#### Tobar indicted, again

County Commissioner charged with retaliation

A Crockett County Grand Jury has handed up a fifth indictment on a local county

Alfredo M. Tobar was indicted on the charge of retaliation on Jan. 31. He was arrested and formerly charged on Feb. 5 at the Crockett County Jail.

Tobar has been released on bond. His bond for this charge was set at \$25,000 by District Judge Dick Alcala of El Paso.

The charge is a third-degree felony, which carries a punishment of 2-10 years in prison and up to a \$10,000 fine, according

to the Texas Penal Code. Tobar, 50, allegedly tried to harm or threaten Texas Ranger Brooks Long by making a false report with the Texas Structural Pest Control Board stating that Long was operating his spraying business, Amigo Chemical Control Inc., without a proper license, according to court doc-

The false report stems from an incident in which Tobar allegedly presented himself as an official of authority to employees of Amigo Chemical Control Inc., and required employee Jose Antonio Rivera to surrender his social security number, court documents state. Tobar then allegedly photographed Rivera's social security card.

Tobar also allegedly impersonated an inspector of the Texas Department of Agriculture and obtained a sample of chemicals from Rivera, court documents state.

Tobar was arrested on those charges in May and indicted in September for fraudulent use or possession of identifying information and on two counts of impersonating a public servant.

In February 2007, Tobar was indicted on two counts of obstruction and two counts of unlawful restraint.

Those indictments stem from an automobile accident in which Tobar's son, Timothy Joe Tobar, 27, was allegedly intoxicated and caused injury to two other teenagers involved.

Alfredo Tobar allegedly restrained Nick Perez and Lyndsie Crawford from receiving medical attention and tried to prevent the two teenagers from serving as prospective

Tobar currently serves as commissioner of precinct 4.

Tobar's attendance at Monday's commissioners' court meeting was the first one he has attended since November. Commissioners' court meetings are held the second Monday of each month.

According to the Texas Association of Counties, the state does not have a set number of meetings a county commissioner has to attend. Instead, meeting attendance is usually set on the local level.

Tobar can remain in office. if he chooses, until he is convicted, if he is convicted.

According to the Texas Local Government Code, the conviction of a county officer by a jury for any felony or for a misdemeanor involving official misconduct operates as an immediate removal from office of that officer.

The Right to Vote

If a voter does not have their voter registration card, they can still vote by using their:

• drivers' license or personal identification card issued by the Texas Department of Public

• a form of identification containing the voters' photograph;

· a birth certificate; U.S. citizenship papers;

• U.S. passport;

 official mail addressed to the voter, by name, from a governmental entity;

· copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the voters' name and address or any other form of identification prescribed by the secretary of

As a voter, people have the

and free from intimidation.

Once the ballots are turned in, no one looks at them until they are ready to be counted, and most ballots are run through a computer to be counted.

Also, the voter's name is not on the ballot, which helps keep the vote secret.

Voters also have:

• The right to a ballot with written instructions on how to cast the ballot.

• The right to receive up to two more ballots if a mistake is made while marking the ballot.

• The right to ask the polling place official for instructions on how to cast the ballot, but not for suggestions on who to vote for.

• The right to bring an interpreter to assist you as you qualify to vote if you do not understand the English language.

• The right to assistance while casting your ballot if you cannot write, see the ballot or understand the language in

• The right to bring written materials into the voting booth to assist you as you cast the bal-

• The right to vote at any early voting location in the county for elections conducted county-wide.

• The right to report a possible voting rights abuse to the Secretary of State or to your local election official.

• The right to cast a provisional ballot if your name does not appear on the list of registered voters, or you do not have proper identification.

AUSTIN - Higher-ups at the Texas Department of Transportation sat in front of two state Senate committees for about three hours and tried to answer questions about how the agency got to where it is, in a financial At a Feb. 4 meeting, law-

makers in a joint meeting of the Senate Finance and Transportation Committees questioned Tx-DOT Executive Director Amadeo Saenz Jr., interim chair of the Texas Transportation Commission Esperanza "Hope" Andrade and others.

The officials said TxDOT committed a \$1.1 billion bookkeeping error and scheduled more road projects than the agency could afford to fund. This resulted in road project freezes and cutbacks.

Lawmakers expressed disdain over how that could happen. They asked if this was a political stunt to push the state closer to public-private roadbuilding projects or just a case of incompetent management.

# Senate committees question **TxDOT** over finances

Sen. Tommy Williams, R- populist appeal. The Woodlands, called for an independent audit of TxDOT's financial records.

