

Texas Comptroller Carole Keeton Strayhorn has announced that the state collected \$1.35 billion in sales tax revenue in December, up 8.3 percent compared to December 2003.

"Our state's great economic engine is improving. We have experienced 16 months of positive

sales tax growth," Strayhorn said. "In my biennial revenue estimate, delivered this week to the 79th Legislature, I predict sales tax revenues will increase 4.1 percent in fiscal year 2005, 3.6 percent in 2006 and 4.8 percent in 2007."

transit systems and special purpose taxing districts their first sales tax allocations of 2005. January payments to local governments total \$329.1 million, up 8.6 percent compared to January 2004.

Strayhorn sent January sales tax allocations of \$223.1 million to Texas cities, up 9.4 percent compared to January 2004. Texas counties received sales tax payments of \$19.5 million, up 11.6 percent compared to last January.

Another \$9.3 million went to 89

around the state, up 17.3 percent compared to last January.

December state sales tax collections and January allocations to local governments represent sales that occurred in November. Haskell County had a 9.99 percent

decrease for January 2005 of \$21,697.71 in comparison to \$24,107.71 for January 2004.

The City of Haskell had a 9.73 percent decrease for January 2005 of \$20,447.21 in comparison to

\$22,652.26 for January 2004. The City of O'Brien had a 90.38

percent decrease for January 2005 of \$27.01 in comparison to \$280.94 for January 2004.

The City of Rochester had a 8.22 percent decrease for January 2005 of \$334.50 in comparison to \$364.46 for January 2004.

The City of Rule had a 11.79 percent increase for January 2005 of \$848.74 in comparison to \$759.22 for January 2004.

The City of Weinert had a 20.81 percent decrease for January 2005 of \$40.25 in comparison to \$50.83 for January 2004.

State takes in extra \$6.4 billion in revenue

AUSTIN-Most of the state's political movers and shakers will be in Washington this week for President Bush's second inauguration, but before they started packing the governor exhorted the Legislature to "go get the job done," the lieutenant governor laid out a school finance plan and the comptroller announced how much

When the 79th Legislature convened last Tuesday, Gov. Rick Perry told the Senate he has "great optimism" for the session. He followed that with a speech to the House in which he recalled the beginning of his political career 20 years ago as a representative.

revenue the state is likely to have.

Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst outlined Senate Bill 2, a 23-point school finance plan he said each member of the upper chamber supported. The plan calls for a local school property tax cut of up to 33 percent and higher teacher salaries. The bulk of the new money would come from revamping the state's franchise tax.

Comptroller Carole Keeton Strayhorn said the state should have \$64.7 billion in available revenue, \$6.4 billion more than was available two years ago. Four days later, the Legislative Budget Board released its recommended budget for fiscal years 2006-2007: \$134.4 billion with \$63.5 billion from general revenue.

Comings and goings...

Coming: Former Rep. Elizabeth Ames Jones (R-San Antonio) has been appointed to the Texas Railroad Commission. She will replace Charles Matthews, the new chancellor of the Texas State University System. The Senate still has to approve both appointments six-year term in 2006).

Petroleum engineer Ernest Angelo of Midland has been named to the three-member Public Safety Commission, the Department of Public Safety's policy-making body. He replaces Bobby Holt of Midland.

Going: Insurance Commissioner Jose Montemayor, appointed in 1999 by then-Gov. George W. Bush, has announced he won't ask to be reappointed when his six-year term ends Feb. 1. No word yet on who the governor will name as his replacement.

Eric Opiela of Karnes City, defeated by Democrat Yvonne Gonzalez Toureilles last November, dropped his House challenge.

With former Rep. Jack Stick of Austin having earlier withdrawn his legislative challenge, that leaves only former Rep. Talmadge Heflin, who has stuck with his challenge of Houston Democrat Hubert Vo's apparent election.

Shapiro elected president pro tempore...

In the Senate, members elected Sen. Florence Shapiro (R-Plano) as president pro tempore. That means she presides over the body in the absence of the lieutenant governor, and is next in line as governor after Dewhurst.

