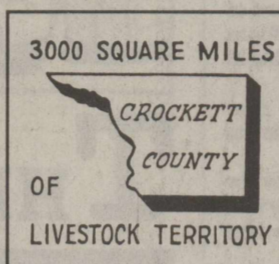

Upon returning to Ozona, Mrs. Semmler was employed by Western Drug and Crockett County Abstract before being called to work in the auditor's office.

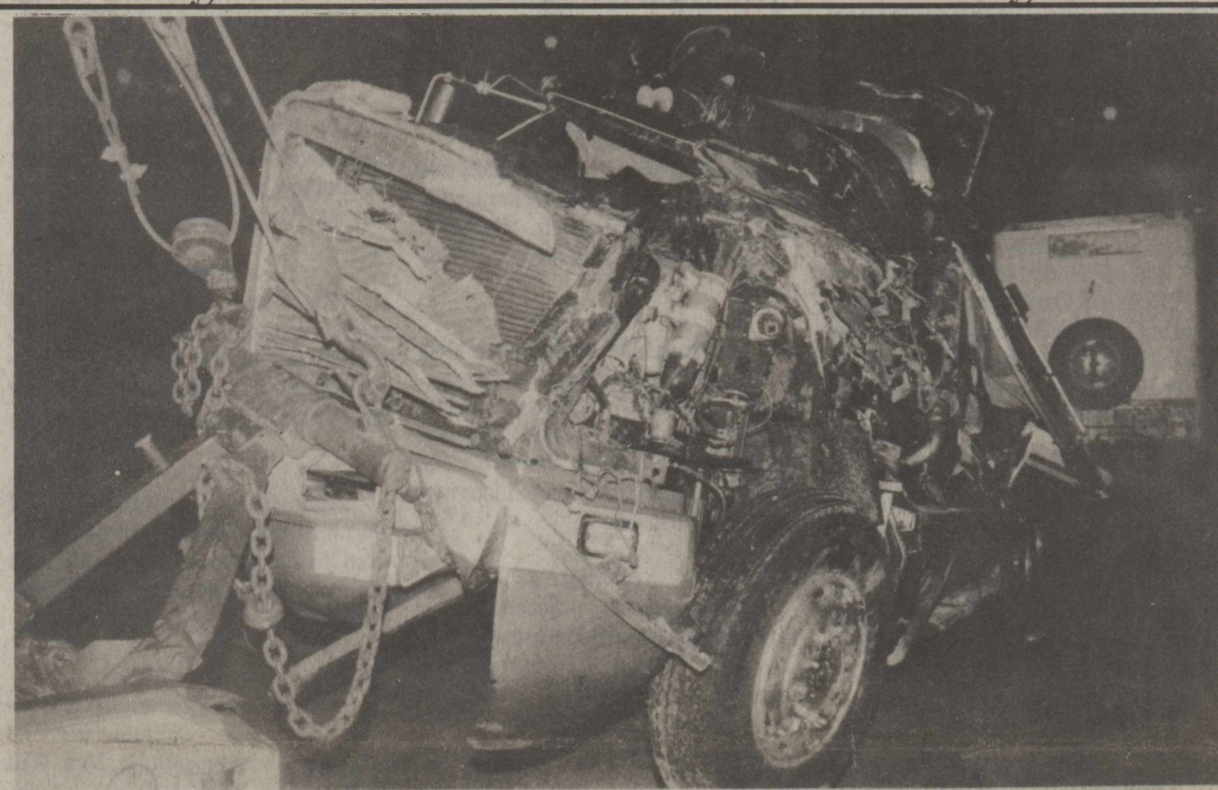
Her plans for retirement are "to just relax and enjoy doing arts and crafts." And, yes...she will be having coffee with the ladies...as usual.

## Two-year-old girl killed in headon

A two-year-old girl was killed and two people injured Monday night in a headon accident 22 miles west of Ozona on I-10. The deceased, Yolanda Michelle Sagisi of Lancaster, CA, was a passenger in a 1987 Nissan which was facing west in the outside lane of eastbound I-10 at the time of the accident.

Eloy Gutierrez Gonzalez of Sanger, CA, driver of a 1990 Freightliner tractor/trailer rig was eastbound and attempted to avoid the Nissan by swerving to the left. According to an accident report filed by DPS Trooper Ben English, the vehicles collided in the outside lane of I-10 with both coming to rest in the south barrow

ditch. The truck driver reported that the lights were off on the Nissan.

Gonzalez and the driver of the Nissan, Maria Louisa Sandoval of Lancaster, CA, were taken to San Angelo by EMS ambulance. Both were listed in serious condition. Ms. Sandoval with internal injuries and Gonzalez with possible spine and shoulder injuries.

