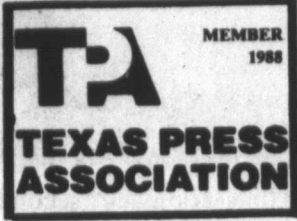

Lynn County Schools To Graduate 89 Seniors

The four high schools in Lynn County will have graduation ceremonies for 89 seniors, starting with a combined commencement-baccalaureate for O'Donnell seniors tonight (Thursday).

Baccalaureate for the other three schools will be this Sunday

evening, all at 8 p.m. For Wilson, it will be in the high school auditorium, with graduation to follow Friday, June 3, also at 8 p.m. in the auditorium.

Tahoka will have baccalaureate in the high school auditorium Sunday and graduation will be on Friday, June 3 at 8

p.m. in the high school gymnasium.

New Home baccalaureate will be in the First Baptist Church, and graduation will be at 8 p.m. Tuesday in the high school gymnasium.

Leal has been an active leader at OHS. He has served as Student Council president this year as well as National Honor Society president. George has led his class as president all four years in high school.

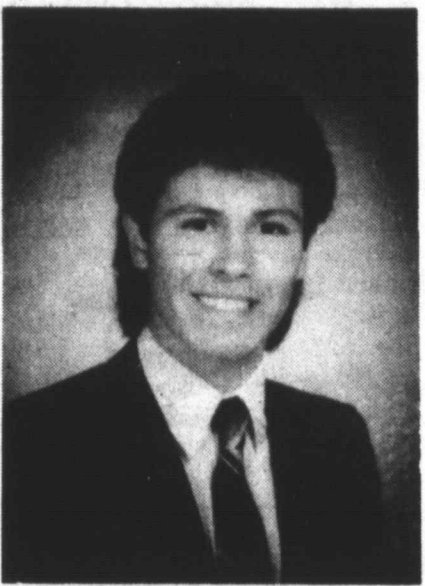

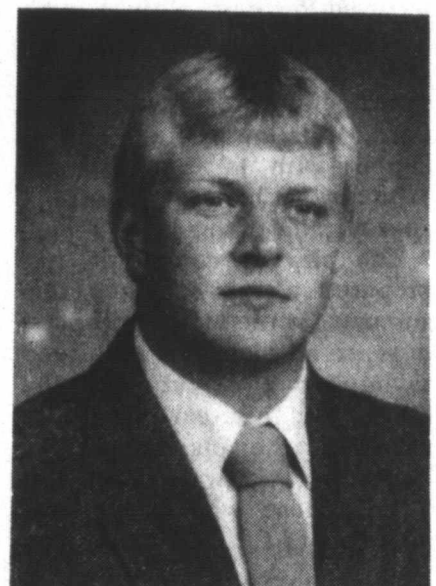
Academically, Denise has received the highest ranking girl her junior year and has been a member of the National Honor Society for three years.