Four bravest Texans?

Jim Bowie, Davy Crockett, William B. Travis and Sam Houston come to mind.

But a case could be made that the four bravest living Texans are Reps. Joe Moreno (D-Houston), Paul Moreno (D-El Paso), Lon Burnam (D-Fort Worth), and Jessica Farrar (D-Houston)-the only members of the 150-member House of Representatives who didn't vote "yes" when the House picked Tom Craddick (R-Midland) for another term as speaker last week.

Three other Democrats abstained.



One of those warriors was my maternal grandfather, William Samuel Wiseman: "Grandpaw Wiseman" to his grandchildren, "Papa" to this children, "Mr. Wiseman" to his wife, and "Will" to his friends and neighbors.

It was mid-summer in 1931. The crops were laid by until harvest, and about the only work to be done was to check the cattle herd that grazed up on the mountain part of his place. On this particular morning, I was up behind Grandpaw on old Star on our way to do just that.

"Jack, I need to go by Sparta and buy a can of Prince Albert pipe tobacco," he said.

It was about a quarter of a mile away, and five minutes later, we were

I spent the whole time that it took Grandpaw to make his purchase, gawking at a man in the store who had horrible looking scars all over both sides of his face and neck. Even as a ten-year-old boy, it was quite obvious to me that he had won second place in a knife fight. They were somewhat more common in those days than now.

As soon as we were back on old Star and riding away from the store, I asked Grandpaw if he had seen that man with all those awful, ugly scars.

"Yeah, I saw him, Jack," he answered. "That's good ain't it?" "What do you mean, that's good?"

"Well," he replied. "There weren't no raw sores on his face. He got hurt.

He got over it. He's got them scars on him to remind him to not get in a position to let it happen again, and he's learned that if he does get hurt, and takes care of it like you need to, you can get over it. You don't take care of it, you could get gangrene or maybe even die. Feller gets hurt, you need to smear some Watkins salve on it and wrap a clean rag around it and let it heal and make a scar."

We rode along in silence, except for the sound of old Star's hoofbeats as she walked along the hot powdery sand, while my ten-year-old mind slowly tried to accept the fact that scars were "good."

Grandpaw broke the silence. "Course there's some folks walking 'round worse scarred up than that feller at the store, but you can't see their scars. Nobody can."

"What do you mean, Grandpaw?" I asked.

"Well," he said. "Somebody done 'em a bad turn, or somethin' happened that hurt 'em inside, tore 'em up somethin' awful, and it left 'em all scarred up inside, where folks can't see 'em. That what I mean."

"But, you said scars are a sign that you got well," I replied. "You can't smear Watkins salve inside of somebody and wrap it up with a clean rag." I thought I had him on that one.

"No, Jack, you can't," he said, "But what you can do is smear some love and understandin' on it and wrap it up with some good, clean forgiveness, and leave it alone and not pick at it, and it'll heal up."

"It's just like on the outside-it ain't no difference-you don't tend to it and it'll fester up and lay in there like a raw open sore, and if there's such a thing as emotional gangrene, you might even get that. And if you got that, you might just die inside."

Riding on in silence for a few paces, as if pondering the thought, my spartan Grandpaw added, "You get hurt inside, you have to doctor yourself; can't nobody do it for you. Way I see it, if a body's got a hurt place or sore, inside or out, they need to tend to it, however it needs. Get shed of it and get on with their livin'. Ever' time you overcome a hurt, your reward's a scar. I'd walk all day beside a man that's all scarred up. But I wouldn't take one step with a feller with a raw sore left festering inside

As if he figured we'd adequately covered the subject I'd opened up, and being one who never wasted words, Grandpaw added, "Next time we go to the store, Jack, I wish you'd just stay outside and hold old Star."

As I recount that day, I am just shy of seventy-five years old, and I have amassed scars of just about every kind in the ensuing years. Some caused by malice, some by friends, family and loved ones. Many I brought on myself.

