January is School Board Recognition Month

New maintenance and transportation director hired

Governor Rick Perry has proclaimed January 2010 as School Board Recognition Month. Districts across the state will use this opportunity to show their appreciation of the critical role elected boards of education play in their local schools and communities.

"The biggest challenge of education is also one of its greatest strengths. During a time when state and national mandates rightly place more emphasis than ever on setting the bar high for education, it remains important for each community to retain control of its own educational system," Perry said.

School board members will be recognized at tonight's (Jan. 20) regular meeting. The meeting will be

at 6:30 p.m. at the Administration Building.

"Today's public schools face tremendous challenges and opportunities, making the school board's role more critical than ever before," said James B. Crow, Texas Association of School Boards executive director. "Local trustees diligently work with community leaders, parents, and educators to develop sound education policies. They help set high standards in the education system, encouraging us to strive to reach those goals and better prepare the next generation of leaders in our state and nation. We encourage every community to acknowledge the commitment that board service requires of more than 7,000 locally elected school board members in Texas and sup-

port them as they tackle the enormous task of governing school districts. We applaud their dedication as they offer vision and leadership and work to empower every child to succeed," Crow said.

Also on tonight's agenda, the board will meet in executive/closed session to discuss personnel matters, including maintenance and transportation director and the superintendent's annual evaluation.

Superintendent Chris duBois has hired John Kain as the new maintenance and transportation director. Kain comes to Ozona with 12 years experience from Rock-springs ISD.

Kain is expected to begin no later than Feb. 1, duBois said.

On the superintendent's

evaluation, the board met last week during two called meetings for training on conducting the evaluation.

Items the board could discuss during duBois' evaluation include goals and priorities, his job description, his performance, campus and district performance and management.

Slick roadways caused two FedEx trucks to collide early Friday morning on Interstate-10.

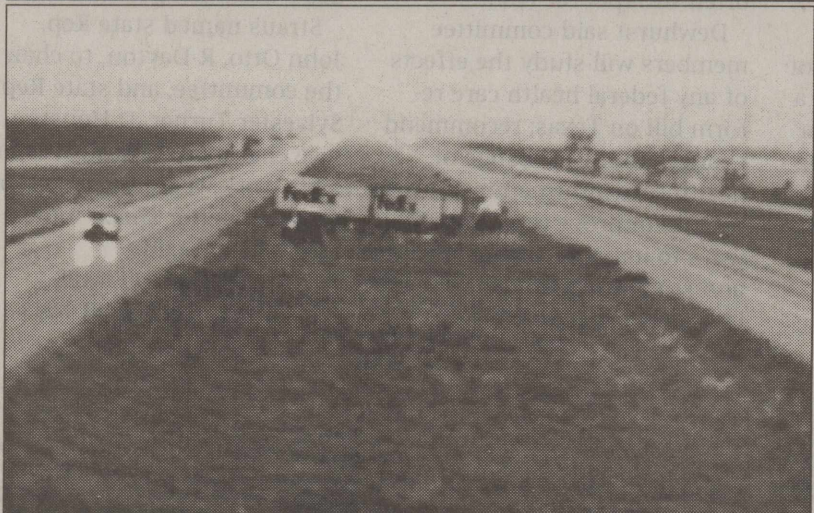
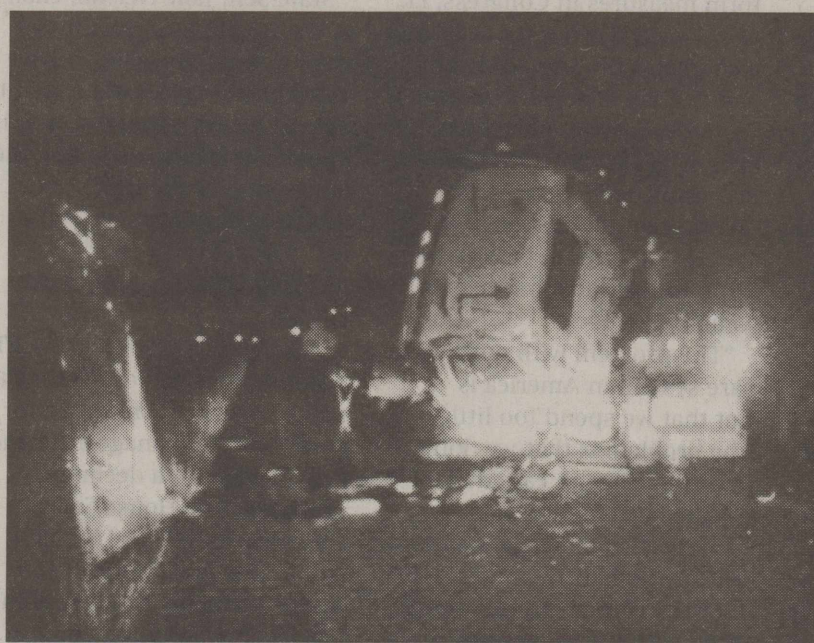
Around 3:30 a.m., local emergency officials received a call of a two 18-wheeler rollover with drivers trapped or missing.

