## CCCCSD asking voters to move funds

To the Voters of Crockett County, as the Nov. 6 General Election approaches, I would like to remind voters that CCCCSD has a Bond on the ballot.

As with all School Bonds, the CCCCSD Board of Trustees has consulted with Region 15 ESC and Financial Analyst Christian Merritt.

As a result of this research and advice, our Board asked Crockett County Commissioners to consider and approve placing a Bond on the November Ballot, and they did.

The CCCCSD Board and Crockett County Commissioners Court are asking voters to

decide whether or not to approve the November 2018 Bond.

The wording on the ballot will read:

"THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,895,000 OF BONDS FOR THE REFUNDING OF ALL OR ANY PORTION OF THE DISTRICT'S MAINTENANCE TAX NOTES, TAXABLE SERIES 2011 AND THE LEVYING OF THE

TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF"

Basically we are asking the voters to "Refinance", or Refund CCCCSD debt that is currently on the M&O, or Daily Operations Budget, to the I&S Bond side. This allows debt to be paid off early with no increase in the current tax rate.

## Laurie English named Prosecutor of the Year

On Sept. 19, Laurie English, 112th District Attorney, received the State Bar Prosecutor of the Year Award at the annual conference for the Texas District and County Attorneys' Association.

TDCAA states that "The award is given annually to a prosecutor who demonstrates outstanding service to the criminal justice system by improving the quality of justice through their leadership and/or efforts to shape public policy."

According to the award criteria, it is reserved for prosecutors who have demonstrated a devotion to the profession and who aspire to be a true example of a 'minister of justice'."

Prosecutor of the year is selected from nominations submitted to the TDCAA board, which votes on the nomination and then sends it to the State Bar Criminal Justice Section for approval.

English began serving as 112th District Attorney on Jan. 1, 2005, and is currently in her fourth term, serving the West Texas counties of Crockett, Pecos, Reagan, Sutton, and Upton.

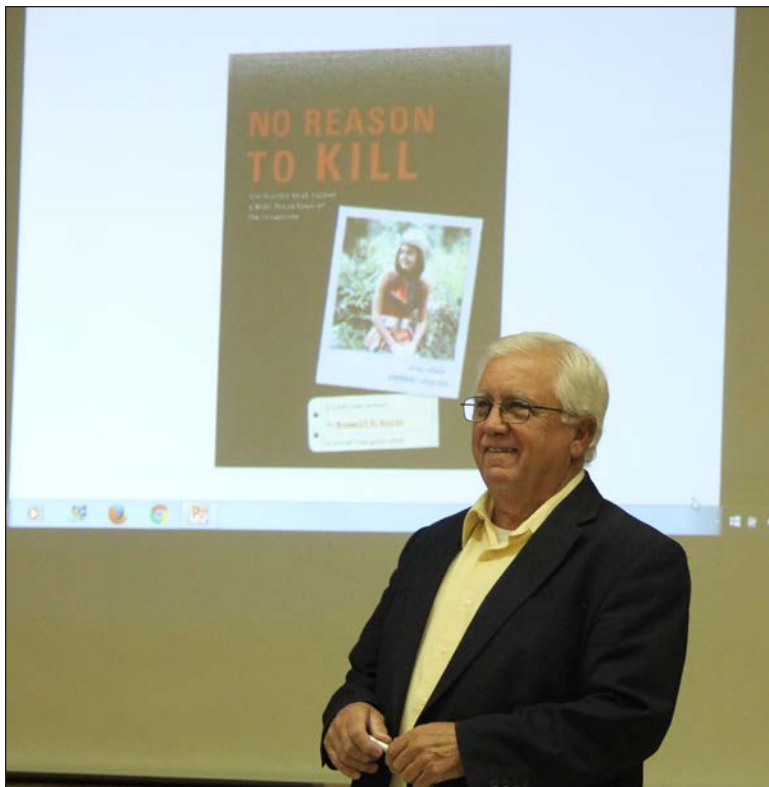

# Reasons for obesity - a big fat lie?

How do you feel about fat? What are your first thoughts when see an obese person? Do you assume they eat continuously, are lazy, and live a sedentary lifestyle? Are you quietly or vocally critical of family members and significant others about their weight issues? Are you over weight and suffer self-judgement, guilt, or shame?

problems, but this doesn't mean obesity CAUSES those problems." ... as Dr. John Schoonbee writes: "even though umbrellas are strongly associated with rain, they do not cause rain!" Science has shown, and we now understand that obesity is usually an external symptom of any number of metabolic disorders stemming from Carbohydrate Intolerance (CI), but more specifically, Insulin Resistance (IR).

IR affects more than 50 percent of Americans, and most don't realize it, because most physicians don't test for it.

In people with IR, insulin levels tend to run high.

