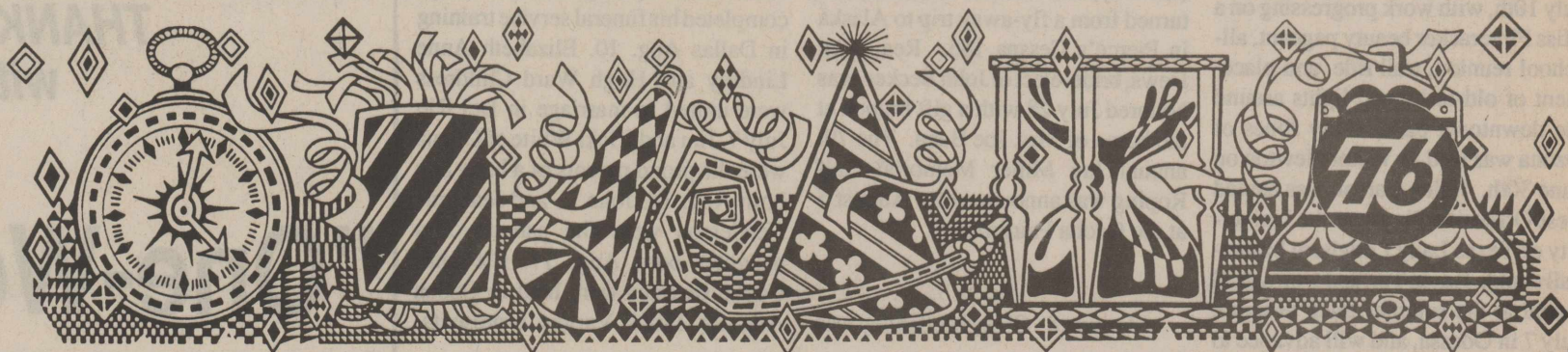

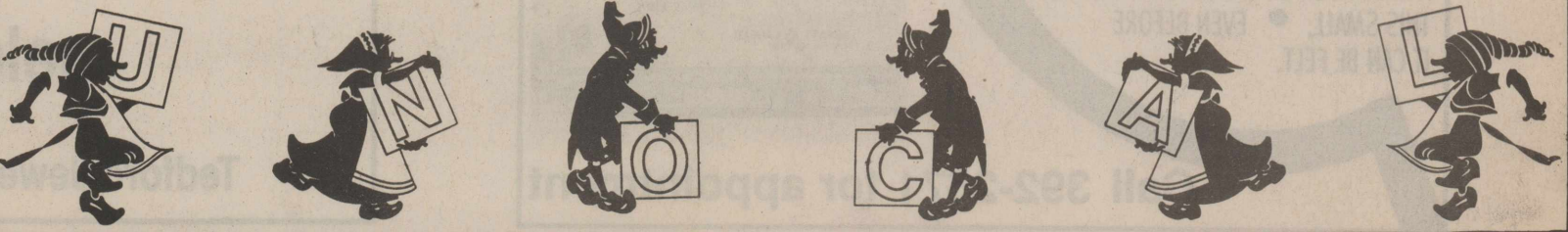

# Looking back at news highlights of 1990

## JULY

**July 4-** Ozona's July 4th celebration kicked off July 3rd with fireworks, pie contest, pet parade and a special performance by the Sahawe Indian dancers. The Ozona Lions Club elected Curtis Keith, president; Doug Meador, first vice-president; Armando Arredondo, second vice-president; Dee Keilers, third vice-president; Ted Cotton, secretary-treasurer. Crockett County sales showed an increase over the same period of 1988. Judge Kathryn Mayfield chaired a special meeting last week to begin plans for the county's 100th birthday celebration in 1991. A Centennial logo contest was also begun. Vickie Vargas and Clark Dennis announced their engagement. Funeral services were held Friday, July 6th for Joe David Williams. Area radio stations, KHOS-FM/AM Sonora were sold by Foster Broadcasting of San Angelo to Ken Ripley and Gail Garlitz of Fort Stockton. The sale also included the license for KYXX-FM Ozona.

**July 11-** Michael Eugene Sharp, an Odessa man convicted by a Crockett County jury in the 1982 murder of a Kermit woman, was scheduled to die by lethal injection July 18th at Huntsville. Plans were finalized for a series of western murals to be painted on the Permer building at the intersection of Highways 290 and 163. Former Crockett County attorney, Tom Cameron, was appointed Winkler County attorney July 2nd. A deadline of July 20th was set for Rodeo Queen entries. County commissioners began work on the 1991 budget, facing the prospect of a \$400,000 drop in end-of-year balance as compared to 1989. Funeral services were held July 8th for Ada Barnett. The engagement of Lorie Crenwelge and Jeff Hill was announced. Elijah Martinez received word that his poem, "Missing Children" had been selected for special recognition in a national competition. Deena Beth Phillips, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dean Phillips, wed Tracy Allan Gatlin of Houston. U.S. Army specialist Benjamin Sanchez received the Army Commendation Medal for meritorious achievement. Katharine Durham and JoLynn Vannoy were winners at District VI 4-H Fashion Show in Andrews. Steffy Sutton placed second in her division, with Martha Mayfield taking third place honors.

