Most businesses in Lynn County, plus county and city offices and financial institutions and U.S. government facilities will be closed Monday in observance of Memorial Day.

Some stores will remain open, including supermarkets and most other grocers.

Traditional Memorial Day is May 30, but the Monday holiday bill passed a few years ago by Congress changes the observance of this holiday and some others.

City Airport Runway Work Contract Let

High Plains Pavers of Plainview was low bidder on sealcoat work for repair of the runway at T-Bar Airport, and Tahoka city council voted Monday night in special session to accept the bid of \$15,400 for the project.

A Texas Aeronautics Commission representative was present when bids were opened. The TEC will make funds available for 75 per cent of the cost, with the city to pay for the other 25 per cent, plus fees for the engineer.

Also approved at Monday night's meeting was a call for bids for paving an estimated 19 blocks in the south, southeast and northeast sections of the city under the last phase of a three-year program funded by the federal government in form of a community development block grant. Bids on the paving will be opened June 11.

Present were Mayor Meldon Leslie, city manager Carl Reynolds and council members W.O. Wharton, Dalton Wood, Richard White and Tom Cooper. Absent was councilman Jim Solomon.

Tahoka Museum Board Meets

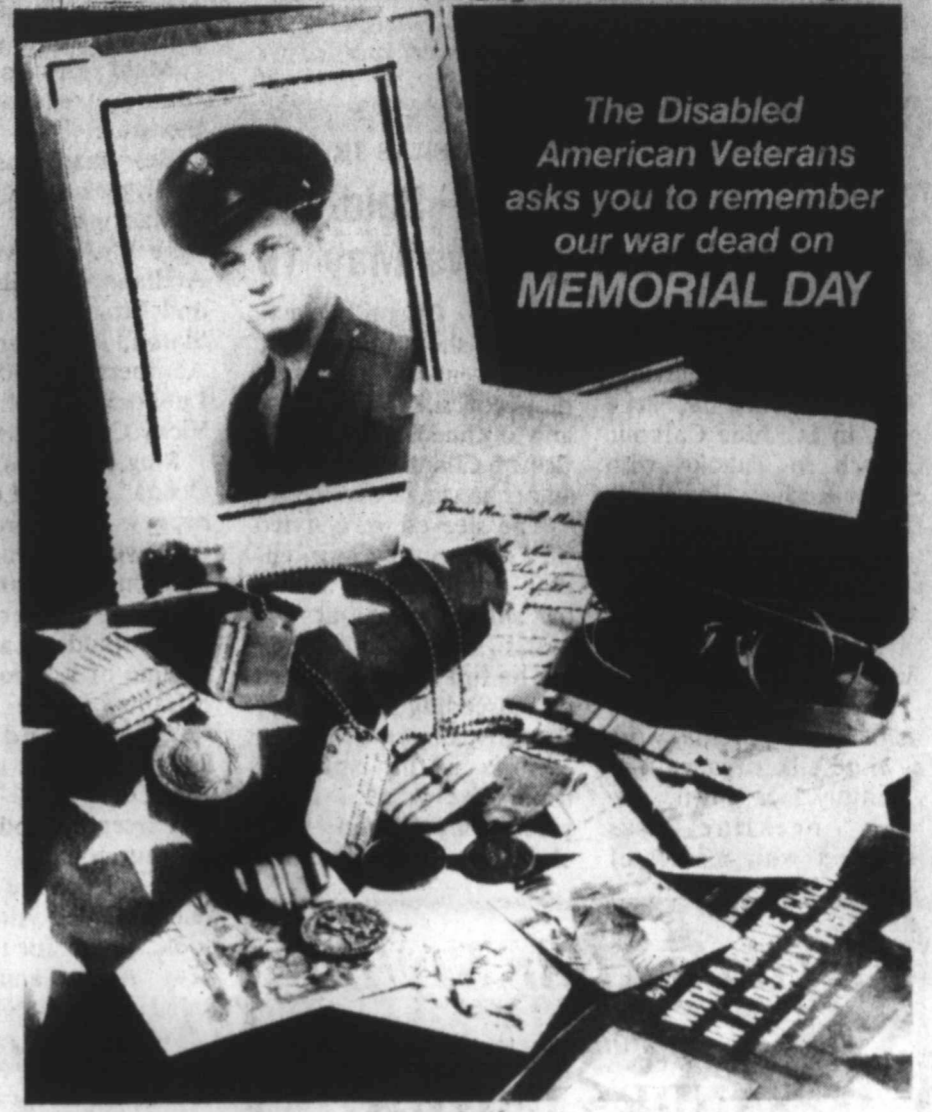
The Tahoka Pioneer Museum board met Monday, May 14, at the museum with Harold Green, president, presiding.

tentatively, a brick walkway, using the existing paving bricks that are stored in this area, will be installed.

