Savagely beaten

Small change bandit murders Dean Phillips Christmas night

In a year of increased murder rates across the U.S., Ozona was not to be left out as late Christmas Day brought the death of local resident Dean Phillips, found beaten in his own coinoperated laundry.

"We theorize," said Crockett County Sheriff Jim Wilson, "that Mr. Phillips walked in on a burglary attempt."

The pried-open soft drink machine and emptied coin box support this

Wilson requested assistance with roadblocks from Sutton and Pecos County officers about 9:45. Officials maintained the roadblocks until midnight. Approximately eight minutes later, Phillips died at Crockett County

His body underwent autopsy procedures in San Antonio at the Bexar County Medical Examiner's office.

Evidence and leads prove slim but existent. Two vehicle descriptions (a white El Camino and faded blue van with California license tags) have surfaced while materials found at the scene have been sent to Austin for analysis at the Department of Public Safety's laboratory.

"Local people have offered numerous tips in a meaningful manner," Sheriff Wilson noted.

A similar incident in Crystal City has been ruled out as having any connection with Phillips' murder.

"At the moment we're doing our most and best to acquire any informa-

tion that might lead us somewhere a "world-wide outlook" and always a worthwhile," Wilson said. The Sheriff's Department is giving top priority to the murder investigation, and Texas Ranger Danny Rhea is assisting.

Dean Phillips' life ranged long and 1907, in Sherwood, it took him to Ozona through farming and cemetery maintenance.

It led him to join the U.S. Armed Forces in 1904 and serve four years and 10 months with an 18-month stint in Alaska during the Aleutian Island campaign and schooling at Oregon Tech, eventually gaining status as one of the top supply men in the U.S.

Phillips' life brought him back to Ozona where he ran a grocery store from 1955 to 1963. During this period, he met Peggy Houston who recalls the dates meticulously.

"We met Sept. 2, 1958, and were married June 27, 1959. We celebrated our 25th wedding anniversary with a second marriage ceremony."

In 1967, the two opened the Redwood Motel which they operated 22 years. He also worked for Gulf for

A beautifully silvered and decorated Christmas tree set up in her front yard by Miss Ethel Childress was judged the most beautiful outside decorations by a committee repre-

Looking back at news highlights of 1990

July 4- Ozona's July 4th celebration kicked off July 3rd with fireworks, pie contest, pet parade and a special performance by the Sahawe Indian dancers. The Ozona Lions Club elected Curtis Keith, president; Doug Meador, first vice-president; Armando Arredondo, second vicepresident; Dee Keilers, third vicepresident; Ted Cotton, secretary-treasurer. 

Microwaves are safe, too, if used properly. The FDA monitors microwave ovens, and ensures that all ovens made after 1971 meet a radiation safety standard.

To make sure radiation levels from a microwave oven remain as low as possible, take the following steps:

•Don't use an oven if an object is caught in the door, if the door doesn't close firmly or is otherwise damaged.






