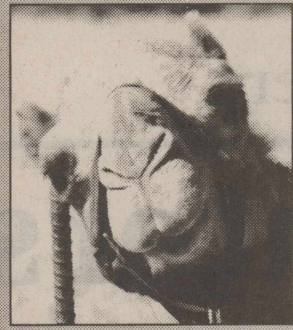
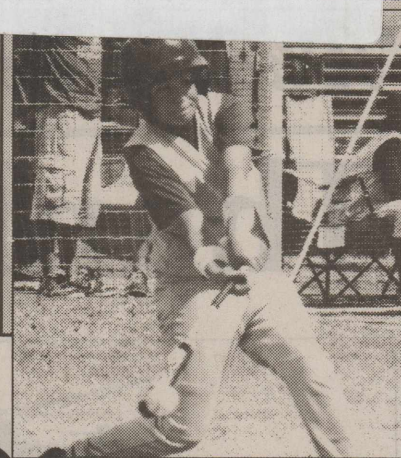

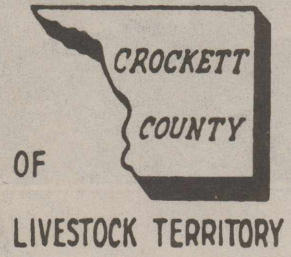

## Parent complains about inconsistencies of school cell phone policy

*Lack of enforcement, no documentation kept on students in violation of the district's rules*

A cell phone policy where students are not punished the same and documentation is not taken where the main concerns of one parent during the Crockett County CCSD Board of Trustees monthly meeting on June 18.

Jill Koerth spoke to the board in open forum about the district's cell phone policy. Koerth, who is also a teacher with the district, said she was at the board meeting as a concerned parent about the problems found in the policy.

The district's cell phone policy states that for safety purposes, the district permits students to possess cell phones; however, cell phones must remain turned off during the instructional day, including during all testing. The use of cell phones in locker rooms or restroom areas at any time, while at school, or at a school-related or school-sponsored event is strictly prohibited.

Generally, students that display cell phones or have them turned on while on school property before the end of the school day will be required to pay a charge of \$5 for the first offense before the phone will be returned.

On the second offense, the student will be required to pay a charge of \$5 before the phone will be returned and the student will be assigned to In-School Suspension (ISS) for one day.

On the third, and all subsequent offenses, the student will be required to pay a charge \$10 before the phone will be returned and the student will be assigned to ISS for three days.

Koerth said after talking with several students, mainly at the high school, she found the policy is being inconsistently enforced, which is confusing to students and parents.

The inconsistency of the policy has caused Koerth's daughter a spot on the varsity cheerleading squad, due to her daughter being caught with her cell phone three times and then sent to ISS.

"We believe it was a judgment made in error," Koerth said. "There is erratic enforcement from the different teachers at the high school."

Koerth said the policy is carried

out by the total discretion of each teacher. Some teachers dismiss the policy and allow students to use their cell phones in class. Other teachers take the phones up at the beginning of class and then give them back to the students at the end of class.

A third group of teachers do enforce the policy, but this is a small percentage, Koerth said.

"A policy not being enforced without fail and not fairly enforced, will always lead to inconsistencies," Koerth said. "This can be confusing to students."

Another problem with the policy is that no documentation or record-keeping is done when a student violates the policy, Koerth said.

Koerth also said she has received a letter from a district official stating that documentation was not kept on students violating the policy.

"If this is a policy with serious consequences, it would seem important enough that records would be kept on these offensives," she said.

Only two students were sent to ISS this year for violating the policy, including Koerth's daughter. However, Koerth said her daughter was the only one sent for three days.

Koerth also said violating the cell phone policy carries more weight than violating the district's drug-testing policy, when it comes to being a varsity cheerleader.

A student has a chance to be reinstated if they violate the drug-testing policy, but not if they violate the cell phone policy, she said.

Koerth said she is going through the district's grievance and complaint policy to have the policy amended in her daughter's case.

"We have a cell phone policy that carries with it serious consequences, so why is there no official record kept on this and why is the policy not carried out the same way for every student?" she said.

Since no item on the agenda pertained to the cell phone policy, the board could not comment on

Koerth's statements, according to the Texas Open Meetings Act.

### NEW TEACHERS HIRED AND REASSIGNMENTS

In his superintendent's report, Abe Gott said several new teachers have been hired.

Linda Thompson will replace Glenda Effinger at the high school; Corby Weeakes will be the new Athletic Trainer; Cody Watkins will be the new high school agriculture teacher, Debra Fred as a fifth grade teacher and Myranda Stokes will be the new middle school computer teacher.

Stokes replaces Keith Harmsen who was promoted to technology director.

Tonya Poindexter has been re-assigned to ESL teacher for grades 1-5 and district testing coordinator.

Koerth and Nikki Harrison have been reassigned to the middle school. Koerth will be teaching sixth grade math and Harrison will be teaching seventh grade math.

