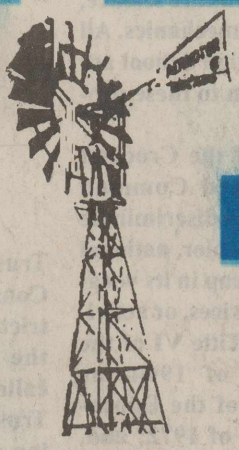
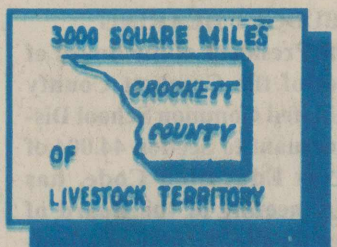

Melvin Wayne White Charged With Capital Murder Nine-Year-Old Ozona Girl Abducted And Murdered

Melvin Wayne White, age 47, of Ozona, was arrested and charged with capital murder at approximately 4:00 p.m. Tuesday in the death of Jennifer Gravell, age 9, also of Ozona. Crockett County Sheriff's Department investigated the disappearance of Jennifer starting at approximately 1 a.m. Tuesday morning. A canvass of the neighborhood was conducted including riders on horseback and law enforcement officers, fire department volunteers and local citizen volunteers, but with



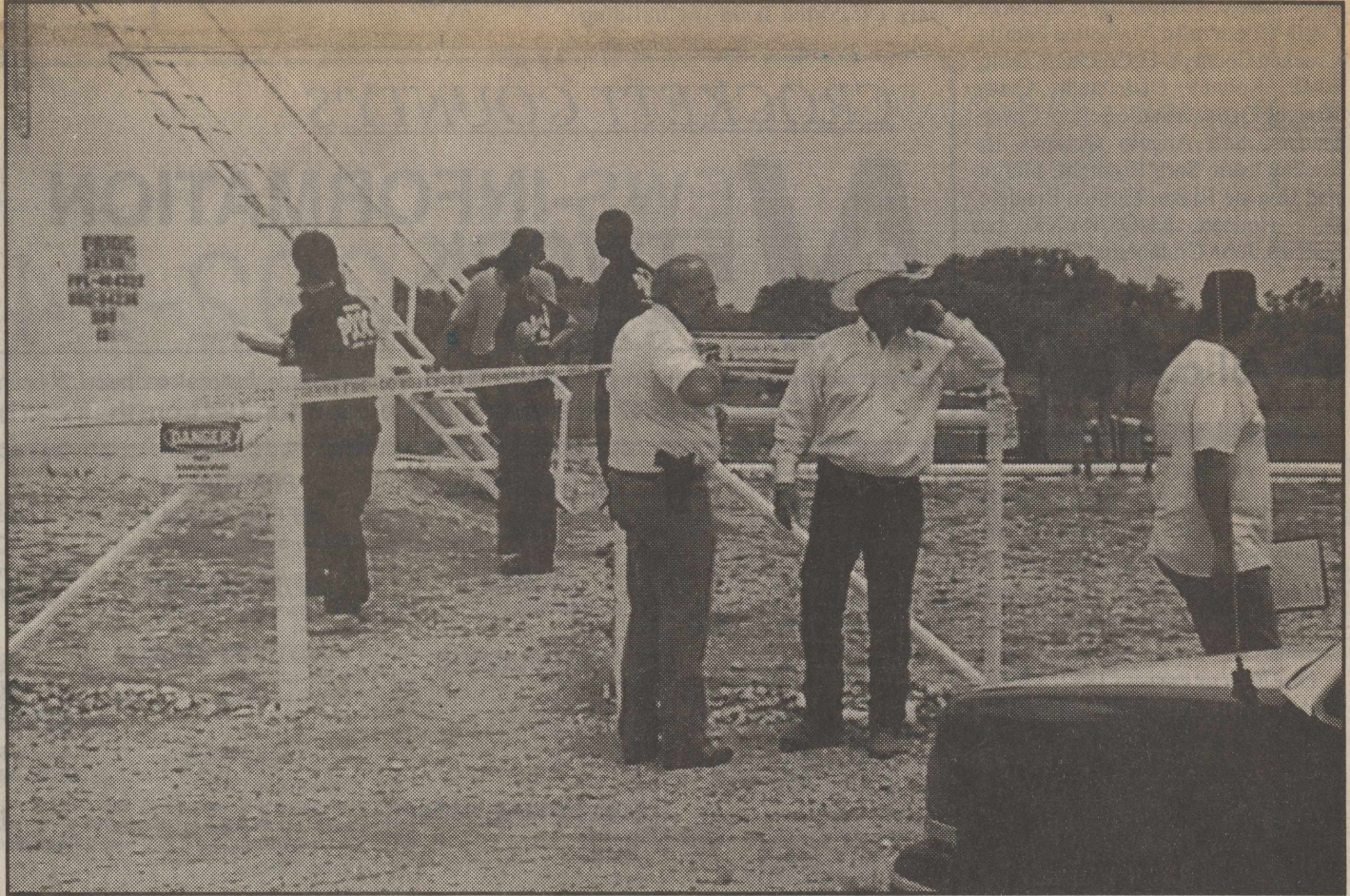
out finding the missing girl. A resident of the same neighborhood, Melvin White, was brought in and detained for questioning concerning

