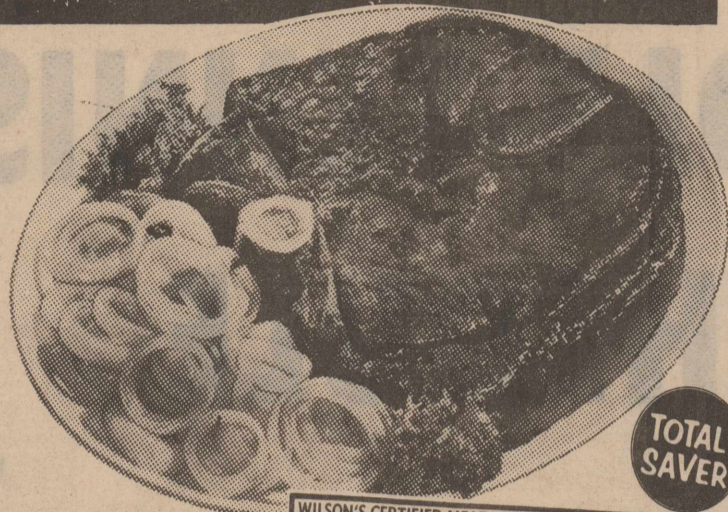

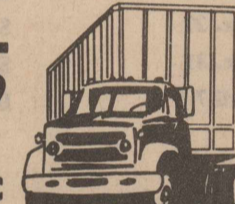

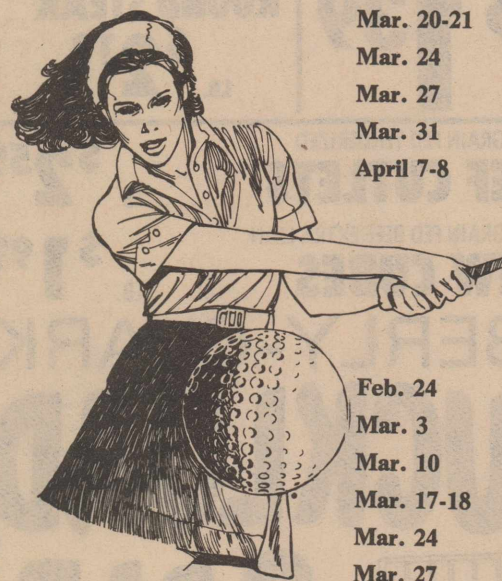

County gains confirmer

The Weger, West (Grayburg) field of Crockett County gained its current sixth producer and a location southwest extension with completion of Ralph L. Way, No. 1 University '25', seven miles south of Big Lake, to pump nine barrels of 33 gravity oil, plus 20 barrels of water, with gas-oil ratio of 122-1. Production was through perforations at 2,402-2,471 feet, which had been acidized with 1,500 gallons and fractured with 15,500 gallons and 19,000 pounds of sand. Location is 1,570 feet from the north and 2,500 feet from the west lines of 25-12-ULS.

It is the Oaklav (San Andres) field of Crockett County opened Feb. 18, with completion of C.F. Lawrence & Associates Inc., Midland, No. 2 Black Oak, 17 miles southeast of Iran, to pump 14 barrels of 30 gravity oil, no water. Production was through perforations at 1,918-1,950 feet. Location is 660 feet from the north and east lines of J. Zunigas No. 7.