Sen. Kirk Watson, D-Austin, serves as vice chair of the Senate Committee on Transportation and Homeland Security.

"Fortunately, legislators from both parties, every region and all backgrounds, are equally fed up with TxDOT," Watson said. "Not only will there be some major reforms on tap for the next legislative session, but the Sunset Commission is reviewing the agency from top to bottom."

#### TEXAS EMERGES AS KEY IN PRIMARIES

Super Tuesday primary elections or caucuses in 24 states on Feb. 5 made U.S. Sen. John McCain of Arizona the prohibitive favorite as the Republican Party candidate for president.

Former Massachusetts Gov. Mitt Romney ended his quest for the nomination after spending more than \$35 million of his own money on the campaign.

Former Arkansas Gov. Mike Huckabee stayed in, having won five states himself on a shoestring budget.

With less than a month to go until its March 4 primaries, Texas is primed for a duel between McCain, the defense-minded war veteran, and Huckabee, the ordained Baptist minister with

At this point, neither Mc-Cain nor Huckabee has the financial means to saturate Texas media markets with advertising.

the GOP race is U.S. Rep. Ron Paul of Lake Jackson, Texas, a wild card with his Libertarian leanings and pro-life stance. His following, especially among college students and younger Texans, could draw double digits and tighten the race between McCain and Huckabee.

The Democratic presidential candidates, U.S. Sens. Barack Obama, D-Ill., and Hillary Clinton, D-N.Y., had nearly matching delegate counts after Super Tuesday and other state primaries held Feb. 6-10.

As of Feb. 11, Obama had captured 19 states and Clinton, 12. Both candidates are expected to spend time and advertising dollars in the delegate-rich Lone Star State as March 4 approaches.

The subject of building a new jail has been an ongoing discussion involving the County Judge, County Commissioners and the Sheriff for some time now. Most of the questions recently posed have been discussed along with viable solutions.

#### Is It Cost Effective?

In less than a year, April 2007-January 2008, we have spent \$102,017.82 housing prisoners out of Crockett County. Our arrest rates rise every year. More prisoners equals more cost and the rates Upton and Reagan County charge us is sure to increase in the future as well.

#### Where would a jail be built and would land have to be purchased?

The land behind the current jail has been assessed by an architect to be suitable for the project being discussed. It is land the county already owns and it's proximity to the courthouse and annex is important

#### What size facility is being considered?

At my request, a needs assessment was conducted by the Texas Commission on Jail Standards. It was determined that a 48 bed jail would meet our needs for the next 20 years. The jail would be designed to allow for future expansion as well.

#### How much will it cost and how long will it take to pay for it?

Contractors must be approved by the Jail Commission and cost is based on the number of beds to be in the jail, in our case, 48. At present construction costs, it is projected to cost about \$4 million to build a new jail. Using funds within the county budget and holding a bond election have been discussed. Length of time to pay for a new jail would depend on which of these is chosen. These are decisions to be made by Commissioners Court.

#### How soon would construction begin?

No time table has been set. Whether to build a jail, who will build it, and how to manage the cost are currently in the planning stage only. No one is trying to rush into a project of this magnitude.

#### What are our options?

The only option we have is to house inmates out-of-county which is what we are currently doing. As set by the Jail Commission, we are only allowed to house 13 inmates locally. On average we run about 17-20 inmates over this amount. As a result, we must transport these inmates to Upton and Reagan County.

Crockett County needs a Sheriff who has current knowledge of State Jail Commission Standards and requirements. We need a Sheriff who has working knowledge of a jail. I've been a Jailer, Deputy, and as Sheriff, a Jail Administrator. I have worked with the Jail Commission to ensure we can continue to operate our current jail, I have reported to the County Commissioners accurate facts and figures concerning the status and condition of the jail, and I will continue to work with them in whatever decision they make concerning the future of our jail.

#### ORDER RESTRICTING **OUTDOOR BURNING**

The Commissioners' Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners' Court of Crockett County, Texas, that outdoor burning is restricted in Crockett County for 30 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code 352.081, and other applicable statues. This Order does NOT prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural Resources Commission for: (1) firefighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or (4) burns that are conducted by an approved Prescribed Burning Association, National Resource Conservation Service, the and/or Texas A&M Agricultural Experiment Station, or presscribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code.

All burns shall be reported to the Crockett County Sheriff's Office (325) 392-2661 and the Fire Chief (325) 392-2626 prior to commencing, together with the name of the landowner, location involved and expert to be on hand.

This Order does NOT prohibit outdoor cooking in a properly contained area which is attended at all times.

In accordance with the Local Government Code 352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.




