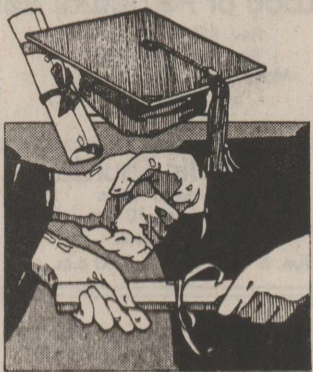

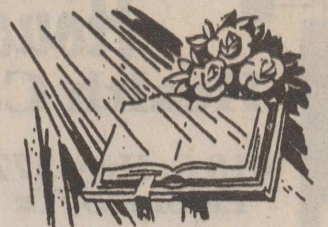

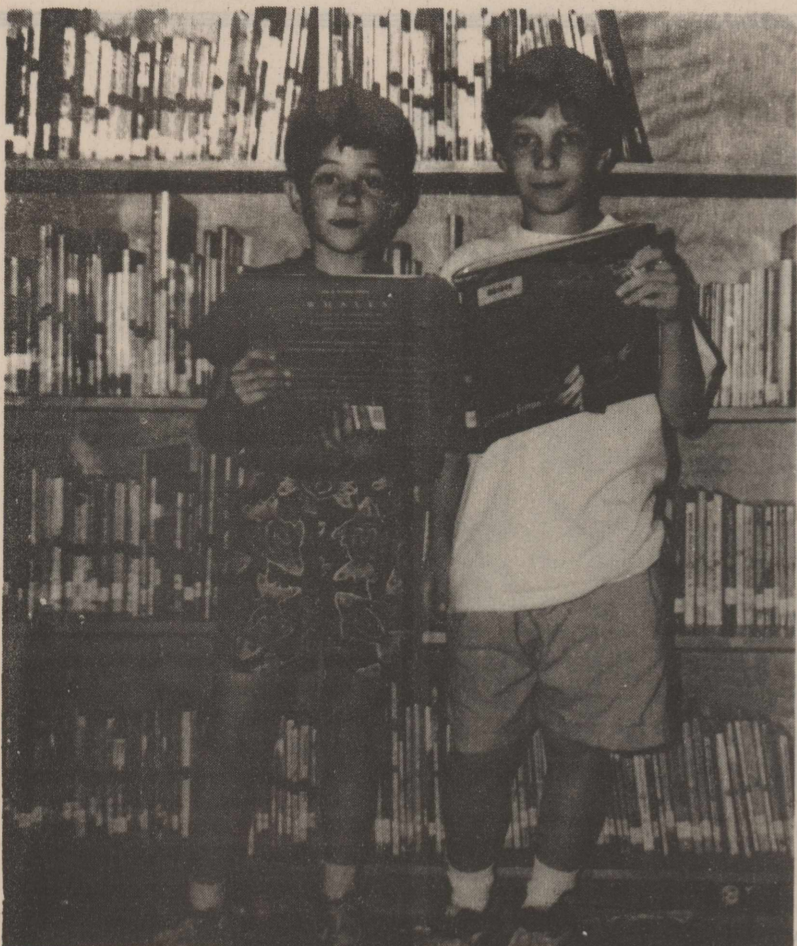

students, teachers and administrators, grouped its recommendations into three domains: 1 programs, 2 facilities; and 3 other items.

In regard to programs, the committee recommended that the district's highest priority should be given to the improvement of reading skills. This was followed closely by the second highest priority of more emphasis being placed on mathematics, prekindergarten through the twelfth grade. Other items receiving a "Very Important" priority rating were to encourage the district to continue to offer vocational programs at the high school level, more books and materials are needed in the junior high library, and continued education or staff development is needed for teachers about

one service break from taking the first set.

facilities, equipment and furniture by developing a short, intermediate and long range plan for each, keep district housing for teachers, continue to update school technology equipment, and implement a repair system for computer support.

The school board studied a comprehensive proposal presented by Mr. Pete Golwas of Johnson Controls for energy conservation and operational efficiency improvements for the school district. The proposal included the installing of energy efficient lighting in the high school main building and in the library, band/wood shop, home economics, vocational agriculture, and auto mechanics buildings, administration building, central cafeteria, Davidson Gymnasium offices and dressing rooms, Ozona Heritage Building, field house, Ozona Middle School, Ozona Intermediate School and Ozona Primary School.