the disappearance of the little girl. The sheriff's office then began an extensive search which included Texas Rangers, DPS Crime Lab, DPS Troopers, Reagan County Sheriff's Office, Sutton County Sheriff's Office, Schleicher County Sheriff's Office, Border Patrol (USINS), employees of the Crockett County Road Department and members of the Crockett County Volunteer Fire Department and Reagan County Volunteer Fire Department and many local citizens.

Many Ozona citizens who have radio scanners were shocked to hear of the disappearance of 9-year-old Jennifer Gravell, daughter of Beth and Charlie Gravell Monday night. The girl had been

to a birthday party at a nearby residence arriving at approximately 9:00 p.m. and leaving the party around 10:00. She never returned to her home. Ozonans were even more shocked to learn that the little girl's body had been found around 1:28 p.m. Tuesday at a tank battery location 1/2 mile west of the junction of Hwy. 137 and Hwy. 163 by DPS Trooper Scales, Texas Ranger Joe Hunt and Sutton County chief deputy Joe Fincher.

Melvin White has been a long time resident of Ozona and was presently working for Dorado Oil Company in Crockett County. White was arraigned by Justice of the Peace James Hearne and no bond was set.

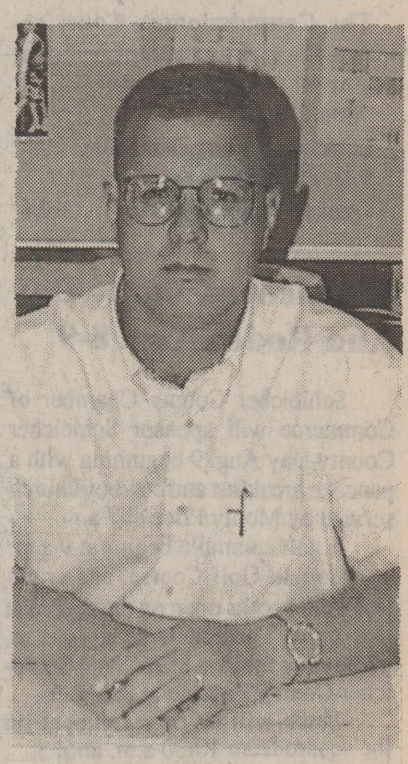
playoffs with a 7-4 season after a 0-10 season the previous year.

Cook of the Week Jill Seahorn says she didn't select any of the recipes she is sharing. "Everyone told me what to put in. Most recipes I had many years; old recipes are the most fun," says Jill.

"I love garlic. I put garlic in everything," says Jill. She also likes lots of fresh, hot peppers.

Jill's large kitchen with a center island is full of things useful to an enthusiastic cook. "I love kitchen stuff." Jill also loves having lots of family around when she is in the kitchen. Grandchildren Kaylee and Weston are especially welcome helpers.

Jill and Pon have two children, Terrel and Will. Will and his wife Cori are the parents of the above mentioned welcome helpers.

Her greatest joys are the family, her grandchildren and her animals, says Jill. The animals she speaks of are goats and little longhorns.

The recipe for Shepherd's Pie is one of husband Pon's favorites, says Jill.