The one thing I do not have is one single "raw, open sore," inside or out. They have all been properly "smeared" and properly "wrapped."

That pleasures me, and it would pleasure Grandpaw.



Q: Is a mudslide the same thing as a landslide?

A: A mudslide is a landslide, only it contains tons of dirt and water, says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M University.

"A mudslide is a type of landslide. It occurs when heavy rains have saturated an area-usually near a hill or mountain-and the unstable ground gives way and flows downhill," he explains. "This is exactly what has happened in California the past few days.

Heavy rains—as much as 17 inches in some places-have turned mountains slopes into huge mudslides, and the moving river of mud can move houses, cars, trees, just about anything in its path. And besides creating huge property

losses, mudslides can be killers. They are extremely dangerous."

O: How fast can a mudslide

A: Although most move fairly slow, at 10 miles per hour or less, some have been clocked at more than 35 miles per hour, McRoberts adds. "Mudslides have tremendous power, and they've been known to knock down bridges and totally destroy roads in their path," he says. "Gravity takes over and the mudslides can be quick and powerful. When the debris flow finally reaches flat ground and stops, the dirt deposits can be 6 to 10 feet thick. Mudslides and landslides have occurred in every state. It's estimated they cause about \$2 billion in damage each year and claim 25 to

PROPERTY OWNERS: Property owners have certain rights that may reduce their property tax burden.

ATTENTION

HOMEOWNERS

Persons who own their residence on January 1, 2005, may claim their home as a residential homestead. The filling of this document is only necessary if the homeowner has changed homesteads since January 1, 2004, or has become eligible for additional exemptions since last year. Homeowners may also defer the portion of the tax on their residence homestead if the value of the home was raised more than 5% above the previous year. Although the tax collection is deferred, interest continues to run on the unpaid portion of tax at a rate of 8% per annum and the deferred tax remains a lien on the property. To apply for the deferral, the owner should contact the appraisal district which appraised the property in question and complete an application.

DISABLED PERSONS

Persons who are disabled under Social Security law are entitled to additional exemptions on their residential homestead. Disabled applicants must apply with the appraisal district and furnish a determination letter from Social Security. Disabled persons now receive all benefits on their home that are available to over 65 persons (see below).

PERSONS WHO ARE OVER 65 YEARS OF AGE

Persons who are over 65 years of age or disabled persons may file for additional exemptions and a ceiling on school taxes for their residential homestead. They will receive a prorated amount of the exemption amounts for the part of the year that any owner is 65. Over-65 persons should apply for this exemption at the appraisal district office in their area. Over-65 persons are also eligible to defer paying the tax on their residential homestead as they wish. The taxes continue to accrue during the deferral along with an interest rate of 8% annually, but no attempt will be made to force payment during the deferral. Details and an application may be obtained from any appraisal district of the State Comptroller.

DISABLED VETERANS

Persons who have been declared disabled by the Veteran's Administration are eligible for additional exemptions on property they own. The declaration letter from VA is mailed annually, but the appraisal district only needs a copy in the first year of eligibility or if the percentage of disability changes.

FARM AND RANCH OWNERS

Farmers and ranchers may be entitled to receive an alternate method of appraisal determined by the farm income to the property. This method is available to farms and ranches commercially raising crops or livestock or which are used as a wildlife habitat under State guidelines. An application for agricultural use value and additional information is available from your appraisal district. Re-filing is only necessary if requested to do so by the Chief Appraiser.

EXEMPTION APPLICATIONS

Exemption applications for all property tax exemptions including total exemptions for charitable, religious, and other total exemptions may be obtained from an appraisal district nearest you or through the State Comptroller's Office at 1/800-252-9121.

BUSINESS PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNERS

State law now requires the filing of a rendition declaring what types of business personal property that a person or company owns. Failure to file the rendition will result in a 10% penalty. If a fraudulent rendition is filed, a 50% penalty is mandated. A rendition can be obtained from the appraisal district office where the property is located. A 30 day filing extension is available by written request.