The proposal includes the replacement of old heaters with energy efficient heaters in the vocational agriculture building, central cafeteria, and Ozona Middle, Intermediate and Primary Schools. The main chiller and boiler unit at Ozona High School and the chiller unit in the Ozona Heritage Building would also be replaced with new equipment. It also includes the installation of a facility management system to control the heating and air conditioning equipment district-wide so that energy usage can be monitored from a central location.

"If this proposal is approved," Golwas said, "Johnson Controls will guarantee that the energy cost savings to the district in the next seven years will pay for the cost of the project." Following discussion of the proposal, the board voted to approve the project with the exclusion of energy conservation proposals for Ozona Middle School. The contract cost is \$476,719.00 and will be financed by a \$200,000 down payment from the district's general fund with the remainder to be paid out over a five-year period through financing from a local bank. Energy conservation measures for Ozona Middle School will be implemented after a study has been made regarding either remodeling the present school or building a new school.

The board discussed tuition payments to Iraan-Sheffield, McCamey and Reagan County school districts for Ozona students who live in the north and south areas of the county and who attend schools in these districts. The trustees voted to approve a tuition payment equal to the local school district's WADA (Weighted Average Daily Attendance) to Iraan-

Sheffield and McCamey and to negotiate an agreement with Reagan County for tuition for these students. During the meeting, school business manager Mae Lay administered the oath of office to newly re-elected board members Wade Richardson and Marcus Sims. Elliott Barrea will continue to serve on the board as a hold-over member until such time as an election is held and the winner of the election is certified. Barrera and Jessie Reina-Zuniga each received 41 votes and tied for the school board District 1 position. The trustees also approved board officers for the 1995-96 school year. The officers are the same as last year and are: Wade Richardson, president; David Bean, vice-president; and Elliott Barrera, secretary.

The trustees also approved a public hearing on the use of the district's Title VI Federal and Title I fund for next year, approved bids for athletic equipment, certified Superintendent Larry Taylor as the district's representative to the Region XV Education Service

Center Advisory Committee, and set the date of the board's regular June meeting on Tuesday, June 13, at 7 p.m. The members also approved the employment of Jennifer Pool as a fifth grade teacher in Ozona Intermediate School next year and accepted the resignation, effective at the end of this school year, of Keith Hall, mathematics teacher in Ozona High School.

special programs such as English as a Second Language, Dyslexia, Gifted and Talented, Special Education, as well as on student's learning styles, reading styles, Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) and Attention Deficit Hyper Disorder (ADHD).

In facilities, the committee recommended that the district place its highest priority on studying the cost of completely remodeling the junior high school versus building a new one. Other priority items needing attention included the correction of a gas problem in the high school physical science lab and the following recommendations: routine maintenance needs to be done continuously on all facilities, the high school band hall needs a second door for safety reasons, the science labs at the junior high and high school need to be upgraded and improved, the junior high girls' dressing room in the gym needs a second door for safety reasons, and the foundation of the junior high school needs to be leveled or repaired.

Other priority items recommended by the committee were to continue to pay teachers above state base salary, deal effectively with student discipline, invest in the district's

