



1993 4-H livestock show approaching

The 46th Annual Crockett County 4-H Livestock Show and Premium Sale wil be held Jan. 7-9, 1993, at the County 4-H Show Barn. There will be 94 4-H members exhibiting some 242 market lambs, 54 commercial ewe lambs, 20 Angora goats, two steers and 114 rabbits.

Judging will begin on Thursday, Jan. 7, at 5:30 p.m. with the rabbit show. Friday, Jan. 8, judging will begin at 5:30 p.m. with the steer show followed by the first year feeder show at 6 p.m. Commercial ewe lambs will be judged at 7:15 p.m., with the Angora goat show beginning at 8:15 p.m. On Saturday, Jan. 9, the market lamb show will begin at 8 a.m.

DeHoyos retires as county commissioner

Sostenes DeHoyos, commisisoner of Pct. 1, retires at the end of December after 14 years in office.

"I've learned a lot from serving Crockett County," DeHoyos said. "It has expanded my horizons."

DeHoyos was the first Mexican-American elected to a county office here. He was finally seated as commissioner in August of 1978 after legal challenges to the election. DeHoyos' only comment about this period during a recent interview is that it "helped me prepare better, inform myself what the job would involve."

When he took office, DcHoyos' concern was to respond to the needs of the whole community. He has served under three county judges.
