Water Study **Includes Cities** In Lynn County

The Texas Water Development Board in Austin has awarded a \$68,650 grant to the Canadian River Municipal Water Authority for a regional water supply planning study.


The planning area includes the cities of Amarillo, Borger, Brownfield, Lamesa, Levelland, Lubbock, O'Donnell, Pampa, Plainview, Slaton, and Tahoka. The one-year study sill evaluate the feasibility of alternative water supplies in the area north of the Canadian River to supplement the water supply from Lake Meredith. The study will also evaluate methods of improving the water quality of Lake Meredith, the major water supply source for the area.

The Authority and its 11 member cities in the area will participate in the study. The Authority will provide matching funds for the study.

"Jammin' January" To Offer Unique Activities For Jr./Sr. High Students

Tahoka Junior/Senior High School students will have an opportunity to participate in activities which are fun and educational in a week called "Jammin' January" at the end of this semester. January 6-10, administrators, educators, parents and community volunteers will supervise unique activities for students.

During that week, students in grades 7-12 will not attend regular classes but instead attend their choice of activities being offered, most of them on the TISD campus, but some which will be offered at various other locations, including Lubbock.

Jammin' January is the first week school when students return from Christmas break, and is the final week in that six-weeks grading period. Sixweek and semester exams will have been given to students before they let out for Christmas break, and this additional week before the next grading period begins is an ideal time to offer such a concept, according to Principal Charles Cate.

"Also, any student who is having problems with certain classes will have the opportunity to work with. their teachers in order to bring up their grades, instead of attending these optional activities provided that week," said Cate. "There will be some students who can use this time to devote some extra study to their problem classes."

Students will be given the choice of participating in activities such as aerobics, art lessons, auctioneering, auto repair, bowling, CPR training and first aid, cake decorating, calligraphy, clothes buying and consumer shopping, computers, cosmetology, crime education, dance lessons, disc jockey, drug education, flower arranging, hiking and exploring, horsemanship, knitting, landscaping, leatherwork, lifesaving, modeling, martial arts, medical technology/nursing, movie analysis, photography, voice fessons, and television station tours.

"I heard a presenter at a workshop on teaching the gifted/talented say that one way to help steer students away from drugs, alcohol and other teenage pressures is for educators and parents to help young people develop hobbies and interests," said English teacher, Mrs. Leah Taylor. "That is something the Jammin' January week will do," she added.

Students were asked to brainstorm and turn in lists of things they might enjoy learning to do in their spare time. Students then selected various activities to fill up the four school days Jan. 6-9. Jan! 10 will be a Career Day and will feature professionals and varied vocational speakers.

"We are hoping that we can excite our students for the second semester," said Principal Charles Cate. "We hope that the activities will be both challenging and stimulating. This week should convince our students that school can be both educational and enjoyable." he added.

Many student activities are being individualized to the students' interests. For instance, many students will be working with a nurse for an entire day at a hospital. Another student may be following a news, weather or sports man around for a day.

Channel 28 weather men want their students to report to them at 5:30 a.m. when their day begins and to stay with them until after the 10 p.m. newscast.

"I'm going to get to work with a news person for a day," said junior Carrie Taylor. "I hope all the kids are looking as forward to this week as I am!" she added.

Parents and volunteers have contacted various people and a qualified group of instructors and supervisors will be on hand for all of the activi-

"We know that we will have some kinks to work out in our planning and organizing of Jammin' January," said

Cate. "Roll call will be taken by teachers, and students not present will be counted absent," he added. The activity choices are optional, but attendance at school will be required of all

Cate says there is some cost to students for some activities, but none of the costs are very high. Instructors and teachers of activities are donating their time, but there may be some cost for materials. For instance, students in leatherwork will need a \$10 kit, and a student who takes the photography course will need to buy film. All materials will be available from the class instructor.

Students are required to sign up for each class ahead of time, and some classes are limited to a certain number of students.

Cate says he hopes to make Jammin' January an annual event. "This project has been in the planning for several years," he said. "It's not something we just threw together to take up some time in school. We think our students will benefit from it, and give them some new and exciting opportunities and skills. Students learn from more than just books," he





School Board Reviews Policies. Discusses Absenteeisms Here

Tahoka I.S.D. trustees met in regular session Thursday night, Dec. 12 in a routine meeting, hearing reports from two high school teachers, reviewing several district policies, and discussing the high level of absenteeism recently due to health problems including reports of measles, chicken pox, flu, strep throat and fifths disease.

Dr. Duane Carter, Superintendent, told trustees that during the week beginning Dec. 9 the elementary campus had 70-plus students out of school each day due to illness. Fifths disease is a highly contagious infection which produces a rearrash, but apparently causes few other problems in students. The disease is contagious, but by the time the rash shows up, a student has already passed the contagious stage, according to one source.