When insulin is low, our bodies will burn stored fat for energy; but, when insulin is high, our bodies will store unused calories, even from fat-free food, as body fat.

We tend to think of insulin as a simple blood sugar regulator, but insulin is a "master growth hormone" that controls the metabolism of nearly every cell in the body.

IR is known as a "silent metabolic killer" because the problems with insulin signaling can have profound effects not only on our fat tissue but on every organ from the heart to the brain and beyond.

Dr. Ede explains, "Insulin resistance is primarily the result of years of eating ultra-processed foods loaded with refined carbohydrates and vegetable oils that our bodies simply aren't designed to handle: sugar, flour, fruit juice, cereal, and foods made with soybean oil and other unnatural fats. Unfortunately, for complicated political reasons, many of these same products are officially recommended in our U.S. Dietary Guidelines, so we've been taught to include them in a healthy diet. These modern non-foods, which have only been widely available to human beings for a handful of decades, contribute to unnaturally high insulin levels,

oxidation, and inflammation, which slowly destroy cells from the inside out."

While IR is an enduring problem requiring permanent management, it is preventable and treatable if you understand its root causes.

Dr. Jason Fung, author of The Diabetes Code, advises, "...there are many ways to lose weight, many of them are unsustainable because they involve a degree of superhuman discipline not required by metabolically healthy people—excessive exercise, severe caloric restriction, or extreme avoidance of dietary fat. These draconian strategies can also worsen underlying metabolic and psychological damage, making it increasingly more difficult to lose weight with each attempt (Fung 2016: Greystone)."

As you may see from the excerpts above, there is a multitude of information on this subject that would require the average person several weeks of study.

My philosophy on this issue is the same as most others, "be the change you would like to see in the world."

You may not be able to change your feelings, but you can practice changing your thoughts.

Next time you see a person with obesity, whether it's on the street or in the mirror, just remember that obesity is a devastating, enduring, metabolic disorder caused by several generations of a worldwide food science experiment interpreted erroneously and gone totally wrong.

While science continues to ferret out the truth about obesity and more clinicians adopt new ways of addressing its root causes, stay focused on your wellbeing.

It's your health and your life, and it deserves your full attention and advocacy.

## Commissioners approve veteran's organization conducting community outreach program at Rodeo Park

The Crockett County Commissioners' Court approved a community outreach project by a veteran's organization during Monday's regular meeting.

The Concho Valley Military Veteran Peer Network submitted a letter to the commissioners asking if the organization could adopt the Rodeo Park by providing a quarterly clean up, where volunteers would clean up trash and an annual to semi-annual touch up of rust or chipped paint.

"The end goal of this is outreach for MVPN, but more importantly, an opportunity for veterans to give back to the community and potentially reach veterans in need," said Paul Keeton, Concho Valley MVPN Peer Service Coordinator, in the letter. "Since I have come onboard as the Peer Service Coordinator, it has been one of my goals to increase the amount of involvement in rural communities."

Commissioner Frank Tambunga said the group won't be using county equipment they will be in contact with him.

### WELLNESS CENTER

Wellness Center Director Stormi Oglesby said the center is working on becoming a facility location for Blue Cross Blue Shield Silver Sneakers and Well On Target Programs. By doing this, members who have health insurance may be able to have their memberships discounted or covered, depending on age, through the insurance.

Oglesby said the center would still receive money for

those memberships, but it would be based on how many times that person attended the center and not a monthly fee.

Oglesby said she has to attend some training to learn more about how the program works.

The center currently has 312 active members.

The commissioners also approved a \$35,000 bid from Champion Irrigation, of San Angelo, to landscape the wellness center.

# Lions can't catch Cranes

CRANE - The Ozona Lions are looking to re-group as they start district play this after a 42-14 loss against Crane on Oct. 5.

"Overall, we just did not have a good game against Crane. They were much bigger and did a good job of taking advantage of the size and numbers advantage," said Head Coach Kyle Freeman.

In the first half of Friday's game at El Ave Stadium, the Lions were matching Crane touchdown for touchdown, but the Golden Cranes, led by Running Back Brandon Cerna, broke through in the second half scoring 21 unanswered points. Cerna had three touchdowns for the Golden Cranes.

Crane (5-2) rushed for 423 yards of their 458 yards of total offense, compared to the Lions 142 rushing yards.

Both the Lions touchdowns came from Junior Running Back Abraham

Rodriguez, whose second touchdown was on a 60-yard run to tie the game 14-14 in the second quarter right after a Crane score. Rodriguez rushed for 108 yards on 13 carries.

Senior Quarterback Marcus Perez rushed for 44 yards on 8 carries.

Ozona (1-4) will start district play next week facing Stamford (5-1). The Bulldogs were ranked number 9 in the state until Clyde (2-3) pulled the upset 21-13 win Friday night.