Shepherd's Pie

1/2 lb. ground meat
1/2 lb. ground pork or sausage
1/2 med. onion, chopped
1/2 med. bell pepper, chopped
1/2 bunch green onions, chopped
2 to 3 cloves garlic, minced
1/2 T. flour
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. red pepper
1/4 tsp. black pepper
1 envelope mushroom gravy mix
Brown meats in skillet, remove meat, drain most of grease, saute onions and next three ingredients, return meat to skillet. Stir in flour and seasonings. Prepare gravy mix in separate pan. Add to meat and simmer down a bit. Pour into greased casserole. Top and seal edges with a couple of inches of mashed potatoes seasoned to taste. Top with grated Velveeta.
Bake at 375 degrees about 30 minutes until bubbly. Doubles well. Serves 6 to 8.

Jill's Potato Soup

4 beef bouillon cubes dissolved in 6 cups boiling water. Add: 5 or 6 peeled and diced potatoes or one package frozen hash browns, one onion, diced, salt, pepper, garlic salt to taste.
Simmer until potatoes are very soft, then add one small can Pet milk. Return to a boil, add 1/2 lb. Velveeta cut into hunks. Cover, turn stove off and let sit until cheese has melted. Stir and serve.
Jill says she usually uses potatoes rather than hash browns.

Restuffed Potatoes

Oil and bake 3 potatoes at 350 degrees one hour. Halve and scoop out potato. Add to potato meat and blend in mixer: 3/4 stick butter, 3 heaping T sour cream, 5 pieces bacon, fried crispy and broken into bits, 1 small onion, chopped, sauteed in bacon grease, milk to make creamy (dash or 2), 1 c. grated American cheese, salt, pepper.

Re-stuff potato shells. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. Sprinkle with grated cheese last few minutes.

Chicken and Dumplings

"I remember when I used to buy chicken backs for 19 cents a pound because that's all we could afford," says Jill. She also remembers her first attempt at making dumplings which resulted in just "one big dumpling".

2 1/2 c. flour
1 tsp. salt
1/2 c. shortening
1 egg (beaten well)
1/2 c. milk
1/2 c. chicken broth
1 small can Pet milk
1 chicken
salt and pepper
1 stick butter
Boil chicken, cool, bone, tear into pieces and set aside.

Blend shortening with flour and salt. Add milk, broth, egg. Mix well. Roll dough thin and cut into squares or strips. Have chicken broth boiling, drop dumplings one at a time into broth. Let cook about 10 minutes.

Add chicken, one stick butter, small Pet milk, salt and pepper to taste. Cook about 5 more minutes.
Thicker second day.