**July 18-** Welcome rains drenched the county, with amounts varying from one to nearly 6 inches. Michael Eugene Sharp, convicted in Ozona for murder, received an indefinite stay of execution last week. School board members hired Elizabeth Clark as a dyslexia teacher and Charles Oren as mathematics teacher/coach. A centennial planning meeting was held July 10th, with work progressing on a Miss Firecracker beauty pageant, all-school reunion, trail ride, and placement of old-fashioned lights around the downtown park. Amy Jones of Ozona was wed to Victor Newton on June 30th. Haley Carson was named Best Offensive Player at the University of Texas Lady Longhorn basketball camp. Kayla Turland won a gold medal at the summer track program July 7 in Odessa, and will advance to

the state track meet August 3-4. Catherine Russell and Lu Ingram returned from a trip of Europe. ### Enjoy your new microwave safely

Did you get a new microwave for Christmas? If so, you're not alone. More than 75% of American households use a microwave oven to thaw, cook and reheat food. It saves time, retains more nutrients, allows cooking with less fat.

Microwaves are safe, too, if used properly. The FDA monitors microwave ovens, and ensures that all ovens made after 1971 meet a radiation safety standard.

To make sure radiation levels from a microwave oven remain as low as possible, take the following steps:

•Don't use an oven if an object is caught in the door, if the door doesn't close firmly or is otherwise damaged.

•Don't operate an empty oven if the instruction manual warns against this. In some ovens, the magnetron tube can be damaged by unabsorbed energy.

•If there are signs of rusting inside the oven, have it repaired.

•Clean the oven door and oven cavity with water and mild detergents. Don't use abrasives such as scouring pads.

•Follow your instruction manual for recommended operating procedures and safety precautions.

•BE SURE CHILDREN WHO USE THE MICROWAVE CAN DO SO SAFELY!

If you suspect a problem, contact the manufacturer, a reputable service repair person, or the local/state health department, or the Food and Drug Administration.

Once you've learned to minimize operating hazards, you need to remember a few tips on cooking with a microwave.

•Do not partially cook a food ahead of time to make microwaving faster. Cooking ahead is fine, but raw foods should be cooked thoroughly during

the first cooking. Partial cooking can be dangerous if the food does not get hot enough to kill the bacteria that may be present especially in raw meat.

•Take care to avoid uneven cooking. Arrange meat and poultry pieces uniformly in covered dish so steam can help kill bacteria and promote uniform heating. Stir and turn the dish several times, and be sure to observe the recommended standing time.

•Discard food that was forgotten and left for more than two hours in the microwave after thawing. I knew a cowboy in college who ate a baked potato after leaving it in the oven for four days - he got a trip to the college health clinic later on! The bacteria that have grown in that length of time won't be destroyed by ordinary cooking - so throw it out or throw it up later!

•Use only the type of dishes designed for microwave ovens. Materials in freezer bags, margarine tubs or other plastic containers were approved for storing food, but not for microwave cooking. When heated, chemicals in the containers could migrate into food; also don't use recycled paper products in microwaves - they can contain contaminating chemicals or cause fires.

If used properly, your new microwave can be a source of fast, easy, nutritious meals for your family. They can save your time and energy as well as your home energy bill.

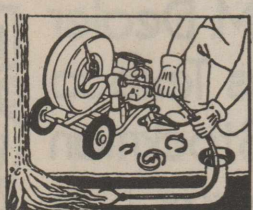

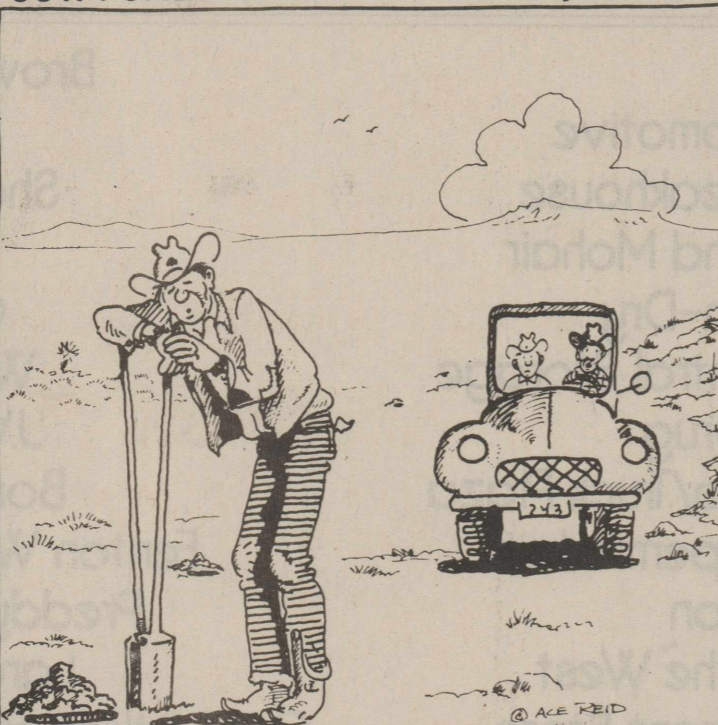

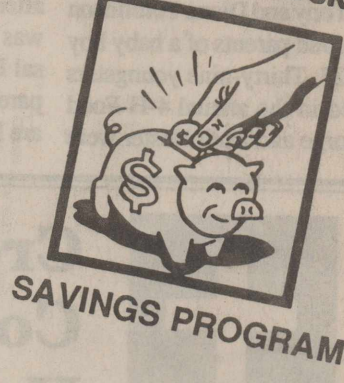
