Have A New Year's Party

New Year's is one of the biggest party times of the year. All it takes is a few plans, good food and lots of friends. Why not plan a get together for New Year's Eve dinner, late evening or a special brunch for New Year's Day.

One of my favorite party foods are Miniature Taco Tarts. These can be made ahead if necessary, and cooked just before serving.

Miniature Taco Tarts

- 1 lb. lean ground meat
- 1 (1 1/2 oz.) pkg. taco seasoning
- 1 c. finely crushed corn chips
- 1 med. egg
- 1 (4 oz.) can chopped green chili peppers
- 1 c. sour cream
- 2 c. grated Cheddar or Monterey Jack cheese
- Jalapeno Pepper slices

Combine meat, seasoning, chips, egg and 1/2 of green chili peppers. Mix well. Press meat on bottom and up sides of miniature (1 1/4") muffin cups to form shallow shell. Combine sour cream, cheese and remainder of drained green chili pepper. Spoon approximately 1 teaspoon in each meat cup. Top each meat tart with 1 slice of Jalapeno. Bake in 350° oven for 10 to 12 minutes. Serve hot. Makes approximately 30 dozen.

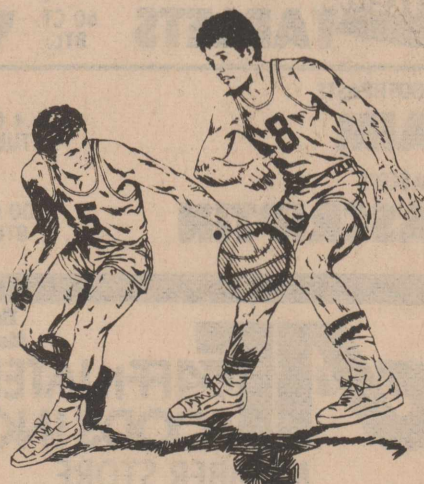

breaking year for sales at the store.

Westerman Drug manager Jimmy Lott said he had not tallied up for a comparison, but his business was off somewhat for the year. He said although Christmas business was good at the store, it could not compare with last year's sales.

Dana McAlister at Small Fashions said she was pleasantly surprised at the Christmas rush and felt the store would compare well with last year in Christmas sales, but overall business for the year had not been good, in fact, she said 1982 had been the slowest year in the five years she has had the store.

He was extremely pleased with Christmas sales and expressed the feeling the Ozona economic picture is very healthy compared with other areas even in West Texas.

Oscar Kost, manager of Ozona Television System, reported business up over last year, and that late buying had pushed the Christmas sales up over the previous year.

Clayton Robinson at Clayton's Drug said his business had not been as bad as he expected and he was well pleased with sales. He said business was off somewhat but not nearly as much as was forecast and he seemed pretty happy with the outcome.

Nick Nicholas at Baker Jewelers reported business down about 20 percent over last year and even though Christmas sales did not come up to 1981, he felt the store had a good Christmas season.

Jodie Sessom, co-owner of the Teacher Store, said that although business was off somewhat at the ladies fashion store, she felt she could not complain as it could be a great deal worse. She did report brisk Christmas sales.