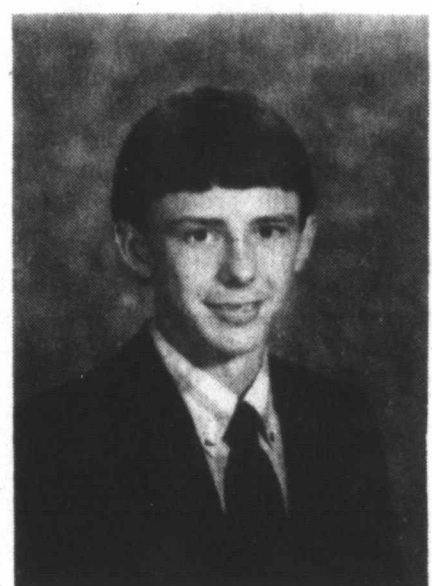

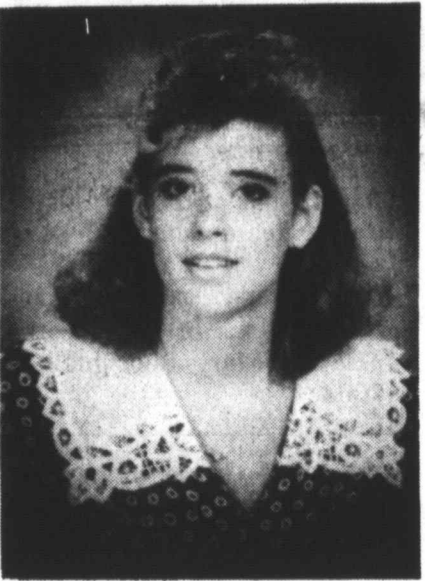

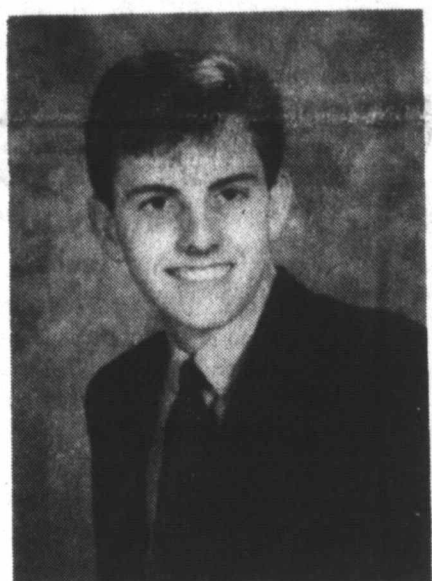

Delinquent Taxes Face Added Penalty July 1

Taxpayers in Lynn County were reminded this week that only delinquent taxes for 1987 not paid by July 1 will automatically have another 15 percent penalty added, which will mean that the taxpayers will have 30 percent added to the original amount of the tax. If paid by June 30, the delinquent penalty is 15 percent.

Property owners have an earlier deadline for filing a notice of protest with the local appraisal review board (ARB). Effective for the 1988 tax year, a property owner must file the protest by May 31 or no later than 30 days after an appraisal notice is delivered, whichever is later. In Lynn County, the review board is scheduled to meet June 6. Minerals and utilities will be from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and questions on real and personal property will be heard from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.

The filing deadline is one month earlier than the old one of June 30. The earlier deadline gives a local review board more time to hear and decide property owner's complaints about value.

Appraisal notices are not sent to all property owners. The chief appraiser must send a notice under three circumstances: for a new property, for a property where the owner rendered a lower value than the appraisal district's value, and for an increase in value over the prior year.

The ARB will schedule a hearing when it receives a taxpayer's protest in writing.

The ARB will then mail a written notice to the property owner listing the date, time and place of the hearing. The property owner will have at least 15 days notice of the hearing.

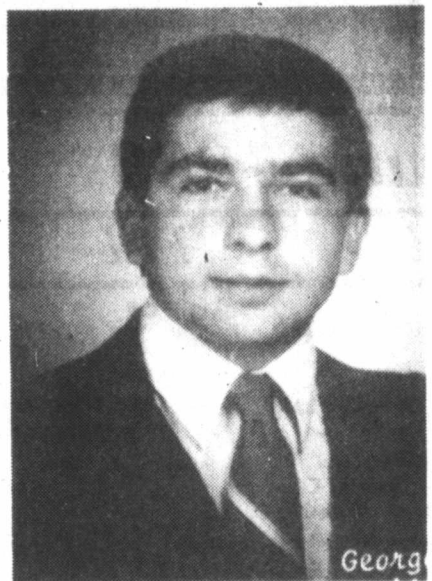
The ARB must schedule a single hearing for property owners who own property in undivided or fractional interests, including owners of mineral interests.

Appraisal districts have official notice of protest forms for property owners to use, or they are available from the State Property Tax Board at P.O. Box 15900, Austin, Texas 78761-5900. Although an official form is not mandatory, the notice must be a written document that identifies the property owner, the property in question and indicates some dissatisfaction with the property's appraisal record.

Property owners must present evidence and information that supports a different determination than proposed by the appraisal district.

Any property owner who acquires property after Jan. 1, but before the filing deadline, may protest an appraisal. Property is appraised as it existed on Jan. 1.

Property owners who intend to have an agent represent them at the protest hearing should make sure they have a completed agent authorization form on file at the appraisal district. Appraisal districts and the State Property Tax Board have these forms available for the public.