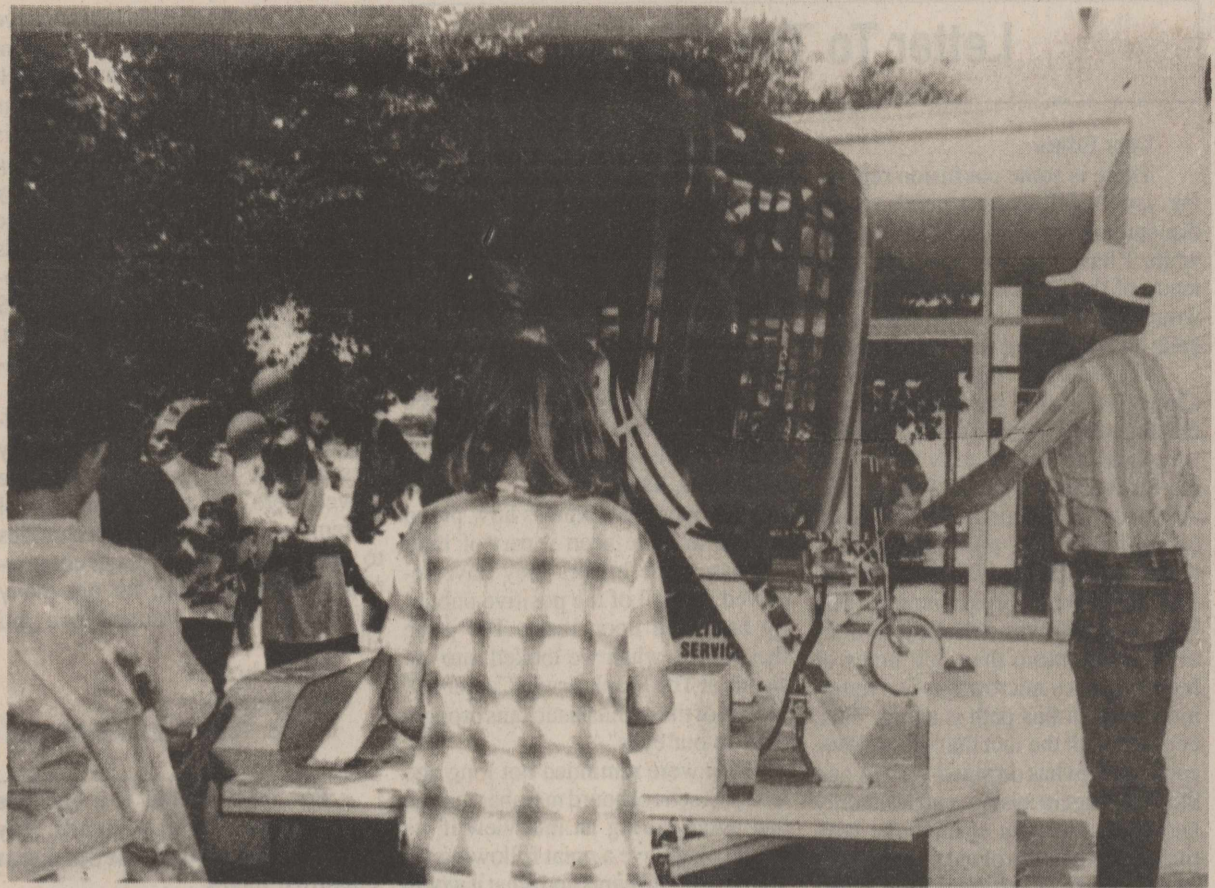

Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor:

There is some confusion regarding your local cable system's recent discontinuation of WFAA-Dallas and, while I have enjoyed speaking with many of the fine citizens of Ozona, I would like to save you all a few phone calls by addressing the issue here.

On March 6, representatives of Circle Bar Cable were present at a meeting where we first announced that we would no longer carry WFAA in our far Western systems. While cable customers in Ozona enjoy access to two different ABC affiliates, our customers have had only WFAA to provide their ABC programming. The WFAA signal was delivered to Sonora through more than 300 miles of high frequency microwave. The equipment used in this path is aging. This, coupled with the fact that the Abilene cable system has dropped WFAA and the San Angelo system carries it only part-time, virtually ensures the continued degradation of the picture quality of WFAA. When the WFAA signal was unwatchable, you simply turned to the Midland ABC affiliate while our customers received no ABC signal.

We had to make this change, and because we currently supply Circle Bar cable with the ABC and Fox signals, the service was also changed on your system. It is certainly possible for Circle Bar Cable to reestablish carriage of WFAA through San Angelo using their own equipment, but we cannot continue to rely on this signal as our sole source of ABC programming.

Thanks to the Editor for the opportunity to explain our reasons for making this change in our communities and for the many calls I have received from each of you.

UIL literary interests have led JoLynn to compete in poetry four years, qualifying for regional the last three, and in persuasive speaking three years with regional qualification this year.

