



Callahan County Commissioners voted Monday, December 13 to approve an order prohibiting the use of fireworks in unincorporated areas of Callahan County for the upcoming Christmas and New Year's holiday season.

On a motion by Commissioner Tommy Holland and second by Commissioner Doris Grider, commissioners voted 5-0 to approve the motion. The order

A. The order states a person commits an offense if he or she intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly detonates, ignites, or in any way uses fireworks on a county road or in the right-of way of a county road.

Uva Jones was present and notified us that Jack Jones was in the hospital. I never see Jack but what I think of the time he and I met on the island of Bora Bora in the Society Islands during WW II. Then I think of the many pleasant faces from Cottonwood and Cross Plains that I have met all over the world, and who gave me a pleasant moment of happiness.

Jack in Bora Bora, and in San Diego was a whole slew of people: Bill White Harold Browning, Neil Wolf and Chuck Woody; the Sunday afternoon gathering place for everyone who went to San Diego for basic

I also met D.C. Hargrove on the streets of Broadway in New York City; Garland Holly in a railway station in New Jersey; Ruth Ramey who I met on a bus going from the Pentagon to the city of Washington D.C.; and there was Frenchy Bennett who came to Okinawa on TDY and flying bombing missions to Korea. I also met Frenchy while stationed in Germany and he flew to Spain on an investigation, with the Air Force. He borrowed a jet fighter plane and flew to Ramstien Air

There may be others who I met and have forgotten. One thing I will never forget are those who gave the last ounce of their devotion to the United States in WWII. Those from Cottonwood were Everette Neal Strahan, and others from Cross Plains.

I often ask God why did they get to die and why did I get to live? 



My sister always said, "You know Sidney, Daddy will probably outlive us all." And you know what? She may be right!

Family members who attended were his daughter, Toni Johnson, of Dallas; son, Sidney Williams, of Fort Worth; granddaughter, Golda Hoffman, of Little Elm and two adorable great-grandchildren, Isaac and Levi, who will turn one year old this January. Another granddaughter, Laura Bezona, of New York, N.Y., was unable to make it, but sends her love to her grandfather whom she loves very much. Another son, Joe Williams, of Selkirk, N.Y., was unable to make it. Which was probably okay because Joe is the eloquent one of the family and with a party that lasted only two hours, he would barely have

Volley Joe was born in Cross Plains, Texas December 19, 1914. He had one brother, W.A. Williams. His parents, William Alfred Williams and Nora Bruton (maiden name) lived in the Panhandle of Texas before moving to Cross Plains. His father was a harness maker and had his own hardware store for many years before going to work for Higginbothams Hardware.

Volley Joe played sports all through high school, played clarinet in the band and participated in the schools theatrical productions. All while working part-time behind the soda fountain at the drug store. Later on he married Annie Edwina Anderson of Rising Star and they resided in Cross Plains while Volley went to work for Weakley-Watson Hardware in Brownwood before serving in the U.S. Navy during WWII, stationed in San Diego, California. After the war the family moved

for Weakley-Watson Hardware. In 1954, he transferred to West Texas and parts of New Mexico representing Weakley-Watson as a hardware salesman for that district. He had a "soft sell" technique that no one could refuse and was very successful. He made monthly sales meeting trips to Brownwood and the family usually went along. Many happy memories were made during those years.

Volley Joe enjoys bird hunting, fishing, playing golf, and let's not forget dominos and forty-two. We got to enjoy a lot of these activities with him. 



### Vaccine helps protect children

As the weather turns colder and children are together indoors more, the chances of youngsters getting the flu increase.

The local Department of State Health Services (DSHS) clinic has vaccine available for children covered under the Texas Vaccines for Children (TVFC) program who are considered "high risk." The high-risk groups

include children who are: • Ages 6 months through 23

• Ages 2 through 18 years with chronic medical conditions;

 Ages 6 months through 18 years on chronic aspirin therapy; Ages 6 months through 18 years who live in a home with a child age 6 months or younger. Children who are uninsured or underinsured, covered by the Children's Insurance Health Program (CHIP), who are of Native American or Native Alaskan heritage, as well as those on Medicaid are eligible to receive vaccine through the TVFC program. This program guarantees that flu and other childhood vaccines are available to health care providers at no cost for children

meeting the criteria. "All children need plenty of sleep, physical activity, nutritional food, lots of water to drink and encouragement to wash their hands frequently," said Dr. James Zoretic, medical director of DSHS Health Services Region 2/3 in Arlington.

To schedule a high-risk child for a flu shot, contact the DSHS clinic in Winters at (325) 754-4945.