When emergency officials arrived on scene, they found one FedEx truck had rolled over and was blocking the east bound lanes of traffic, according to the Ozona Volunteer Fire Department.

The second truck had damage to its front and both drivers were inside the second truck.

Both drivers were taken by Crockett County Ambulance to the Family Health Center of Ozona.

Firefighters worked traffic until officials from the Texas Department of Transportation arrived.

Ozona Woman's League raises \$8,130 in Rehab Telethon

Members of Ozona Woman's League raised \$8,130 for the West Texas Rehab Center during their 40th annual Telethon Saturday night.

The annual telethon and auction raised a grand total of \$1.2 million, which goes down in history as one of the top three years for donations. The money came from the telethon and online auction.

In 40 years, West Texas Rehab has raised over \$32 million to help pay for services for people who could otherwise not afford them.

For the past three years, Ozona Woman's League has raised more than \$30,000 for the Rehab. Money raised by Ozona Woman's League goes directly to the Ozona Rehab Center.

Along with Ozona Woman's League, Heidi Williams, treasurer of the Crockett County DeerFest Association, presented a check for \$1,500 raised through meal tickets at the annual December event.

The West Texas Rehabilitation Center serves

more than 25,000 people, regardless of their financial circumstance. The center was established in 1953 as a private, nonprofit outpatient rehabilitation center and has become one of the largest, most comprehensive facilities of its kind in the nation.

The center operates facilities in Abilene, San Angelo and Ozona.

The Rehab 2010 telethon was broadcast on television

stations throughout Texas and parts of Oklahoma. This year, for the first time, the show was simulcast online at West Texas Rehab's Web site.

"We are so pleased. There was a tremendous outpouring to support West Texas Rehab," said Dan Huggins, the center's director of donor relations. "We were a little concerned with the economy the way it is, but we are all smiles today."

