## Grass fire burns 10,000 acres

The catalytic converter on a pickup is believed to have started a grass fire that burned some 10,000 acres of rangeland last weekend in Schleicher County. The fire started Saturday 12 miles west of Eldorado on the H. G. "Buddy" White Ranch. Firemen from Eldorado, Sonora, Ozona, Big Lake and Barnhart worked to extinguish the fire, which was near the Schleicher-Crockett county line.

In addition to the 31 fire vehicles which responded, two Blackhawk helicopters dumped water on the fire, a DPS safety scout plane was in the air and The Texas Forest Service was also represented. Firemen were out again on Sunday and Monday in response to rekindles of the same fire, which spread onto the Oglesby and Mertz 09 ranches Saturday. The fire cut a path

five miles long and two miles wide near Hwy. 190, killing unknown numbers of livestock and wildlife. Crockett County sent four trucks, one tanker, three county water trucks and 16 firefighters Saturday. Sunday's rekindle drew two Crockett County trucks, one tanker and eight firefighters. No statistics were available for the Monday afternoon call out.

## School enrollment continues to decline

First day enrollment in Ozona's schools last week showed a decrease of 69 students with the largest drop in the intermediate school. Total enrollment was 892, down 69 from the 961 first day enrollment of 1998. Ozona Primary enrollment this year is 214, a decrease of 20 from the 234 in 1998. The intermediate total was 187, down 29 from 216 in

1998. At the middle school level, there are 202 students compared to 216 last year. High school enrollment is 289, down only six from the 295 of 1998. Enrollment by grades is as follows: Pre-K - 24, Kinder - 57, 1st - 66, 2nd - 67, 3rd - 52, 4th - 64, 5th - 71, 6th - 65, 7th - 67, 8th - 70, 9th - 74, 10th - 67, 11th - 57, 12th - 91.

## Crockett County DeerFest enters 12th year

### Leta Powell celebrates 90th birthday

Miss Leta Powell was honored on her 90th birthday Aug. 11 with a party hosted by family members in the Crockett Room. Many friends and relatives came by to extend birthday greetings and to enjoy the afternoon of visiting and partaking of refreshments.

Leta Irene Powell was born Aug. 11, 1909, in Izora, Lampasas County, Texas, to Richard Fisher Powell and Katherine Narsisus (Schrimsher) Powell. She began school in Lampasas and moved to Gatesville where she attended second grade.

The family moved to Ozona in January of 1919. After graduation from Ozona High School in 1927, Miss Powell attended Simmons University (now Hardin-Simmons) in Abilene for a year. She returned to Ozona and worked as a bookkeeper for her father in the Ozona Tire and Battery Shop.

In January 1929, Miss Powell started work as deputy clerk for County Clerk George Russell, beginning a career which lasted 50 years. Upon Mr. Russell's death in the flood of 1954, she was appointed clerk and elected to the office in the general election that year. She was re-elected every four years thereafter, never drawing an opponent.

The late Claude Denham gathered much of the information for his history of Crockett County from her office, Miss Powell remembers. She recalls the arrival of the county's first photostat machine in her office. "Everyone wanted to see how it operated," she said. Although it took two people to operate it, the equipment was a great

improvement over the hours and hours of typing required before the photostat machine.