Peace Justice Jim Hearne said Tuesday he has ordered an autopsy of the child.

The truck, which is owned by Tony Escobedo Trucking of Pharr, was transporting 55 cartons of carrots and 1530 packages of Empire grapes from Bakersfield, CA to H.E.B. Grocery in San Antonio. A Texas Health Department official was to arrive Tuesday to condemn the produce so it could be disposed of by the Texas Department of Public Safety.

## DeHoyos retires as county commissioner

Sostenes DeHoyos, commissioner of Pct. 1, retires at the end of December after 14 years in office.

"I've learned a lot from serving Crockett County," DeHoyos said. "It has expanded my horizons."

DeHoyos was the first Mexican-American elected to a county office here. He was finally seated as commissioner in August of 1978 after legal challenges to the election. DeHoyos' only comment about this period during a recent interview is that it "helped me prepare better, inform myself what the job would involve."

When he took office, DeHoyos' concern was to respond to the needs of the whole community. He has served under three county judges.

"County government changes, it improves...Slowly but surely we've modernized in a fashion that hasn't hurt our taxes. We provide good services for our tax rate," DeHoyos said.

DeHoyos is especially proud of the county library, saying that the community "needs more things along that line, intellectually, culturally". He also sees the need to be able to draw professionals to the community. "It is a critical thing to find a doctor who wants to settle in a small town."

Being commissioner is interesting work according to DeHoyos. "If you don't have a purpose in life, that'll give you one."

The commissioner believes in the importance of peoples' opinions as a guideline for commissioners' court, saying that county government can't operate in a vacuum. "You have to listen to people with an open mind rather than be defensive...see through their anger and frustration to what the problem is."

When he took office, DeHoyos resolved to keep the ability to always



talk with anybody. "The other person's opinion is just as important as yours." He applied this philosophy to his fellow commissioners as well as the community at large, and leaves it as his advise to the court.

"If you can't face your fellow commissioner and work with him, how are you going to get anything done?" DeHoyos is a field foreman for Lilly Construction where he has worked since 1975. He is a 1963 graduate of Ozona High School, earned a degree in history and government from Sul Ross State University and was employed as a graduate assistant there. He served in the U. S. Army two years and taught in Lubbock before returning to Ozona when his parents, Anastacio and Carlota DeHoyos, became ill.

"It was an honor getting elected. A lot of work from a lot of people and a little luck got me elected. I owe thanks to a lot of people and to Gene Lilly for putting up with me."

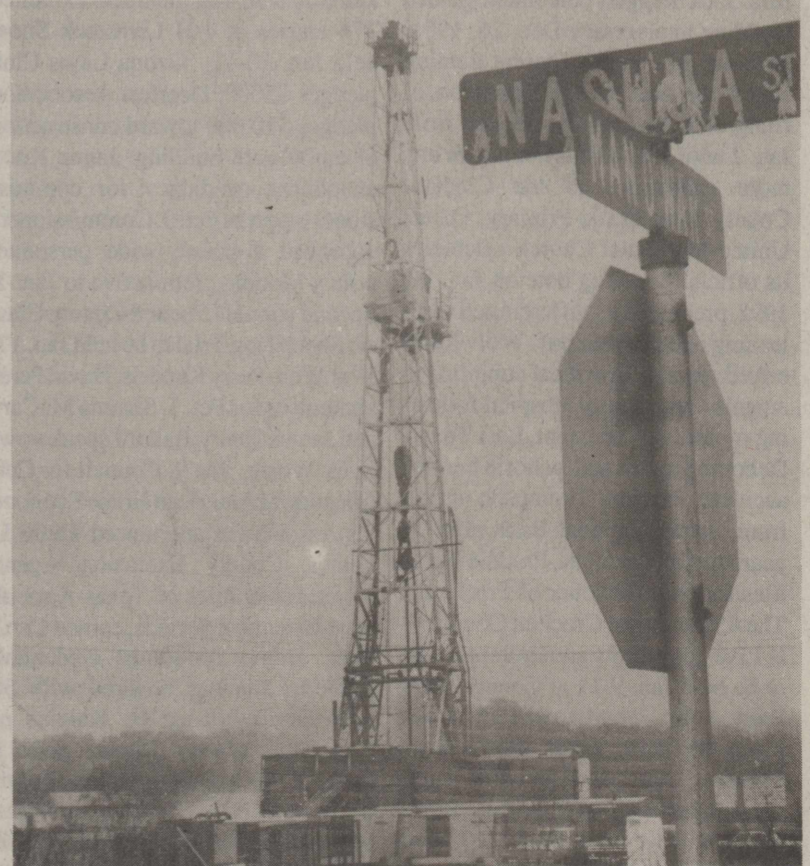
"It was enjoyable, exciting," DeHoyos said of his years as commissioner. "I think I'm going to miss it."