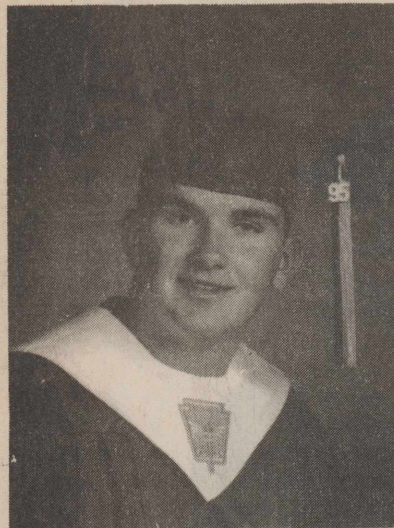

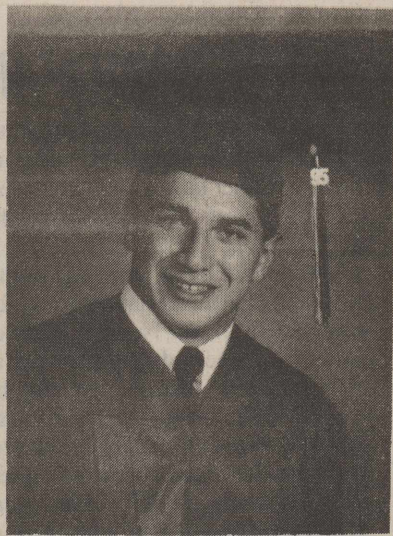
Anthony received the Fighting Heart Award in track this year. He earned honorable mention as running back in football his junior year and was All-District second team safety this year.

ing graduation he will go to college and major in kinesiology with the goal of becoming a coach.

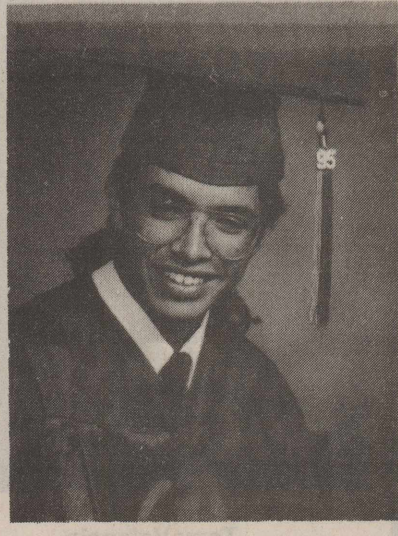

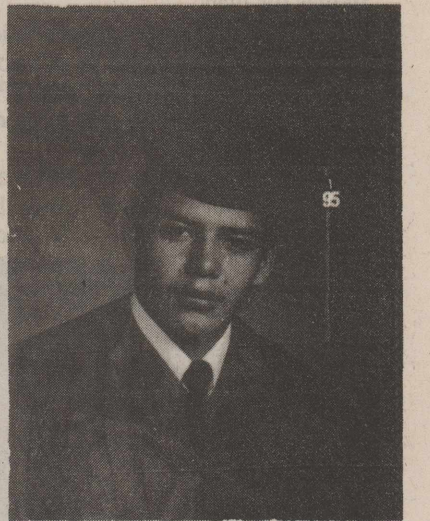

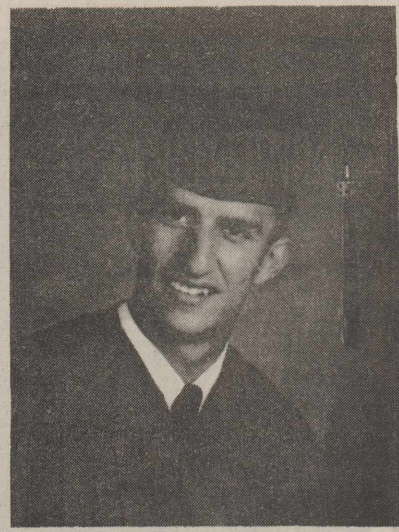

Garcia Awarded Carr Scholarship

Dora Garcia, a 1995 senior at Ozona High School, has been awarded a Carr Academic Scholarship at Angelo State University for 1995-96.

More than 300 Carr Academic Scholarships for 1995-96, ranging in value from \$1,000 to \$6,000 have been awarded to qualified high school seniors. During the current year, approximately 900 students from throughout Texas and the nation, as well as numerous foreign countries, are attending Angelo State University on Carr Academic Scholarships.

As a general rule, students must rank in the top 15 percent of their high school class, have a high school grade

average of 90 or above, and present a combined math and verbal score of 1000 or higher on the SAT or a composite score of 25 or higher on the ACT.

Supported by a growing multi-million dollar trust established by the late Robert G. and Nona K. Carr of San Angelo, the undergraduate scholarships may be renewed annually by the University for students who maintain the required academic record. During a four-year course of undergraduate study at ASU, Carr Academic Scholarships can be worth from \$4,000 to \$24,000.

The Ozona High School Class of 1995 has 10 students selected as candidates for Best Citizen Award. Because the winner is selected by the teachers, the Best Citizen Award is one of the highest honors received by a graduating senior.
