Illegal Dumping, Indecency With Child Reported

Last Thursday sheriff's officers were called to a location two miles east and a mile north of New Home where someone had illegally dumped eight barrels of an unknown solution on County Rd. M. The Environmental Protection Agency was notified as the barrels possibly contained some kind of hazardous chemical. Sheriff Jerry Franklin said some progress has been made in efforts to determine the source of the material.

Whoever dumped the barrels then apparently ruptured them with blasts from a shotgun, the sheriff said.

The mother of an 8-year-old girl told Tahoka police officers that her daughter had been inappropriately touched by an 18-year-old youth, who denied the charges. Investigation of the incident is continuing.

Police also were advised by Josefina Rangel that her 1986 Chevrolet pickup had been damaged on the front sometime during the last week in an unknown manner.

Lynn County jail was holding 48 inmates as of early this week, including 15 for Garza County, 10 for Lubbock, three for Gaines and two for Dawson County. The seven most recent additions to the list were arrested for warrants from Lubbock and Garza counties, application to revoke probation on conviction for manufacture and delivery of a controlled substance, driving while license invalid, assault, and possession of marijuana under two ounces.

Filing Period Opens For May 12 Elections

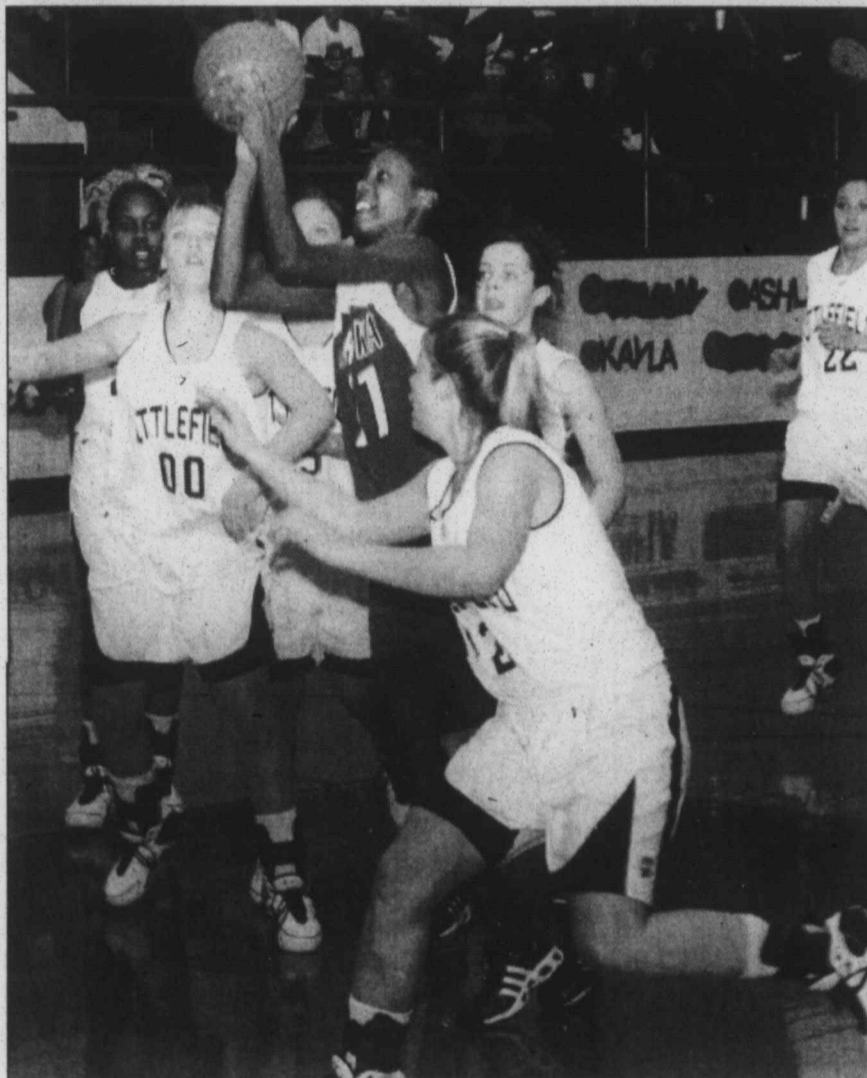
The filing period for city, school and hospital board elections in Lynn County opened this week, with Monday, Feb. 12 the official first day to file for a place on the ballot at the main offices of the respective entities. Filing will continue through March 12, with elections to be held on May 12.