Up until Clyde, Stamford had been beating its opponents by 30-40 points, including a 90-62 win over DeLeon on Sept. 28 where Senior Quarterback Peyton Bevel broke the state records for passing touchdowns with 12 during the game and passing yardage of 789.

Clyde managed to hold Bevel to 277 passing yards and only two touchdowns with 23 completions on 41 attempts.

The last time Ozona faced the Bulldogs was in 2015 in the first round of playoffs, where the Lions were unsuccessful.

Kickoff is 7:30 p.m. Friday, Oct. 12, at Lion Stadium.

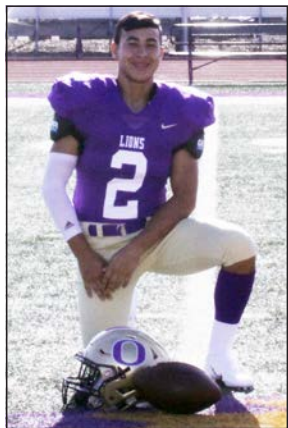

**WHAT QUALIFIES YOU FOR THE POSITION YOU ARE RUNNING FOR?**

I believe that my experience as a business owner, board member, and entrepreneur have prepared me for this position. While being a business owner and board member, I have assisted in the management of budgets for both profit and nonprofit organizations.

I have always used conservative judgement when making decisions for these organizations and if elected I will use this same judgement when evaluating the budget for Crockett County.

I am currently serving on the Crockett County Appraisal District Agricultural Advisory Board, Crockett County Predator Control Board, Ozona Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, Ozona Chamber of Commerce Executive Committee as the Vice President, Ozona National Bank Board of Directors and the ONB Bancshares Inc. Board of Directors.

I have previously served on the Crockett County Deerfest Association Board, Ozona Country Club Board of Directors, and the Ozona United Methodist Church Board of Trustees.

Having the opportunity to serve on these boards of directors within the community has provided me with an inordinate understanding of the fundamentals of our community.

Each of my tenures in these organizations has also provided me with a different set of experiences and lessons that I feel would be beneficial to the county and the commissioner's court.

adherence to all State requirements for public notification, preparing agendas and Director materials and compiling monthly reports; develop, maintain, and update the District Management Plan in accordance with state law and requirements; review and revise District Rules, policies, and procedures, as warranted, to respond to evolving District objective and needs; manage and coordinate electoral process for board members; develop and maintain cooperative relationships and working partnerships with local, state and federal agencies, private consultants, constituents, and affiliated organizations with common interests; develop and maintain strong relationships with legislative offices and work cooperatively with elected and appointed officials at all levels of government; participate in the joint planning process for the relevant aquifers in the District to establish and refine Desired Future Conditions that protect the local aquifer; provide oversight and supervision of employees and plan, assign, and coordinate employee responsibilities, activities, and daily job duties; develop, prepare, and maintain an accurate annual financial budget; ensure maintenance and security of financial and contractual records; oversee and manage all District expenditures and credits; serving as the primary District contact for news media, legislators, public officials and citizens, taking action as necessary for news releases, public service announcements and dissemination of District information; develop and implement educational activities and programs; develop, implement and manage a water well tracking system in compliance with District Rules and state law; conduct field work such as water level monitoring and water quality sampling throughout the county. I represent the District as a voting member of the Texas Alliance of Groundwater Districts, the West Texas Regional Groundwater Association, and the Groundwater Management Area 7.

I am currently serving on the Crockett County Appraisal District Agricultural Advisory Board. I am actively involved at First Baptist Church serving on the Properties committee, Baptismal committee and help lead our Wednesday night children's program. As a child, I would travel with my father to Mexico on mission trips. During those trips I learned how to listen, respect and appreciate diverse needs in the com-

munity. BUS GRANT IS RECEIVED

The Texas Department of Transportation announced it would receive \$7 million from the Federal Transit Administration's Buses and Bus Facilities Infrastructure Investment Program to help rural transit providers buy new buses.

In addition to bus pur-

chases, the grant money helps rural transit agencies purchase related equipment and construct bus-related facilities. The majority of Texas' rural transit districts are expected to receive funding based on replacement needs.

TxDOT deputy executive director Marc Williams said, "Providing newer buses to our rural transit providers means providing more efficient travel for Texans in need."

FLU SHOTS ARE PROMOTED

Oct. 1 was Texas Influenza Awareness Day, and the Texas Department of State Health Services is recommending flu shots for everyone over six months of age.

Early vaccination is important because it takes about two weeks for the body to make flu antibodies after the vaccine is administered, the DSHS said.

"This year, there are many different flu vaccines available and they have all been updated for this flu season. The nasal spray flu vaccine, also known as FluMist, is once again on the list of recommended flu vaccines for the upcoming flu season," said DSHS Infectious Disease Medical Officer Dr. Jennifer Shuford.


