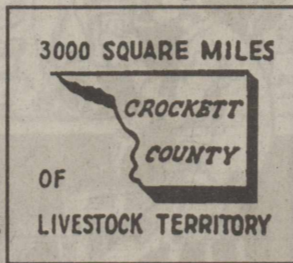

New Goat Roping Champ Crowned

Hot weather and plenty of dust met ropers in Ozona as they threw their loops in pursuit of elusive goats last Thursday through Saturday. Ropers from across Texas competed in the Texas Goat Roping Association's 1994 World Championship Goat Roping held June 23-25. A total of 222 contestants roped in seven

events and 21 contestants were entered in the two goat tying events.

Johnny Bownds of Eldorado became the world champion when he dropped a loop on his last goat with a time of 11.41 seconds to seal the victory. Bownds, the 1992 World Champion, finished with a 96.70 seconds on seven head. He was 7.2 seconds faster than Sterling City roper Justin Frizzell's 103.90 time.

The champion roper received prize money, a belt buckle, saddle, and the Karl Kinney Kothman Memorial Trophy for his efforts. Friday night Bownds was the match roping winner over the 1993 World Champion Goat Roper- Jesse Banner of Dryden. Roping eight goats each, Bownds' total time was 132.55 seconds with an average time of 16.57 seconds. Banner's total time was 138.50 seconds with an average time of 17.31 seconds.

The Goat Roping Horse Award went to horse owner Jerry Polk of Florence. This is a new award and it was awarded to the top horse judged from all events.

One of the highlights of Saturday night was the drawing for the winner of a new 1994 Ford 3/4 ton pickup. Mr. and Mrs. Jim Grenda from San Angelo are the proud owners of the new pickup. One ticket bought by the Grendas was purchased earlier in the month from Raul De La Rosa when they attended a recent square dance.

With a wide grin on his face, Grenda said, "I've never won anything in my life--I'm overwhelmed and it's

perfect." The Grendas were not present at the time of the drawing but were awarded the pickup at the Crockett County National Bank on Monday afternoon. A total of 1,038 tickets were sold by many Ozona people.

Roping fans were treated to a personal touch of the singing of the Star Spangled Banner by four young Ozona ladies. Those singing the national anthem include Lacy Hunnicutt, Millie Wadsworth, Codi Richardson, and Kimberly Bean.

Blistering Heat Prevails

One hundred plus degrees have been recorded by Crockett County Water Control's weather station frequently since the end of May.

The current run of high temperatures began June 23 with 101, escalating to 106 on June 27 with a low of 78 that day. A brief rain on the 23rd helped limit the next day's high to 100, but by Saturday, the 25th, the temperature climbed to 103.

Sunday's high was 105, leading up to the 106 scorcher on Monday.

May ended with 100. The next really hot spell started June 7 with 101 followed by 103 on the 8th, 105 the 9th and 101 the 10th of June.

Faculty Members Hired

Trustees hired a primary school principal and five instructors when they met June 14. The new principal, Faith Ballard, and four of the teachers come from Ralls, former home of new superintendent Larry Taylor.

The teachers include Mr. Taylor's wife, Carolyn, who will teach fourth grade; Deborah Ramon, middle school reading teacher; Renée Casey, middle school English teacher and Ronnie Casey, high school biology teacher. Also joining the faculty is Brandy Gothard. He comes to Ozona from Abilene and will be the new athletic trainer.

Additional employment approved at the meeting was for one person in the maintenance department. Selection was to be made later.

Salary increases of 2.5 percent were okayed for principals at the high school, middle school and intermediate school. A 4 percent increase was given to the assistant superintendent.

Maintenance supervisor Ray Don Myers reported on gas line problems at the primary school. A budget amendment was made in the amount of

Blood Drive Thursday

Xi Sigma Omega will sponsor a blood drive tomorrow, Thursday, June 30, at the civic center from 1 to 7 p.m. United Blood Services of San Angelo will be collecting the voluntary donations.