Lynn County Hospital District will have an election for two directors, both of whom will have three-year terms. City elections in Lynn County are for two-year terms, and school board trustees generally serve three-year terms (unless designated as an unexpired term).

Wilson ISD will have four trustee positions on the ballot this year, with three regular terms, and a one-year unexpired term open due to a trustee moving away from the district. Tahoka and O'Donnell ISD have three trustee seats up for election, and two of the incumbents in O'Donnell have already filed this week for re-election. Mark Roye and Kirby Williams both filed for re-election at OISD on Monday, the opening day of the filing period.

New Home ISD officials indicate that their school board election will be held in November this year, with four positions to fill. Terms expiring are for Kevin Mitchell, Angie Kieth and Michael White, and to fill the position held by Charles Burenheide who resigned in December when his wife Annette was hired by the school district as a science teacher. The filing period for the November election will be held at a later date.

City elections in the county include three council seats in O'Donnell, two council seats and a mayoral term in both New Home and Tahoka, and four council seats (one is an unexpired term) in Wilson. One person has filed during the opening day, with Mayor Mike Mensch filing for re-election as Tahoka Mayor.

The New Home Lady Leopards basketball team advanced to bi-district playoff action Tuesday night, facing Wellman-Union in Division II Class A action.

Lady Dogs Bow To Wildcats In Bi-District Play

The Tahoka Lady Bulldogs were pushed out of playoff hopes by the Littlefield Lady Wildcats Tuesday night, in Class 2A bi-district playoff action at Sundown. Littlefield, who won 46-41, led the entire game, although the Lady Bulldogs closed in to within one point a couple of times late in the fourth quarter.

Tahoka scored most of their points in the fourth period, actually outscoring Littlefield 20-17 in the last quarter, but the Lady Wildcats took the lead from the get-go, tossing in several three pointers to get a 11-2 lead early in the first period, and leading 22-16 at the half.

Tahoka trailed by one, 32-31, with 3:23 remaining in the fourth, but the Wildcats tossed in a 2-pointer, leading 34-31 at 2:35 left. Tahoka closed in again, 34-33 with 2:19 remaining, but were unable to catch the Wildcats, who ran up 7 points and maintained a 5-point margin until the buzzer.

Littlefield had three players in double figures, while Tahoka's Kyra Helm paced the Lady Bulldogs with 17 points, and Cori Vega added 9.

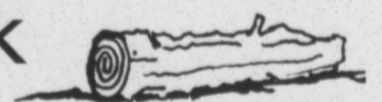
Coach Steve Fancher's Lady Bulldogs ended a good season with a 10-21 record.

Trustees extended Zant's contract with a \$3,000 salary increase, which will raise his salary from the current \$64,000 to \$67,000 for the 2007-08 school year.

Hospital Searching For New Physician

At a meeting of directors last Thursday, Lynn County Hospital Administrator Jimmy Morris reported on the progress of a search for a new fulltime physician to succeed Dr. Griffith Thomas, who has resigned his practice in Tahoka effective March 1.

Morris also said there are plans to keep the clinic now operated by Dr. Thomas open for three days a week once Dr. Thomas has left, probably with physicians brought in on a temporary basis, so that Dr. Thomas' patients may continue to be treated at the hospital.

Records of Dr. Thomas' patients will remain at the clinic and will be available to those patients, Morris said.

The board officially approved a resolution calling for an election of two directors on May 12, with early voting to be conducted at the county clerk's office

starting Monday, April 30 and ending Tuesday, May 8.

Terms of Dalton Wood and Virginia Griffing are scheduled to expire. Anyone wishing to seek election to the hospital board may obtain the proper papers for filing at the office of the hospital administrator.

Ms. Griffing was sworn in to fill out the remaining term of Joan Knox, who resigned.

The board approved the annual assessment of community needs as related to the hospital.

