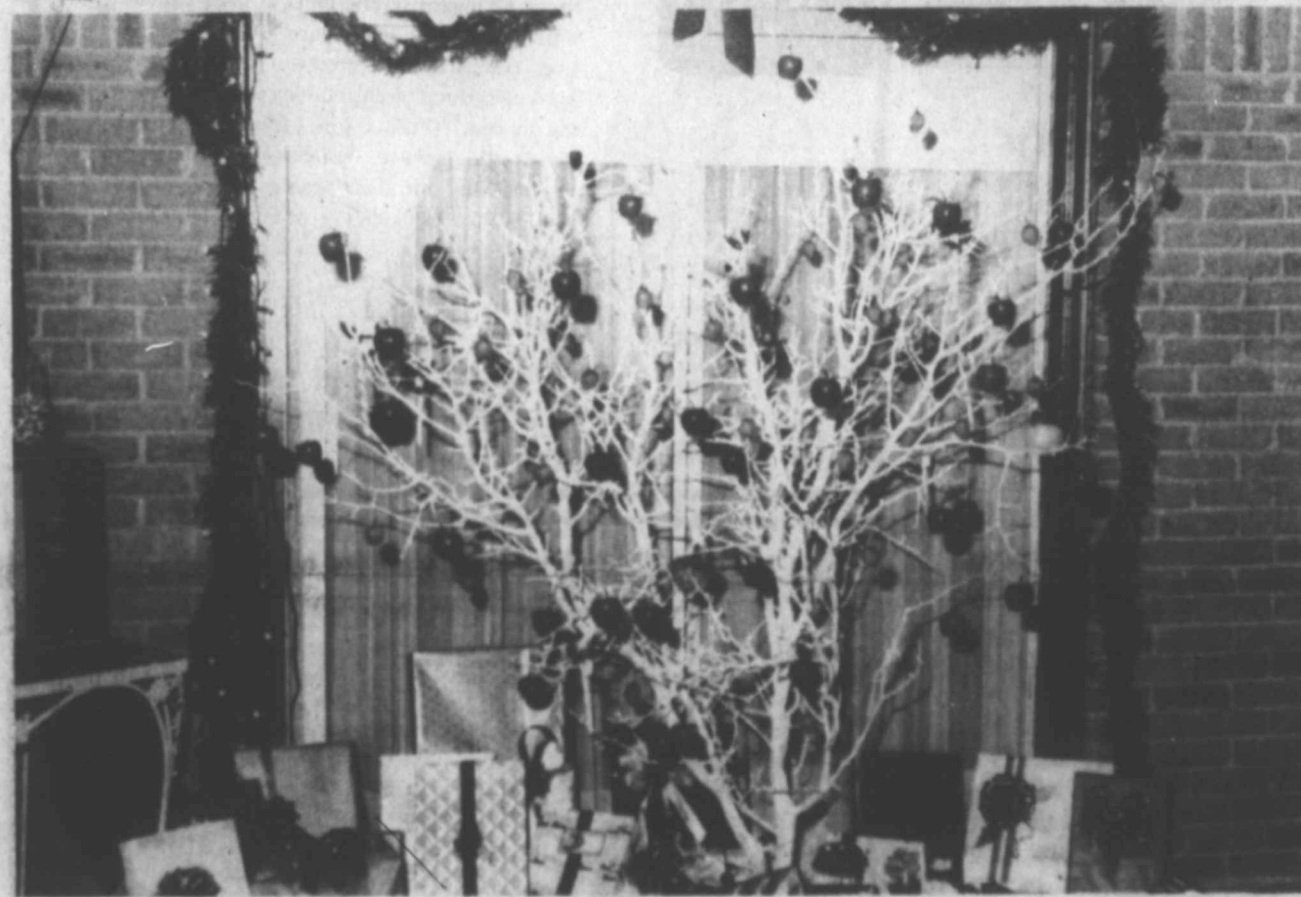

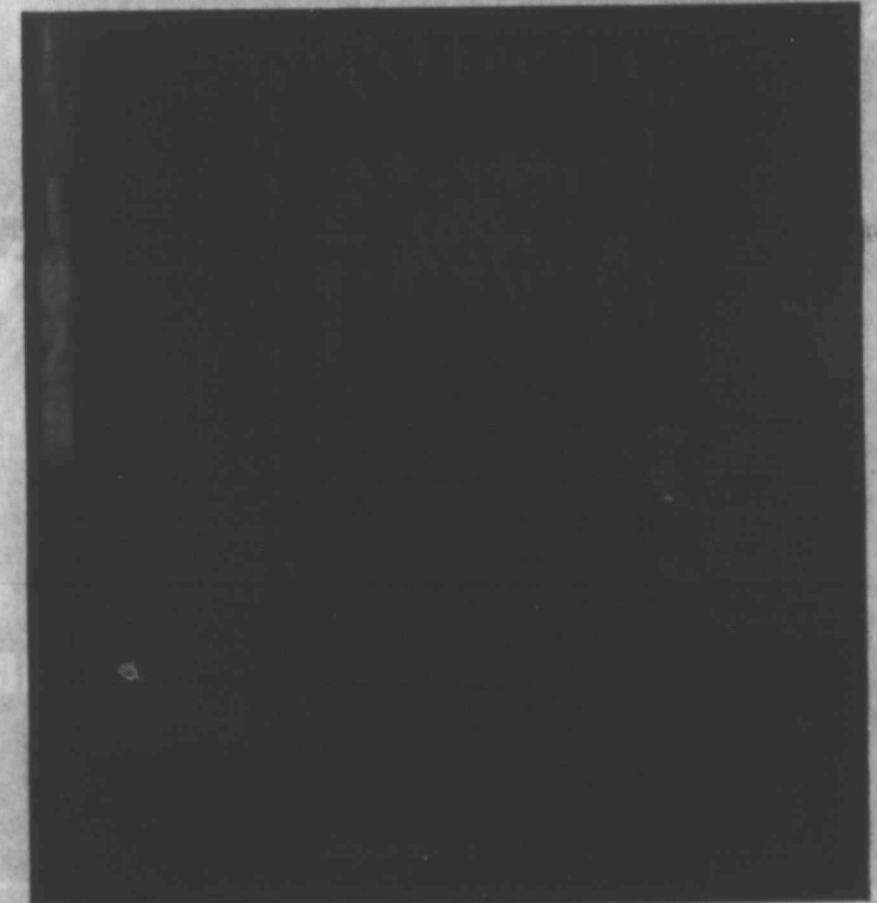

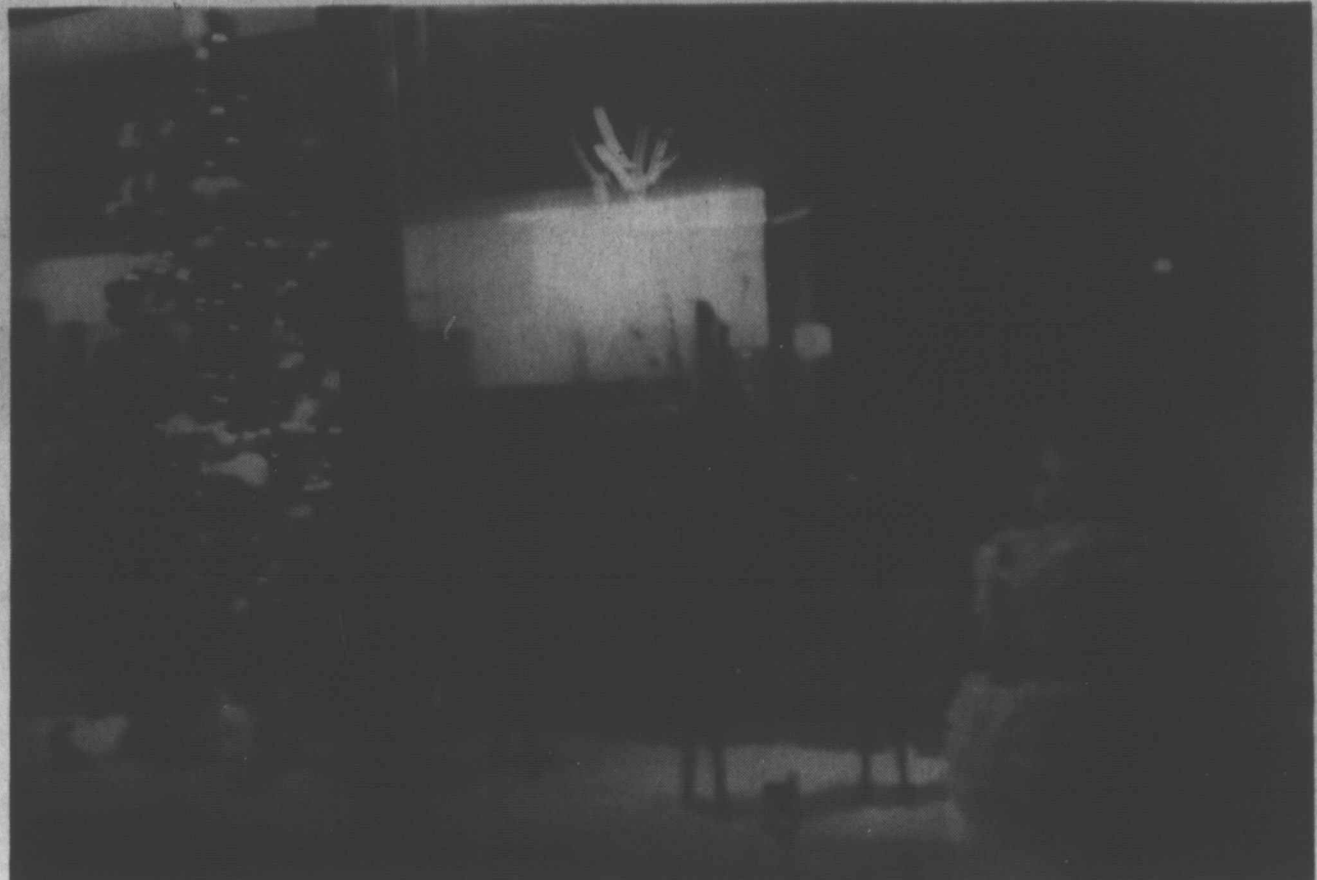

Dear Editor,

I would like to respond to a letter by Dr. Kenneth Durham (Oct. 16) and one by Rev. Glenden P. Riddle (Nov. 26) concerning our present state of prisons and prisoners.