"There is absolutely no risk of getting AIDS or any infectious disease by donating blood," said Jan Gallagher, Senior Community Relations Representative of United Blood Services. "Only sterile and disposable materials are used during the donation process. Everything, from the swabs to the blood bags to the needles, is used just once and then thrown away."

United Blood Services is this region's nonprofit community blood provider, serving patients in 23 hospitals throughout the West Texas area. Since blood cannot be manufactured and can be stored only 42 days, a safe

and adequate supply of blood must be available to meet the needs of local hospital patients. Currently, nearly 375 blood donations must be collected each week to meet area demands.

Since the blood used by patients served by United Blood Services is freely provided by volunteer blood donors, there is no charge for the blood itself. There is a processing fee to recover the operational costs of the blood center, including collecting, testing, processing, storing and delivering blood and blood components. Health insurance usually covers this fee.

Most healthy people 17 and older who weigh at least 110 pounds can donate blood. Each donor receives a thorough pre-donation interview, including a careful review of medical history and a check of temperature, pulse, blood pressure and blood iron level. After the blood is collected, it is typed and tested for diseases which could be transmitted to the recipient. Should any of these tests indicate the need for medical attention, the donor is notified.

The actual donation takes about 10 minutes. The donor relaxes in a comfortable chair while one unit (about a pint) of blood is collected in a special container. Afterward, donors enjoy a light refreshment before returning to their normal routine.

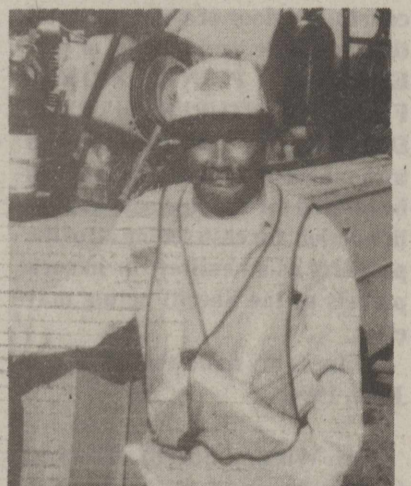

Members of Ozona G.I. Forum will conduct the flag ceremony at 10:15 on the square. Following at 10:30 will be the pet parade and children's parade.

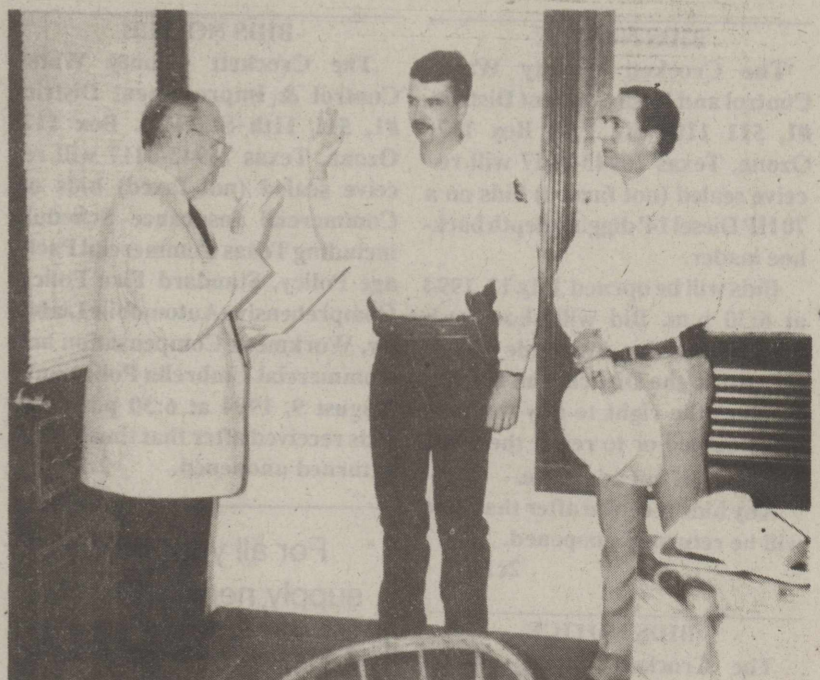
Splash Day activities at the North Pool begin at 2:30 and continue until 5 p.m.