President Jerry Ford presided at the meeting attended by members Wood, Griffing, Regina Crutcher, Jannis Horwood and Cal Huffaker. Member Billy Tomlinson was absent.

City Audit Approved; Road Closure Discussed

Tahoka City Council met in regular session Monday night, Feb. 12, approving the city's financial audit for 2006 as presented by Joe Hays, CPA. Hays presented the information to the council, noting that the audit had received a "clean" report.

Several guests met with the council, including Lynn County Judge H.G. Franklin, Commissioner Brad Hammonds, John Baker, and four TxDOT representatives including Steve Warren, Jim Conklin, Ernie Lucero and Steve Renfro, for discussion with city officials regarding the possible closure of a portion of Loop 472, as requested by county officials. The closure would be in conjunction with a courthouse renovation project, to re-establish the "square" around the courthouse where currently the road curves through the western portion of the former "square". A \$3.5 million courthouse renovation project has received grant approval from the Texas Historical Commission, but one of the conditions in the grant proposal is the re-establishment of the courthouse square.

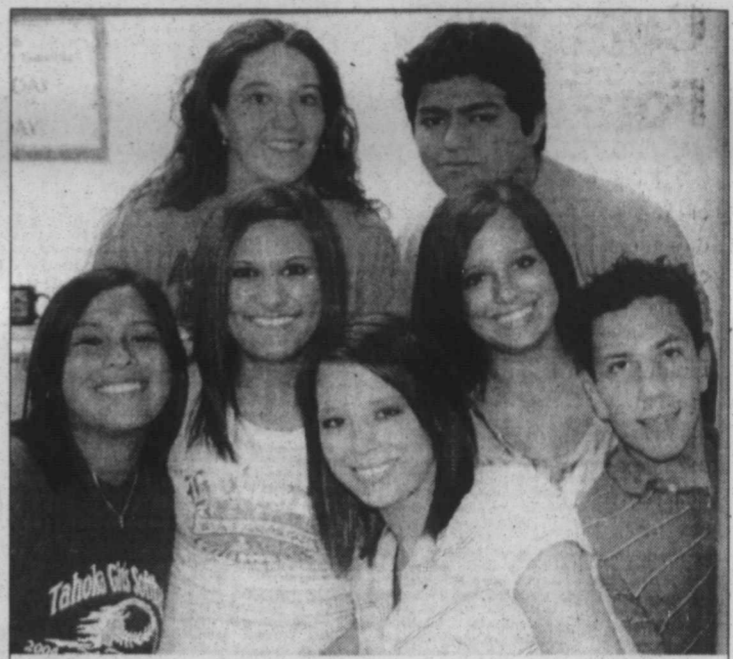
City and county officials agreed to conduct a public meeting to receive input from

local citizens regarding the proposal before the city reaches a decision, but a meeting date has not yet been set. At the heart of the issue is who will be responsible for maintaining the road if the proposal is approved. Currently, the road is designated as Loop 472 and the highway department maintains the road. If the closure is approved, TxDOT will seek an abandonment for Loop 472, and the road will become city property, from the north city limit to the south city limit (including the Hwy. 87 on-ramps and off-ramps), which would require city funding for maintenance.

In other business, Mayor Mike Mensch declared 2007 as "Colon Cancer Prevention and Awareness Year," signing a proclamation to that effect.

Monthly bills were paid, and Police Chief Doyle Lee presented a report on the Tahoka Police Department.

Mayor Mike Mensch presided at the meeting, with council members Rudy Fuentes, Clara Calvillo, Jeff Martin and Ray Box present, as well as City Administrator Jerry Webster and city attorneys Cal Huffaker and Dennis Scott. Council member Amy Preston was absent.

County Okays Contract For Collecting Fines

Lynn County Commissioners met in routine session Monday morning, considering several issues relating to county business. Danny Barrett with the firm of Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins and Mott, LLP, presented information regarding his firm's procedures for collecting fines and fees for Justice of Peace offices, and commissioners unanimously approved a contract with the firm for collection of overdue fines and fees for Lynn County.