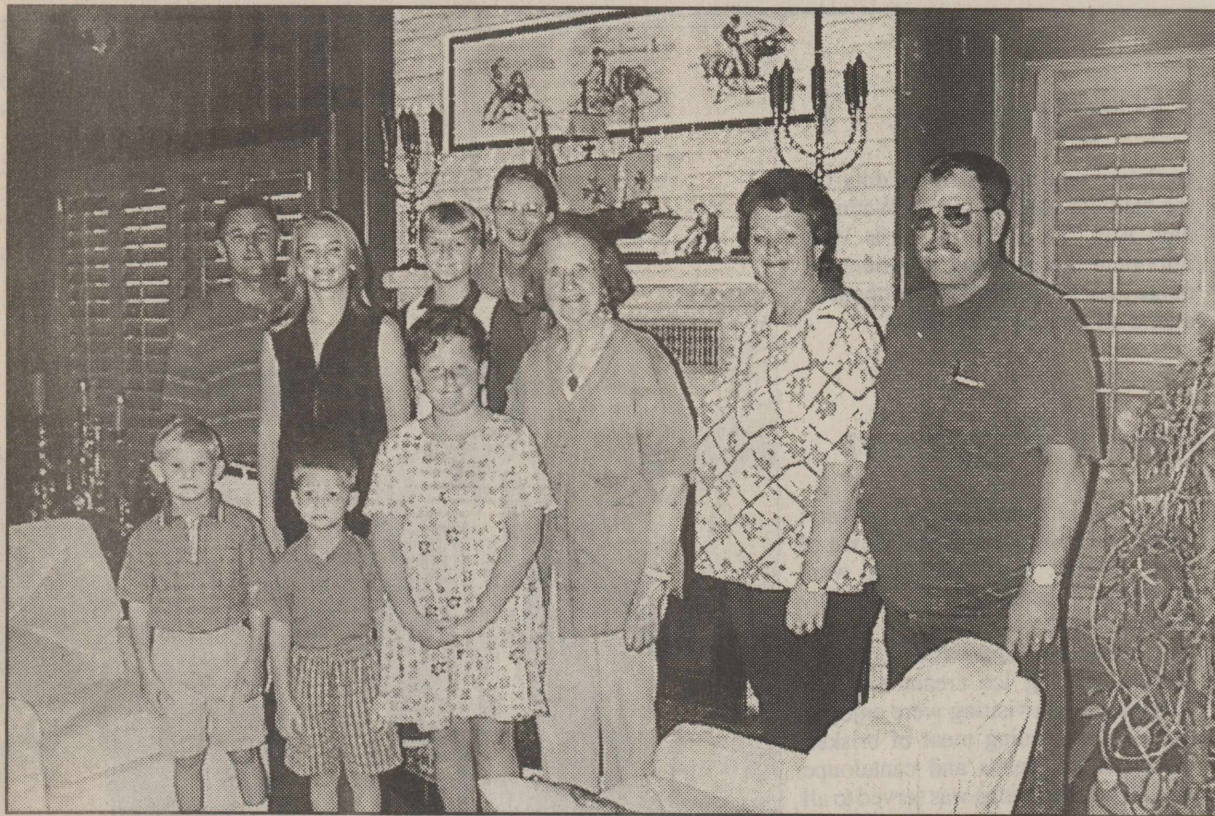

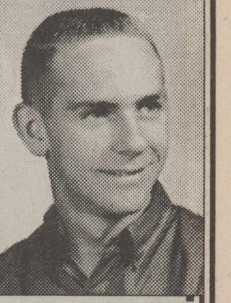

Plant Tips
from M&R Nursery
by: Ronnie Winkler
DOG DAYS OF SUMMER

Still no relief in sight. There is still spraying, feeding, and various other tasks that need attending.

Our Merit grub control has arrived. If you have not treated your lawn there is still plenty of time and this is the stuff to use. You get season long control with one application.

One problem we're seeing is bagworms on junipers (cedar) and most conifer type trees and shrubs. These are not hard to control after you find them. They form a cone shape cocoon made from the host plant so they blend in very well. Ferti-lome bagworm and caterpillar spray will work when sprayed two week intervals for three sprays.

I have also seen sunscald on some hawthorns and other shrubs that it normally does not affect. It's just too hot and dry. Try to avoid getting water on the leaves during the day. This rarely kills the plants and they will recover.

Some lawns are showing signs of summer stress. A good shot of tonic will take care of that. (That's the lawn tonic fertilizer we have in stock now.) It's great for growth and color on lawns. It can also be used on trees and shrubs.

I could go on and on but I am going to leave something for Mike to talk about next week.

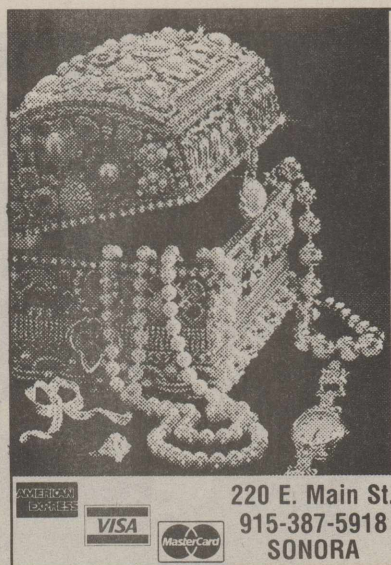

4-H'ers Take Trip Of A Lifetime

What do 'gators, racehorses, an aquarium and a U. S. President have in common? Nine 4-H'ers from Crockett County will tell you they are now part of the unforgettable memories gained from participation in the senior 4-H exchange trip this past July.

4-H'ers taking the trip were graduating seniors Amy Laughlin and Jason Hignight, plus Mark Childress, Dustin Shaffer, Ty Porter, Trey Hale, Ashlee Worley, Amanda Hignight and Leana Baggett.

Planning started a year ago on the trip, which lasted 10 days. County Extension Agents Miles Dabovich and Tedra Ulmer agreed that an exchange trip would greatly benefit the 4-H members both by broadening their horizons and through setting and reaching a major goal. While Crockett County had hosted Lamar County, Texas, in 1991, they did not have the opportunity to travel elsewhere. When the idea was mentioned at the first Senior meeting in the fall of 1996, the 4-H'ers were eager to try.

Fundraising was the first concern. The group sold tickets for their fundraiser and also required a \$50 deposit from each member, raising approximately \$5,500. Part of the funds would be used for travel this year, and the

rest to host the following year. Shelby County, Kentucky, was looking for a county to exchange with, and arrangements were made. It was time to set an itinerary.