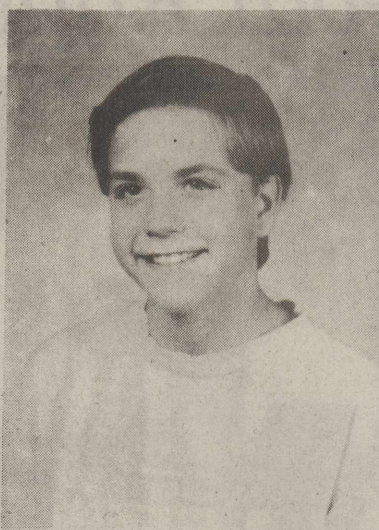
Brown Chosen As All-American Scholar

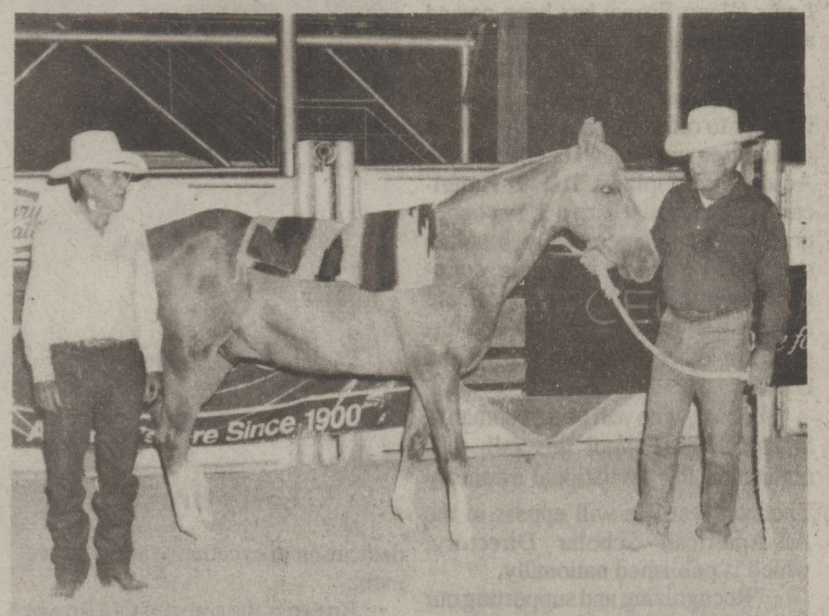

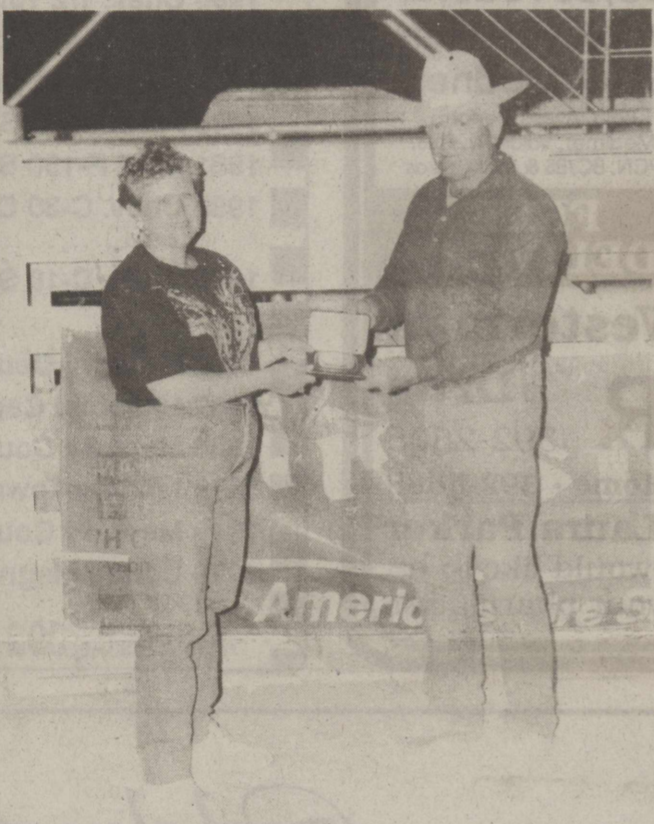

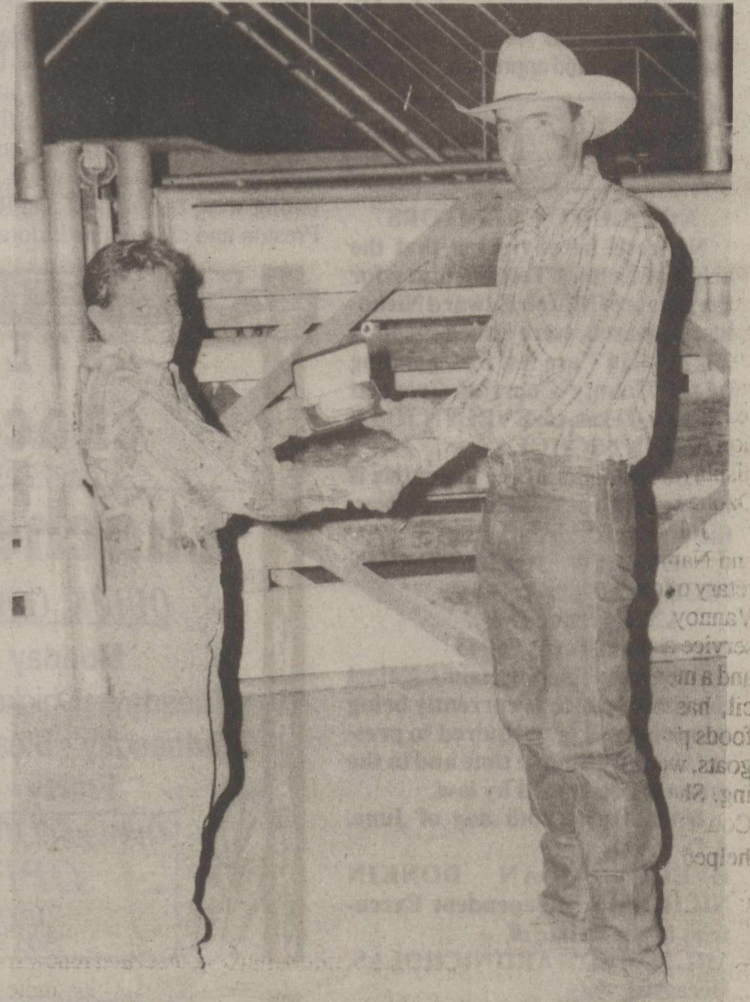

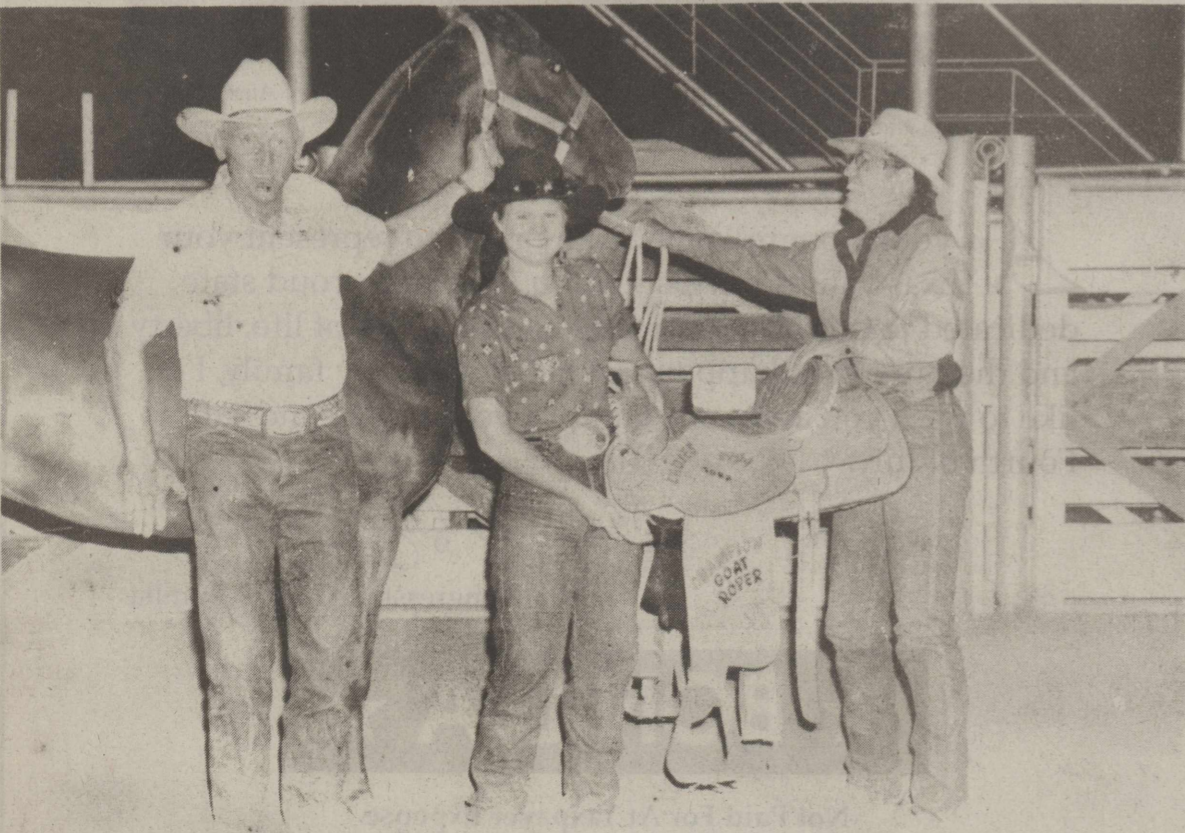

"Many of these teachers want more resources and information to use in their classrooms," said