An annual contract with the City of O'Donnell was approved regarding the county's \$1875 annual contribution to the O'Donnell Fire Department. The county also contributes annually to the other fire departments in the county, giving \$4500 to the Tahoka VFD, and \$1125 each to the Wilson and New Home fire departments. The amount is based on each fire department's coverage area and number of fire calls answered each year, among other factors.

In other business, commissioners accepted a revised contract with AB Construction for repairs to the Lynn County Extension office building roof, in the amount of \$13,480.

Jimmy Woodard, Emergency Services Districts Coordinator for the State of Texas, presented information regarding

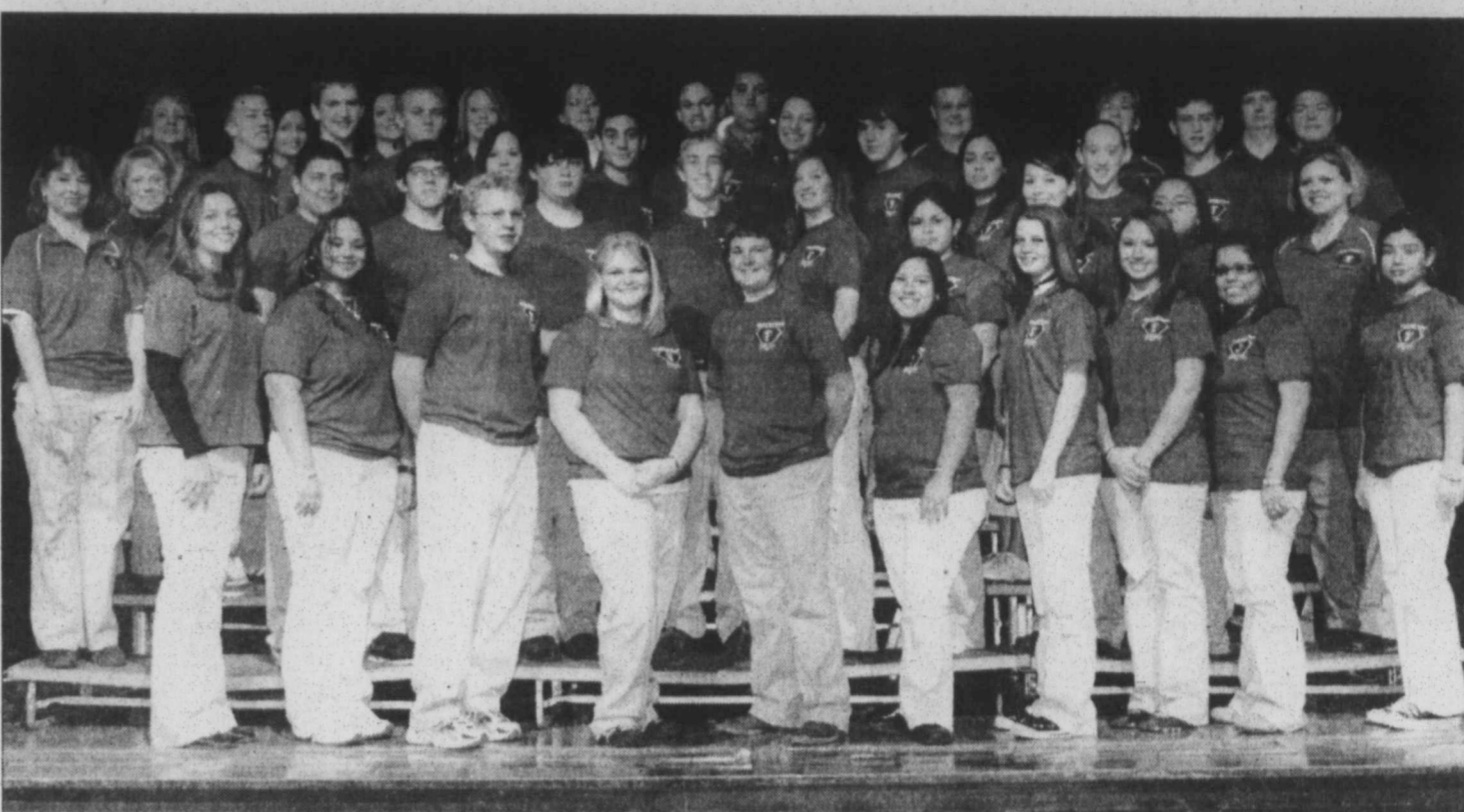
Emergency Service Districts for commissioners to consider. He informed commissioners of options for obtaining funding for emergency services, including ambulance service and fire departments, in the county. No action was taken, but commissioners indicated they would keep the information for further consideration.