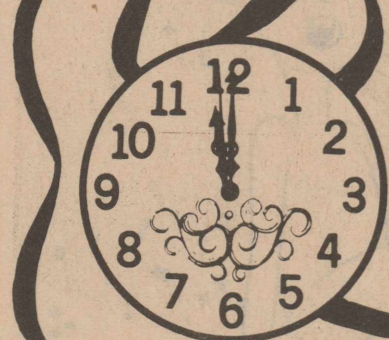

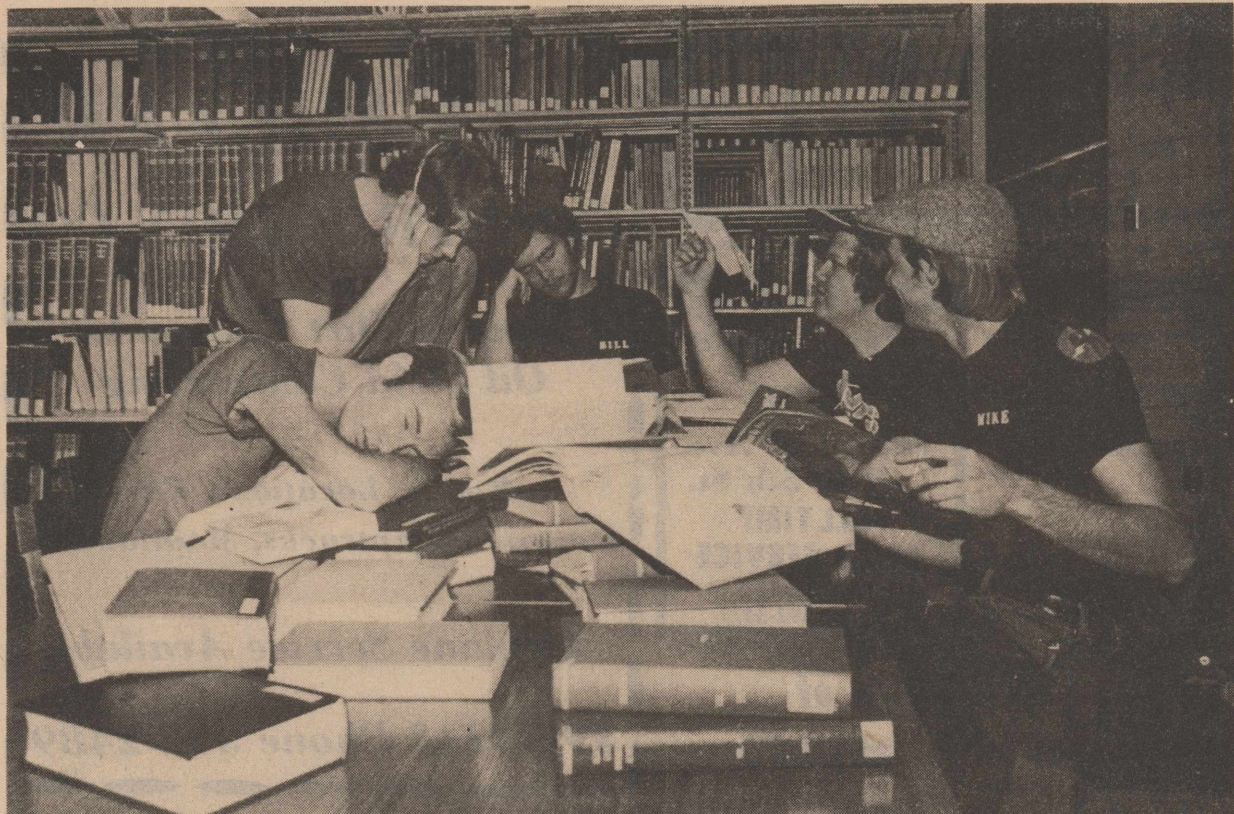

"Meat Extender" in Beef Patties Can Affect Cholesterol Content

Textured soy protein, called "ground meat extender" in beef patties, can affect the amount of cholesterol retained in cooked beef patties, according to meat scientists at Texas A&M University. "Cholesterol content of beef patties including soy extender may be higher or lower in cholesterol, than cooked pure beef patties, depending on ingredients," according to Dr. Gary C. Smith, a member of the Meat and Muscle Research Group for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station (TAES).

In this research, ground beef patties were prepared to contain 0, 10, 20 or 30 percent rehydrated textured soy protein, (TSP), and 7.5, 15 or 30 percent fat. Patties were cooked from the frozen state on a rack in a preheated oven at 177°C, to an internal temperature of 75°C (well done), according to Dr. Ki Soon Rhee, a member of the TAES research team.

The cholesterol content of raw ground beef patties naturally decreased as the amount of TSP increased because the meat extender has no cholesterol. It also decreased as the fat content decreased from 30 percent, to 15, or 7.5 percent.

Even after cooking at initial fat levels of 7.5 and 15 percent, the cholesterol content per cooked patty tended to decrease as the amount of TSP increased, but the decreases in cholesterol content were not proportional to the increase in the amount of TSP in the initial uncooked

patties. However, at an initial fat level of 30 percent, patties containing TSP retained substantially higher amounts of cholesterol when cooked than did those without TSP. At this highest fat level, the binding effect of TSP on the fat present in patties became obvious.