Kit Home, farm and ranch community relations consultant of WTU.

"We try to give the fourth through eighth grade science teachers something they can't get from textbooks," said Home, who has been coordinating science workshops for area educators for more than 10 years.

Once a year WTU sponsors work-

shops aimed at different teachers, such as science or agri-science teachers. By participating in these workshops, teachers may obtain credit from their school systems.

WTU, headquartered in Abilene, serves 180,000 customers in 52 Texas counties stretching from the Red River to the Rio Grande.

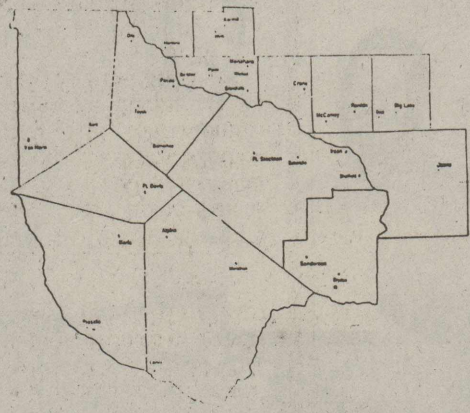

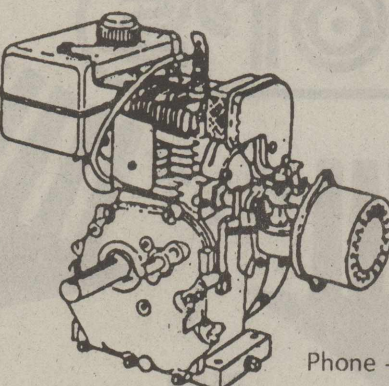
