## Rule Bobcats defeat Vernon Northside Indians

In the final game before district play begins this week, the state-ranked (#5) Mighty Rule Bobcats soundly pummeled the Northside Indians in Northside Fri. night, Oct. 1 by a score of 52-0. The

## Sailplane contest set Oct. 17

During a drawing Sunday afternoon, Oct. 17, at the Haskell Model Airport, a "Windstar" Sailplane will be awarded to a lucky spectator at the radio controlled sailplane contest.

The plane has a 78 inch wingspan, and is controlled by a two-channel single stick radio. The

radio operates the rudder and elevator to fly the plane.

Anyone attending the two-day Sailplane Contest may register to be eligible to win the plane. It will come ready to fly with radio installed. The Haskell Model Airport is located three miles east of Haskell at the old landfill site.

game, called at halftime because of the "mercy rule" in 6-man football, was completely dominated by the Bobcats, who were led on offense by the passing and kicking of junior quarterback Josh Smith. The stout defense, led by seniors Cody Tibbets, linebacker and Joe Sotelo, end, managed to hold Northside to only one first down during the game.

Smith connected on first-quarter scoring passes to senior team mates Grant Hisey (44 yards) and Joe Sotelo (18 yards) and a second-quarter touchdown to junior Jeffrey Murray (6 yards). He also ran 38 yards for a touchdown, and kicked four extra point conversions to contribute eight more points to the Bobcats' margin of victory. Tibbets intercepted an Indian pass and rambled 35 yards for Rule's second touchdown. Jody Harvey had a TD run of six yards and Brian Lehmann returned a punt of 52 yards for a score. Harvey and Sotelo double-teamed a Northside back behind his own goal line and downed him for a two-point safety in the first quarter, which ended

with Rule up by 38-0.

Smith's run and Murray's catch ended the scoring in the second quarter for Coach Paul Page's Bobcats, who saw seven different players light up the scoreboard. Two other Rule scores were called back because of penalties.

Senior center Jeremy Hertel and senior ends Mike Casey and Hisey cleared holes for the runningbacks on offense, while on defense, senior cornerbacks Hisey and Harvey teamed up with safety Lehmann to hold the Indians to only 9 total yards on offense.

Junior Justin Coker, injured in the first game of the season, was back in limited action. Making plays on both defense and offense were juniors Matt Arendall, Tony Navarrette and Murray; sophomores Jason Custer, Bobby Flores and Kyle Falkner and freshmen Trey Kittley and Carlos Flores.

Rule travels to Jayton on Fri. night, Oct. 8 for a 7:30 p. m. District 4 Six-Man opener. The Jaybirds are ranked #18 in the state's top six-man teams.

## Indians to open District Friday night

Friday night at Indian Field, the Haskell Indians will open District 2-A play when they meet the Olney Cubs. Kick-off time is 7:30 p.m.

Coming into district play, Olney supports a 5-0 record while the Indians are 4-1.

Haskell, off to its best start in a few seasons, comes into the game from an open week. Having played their first play date of the season back in August, they had an open date coming into district.

Haskell's rushing game is lead by fullback Jason Trammell, with 72 rushes for 567 yards. Quarterback Casey Riley has 54 rushes for 136 yards; tailback Dustin Threet has 30 rushes for 133 yards; and wingback Micah New has 22 rushes for 116 yards.

Quarterback Riley has thrown for over 300 yards in non-district play. In five games, Haskell has scored 100 points, while holding their opponents to 64 points.

Olney, on the other hand, has scored 195 points while giving up just 43. As one of the pre-season picks in 9-2A, Olney will be one of the best teams the Indians will face in the '99 campaign.

The coaching staff is urging everyone to come out and support the Indians as they begin the district race.

The 7th, 8th and JV teams will play in Olney on Thurs., Oct. 7. Game time there is 4:00 p.m. for the 7th grade game. The 8th and JV game will follow immediately.

Haskell's 7th grade team is undefeated with a 4-0 record. The 8th grade is 1-3, while the JV is 4-0-1.

All teams begin District 9 2-A play this week.



# Prevent Wildfires!

Fire Prevention Week is October 3-10 and it's the perfect time to learn about fire prevention in and around your home. This year's extremely dry conditions present a need for a focus on wildfire prevention.



**HASKELL'S NEWLY COMPLETED GRASS FIRE TRUCK**—This grass firefighting truck has recently been completed by Haskell Volunteer Fire Dept. Many man hours were required to convert the basic truck to a grass fire truck. This unit, finished earlier this year, has been used to fight rural wildfires.