### BID APPROVALS

The board approved a \$50,260 bid from Texas Rock-N-Stone for the rock for new fencing at Lion Stadium. Board member Tom Anderson voted against the motion.

A bid from T&C Wholesale was approved for gasoline products, and bids from Alamo Tees & Advertising, Alert Services Inc., Athletes World, Athletic Supply Inc., Big Country Athletics, BSN Sports.com, Cleveland Athletics, Got To Specialties, GTM Sportswear, MD Sales Co, Medco Sports Medicine and M-F Athletic Company were approved for athletic supplies.

### OTHER AGENDA ITEMS APPROVED

- Budget amendment of \$11,000 for gasoline, oil and other fuels for vehicles.

- Veronica Fierro was appointed as official delegate for the Texas Association of School Board annual convention Sept. 25-26 in Dallas.

- Changes to TASB board policy update 83.

The next regular board meeting will be at 6:30 p.m. July 9 at the Administration Building. The board will also have a joint meeting with the Crockett County Commissioners on July 14 and then a budget workshop on July 30.

## Methodist church welcomes new pastor

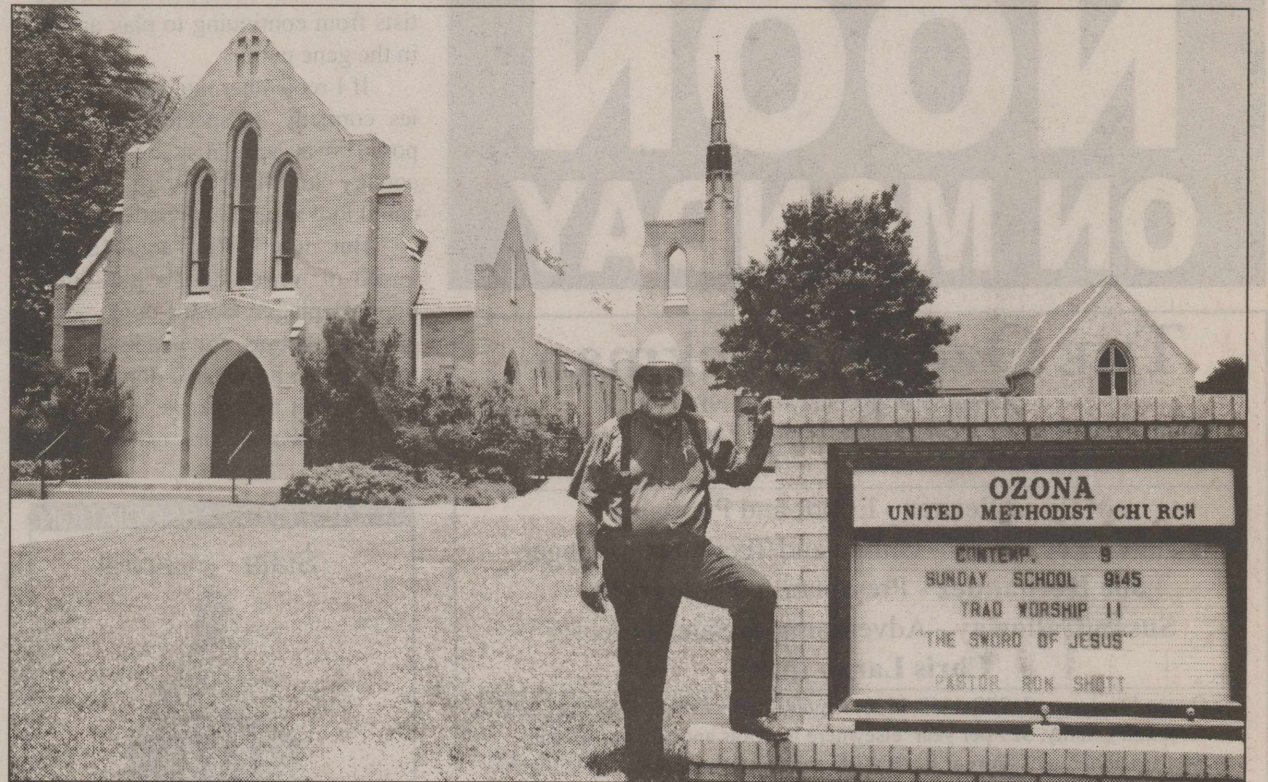

At age 12, Ron Shott though he received a call to enter the ministry, but it would take him 31 years before he answered it.

"I don't have all the answers," he said. "Sooner or later I will get a sense of why God brought me here."

While Ozona is one of the largest communities the Shotts have lived in since he started in the ministry, Shott said he will miss fishing on the Gulf Coast.

"I am open to anyone who wants to take me out on their boat," he said.

Shott said him and his wife have enjoyed the summer evenings, sitting on their front porch and watching the turkey in their yard.

"We've learned happiness come from inside," he said. "Ozona is my hometown now."