Sheriff Jerry D. Franklin presented a report on the Sheriff's Department, and informed commissioners that the department had received "Lifescan" equipment through a Homeland Security grant.

"We expect to get the Lifescan equipment installed this week," said the Sheriff. "The Lifescan allows a fingerprint scan that we can send directly to a database in Washington, D.C., as part of a terrorism identification program," he explained. "This grant has supplied \$75,000 worth of equipment to each county in Texas, and will aid us making positive IDs. The cost to the county was minimal," he added.

Monthly bills were approved as presented.

County Judge H.G. Franklin presided at the meeting, with all four commissioners present, including Brad Hammonds, Don Morton, Mike Braddock and Don Blair.

HEALTH NEWS FROM LYNN COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT

KNOW YOUR NUMBERS

In conclusion to the "know your numbers" series, we'll take a look at blood pressure. Your blood pressure consists of two numbers, systolic and diastolic.

The **systolic measurement** is the pressure of blood against your artery walls just as your heart finishes a beat (contracting). It is the first number, or the number on the top of a blood pressure reading. The normal adult systolic pressure is 119 mmHg or below. 120 mmHg - 139 mmHg is considered pre-hypertensive, and 140 mmHg or above is considered to be high.

The **diastolic measurement** is the pressure of blood against your artery walls when your heart is relaxed between beats. It is the second or bottom number of the blood pressure reading. The normal adult diastolic pressure is 79 mmHg or below. 80 mmHg - 89 mmHg is considered pre-hypertensive, and 90 mmHg is considered high. So a good blood pressure for an average adult would be 119 mmHg / 79 mmHg or less.

You may have noticed that what is considered to be the "normal" range is a little bit lower than it was in the past. New studies show the risk of heart disease and stroke begins to increase at lower blood pressures than previously believed, health experts lowered the acceptable normal range to promote more aggressive and earlier treatment of high blood pressure.

So, what causes **high blood pressure**, also known as **hypertension**? In most cases your health care provider may not be able to pinpoint the exact cause of your high blood pressure, but several factors are known to increase blood pressure. These include obesity, heavy alcohol use, smoking, family history, high salt intake, aging, sedentary lifestyle, and stress. Most people never know they have high blood pressure because it rarely causes symptoms; however, occasionally people will experience headache, visual disturbances, nausea or vomiting. Because of the general lack of symptoms, hypertension has been nicknamed "the silent killer".

Hypertension when left untreated can damage the arteries, heart, kidneys, and can lead to heart attack and stroke.

Generally health care providers will not diagnose hypertension based on one single abnormal reading. The diagnosis is usually made after 3 or more abnormal readings that are taken 1 or 2 weeks apart. Treatment of hypertension include lifestyle changes including weight loss, using less salt, exercising more, decreasing the amount of alcohol consumed, and stopping smoking. If these changes aren't effective, or if the person's blood pressure was too high to start with, the health care provider will likely start the person on anti-hypertensive medication.

Some people experience a different blood pressure problem called hypotension. **Hypotension** is the medical term for "low blood pressure". In healthy people, especially athletes, low blood pressure can be a signal of good cardiovascular health. But, for others hypotension can be a sign of an underlying problem.

What causes low blood pressure? Its cause is not always clear, but can be associated with many abnormalities, some of which include abnormal thyroid function, use of some over the counter medications, heat exhaustion, loss of blood, abnormal body temperature, dehydration, severe allergic reaction. Some common symptoms of hypotension include dizziness, lightheadedness, and shortness of breath especially when rising from a lying or seated position. Treatment for hypotension include increased intake of salt and non alcoholic fluids, instructions to rise slowly from a lying or seated position, avoiding prolonged exposure to the heat and hot water, and in addition the health care provider may prescribe medication.

