## More Burglaries Listed In County

Several more thefts and burglaries were reported in the county and city during the last week and officers also investigated reports of criminal mischief, loud noises, a fight and a teenage Wilson girl being severely scratched and bitten by a possibly rabid cat.

Mt. Zion Church, a mile northeast of New Home, was burglarized between April 29 and May 6. Stolen were a Realistic public address system with accessories. Total value of the system was set at \$725. Crime Line, 998-5145, is offering a \$300 reward for information clearing this case.

Jerry Forsythe, Rt. 5, Tahoka,

reported theft of 12 trailer tires and wheels from trailers sometime during the last week.

Edwin Nettles, Rt. 1, Meadow, reported windows on a John Deere tractor damaged by gunshot at a farm 1.5 miles northeast of Lakeview Friday.

J.C. Durham, Rt. 5, Tahoka, reported a farm house three miles southeast of O'Donnell burglarized with four doors, a gas heater and an electric air compressor stolen, total value \$645.

### Cat Attacks Girl

Sheriff's deputies and members of Tahoka Volunteer Fire Dept. went to Wilson Tuesday and finally

located a stray cat which had attacked a 16-year-old Wilson girl Sunday. The cat was destroyed and tests are being conducted. The girl was treated by a physician and released.

A Tahoka High School freshman girl, Isabel Perez, still had not been located this week after disappearing from her home April 23. Officers said Wednesday they were checking a report she had been seen in the Odessa area.

In County jail during the last week were two persons for public intoxication.

Tahoka police answered a family disturbance call on Sunday night where two family members were involved in a fight. Both were taken to Lynn County Hospital where they were treated for severe cuts and bruises. Neither of the residents was charged at press time.

### Man Treated

Also on Sunday, a Tahoka man was treated for a drug overdose consisting of valium and a bottle of mixed pills. He was treated for complaints of a severe headache and hyperventilation.

Police also received several other calls on Sunday including a prowler call from a resident in the 1600 block of South 4th who reported she had heard a car door slam outside of her house and when she got up to look out, she saw someone standing by her window. A resident at Tahoka Care Center reported she heard someone beating on a door across the street and wanted it investigated.

Also on Sunday night, police received calls from a resident complaining of people making a lot of noise at S. 3rd and Ave. G and could not sleep, and a tennis player at the Mini-Park complained of young persons playing loud music on Main Street.

Judy Holden of 1828 N. 2nd reported to police last Wednesday that someone had stolen an older model red and white Huffy bicycle from her residence between 6:30 and 7:30 p.m.

## White, Miller In Runoff For County Commissioner

Lynn County voters Saturday gave incumbent Sheriff Stanley Krause a heavy margin of ballots which returned him to office without having to be in a runoff against either of two opponents. But in a three-man race for commissioner of Precinct 4, candidates Leland White and J.T. Miller will be in a runoff June 2 for the Democratic nomination, which means election, since there are no Republican candidates for the position.

Miller led the ballot on the commissioner's race, an election to fill the unexpired term of the late E.R. Blakney, who died in a tractor accident. Miller had 277 votes to 235 for White and 88 for Robert Edwards.

Three voting boxes in the New Home vicinity gave White big margins over Miller, but the Tahoka box in that commissioners precinct gave Miller a huge cushion of 172 votes to 23 for White, while Edwards had 53 in that box. New Home Box 4 gave Miller 48, White 124 and Edwards 9. Lakeview, Box

11, gave Miller 14 and White 45. North Lynn, Box 13, had 17 for Miller, 33 for White, and 22 for Edwards. Miller had the edge in the absentee balloting, getting 26 to 10 for White and 4 for Edwards.

Krause received 1,321 votes to 123 for Randy Smith and 171 for Kenneth Cawthron.

Kent Hance, who statewide led the Democratic ticket in the race for U.S. Senator from Texas and will face Lloyd Doggett in a runoff, also led Lynn County easily, getting 1,425 votes to 118 for Bob Krueger and 26 for Doggett. U.S. Rep. Charles Stenholm steamrolled his opponent in the 17th District race,

getting the nomination and winning 1,438 to 80 in this county.

Commissioners Bart Anderson, Precinct 4, and Eldon Gattis, Precinct 1, were re-elected without opposition, as were Tax Assessor-Collector George McCracken and County Attorney Jimmy Wright.

