Commissioners adopt new rules for rodeo slab events

The Crockett County Commissioners' Court approved a new Rental Contract for the Fairgrounds Park Arena Slab Area during their regular meeting Monday.

The new rules and regula-

tions state:

- Rental duration for the slab area is for four hours maximum. Slab closes at 10 p.m.
- Due to past abuses and complaints to commissioners' court - no loud music or amplifiers are permitted at the slab area.
- Cost of rental is \$25 plus

a \$75 deposit.

- No ground campfires will be allowed.
- All trash must be cleaned up by the renter(s) and deposited into trash containers provided by the county by noon the following day.
- Renter(s) agrees to take full responsibility and to make

the necessary repairs and/or compensation of all damages occurred during the time of this rental contract to the satisfaction of commissioners' court.

- This contract does not end until proper inspection has been made and reported to the county road supervisor.
- All Crockett County 4-H

and FFA events have priority over other activities and events. Rental does not include the public park or the Fair Grounds Arena. Slab area includes restrooms and concession stand only.

- Renter(s) failure to follow or comply with any rules or regulations may result in

being denied any future rental of county facility per the road department supervisor.

· Neither commissioners' court nor any individual county employee is responsible for any accidents or injuries that occur during the time of this

Lions named to All-West Texas Football Team

Six Ozona Lions have been named to the San Angelo Standard-Times Class 2A All-West Texas Football Team.

Utility Back Kobe Rodriguez
5-11, 180, Sr.

Senior Kobe Rodriguez was also named to the All-West Texas Super Team, which is comprised of players from 6A-1A.

Rodriguez didn't have the same kind of stats he had last year when he was a running back on the 2A AWT Team, but it was still a very productive senior season. He had 885 yards rushing on 115 attempts and 225 yards receiving on 19 receptions, finishing with 13 TDs.

Quarterback Alec Lara
5-5, 145, Soph.

Sophomore Quarterback Alec Lara was a dual-threat with 770 yards rushing on 124 carries, averaging 6.2 yards per carry. He also threw for 1,072 yards and accounted for 18 TDs.

Linebacker Abraham Rodriguez
5-8, 160, Soph.

The District 3-2A Division I Defensive MVP had a stellar season for the Lions as just a sophomore. He accounted for 115 tackles, six sacks and one interception.

Defensive back Sebastian De La Cruz
5-9, 155, Soph.

De La Cruz really made a name for himself as just a sophomore and opposing offenses will have to deal with

him two more years. He recorded 75 tackles, 11 pass deflections, one interception and two caused fumbles.

Defensive back Marcus Perez
5-7, 150, Jr.

Perez was a first-team selection in district. The Lions' junior defensive back turned in 36 tackles, 10 pass break-ups and one interception and was one of Ozona's top players on that side of the ball.

Punter Dario Rodriguez
6-0, 180, Jr.

Also a standout at tight end for the Lions, Rodriguez was very reliable when called on for a big punt. He finished with a 36-yard average and was a first-team selection in district.

English to sign books Tuesday at library

Former Ozona resident Ben H. English will be featured at a book signing from 5-8 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 16, at the Crockett County Public Library.

English will sign copies of his book "Yonderings: Trails and Memories of the Big Bend."

The library has copies available for purchase, or they can be purchased at Amazon.com, at tamupress.com or at Barnes & Noble.

The event is sponsored by the library and Crockett National Bank. Refreshments will be served.

In "Yonderings: Trails and Memories of the Big Bend," English writes about a time before Terlingua Ranch and chili cook-offs, and you could drive a hundred miles without seeing another vehicle or another person.

The year was 1961, and the tides of humanity which ebbed and flowed into the lower reaches of the Big Bend were at their historical nadir.

It was a vast, empty land spotted by isolated ranch headquarters, a national park with few visitors, and the many ruins of a past shrouded in legend, lore, and improbable truths. There was no television, no daytime radio, few telephones, and very few people.

Ben H. English came to the Big Bend at the age of two, the fifth of six generations of his family to call this enigmatic region home.

With his family headquartered at the old Lajitas Trading Post, he worked and lived on ranches and places

now little more than forgotten dots on yellowing maps. He attended the one-room schoolhouse at Terlingua, prowled the banks of the Rio Grande, and crisscrossed the surrounding areas time and again on horseback and by foot.

Some 50 years later he writes about those many decades ago, as well as the history and legends of this singular land he knows so well. Ben separates fact from fiction and brings the reader into a world that few these days can ever imagine, much less experience. He also writes about the lower Big Bend as it is found now, and what one can still rediscover just over the next rise.

English also served in the United States Marine Corps for seven years, taught a Criminal Justice program at Ozona High School and retired after 22 years as a trooper in the Texas Highway Patrol, serving in Ozona. He is also an honors graduate of Angelo State University with a BA in Government. Currently he lives in Alpine and writes on a variety of subjects.

Ben and his wife, Cathy, has two sons, Levi and Ethan, both of whom graduated from Ozona High School and the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis.

Food Handlers Class Jan. 17

The "Texas Food Establishment Rules (TFER)" now requires all food employees to complete an accredited food handlers training program within 60 days of employment, effective Sept. 16, 2016.

A food handlers course accredited by the Texas Department of State Health Services is being offered by Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, Crockett County.

"Food Safety: It's In Your Hands" is scheduled for Wednesday, Jan. 17, 2018 starting at 9 a.m. at the Extension office at 1301 Avenue AA.

This 1-2-hour course will now be required for all food service employees to help promote the service of safe food.

The certificate is good for 2 years and is valid anywhere in the State of Texas. The course is a basic overview of food safety practices that are necessary to ensure that safe food is served at your establishment.

Practices discussed in-

clude good personal hygiene, cross contamination, and time and temperature abuse.

To register for the course, call the extension office at (325) 392-2721.

The cost is \$20 per person (check or money order only) and must be paid in full before the course begins.

Those unable to attend the in-person class may also take the course online at foodsafety.tamu.edu for a \$15 fee.

Individual with disabilities who require auxiliary aide service or accommodation in order to participate in the event are encouraged to contact our office within 5 working days prior to the program.

Educational programs of Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service are open to all people without regard to race, color, sex, disability, religion, age, national origin or genetic information or veteran status.

The class is taught in English but Spanish handouts are available.