**NEW CONCEPT IN GRASS FIRE EQUIPMENT**—This track vehicle, donated by the Texas Forestry Service, was converted by members of the Haskell Fire Dept. and Haskell County Precinct 1 employees to aid in firefighting in the county's rough and rugged areas. It will be painted later this year. This is the department's second track vehicle.

*Prevent fire danger around your home:*

1. Control vegetation within 30 feet of your home.
2. Keep trees and brush away from power lines.
3. Space trees at least 25-30 feet apart.
4. Install spark arrester on chimney.
5. Keep roof and gutters clean.
6. In rural areas, know where existing water sources can be found, such as ponds, that can be used as a source of water for fire trucks.
8. Stack firewood away from home.

*Prevent fire danger in your home:*

1. Have your furnace or heating system checked by a competent service company at least once a year.
2. Take special care with fireplaces. Use a spark screen to prevent sparks from flying and be sure the chimney is unblocked and free of excessive creosote accumulation. Fireplace fires are very common.
3. Keep combustible items away from all heating units.
4. At any sign of electrical trouble, shut off power to the circuit and have it checked by a good electrician.
5. Check cords and plugs frequently for signs of broken insulation or frayed wires.
6. Keep matches and cigarette lighters away from children.

**Practice home fire drills. Know your exits. Check your smoke detectors. Don't wait until it's too late!**

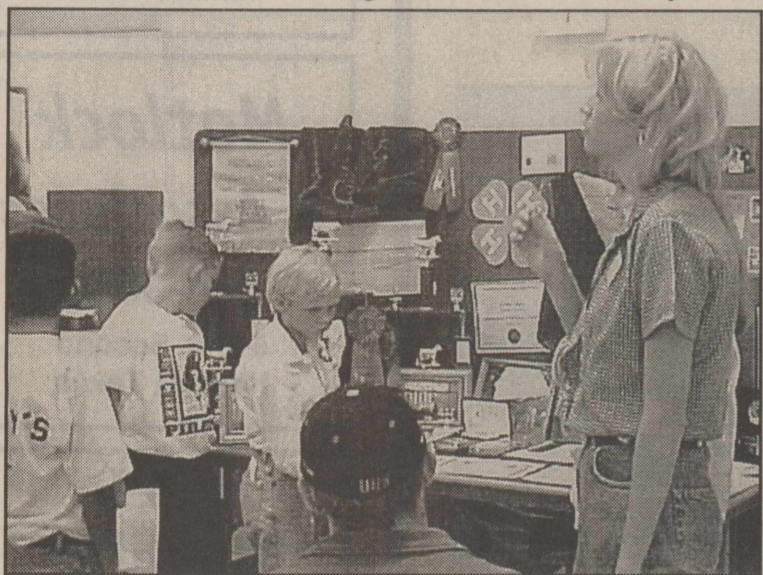

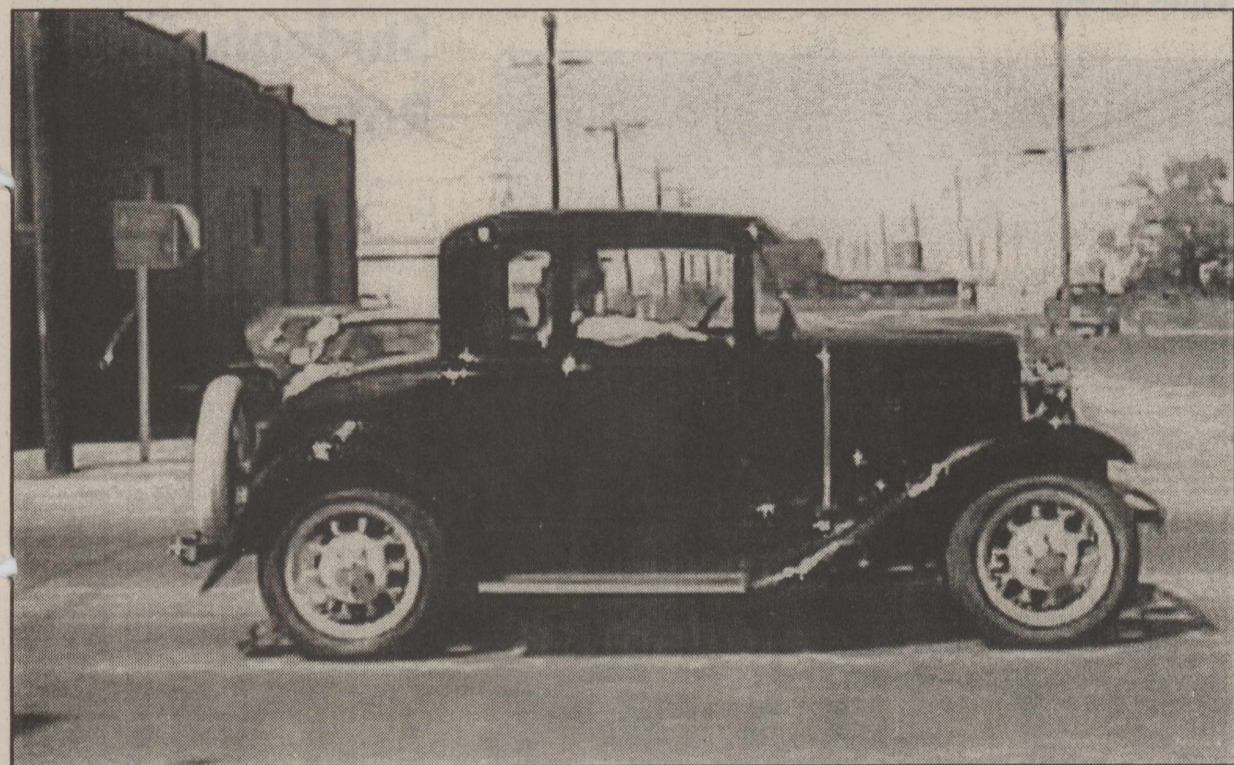

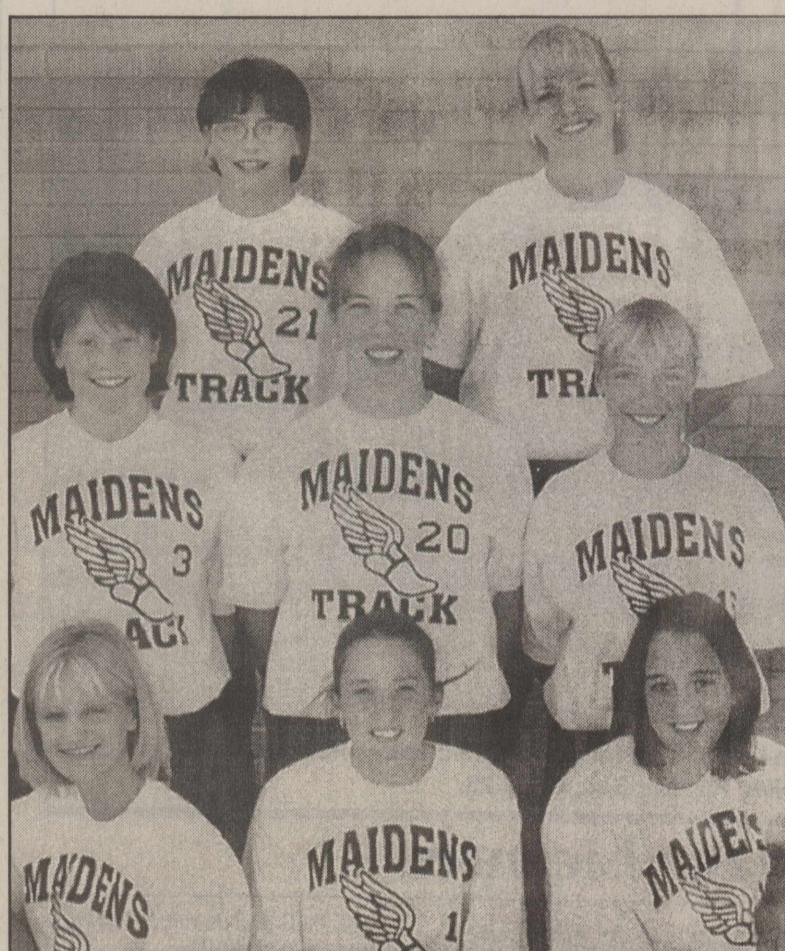

## Two jury trials held in Haskell

Haskell County Attorney Bill Jones prosecuted two jury trials Thurs., Sept. 30 and both trials resulted in convictions. Haskell County Judge David Davis heard the cases and pronounced sentence in both trials at the request of the defendants.