Tommy Lawson, who was re-elected County Democratic Chairman, said this week that the Lynn County Democratic Convention will be at 10 a.m. Saturday, May 19, in the District courtroom in Tahoka. At this time four delegates from the county will be elected to go to the state convention.

She participated in basketball, tennis, golf, FHA and cheerleading. She was 1983 Homecoming Queen, named to Who's Who her junior year and is a member of the National Honor Society. She plans to attend Texas Tech and major in mathematics.

Mary G. Perez, salutatorian, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ignacio Perez. She has a grade point average of 94.2. Mary was involved in track, FHA, National Honor Society, pep squad, Student Council president, and was elected to Who's

Who her junior and senior years.

Jeff Wyatt, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Wyatt, was high point boy with a grade of 93.45.

Tahoka High School will hold baccalaureate services Sunday, May 13, at 8 p.m. in the high school auditorium with Gene Wisdom, pastor of the First United Methodist Church, giving the sermon. Commencement for the 43 seniors will be held Friday, May 18, at 8 p.m. at Kelley Field.

O'Donnell High School will hold commencement exercises Thursday, May 17, at 8 p.m. in the high school auditorium.

All graduation exercises for Wilson will be held at 8 p.m. in the high school auditorium, beginning with the high school baccalaureate services Sunday, May 20. Junior high commencement will be Thursday, May 24, followed by the high school commencement on May 25.

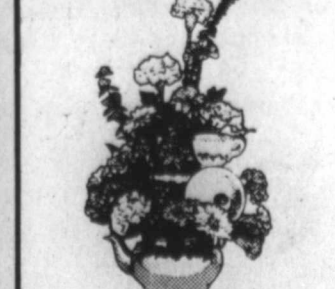
The council is planning an end-of-the-year picnic honoring the graduating seniors and a breakfast honoring the teachers.

### A Visit With Your County Agent

By Stanley Young

Lynn homeowners hoping to harvest good fruit from their trees this year need to start work now to assure healthy trees and quality yield. "The first step in producing quality fruits is to insure that the tree is in a healthy, vigorous state," Young said. Various insects attack fruit trees and often the use of insecticides is the only means of control, the county agent said. Cultural practices such as proper

pruning, fertilizing and watering also play important roles in preventing insect damage, he noted. Insect losses can be reduced with a spray program and by diligently following good cultural practices. "But this should begin right away for peach and apricot trees and in the next few days for apple trees," he stressed. The most important insects which damage fruit

in this area are the codling moth in apples and pears and the peach twig borer in peaches and apricots. Other damaging insects include the peach tree borer, which attacks the base of the trunk and thrips, which attack foliage.

The first cover spray to prevent insects from damaging fruit should be applied to peach and apricot trees when 75 percent of the blossom petals have fallen, and to apple trees when 90 percent of the petals have dropped. Subsequent applications should be made every 10 days to assure undamaged fruit. "Five or six applications will be needed for apricot and peach trees, and up to 14 applications for apples and pears. Thorough coverage of the tree is important.

Several insecticides, including diazinon, malathion and zolone provide good control of damaging insect pests. Sevin will thin apples and shouldn't be used until 30 days after full bloom. A fungicide can also be applied with the insecticide to help prevent diseases in peaches and apricots.

Always read and follow label instructions for the pesticide you are using, the county agent said.

#### Time To Watch For May Flowers And The Pine Tip Moth.

Local residents with pine trees on their property should be aware that now isn't only the time to think about May flowers, but

about action to control the pine tip moth, a major pest of area pine trees.

The tip moth spends the winter as a pupa within injured terminals of the tree. Adult moths emerge in early May to mate and lay eggs.

The female moths fly at night, placing eggs singly on needles, buds or shoots. The eggs hatch in 10 to 30 days, with small larvae constructing small webs in the axils formed by developing needles and stems. The larvae bore into the needles and stem tips. The larvae first eat the bud area of new shoots and then bore down the centers of the new stems.

Trees damaged by pine tip moth will have brown terminals, poor tree shape and stunted growth. In severe cases the tree may die.

There are usually two or more generations of pine tip moth each year.

The pest can be controlled with pesticides, the Extension agent said. Foliar sprays of cygon, diazinon, malathion or orthene may be applied to foliage in early May in our area. Exact spray timing will vary each year.