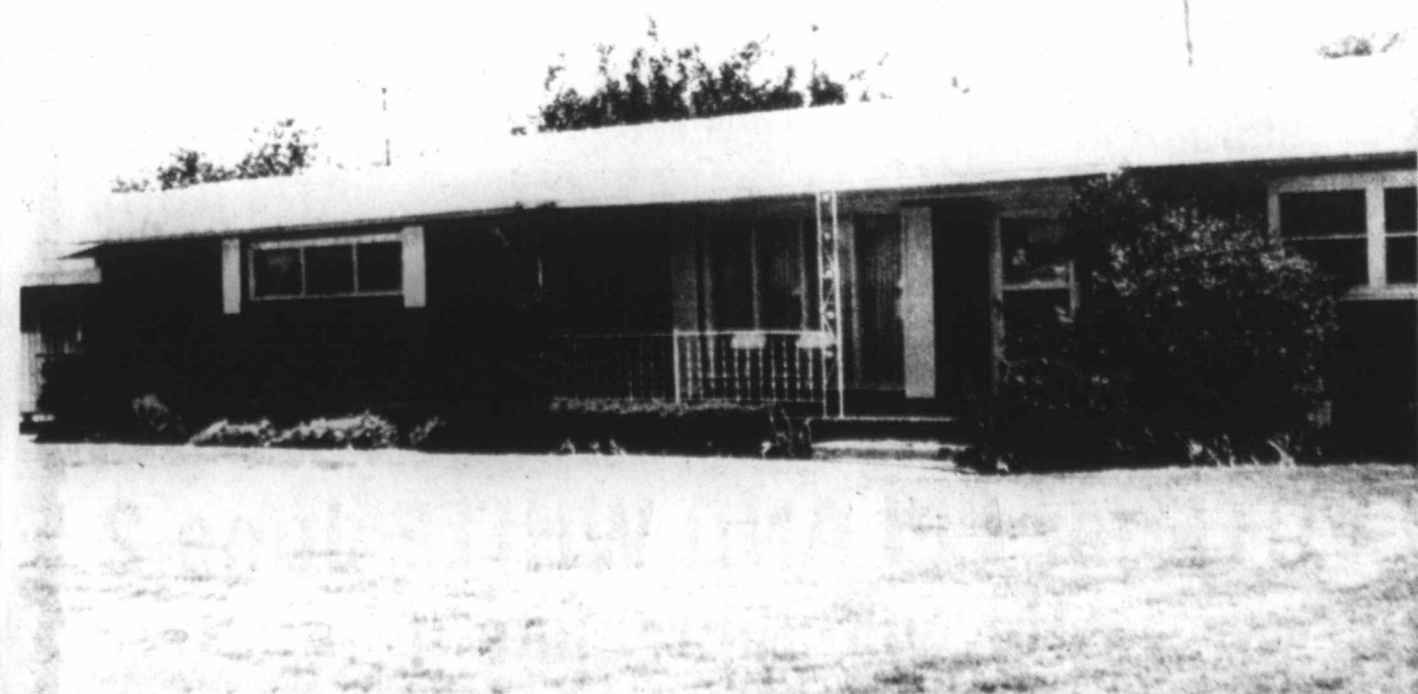
Belton Howell, Lynn County patriarch, will be contacted by Dr. K.R. Durham regarding the many items he has mentioned as possible acquisitions to the museum.

This signifies the yoke of marriage and the bond that will unite their lives and love. The symbolism of tying together and uniting the couple to stay together. This is a visual sign for the couple that they are tied together as one.

"Padrinos or witnesses for the wedding also have a special role as in some of the other sacraments. This is done to defray wedding expenses, in that each padrino contributes. The groom pays for the bride's dress, veil and shoes. The couple's parents pay for the dinner in which friends and relatives are invited.

"During the dance, around 10:30 p.m., a waltz is played and anyone can dance with the bride or groom for \$1. The band plays the waltz until the last participant dances. The couple use this money for their honeymoon expenses."

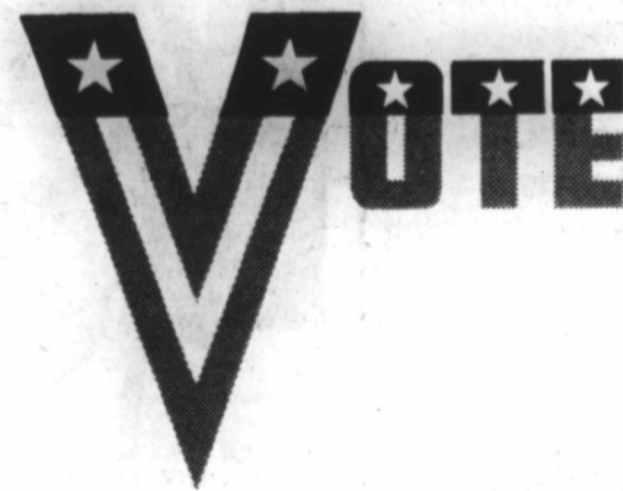

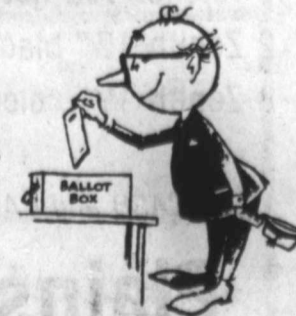
