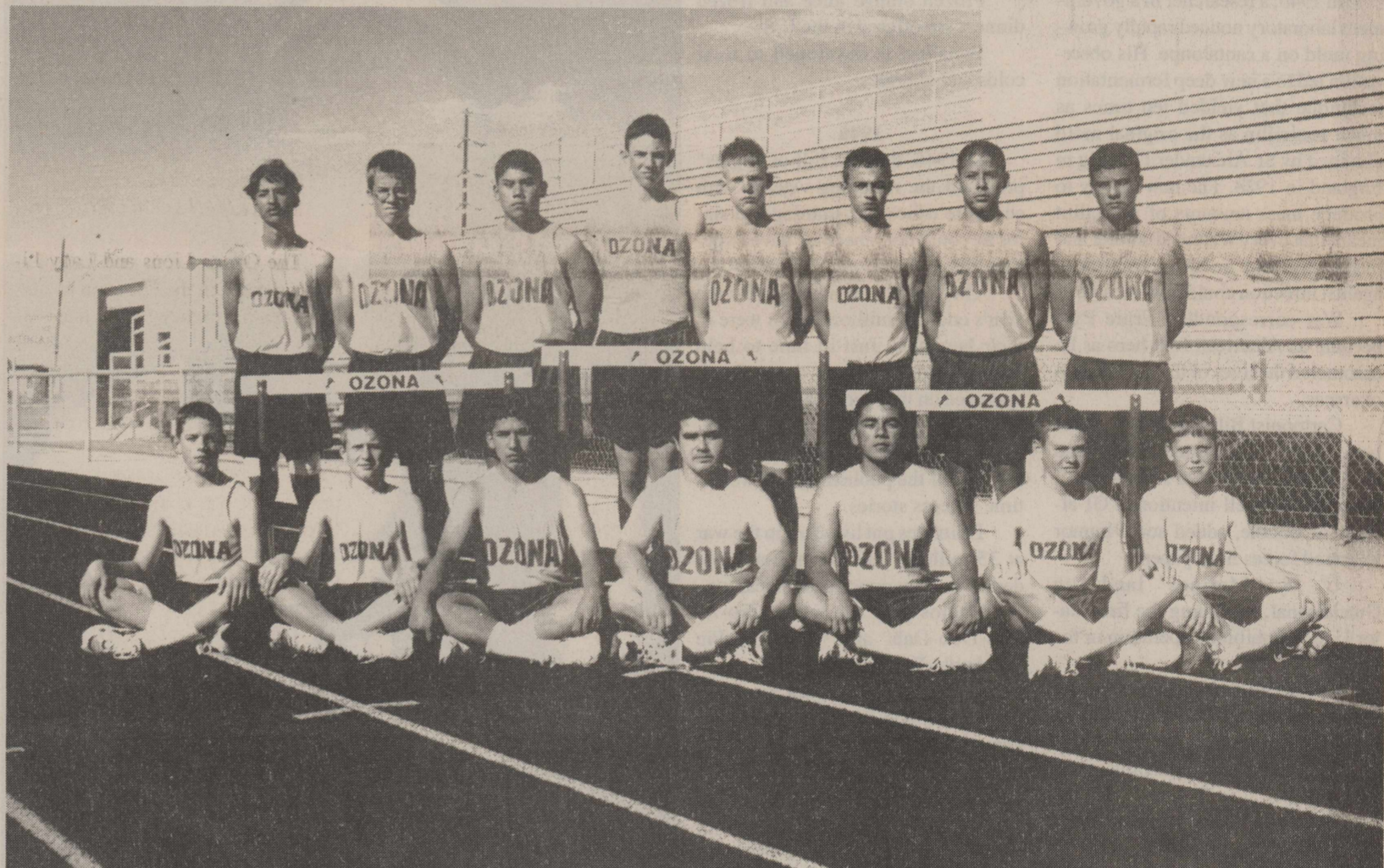
Three Ozona High School students made the 2A Region 1 Second Team of the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches Roundball Roundup.