Miles suggested the group do sightseeing on the way to Kentucky. It was an inspired suggestion. Where did the group want to go? After digging out a U. S. map, the 4-H'ers insisted on New Orleans and Nashville. Tedra and Jason Hignight did some digging on the Internet, and tourist information from Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Tennessee and Kentucky was gathered.

After checking mileage, it was decided the group would spend the first night in Lafayette, LA. It's a small world, and the day after the decision was made, Tedra received a card from a former Dickens County 4-H'er who - you guessed it - lives in Lafayette. Tedra called and got some hot tourist tips for Lafayette, the Cajun country of Louisiana and New Orleans.

Steve Wilkins generously loaned his trailer. The 4-H'ers voted to take Laurie Hale and Ray Shaffer as adult leader chaperones, and both agents prepared to go. Laurie also very generously volunteered the use of her suburban, so with the county suburban, the group was ready to "head 'em up and move 'em out".

We met at 5 a.m. at the Extension Office and piled in the junk. Parents said goodbyes as we pulled off on the first leg of our journey - to Town and Country to get "provisions"! The first real stop was at a Jack in the Box on the east side of San Antonio, where Laurie met her mom and Clay Hale to obtain delicious homemade chocolate chip cookies and drop off clothes for Clay. They promptly disappeared, and the whole group wondered where he was - until we found him with "Grandma".

We started off again, stopping only for a sack lunch at Chick-Fil-A in Houston. There the 4-H'ers learned the truth about Ray's stories - listen and laugh, but don't fall for them! He asked if we had heard about the hurricane that hit the famous cemetery in New Orleans where we had talked about going - everyone gasped and said, "No!" Ray continued, "Yes, it hit right inside the cemetery yesterday...hundreds there are dead!" You figure it out.

The next stop was at the Louisiana visitors center - where we were greeted by the sight of a beautiful lake - with a "No Swimming - Alligators" sign. The temperature was at least several hundred degrees hotter - and more humid - than Ozona.

We crossed the high bridge at Lake Charles and saw our first rice and cane fields as we neared Lafayette. As we came closer to the motel for that night, the first "lost incident" occurred with the guys' vehicle. They turned and failed to go in the motel parking lot - we're not sure where they went. By the way, the group divided into a "girls" and a "guys" suburban. We didn't ask what went on the guys' vehicle, and they didn't ask what was said in ours. Let's just say some ears burned occasionally!

We changed our rumpled clothes and headed for Randol's, a well-known Cajun restaurant with a live Cajun band. The food was great, and the dancing and music were a real eye-opener for our little Texas two-stoppers. At Randol's Boudreau and Thibodeaux were born, as our two male chaperones assumed new identities for the rest of the trip. To prepare for the airboat and swamps the next day, the group headed to Wal-Mart for a shopping marathon. Miles ended up with the big purchases...the heat had gotten to him, so he picked up some really swanky black velcro running shoes, khaki shorts and a green T-shirt. The

girls loaded up with Deep Woods Off - which we never even used.

After too little sleep, we went down for breakfast, loaded up and moved out for St. Martinville, the site of St. Martine de Tours church, built in 1765, the oldest church building still in use in the state of Louisiana. A sign posted on a telephone pole urged us to attend "Spankfest", and we still don't know what that was. The church - and entire downtown - were beautiful and historic - the flowers were incredible, and we also got to see the Evangeline statue and learn more about Cajun history. Longfellow's epic poem, Evangeline, was based on the true story of Louis Arceneaux and Emmeline Labiche, who were forced from their Acadian homeland in Nova Scotia in 1755 because they (and the other Acadians) refused to swear allegiance to the British Crown. Many families were separated and more than half died.

We were surprised to find a truly wonderful exhibit of elaborate Mardi Gras costumes upstairs in the little parish museum. We had never seen so many sequins, pearls, lace and velvets in one place before.

We then headed to New Iberia and Shadows on the Teche plantation house. It was a beautiful home built in 1834 by sugarcane planter David Weeks. Weeks never lived to see his completed home, and his wife spent the Civil War on the second floor after it was confiscated for use by the Yankee army. Seeing how people lived 150 years ago was truly fascinating. One of the most important things about the house was its location right on the banks of the Bayou Teche, so boats could bring supplies and building materials right to the back door.