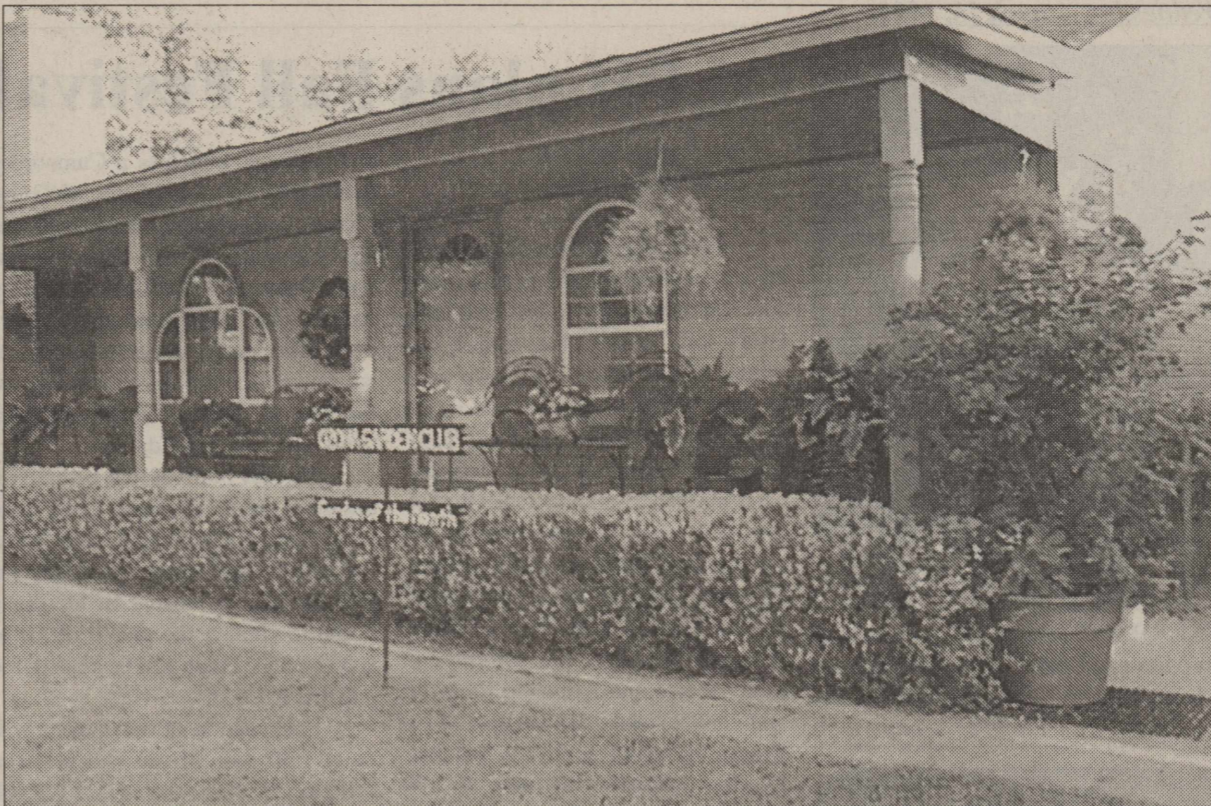
During her 50 years in office, Miss Powell recorded many real estate transactions, births and deaths and issued many marriage licenses. The marriage license information was kept confidential at her office until the couple announced their plans. Her office was the location for the rationing board one year during World War II and for the Selective Service.

She worked under Judge C. E. Davidson and Judge Houston Smith and numerous commissioners. "All through the years I've enjoyed working with every one and tried to be a good county clerk," said Miss Powell.

For several years during her tenure in the clerk's office, she was a partner with the late Jim Dudley in the Ozona Audit Co., continuing her business association with him even after her retirement from office. She was secretary for the late Marshall Montgomery, Ozona rancher and oilman, until her retirement in January 1998.

Miss Powell is a member of First Baptist Church where she taught Sunday School in the primary department for several years. She is a longtime member of the Ruth Sunday School Class and the Canasta Club. She is a former active member and officer of the Eastern Star of Ozona.

Among those gathering to honor her on her birthday were her sister and brother-in-law, Luetta and Oscar Kost of Ozona and brother and sister-in-law, E. F. (Fish) and Louise Powell of Fort Stockton.

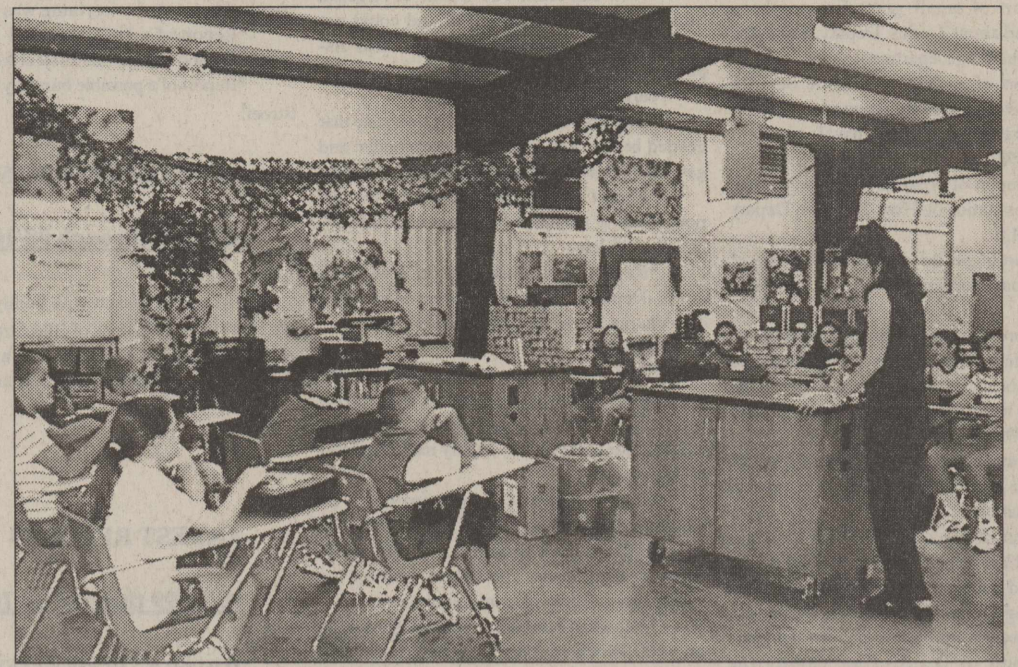