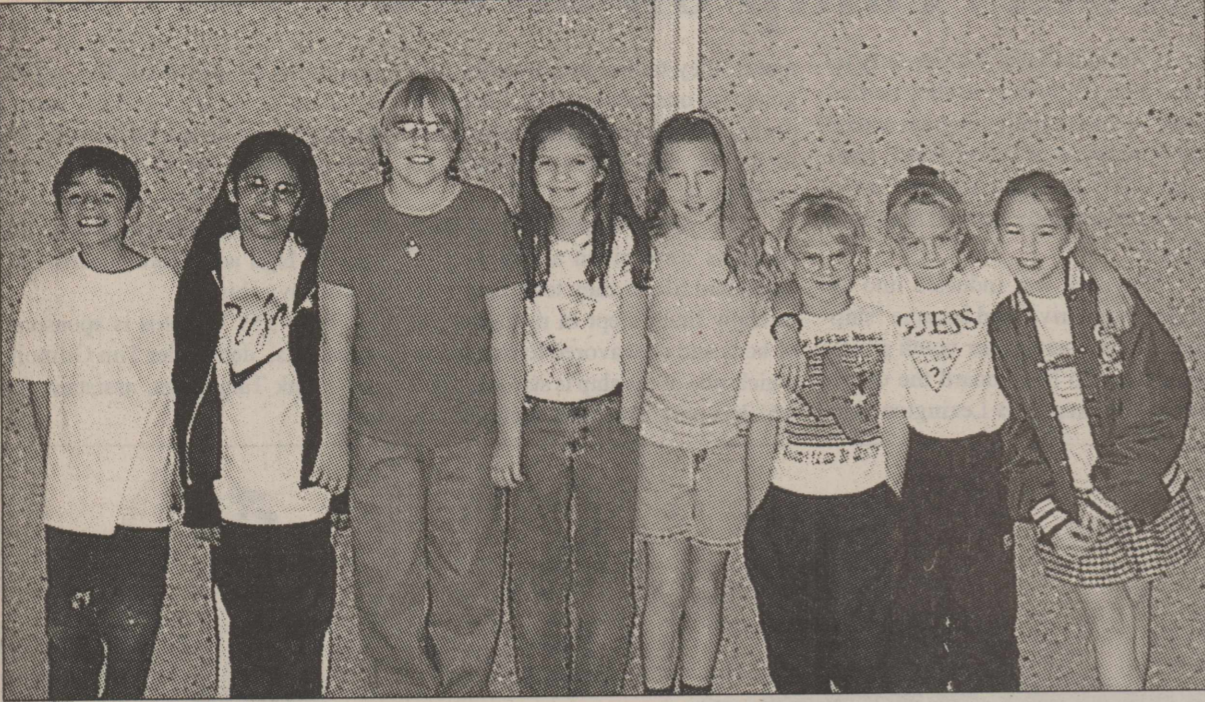

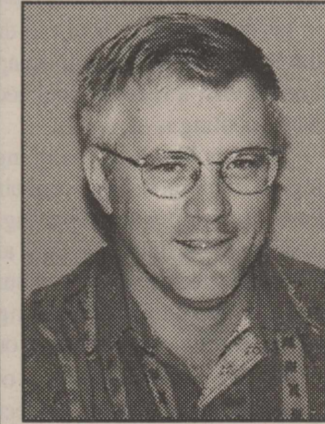

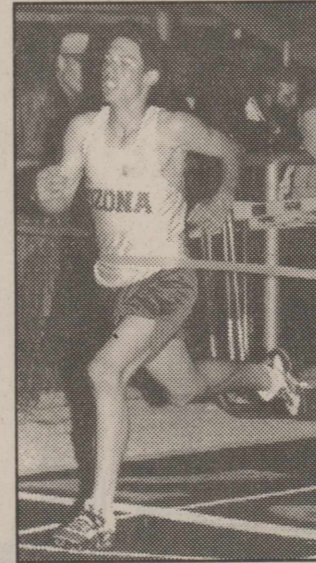