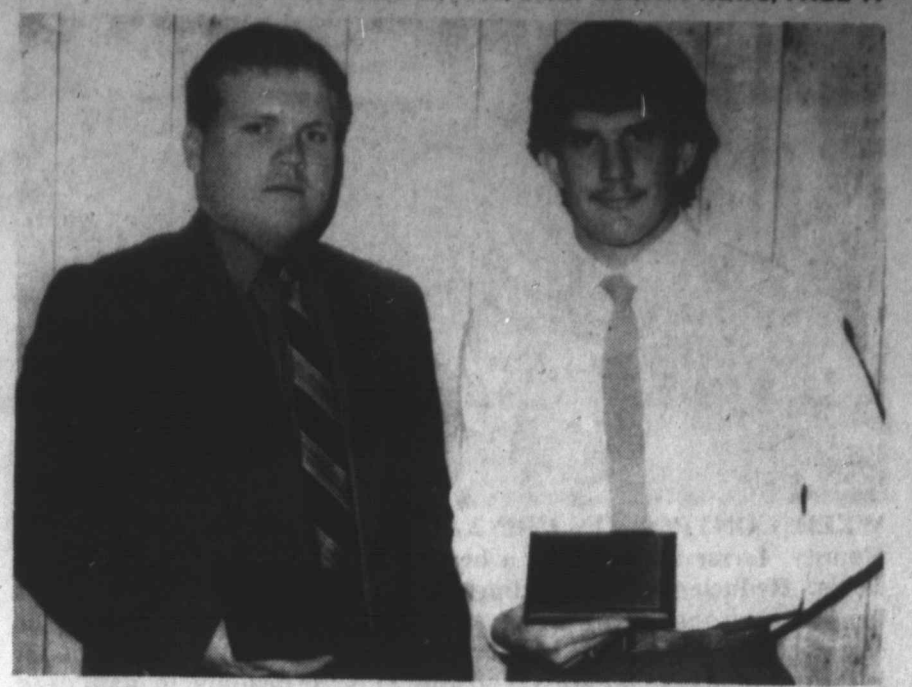

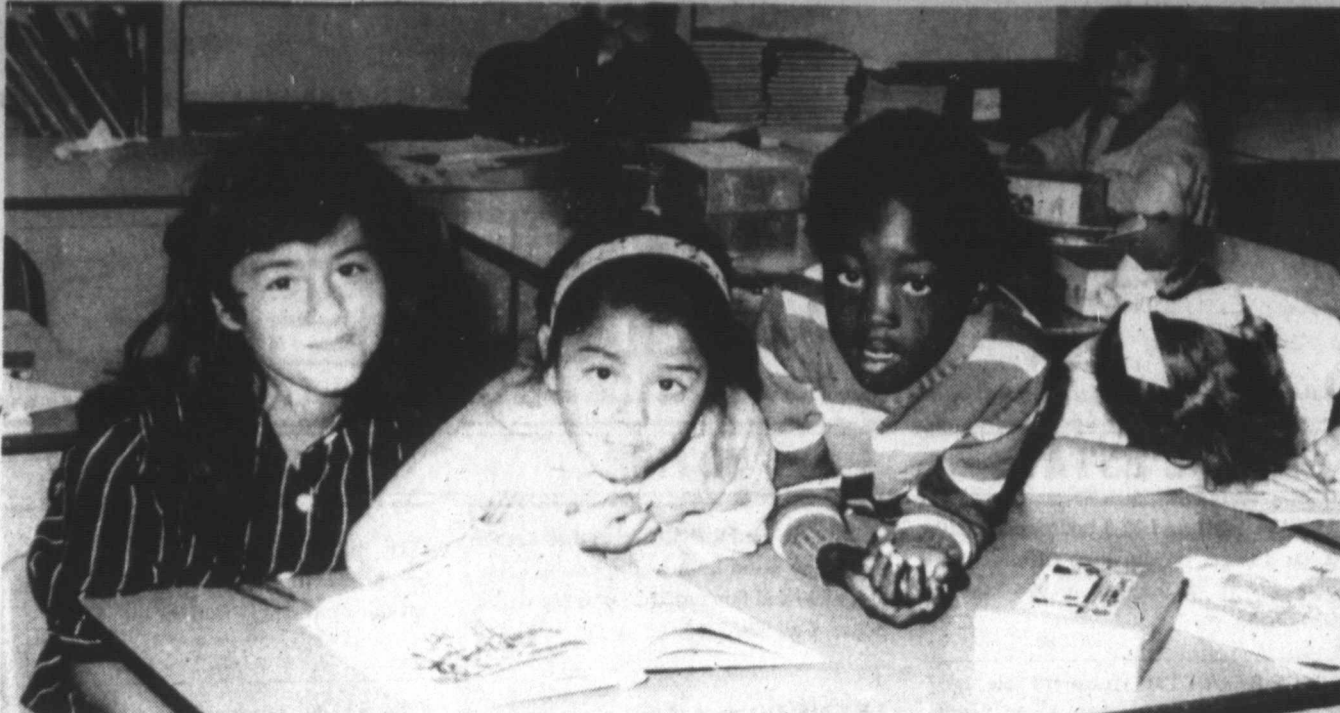