Henry Lerma was found guilty of burglary of a motor vehicle and Judge Davis sentenced him to one year in Haskell County Jail and ordered him to pay a fine of \$4,000.00. This was the maximum sentence. Lerma was represented by Haskell attorney Andrew Ottaway.

In the second trial, Samuel Eldridge Wade was found guilty of driving while intoxicated second offense and also found guilty of driving while license invalid. Judge Davis sentenced him to a \$2,500.00 fine and one year in Haskell County Jail on the first count, but suspended the sentence for two years. On the driving while license invalid count, he was sentenced to a \$500.00 fine and 6 months in Haskell County Jail. Judge Davis suspended the jail sentence only for a period of two years. In both cases, the defendant was ordered to pay court costs and probation fees. Wade was also represented by Ottaway.

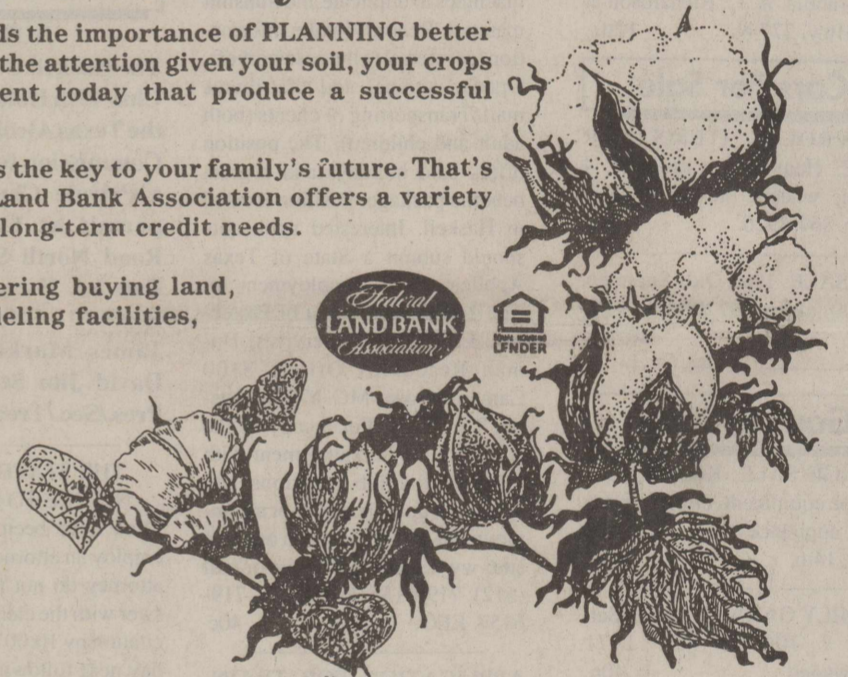

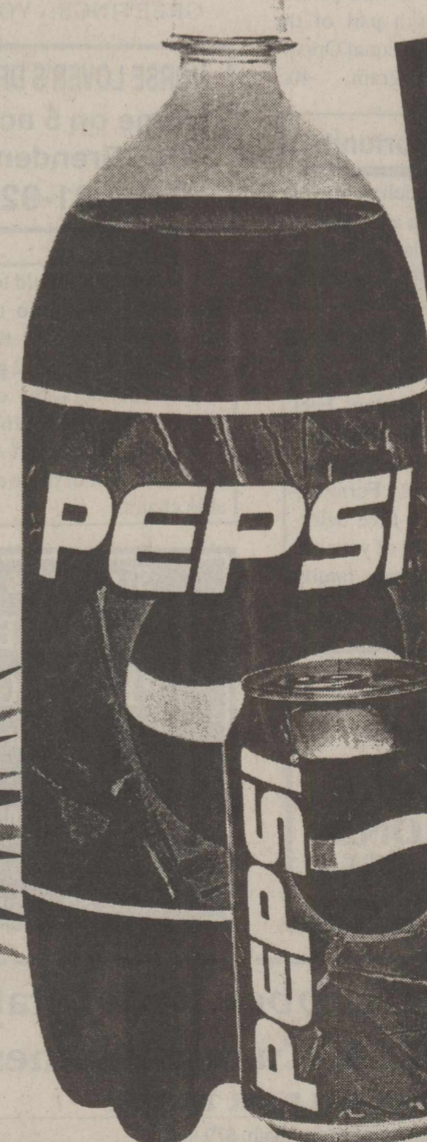