We ate lunch at a wonderful but slow restaurant. During the meal, Boudreau was attacked by a crab claw from the gumbo which was being cracked by Thibodeaux. (Boudreau is the tall one.) Attempting to demonstrate how to properly crack a crab claw, Boudreau inflicted more damage to his lovely green T-shirt, eyes and face. He then retired from the crab-eating instructor's business.

The group raced to the airboat tour site outside of New Iberia. Luckily, the women were leading the way, so we didn't get lost. The airboat tours of the Atchafalaya basin were terrific. We spent an hour on Lake Fausse Pointe seeing the shallow-water swamps, giant 200 year-old cypress

trees, one itty-bitty gator, and a really big nutria. Our guides were two natives of the swamp, and really knew their way around - which was good, because one bayou looked the same as the rest to us desert-dwellers. The water in the lake was probably around 85-90 degrees, so all the gators were out of the water, holed up in the shade; however, riding on an airboat is a tremendously fun experience in itself, and the scenery was great.

After the airboat tour, we traveled to Avery Island - home of the famous Tabasco Sauce. We were immediately hit by the strong fragrance of pickled peppers as we drove up. The 4-H'ers saw a short film on the history of Tabasco, we saw the factory in operation,

then hit the gift shop. No one left empty-handed, and at least one delicious roast has since been cooked using their products.

On to New Orleans. We took the southern route through Morgan City. Unfortunately, the guys weren't watching closely and failed to make a critical right-hand veer - and we were separated. After trying in vain to get through on the phone, we discovered they were near Raceland...we were at Thibodeaux...they said they'd wait for us...we got there...they were gone...where are you, guys? Another phone call revealed they were pulling in to New Orleans at that very minute. New Orleans is another story in itself - more next week!

Any donations will be accepted and appreciated.

