Economy Group Cites Objectives

Tahoka Co-op Is Near Completion

Work on the new Tahoka Co-op gin is now nearing completion, according to H. G. Hodges, manager.

The interior of the gin plant is entirely complete and ready for operation. Outside work will be completed in a little over a week, possibly.

Workmen are now rebuilding the cotton and seed houses and the burr burners. Driveways into the station have been paved to connect with the street paving. Grounds surrounding the plant are being filled in and improved.

Completely new gin machinery has been installed and the gin building is new from the ground up. The plant has the very newest in gin equipment, and can boast that it is as good as the best gin in all West Texas.

As Texas citizens who have been designated to work out an economical policy for maximum government efficiency at minimum cost we, the members of the general committee of the Texas Economy Commission, adopt the following objectives:

3. That the TEC will support the enactment of these bills into laws to insure and efficiently organized an operated executive branch of state government.

4. That THRIFT, not penury, will be the exclusive aim sought by this group in all its studies to achieve a just wisdom and a strict economy, without instances of wastefulness, in the administration of the State's affairs.

5. That members of this Commission in their deliberations have before them always the questions—"Is it wise? Is it the State's business? Is it economically administered?"

6. That "Save; eliminate; combine" shall be the TEC's watchwords subject to careful scrutiny and examination.

7. That all new proposals for expansion of the machinery of government shall be contemplated with these objects in mind at all times, bearing in mind that governmental services and operations must keep pace with the growing economy and manifestation of the state's needs.

8. That the TEC dedicate itself further to a constant, constructive campaign of education that the people of the state may know of these objectives and thus give their cooperation to aid in their attainment.

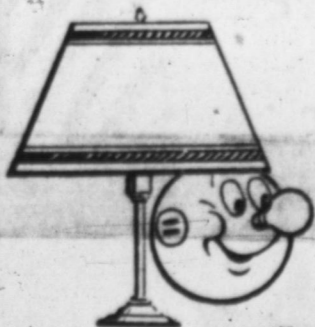