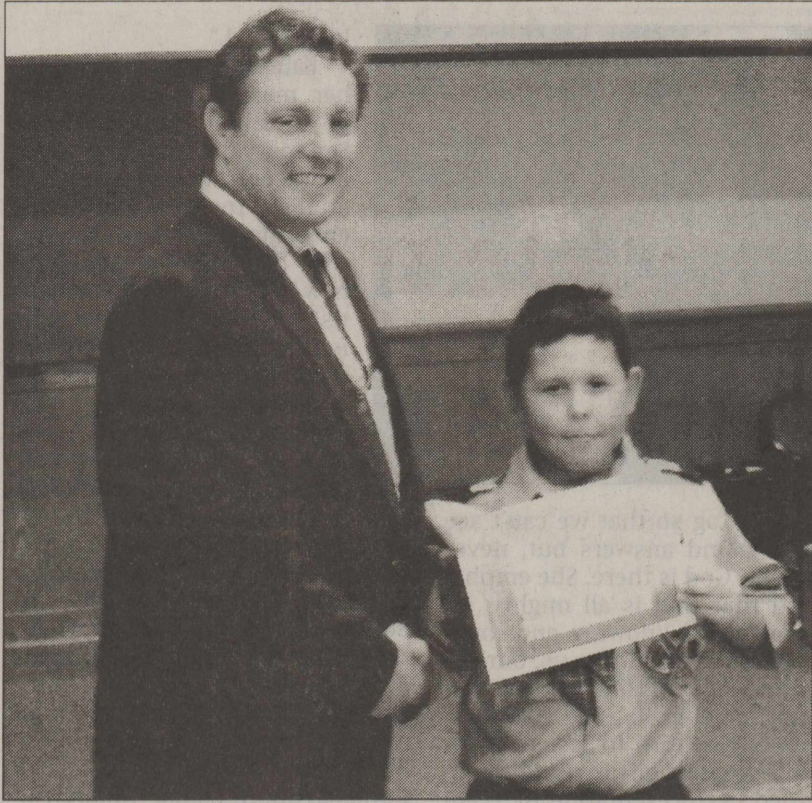
Bedford-Stuart to wed this spring

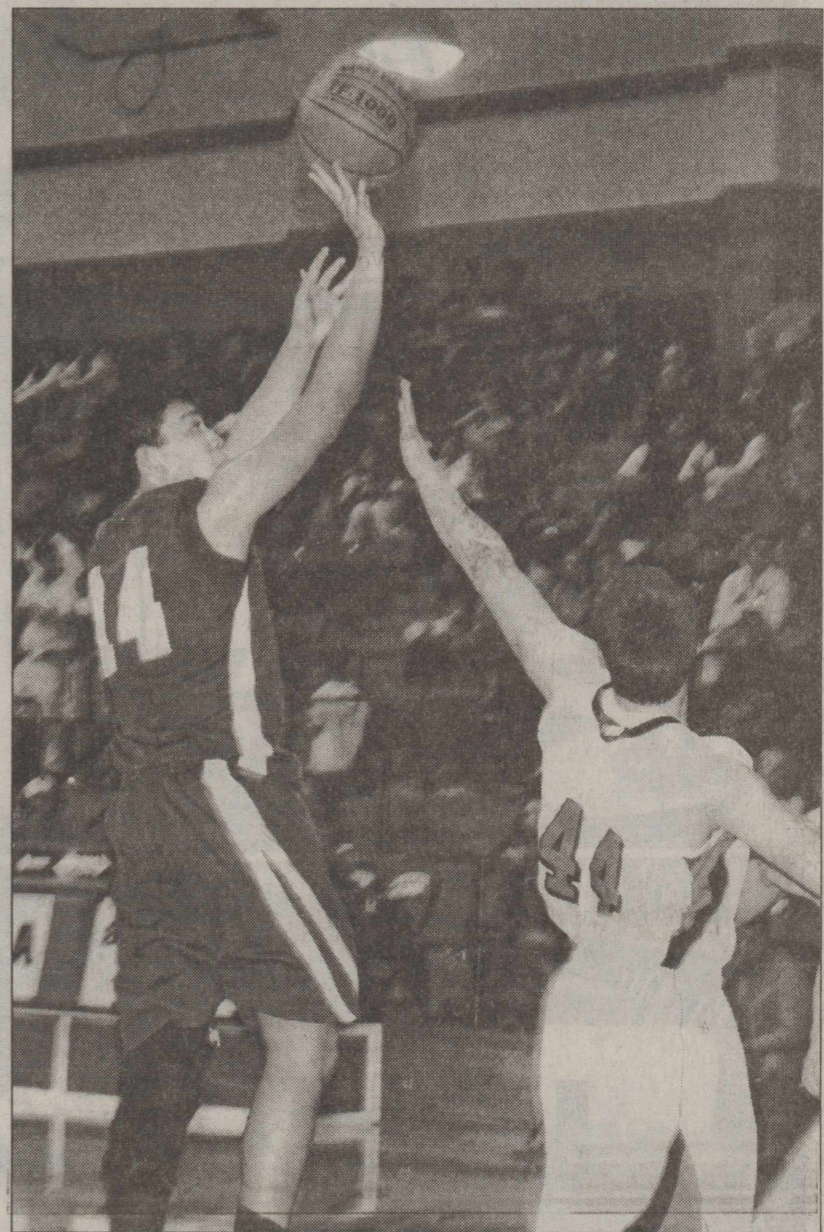