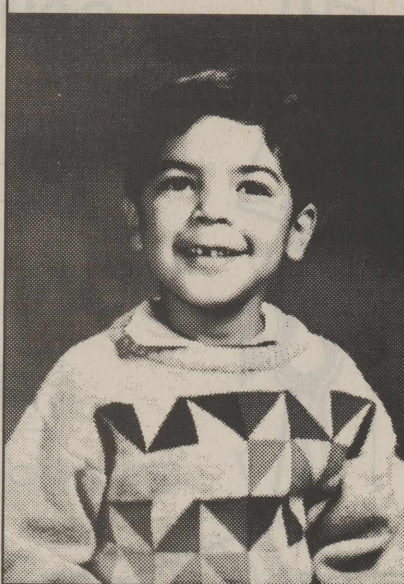

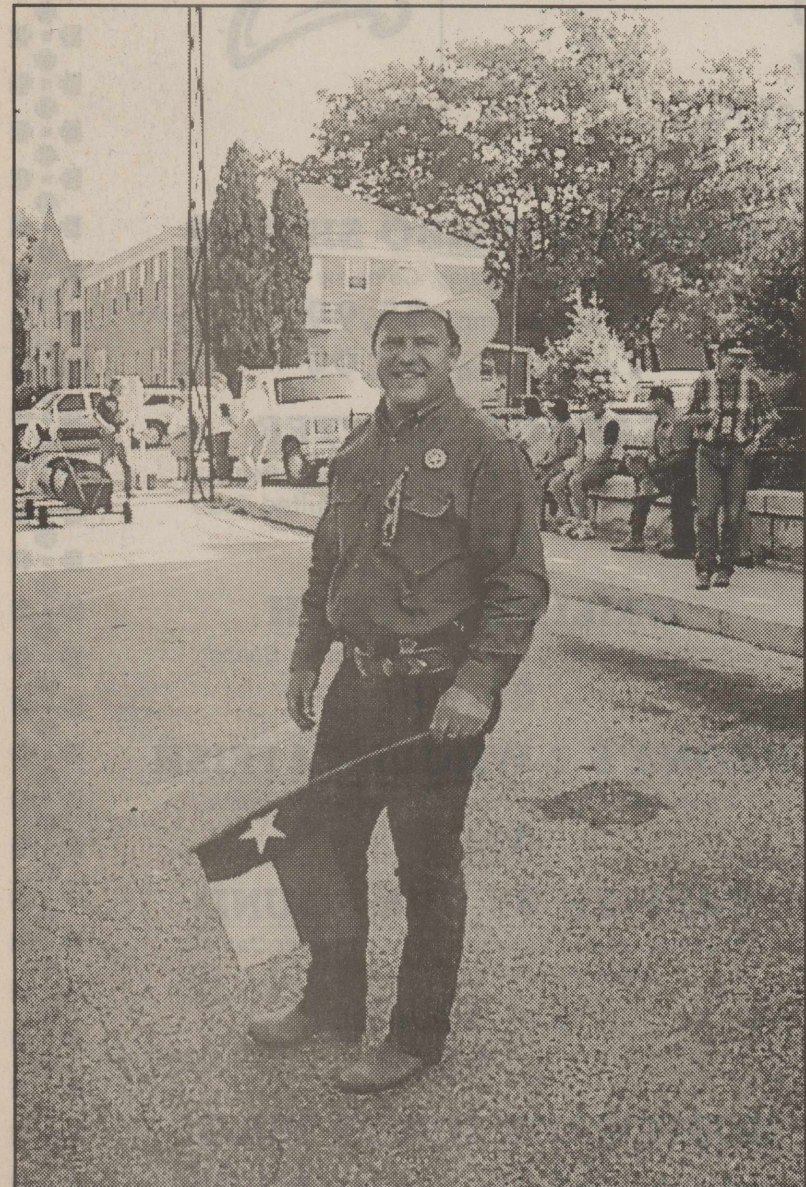

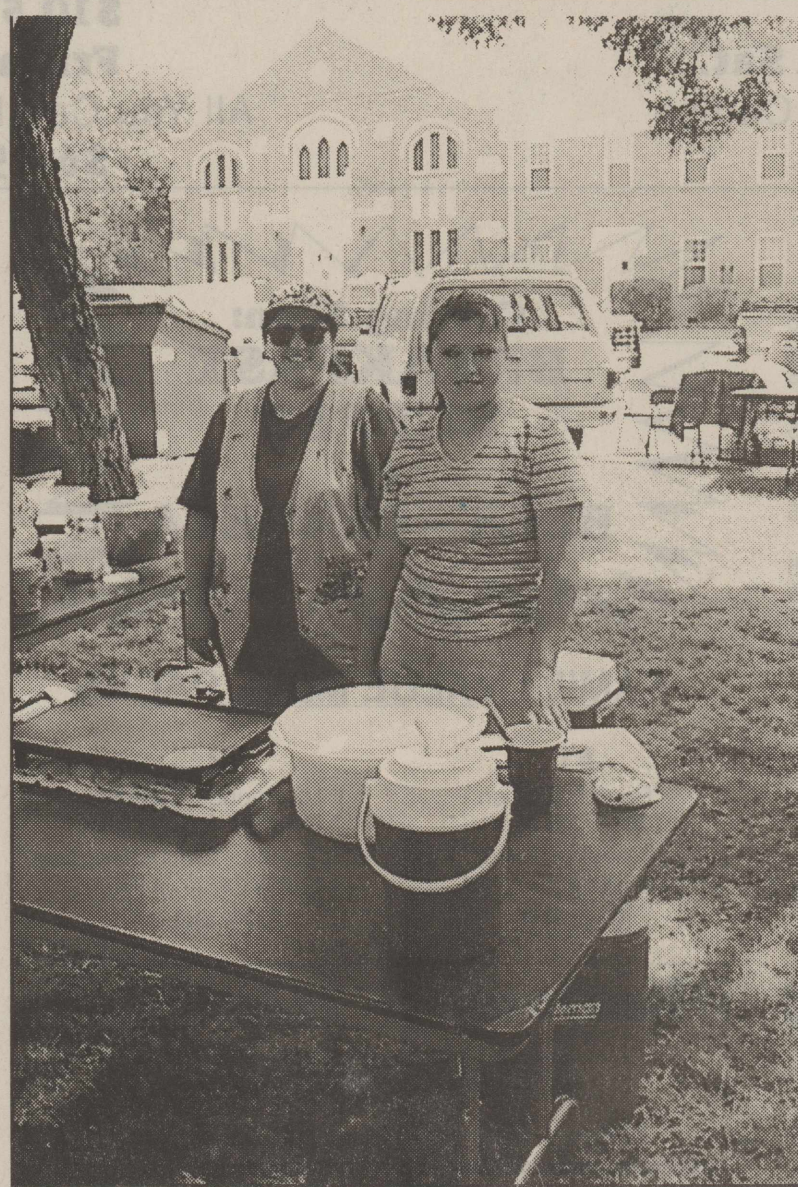

Weekly Drilling and Completion Report

Crockett County's Holt Ranch Field will gain new production when the No. 3 Chivest is spudded 10 miles north of Ozona. Wynco Energy Co. of Midland is the operator. The operation is in a 1,100-acre lease in the G. W. Sweat Survey A-2838. Canyon formation will be the objective at a depth of approximately 8,200 feet.