Smith says that though there have been numerous studies on cooking properties and sensory quality of ground beef patties extended with TSP, no studies have been reported of the effect on cholesterol content when beef patties were extended with TSP.

No consistent trend was observed as to the effect of the initial fat level on the cholesterol content per cooked patty. However, among patties containing no TSP, those with an initial fat level of 30 percent had less cholesterol per patty when cooked than did those with an initial fat level of 7.5 percent.

One possible explanation may be that the patties with the higher initial fat content may have lost a substantial amount of fat, with accompanying loss of cholesterol as drippings, during cooking.

Conclusions are, Smith says, that the cholesterol content of raw ground beef patties can be decreased by adding TSP and also by decreasing the fat content to 15 percent or lower; the cholesterol content of cooked patties can also be decreased by incorporating TSP in

raw patties, if the fat content of raw patties is 15 percent or lower; and if the fat content of raw patties is high, (30%), patties containing TSP retain more cholesterol on a per-patty basis when cooked.

These meat scientists caution readers and other researchers that these results are based on patties which were cooked from the frozen state to a given internal temperature.

However, in the home, or in many fast food restaurants, patties are usually cooked for a given length of time. Therefore, these results may not be wholly applicable to the home situation.

If you must be concerned with the quantity of cholesterol in your diet, then these results indicate, Smith says, that you may be better off buying pure ground beef with a low-fat content and avoiding extended beef patties altogether unless you can be sure that their fat content is 15%, or less.

Texas dairy herds increase

The number of dairy cows in Texas enrolled in a special record keeping and testing program—the Texas Dairy Herd Improvement Association—has surpassed the 100,000 mark, a benchmark goal set by the state's dairy industry a few years ago.

"Texas is now the first state with records of more than 100,000 dairy cows being processed through the Dairy Records Center at Raleigh, N.C.," said Dr. Michael Tomaszewski, dairy specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. The center processes dairy records for 12 southern states.

"The 100,000 cows mark an increase in TDHIA numbers of some 20,000 head in the past two years," said Tomaszewski. "Of course, we still have a long way to go with respect to enrolling all of Texas' dairy cows. Current enrollment is only 31 percent of the state's total dairy cow herd."

In an effort to continue to promote enrollment, a new goal has been set—35 in '85, Tomaszewski said. That means 135,000 cows in the program by 1985. This would be 40 percent of the state's dairy cows.

More drilling set for Crockett Co.

JEM Petroleum Co., Midland, will drill the No. 1 Shannon C as a 6,700-foot wildcat in Crockett County and as a 5/8-mile north and very slightly east of the opener and lone producer in the Seright (Strawn 5800) field, and a 1-mile south of the current three-well Todd North (San Andres oil) field, separated by Todd Northwest (San Andres gas) field, 17 miles northwest of Ozona. The Seright opener, Holley Energy Inc. No. 1 Todd Ranch, was finished Aug. 27 for 199 barrels of 42.3 gravity oil, with gas-oil ratio of

1,035-1, on a 16-64-inch choke through perforations at 6,102-130 feet.

G&G Exploration, Granbury, resubmitted application Dec. 15 to drill the No. 1 Meadows "51" as a 2,500-foot wildcat and a 1 5/8-mile west of Half oil pro-

duction, 3.2 miles northeast of Sheffield.

Location is 784 feet from the north and 470 feet from the west lines of 51-1-I&RN.

Application was originally submitted Sept. 18, 1978 by Pecos Petroleum Co. of Martindale, amended July 23, 1981 to operator G&G Exploration.

MGMT & Sales Consultants Inc., San Angelo, will drill the No. 1 Half-Roberts as a location-northwest offset to the Felker gas opener and lone producer from that pay in the Noelke, West multipay field of Crockett County, 3 1/2 miles southeast of Iraan.

Location is 838 feet from the south and 1,812 feet from the west lines of 70-1-I&GN. Contract depth is 1,182 feet. The Felker opener, Cedar