Tahoka Jr./Sr. High School teachers Julie Cypert and Altah Harvick reported on their classroom activities, and told Board members how they were adjusting to this year's block schedule. Mrs. Harvick teaches freshman and sophomore English, and Mrs. Cypert teacher Chapter I and high school reading improve-

Both teachers liked the longer classroom periods in the block schedule, and said students were probably adjusting faster than teachers were. "We are still learning how to plan our class time to adjust to the longer

The award-winning story was written by Mrs. Baker after she investigated alleged misappropriation of funds at West Texas State University. The expose details unauthorized investments made by school officials. Mrs. Baker wrote the story while a student at WTSU, and the article was published in the Oct. 17, 1990, issue of The Prairie, the school's weekly newspaper.

Mrs. Baker said she began her investigation after auditors raised questions about the school's 1987 investments. The auditors had reviewed WTSU's financial records in early October of 1990.

A Randall County grand jury last week indicted former university president Ed Roach and two others on charges of misappropriation of funds and property.

Mrs. Baker said she "couldn't believe that no one else had discovered the discrepancies in the university reports."

Food Gifts Should Be Stored Properly

Last-minute shoppers may find food baskets to be perfect gifts this holiday. However, food safety should be a main ingredient, according to the Texas Agricultural Extension Ser-

Whether a person plans to buy a prepared basket or fill one with homecooked treats, taking precautions will prevent gifts from harboring bacteria that can cause illness.

Always read product labels or ask the vendor for proper storage instructions when selecting food gifts. Most protein foods are perishable and needto be stored at refrigerator temperatures, while some specially processed foods are safe at room temperatures.

Those who plan to mail food gifts should consider the length of shopping time. Also, check to be sure that someone will be home to accept the package and store it properly.

People who receive food gifts should check the items for signs of food deterioration and for proper storage and delivery conditions before accepting them.

Items that need refrigeration are probably not the best choices for gift baskets. However, regardless of what you send, labeling all items as to storage requirements is a good idea.

Furniture First Aid

(DM)—Sweep up the pine needles, ut away the decorations, rearrange the furniture-everybody's gone. No matter how much you look forward to the holidays and the round of entertaining that typically goes with them, it can be a relief to reclaim your home from visits by family and friends.

In that final clean-up, it's a good idea to take some precautionary steps to make sure your home always looks its best. Since furniture is a prominent feature of everybody's home, a lot of time can be spent on sprucing up its appearance. For wood pieces, an application of furniture polish will not only clean, it can protect against every day wear and tear.

Using furniture polish every time you dust is a better way to clean since a cloth with polish holds the scattering them into the air to settle elsewhere, One new product recent-ly introduced by S.C. Whether you're concerned about past or future injuries, here is some basic furniture first aid to help you keep your furniture looking its best.

Most minor furniture damage such as scratches, white rings and other spots can be repaired or suc-cessfully camouflaged by using one of two techniques: rub-it-out or

recolor. In the rub-it-out method, a gentle abrasive and a lubricant are rubbed into the damaged area, with the grain, until the spot blends in with the surrounding, undamaged area. The trick of the method is to use a very light hand and treat only the thin top layer of the finish. Rub gently and stop frequently to wipe away the abrasive and lubricant, checking on how the spot compares with the surrounding area.

Examples of abrasives and lubri-

cants that can be used for this method include #0000 steel wool dipped in paste wax and the powdered abrasives, rottenstone or pumice, mixed with mineral or salad oil. Put a few drops of oil on the spot, shake on abrasive powder to make a paste and rub gently using a clean, soft cloth. In the recolor method, a coloring

material is applied to the wood to camouflage a damaged area. The coloring options, most of which are available at paint or hardware stores, include crayon-like wax sticks, available in a range of wood colors; paste shoe polish; wood stains; or artist's oil paints. The polish, stains or paints can

be applied with a cotton swab or toothpick. Be sure to match the color to the furniture as closely as possible. The polish usually buffs to a higher shine than the other options. If the color produced by either the stick or the polish is darker than the original finish, it can be partly removed with mineral

All minor repairs should be followed by an application of furniture polish, according to the experts.

Test Soil Now For Spring Crops

It's time to test soil and determine which fertilizer nutrients should be used for spring crops, according to a Texas Agricultural Extension Service Soil Scientist.

Sound Soil Fertility programs are the foundation upon which profitable farming businesses are built. A reliable test should be used to determine which nutrients can minimize losses and ensure that crop production is economical, environmentally sound, profitable and sustainable.