I was interested in the facts and personal experience that Rev. Riddle was able to share about the difficulties prisoners have in making their lives work successfully after being released. With the facts he gave, it appears it would behoove us to look realistically at what we could do toward rehabilitation. I would like to offer one safe, easy, and inexpensive suggestion that would not be a panacea, but certainly could benefit a great many prisoners and consequently the rest of us.

I'd like to invite each of you to read: "Diet, Crime and Delinquency" by Alexander Schauss. The author has worked with criminals and delinquents all his adult life. The book explores much of the work linking diet and nutrition to behavior. Some of the research occurred in prisons. It is very hard for me to understand why changes in prison diets have not been implemented with the kinds of results cited in this book.

On June 22, 1977, a chief probation officer testified before the Senate and said, "Never before has the court had such a tool for working with the many ill people who find themselves in court. We wonder what the results would be if this method of treatment would also be applied to all those sentenced in jail." The 'tool' was proper nutrition.

My first introduction to the link between diet and behavior in prisons was an article in the East-West Journal in the early 1980's. The article was written about the positive changes in the lives of some hard-core criminals in Portugal when they adopted a natural foods diet.

Could part of our answer be this simple? We tend to look for very complex solutions to problems. If the hope for

some of these people is in whole grains, fresh fruit, and fresh vegetables, why don't our prisons supply their need?

Many people have particular sensitivities to preservatives and pesticides we often find in our foods. One way to make certain those are limited from the diet as much as possible is to grow your own food. Why can't the prisoners grow their own food with these ideas in action? With the food prepared properly they would easily and inexpensively eat good diets. Junk food could be eliminated. Is the problem that this is too simple and too inexpensive to be a political issue?

Having taught school for several years, I can verify that many students do not eat food all day—they eat processed junk with no nutritive value. Many children are now labeled hyperactive or learning disabled. I do wonder what kind of diet many of these children eat.

My suggestion is two fold.
1. For prisoners- Concerned citizens should clip this article and send to their legislators and say we want our prisoners to be fed healthy diets as outlined in the Dietary Goals for the United States prepared by the Select Committee on Nutrition and Human Needs in the United States Senate.

2. For prevention- Parents please feed your children healthy diets including fresh fruits and vegetables and whole grains in an effort to prevent delinquency. Limit processed foods and chemicals.

Just these two simple actions could greatly change some people's lives.

As Hans Selye said "Progress can only be made by ideas which are very different than those accepted at the moment."

I am not presuming this would solve all our problems with criminals, but sometimes solutions come one step at a time. I can't think of a reason why this shouldn't be tried!

Tips to help avoid holiday depression

For some people, Santa's ho-ho-ho may sound more like ho-ho-hum.

These are people who suffer from depression, which can be a particularly acute problem during the holiday season.

"Holiday seasons often serve as trigger points for feelings and anxieties that already exist within individuals and within families," says Rodney C. Brown, head of R.J. Reynolds Industries' employment counseling department. Brown says that holiday reunions with family members can rekindle old conflicts, and that the expectations for happiness are higher during the holiday season. If those expectations fail, depression can be the result.

Brown says he tells his clients that they should approach the holiday season with realistic expectations, and not hope to settle all their problems just because it is Christmastime. He also recommends taking time out from holiday activities for some personal leisure activities, and when you do participate in holiday events, try to pace yourself. Rushing out to do all your shopping in one day is not the best way to plan for a happy season.

Most important, Brown says, is admitting your feelings and discussing them. Getting problems out in the open with family members, friends, clergymen or a counselor can help avoid feelings of depression. ▲

Apricot Ice

1 1/2 cups dried apricots 1/4 cup sugar
2 tbsp. lemon juice

Place apricots in a saucepan with enough water to cover and bring to a boil over medium heat. Reduce heat, cover and simmer until fruit is soft (about 20 minutes). Drain and reserve 3/4 cup of fruit liquid. Cool. Purée fruit in a food processor or blender with reserved fruit liquid.

Add lemon juice and sugar to fruit and purée an additional 30 seconds.

Pour into an 8-inch square pan, place in freezer, and stir every 15 minutes until creamy. Cover and freeze until semi-hard.

Yield: 4 servings

NOTE: Just about any puréed fruit may be used to make this refreshing dessert: strawberries, pears, honeydew, pineapple, mango and papaya to name a few. If fresh fruits are used, the proportion is 2 cups of puréed fruit to 1/2 cup of water.