## 1993 4-H livestock show approaching

## New Year's resolutions not made to be broken

Contrary to the way it usually happens, New Year's resolutions are not made to be broken.

"Resolutions can work any time of the year if you go slowly and realize you may not succeed on the first try," said Dr. Michael Cox, a psychologist at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

Successful New Year's resolutions begin as reasonable goals with reasonable expectations.

"Make the first step a small one, and take your time," Cox said. "Pick something at which you can be successful, and build on that success."

Cox encourages people to ask, "How can I take better care of myself next year?"

"It may sound self-centered, but working on personal growth makes you more able to take care of relationships," he said.

"Give them your sense of direction, so they can help."

It may be a friend's encouragement to stick with that new walking program or a co-worker's positive comments that make the difference.

And, if you do break your resolution? Try again. There is nothing magical about New Year's. Cox says it is seldom, if ever, too late to make a change.

"Take credit for positive changes and accomplishments," Cox said. "As you begin to see yourself making changes, the attitude truly begins to change."

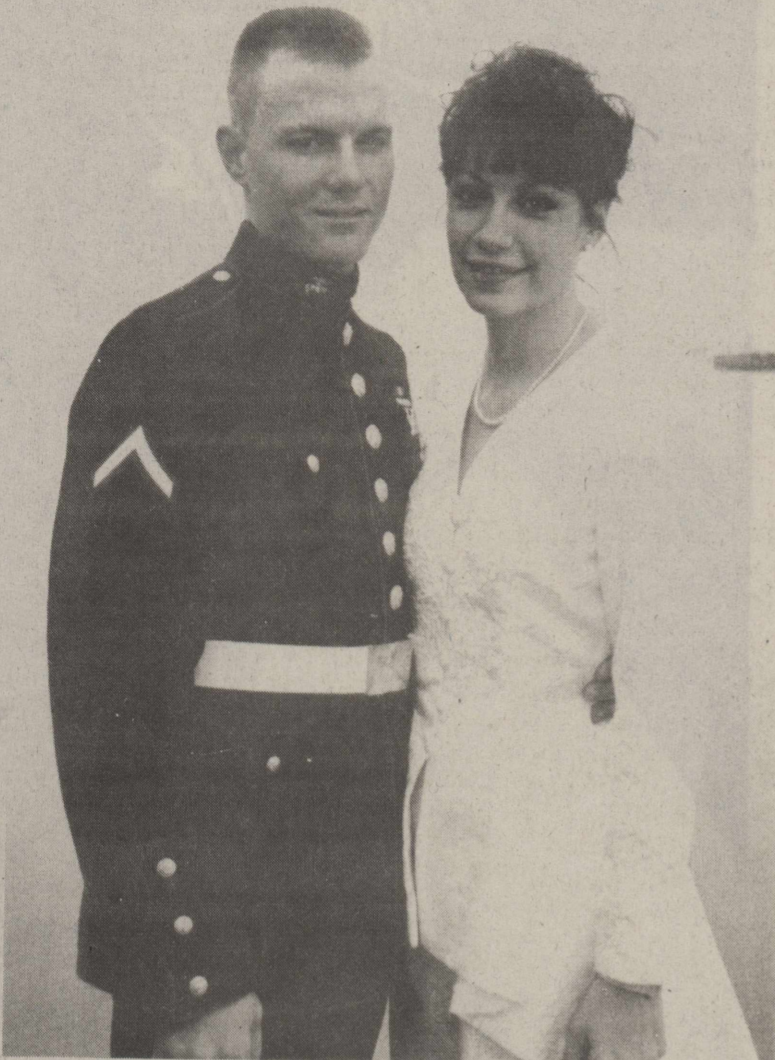

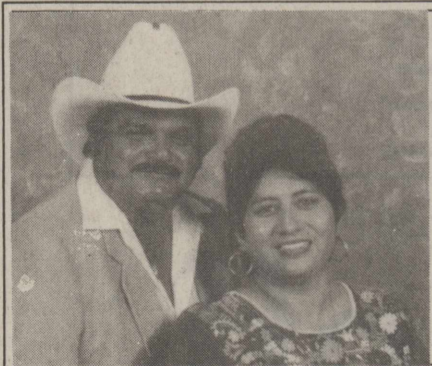