Di-syston granules may be used as a soil-applied systemic insecticide. The granules should be spread evenly under the tree canopy and then worked into the soil. The ground should then be watered thoroughly so that the insecticide can be absorbed into the root system.

Care must be taken when

using chemicals, such as Di-syston, to prevent poisoning animals and injuring plants. Never allow children to play in treated areas and always read the label for correct application rates and special precautions.

The activities will begin with a career assembly in the University Center Theatre. A lunch in the University Center Ballroom will follow. Then all participants will see the Texas Tech - SMU football game.

#### 4-H Program Stresses Fire Safety

Installing one or more smoke detectors in your home can greatly improve your chances of escaping safely in case of fire.

Most fires can be prevented. But should fire strike, 4-H'ers have found that lives can be saved by early warning devices that are properly installed, tested and maintained.

The National Safety Council reports that in a recent year about one-fifth of all home accident deaths—5,100 out of a total of 25,500—resulted from fires, burns, asphyxiation and related causes. These statistics point to

the need for continuing fire safety education for 4-H'ers, their families and their communities.

Boys and girls enrolled in 4-H safety projects and activities learn-by-doing about fire control methods. They inspect and rid their homes of trash, papers and other combustibles.

4-H members check to see that flammable liquids are stored in sturdy metal containers, and that electrical wiring and equipment are kept in top condition. And they educate their families to the vital importance of installing smoke and fire alarms.

Fire safety is only one emphasis in the 4-H safety program, notes Henley.

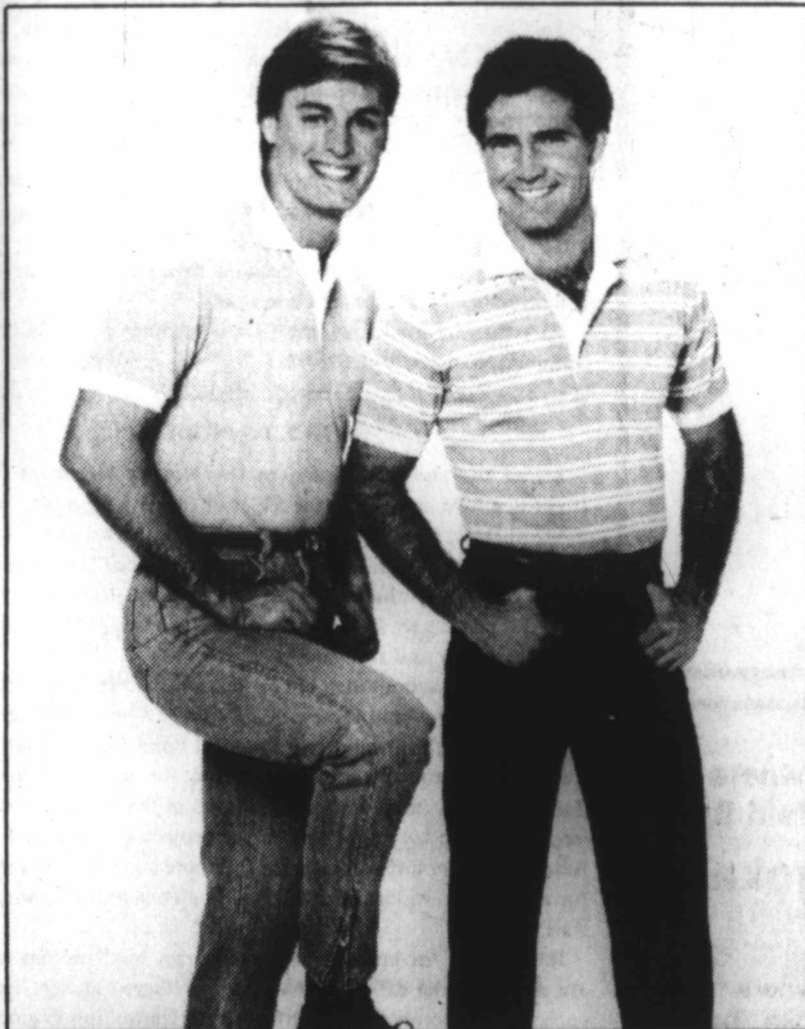