Aimed at expanding the production of Crockett County's Baggett Field, a new pool wildcat is scheduled to be drilled 12 miles southeast of Ozona. Sonat Exploration Co. of Midland is the operator. Designated as the No. 3 Jack Riggs "30", it carries permit for 10,000 feet maximum hole. It is in a 654-acre lease in the GC&SF Survey A-4752.

Another new pool wildcat is planned by Devon Energy Corp. of Oklahoma City four and a half miles south-southwest of Ozona near existing production in Crockett County's Hunt-Baggett Field. The No. 4 Ruby Helbing 27 is in a 640-acre lease in the EL&RR Survey A-2034. Total hole is projected at 9,200 feet.

Union Pacific Resources Corp. of Fort Worth recently posted first production reports for the No. 4 Dollye Coates "69", located about 22.1 miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's Ozona Field. Flowing 738,000-CFD on a 1.375-in. choke, the well was rated at 801,000-CFD on absolute open flow. It was drilled to a total 7,321 feet total depth and perforated for Canyon Sand Formation pay, 6,774 to 6,922 feet into the wellbore.

The same operator has scheduled a recompletion bid for extended well life at the No. 1RH E. J. Jones about 28 miles south of Ozona in Crockett County's Massie Field. Location is a 321-acre lease in the G H & S A Survey A-4707. Strawn formation pay will be the target at a depth of approximately 11,700 feet.

Location has been staked for the No. 23 Joe Tom Davidson, Jr. "E" about eight miles south of Ozona in Crockett County's Davidson Ranch Field. Harrison Interests LTD of Houston is the operator. Carrying permit for 9,250 feet total depth, the venture is located in a 673-acre lease in the G C & S F Survey A-2403.

The No. 25 Joe Tom Davidson, Jr. "E" is scheduled for spudding about eight miles south of Ozona in Crockett County's Davidson Ranch Field. Harrison Interests LTD of Houston is the operator. Location is a 673-acre lease in the G C & S F Survey A-2403. The venture is under permit for 9,300 feet of hole.

Midland-based Rencova Oil Co. has filed for permit to drill the No. 1 University "11" about 13 miles northwest of Iraan in Crockett County's Crockett Field. Drillsite is a 160-acre lease in an unlisted survey. Authority has been granted for 1,750 feet total depth.

Sonat Exploration Co. recently completed the No. 2504 E. J. Baggett about 11 miles south-southeast of Ozona in Crockett County's Hunt-Baggett Field. The developmental well flowed 1,003,140-CFD on a 1.375-in. choke and was rated at 1,677,300-CFD on absolute open flow. It was drilled to a total of 9,470 feet and perforated for Strawn formation pay, 9,136 to 9,302 feet into the hole.

The No. 4 Crystelle Childress "4D" has been brought on line about 14.4 miles from Ozona in Crockett County's Ozona Field. Union Pacific Resources Corp. of Fort Worth is the operator. Flowing 184,000-CFD on a 1.125-in. choke, the well was rated at 197,000-CFD on absolute open flow. It was bottomed at 6,900 feet and will produce from a Canyon Sand Formation interval, 6,490 to 6,510 feet into the hole.

J. Cleo Thompson of Dallas has filed for permit to drill a trio of new pool wildcats about between 13 and 15 miles northwest of Ozona near Crockett County's University 31 Field. They have been designated the No. 1 University 31-11W, No. 1 University 31-20W and No. 1 University 31-17E. Location is a 320-acre lease in an unlisted survey. The wells are under permit for 1,200 feet maximum hole.

Arco Permian Co. has posted first production reports for the No. 1 Meadows Ranch "2", about five miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's Southwest Ozona Field. The new gasser flowed 999,000-CFD on a 2-in. choke and was rated at 3,020,000-CFD on absolute open flow. Drilled to a total of 8,150 feet, it will produce from Strawn formation performances, 7,940 to 7,960 feet into the wellbore.