Nitrogen is the most frequently deficient soil nutrient, but sometimes it is over-applied, Extension testing laboratories in College Station and Lubbock can asses residual or carryover nitrogen levels in soils by analyzing for nitrate nitrogen. By determining the amount of available nitrogen in the soil, the lab can recommend what additional amounts are needed to reach desired crop yields, resulting in saving to producers.

Phosphorous is the second most commonly deficient nutrient in most-

Texas soils and should also be applied when tests indicate low or moderate levels.

Although most farmers do a good job fertilizing with nitrogen and phosphorous, micronutrients needs may be overlooked. Laboratories have found zind deficiencies in more than 50% of soil samples submitted from the Blackland prairies. Corn and Grain sorghum are particularly sensitive to zinc deficiencies. Cotton, wheat, and other crops can also be affected.

Soil testing can help you make those major economic decisions with greater confidence. Soil-test sample bags and details on soil testing are available at the Lynn County Exten-

NOTICE OF INTENTION

TO CONDUCT WEATHER MODIFICATION OPERATIONS IN THE STATE OF TEXAS

1. Notice is hereby given that the Colorado River Municipal Water District has filed an application with the Texas Water Commission for a State permit to conduct weather modification operations to change or attempt to change the natural development of clouds for the purpose, objective, period, and by the method summarized hereinbelow.

Date of the first of three weekly publications of this Notice: 12-12-41

2. The Colorado River Municipal Water District has a valid Texas weather modification license. The initial license was issued on December 18, 1974, and was renewed in 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, 1980, 1981, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, and 1991.

3. The purpose of the weather modification operation is to increase rainfall to affect water resources. The period of the permit is March 1 through November 30 during the years 1992, 1993, 1994, and 1995.

4 The proposed weather modification operation is to be conducted for and on behalf of the Colorado River Municipal Water District, P.O. Box 869, Big Spring, Texas 79721-0869.

5. The proposed weather modification operation is to be carried out in both an "operational area" and a "target area" to cause the intended effects to occur only in the target area. The operational area is that area described as being the area between an outer boundary which is defined by a line that encompasses the block of counties of Lynn, Garza, Kent, Fisher, Nolan, Runnels, Coke, Sterling, Glasscock, Martin and Dawson, and an inner boundary which is that of the target area.

6. The area to be affected by the proposed weather modification operation is the target area. The target area is that area described as bounded by a line beginning at a point of origin at Big Spring, Texas, and running along Highway 87 in a northwesterly direction to Lamesa; thence, north-northeast on Highway 87 to the north border of Dawson County; thence, east along the northern boundary lines of Dawson, Borden, and Scurry Counties to Highway 84; thence, southeast along Highway 84 to Roscoe, in Nolan County; thence, south-southeast to Maryneal; thence, east to the Nolan-Taylor County border; thence, south along the eastern-Nolan County line to the Runnels County border; thence, east along the northern Runnels County line; thence, south along the eastern Runnels County line; thence, west along the southern Runnels County line; thence, north along the western Runnels County line to a point where the southern Coke County line meets Runnels County; thence, west along the southern Coke County line to a point 13 miles south of Robert Lee in Coke County; thence, north to Robert Lee; thence, west to Highway 87 at a point approximately 13 miles northwest of Sterling City; thence, northwesterly along Highway 87 to the point of origin at Big Spring, Texas.

7. The methods and materials to be used in conducting this operation are summarized herein: A licensed meteorologist will select cumuliform clouds for cloud-seeding using a weather radar display, standard meteorological analyses, forecast techniques, observations, and pilot reports to direct an aircraft equipped to dispense the seeding particles, silver iodide crystals, into the updraft air at cloud base.

8. Persons interested in knowing more about the technical aspects of the proposed operation should contact the applicant or the Weather & Climate Section of the Commission.

9. If at least 25 eligible persons make a written request for a hearing, the Commission shall hold a public hearing on this application. Those eligible to request a hearing are all persons at least 18 years of age who reside or own property within the boundaries of the proposed weather modification operational area. A request for hearing must contain (1) the signature, full name, address, and phone number of each person requesting a hearing; (2) a statement that each person requesting a hearing is at least 18 years of age and resides or owns property within the proposed operational area; and (3) a brief description of each requester's interest and how that interest would be adversely affected by the granting of this application.

Requests for hearing must be received by the Commission within 30 days after the first publication of this notice. All requests for hearing should be mailed to the Executive Director, Texas Water Commission, P.O. Box 13087, Capitol Station, Austin, Texas 78711-3087. Further information concerning the hearing on this application may be obtained from Claire Arenson, Chief Hearing's Examiner, Office of Hearings Examiners, at the same address or by calling (512) 463-7875.


