the two-point pass to make it Sonora 14 Harper 0 halfway through

the second quarter.

After Sonora's score, the Longhorn kickoff returner scored the only Harper points with his return. The Longhorns' two-point play was good. Sonora 14 Harper 8.

In the last play of the second quarter, the Colts tried a double reverse. When the runner realized that he was trapped, he lateralled (is that a word?) back to Dutton. Dutton reversed the direction of the play and sprinted down the sideline for an improbable 60 plus yard touchdown in a downpour. The two-point play was good. At the half, it was 22-8 Colts.

Willie B. Munoz got the Dutton's option pitch and scored the only second half touchdown on a 35 yard run in the fourth quarter. The two-point pass play was over both Michael Johnson's and Mc-

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-O-08

AN ORDINANCE CALLING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SONORA, TEXAS, TO SUBMIT A PROPOSITION ON THE QUESTION OF THE ADOPTION OF AN ADDITIONAL SALES AND USE TAX TO REDUCE THE ANNUAL PROPERTY TAX, MAKING PROVISION FOR THE CONDUCT OF AN ELECTION, AND RESOLVING OTHER MATTERS INCIDENT AND RELATED TO SUCH ELECTION

WHEREAS, the City Council (the City Council) of the City of Sonora, Texas (the City), located in Sutton County, Texas (the County), has determined that an election should be held on the question of whether an additional municipal sales and use tax should be adopted pursuant to Subchapter B of Chapter 321, as amended, Texas Tax Code (Chapter 321) and Subchapter B of Chapter 321 (the Election); and

WHEREAS, an election under Chapter 321 has not been previously held within one year from the date of the new election; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby further finds and determines the City is not disqualified from adopting the additional municipal sales and use tax in that:

- 1) the City is not included within the boundaries of a rapid transit authority or regional transportation authority;
2) the City is not located within a county that contains territory within the boundaries of a regional transportation authority;
3) the City does not impose a tax authorized by Chapter 453, as amended, Texas Transportation Code; and
4) the combined rate of all sales and use taxes imposed by the City of Sonora, Texas and other political subdivisions having territory in the City does not exceed two percent at any location in the City; and

and will not, with the adoption of the additional municipal sales and use tax, exceed two percent at any location in the City; and

WHEREAS, the City will enter into an election services contract with the City, by and through its City Clerk (the Clerk) in accordance with the provisions of Subchapter D of Chapter 31, as amended, Texas Election Code, or other applicable law, pursuant to which the City will conduct all aspects of the election therefore;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SONORA, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: The Election shall be held in the CITY OF SONORA, TEXAS on the 4TH day of November, 2014 (Election Day), which is a uniform election date under the Texas Election Code, as amended, and is not less than thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption of this ordinance (the Ordinance), for the purpose of submitting the following proposition to the qualified voters of the City:

PROPOSITION

"Shall the City of Sonora, Texas adopt and impose an additional municipal sales and use tax authorized by the Municipal Sales and Use Tax Act, as amended, Tax Code, Section 321.101 (b) at the rate of one-quarter of one percent to be used to reduce the property tax rate?"

SECTION 2: The election precinct hereby established for the purpose of holding the Election and the polling place hereby designated for holding the Election in the City election precinct is identified in Exhibit A to this Ordinance (which is incorporated herein by reference for all purposes). At least 31 days prior to the scheduled Election Day, the Mayor or the City Manager, or their designees, in coordination with the Clerk, will identify and formally approve the appointment of the Presiding Judge, Alternate Presiding judges, Election Clerks, and all other election official for the Election, together with any other necessary changes to election practices and procedures and can correct, modify, or change the Exhibits to this Ordinance based upon the final locations and times agreed upon by the city, the Clerk and the Participants, to the extent permitted by applicable law.

The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two (2) resident qualified voters of the City to act as clerks in order to properly conduct the Election. To the extent required by the Texas Election Code, as amended, or other applicable law, the appointment of these clerks must include a person fluent in the Spanish language to serve as a clerk to render oral aid in the Spanish language to any voter desiring such aid at the polls on Election Day. If the Presiding Judge appointed actually serves, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall serve as one of the clerks. In the absence of the Presiding Judge, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall perform the duties of the Presiding Judge of the election precinct.

On Election Day, the polls shall be open as designated on Exhibit A.

The main early voting location is designated in Exhibit B to this Ordinance (which is incorporated herein by reference for all purposes). The individual named as the Early Voting Clerk as designated in Exhibit B is hereby appointed as the Early Voting Clerk to conduct such early voting in the Election. The Early Voting Clerk shall appoint the Deputy Early Voting Clerks. This office or place shall remain open to permit early voting each day, with the exception of official State holidays and Sundays, as stated in Exhibit B. Early voting shall commence as provided on Exhibit B and continue through the date set forth on Exhibit B, all as provided by the provisions of the Texas Election Code, as amended.

An Early Voting Ballot Board is hereby established for the purpose of processing early voting results. The individual designated in Exhibit B as the Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board is hereby appointed the Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board. The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two (2) resident qualified voters of the City to serve as members of the Early Voting Ballot Board.

SECTION 3: Electronic voting machines may be used in holding and conducting the Election on Election Day; provided, however, in the event the use of such electronic voting machines is not practicable, the Election may be conducted on Election Day by the use of paper ballots (except as otherwise provided in this section). Electronic voting machines or paper ballots may be used for early voting by personal appearance (except as otherwise provided in this section). Pursuant to Section 61.012, polling place used in the Election. Such voting system shall comply with Texas and federal laws establishing the requirement for voting systems that permit voters with physical disabilities to cast a secret ballot. Paper ballots may be used for early voting by mail.

SECTION 4: The official ballot shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, as amended, so as to permit voters to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid proposition which shall appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

PROPOSITION

"THE ADOPTION OF AN ADDITIONAL SALES AND USE TAX WITHIN THE CITY AT THE RATE OF ONE-QUARTER OF ONE PERCENT TO BE USED TO REDUCE THE PROPERTY TAX RATE."

SECTION 5: All resident, qualified voters of the City shall be permitted to vote at the Election, and, on Election Day, such voters shall vote at the designated polling place. The

Election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, as amended, except as modified by the provisions of Chapter 321 and a may be required by law. To the extent required by law, all election materials and proceedings relating to the Election shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

SECTION 6: A substantial copy of this Ordinance shall serve as proper notice of the Election. This notice, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be published on the same day in each of two (2) successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City, the first of these publications to appear in such newspaper not more than thirty (30) days, and not less than fourteen (14) full days prior to Election Day. Additionally, this notice shall be posted on the bulletin board used for posting notices of City Council meetings not later than twenty-one (21) days prior to Election Day.

SECTION 7: The City Council authorizes the Mayor and City Manager, or the respective designee of either of such parties (individually, an Authorized Official), to make such technical modifications to this Ordinance that are necessary for compliance with applicable Texas or federal law or to carry out the intent of the City Council, as evidenced herein.

SECTION 8: It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Ordinance, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, as amended, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 9: The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Ordinance for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.

SECTION 10: All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as the matters ordered herein.

SECTION 11: This Ordinance shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

SECTION 12: If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City Council hereby declares that this Ordinance would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

SECTION 13: This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so ordered.