Blood pressure norms vary due to many factors, so have yours checked regularly and always consult your healthcare provider before making any changes in your medications or lifestyle.

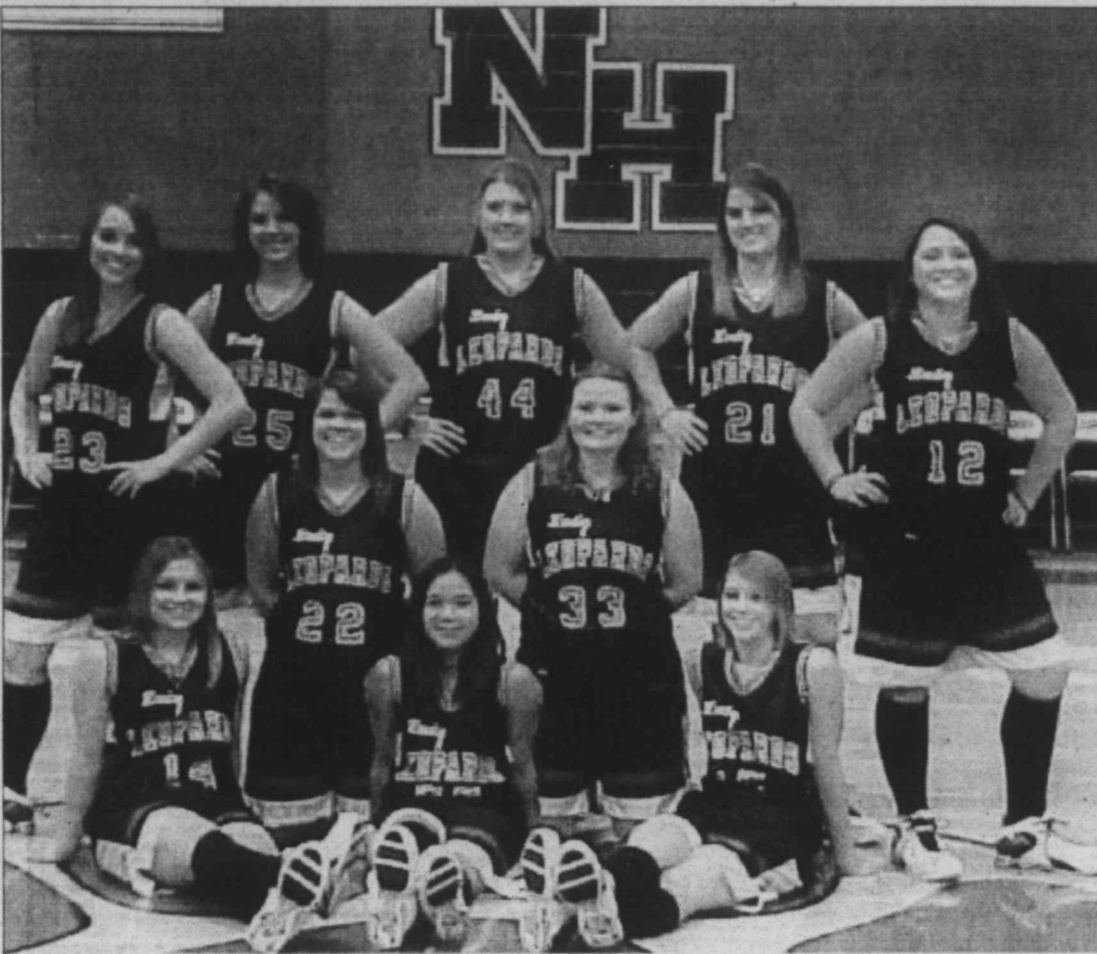

TISD Administrative Salaries Approved by Board of Trustees

Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees met last Thursday night, approving a slate of administrative salaries and calling for an election in May for three trustee positions.

Six administrative positions were considered, with contract extensions and salary increases approved as follows: High School Principal Troy Hinds, one-year extension on contract with \$1,500 raise, which will make the principal's salary \$63,500 for the 2007-08 school year; Athletic Director/Assistant Principal Drew Stone, one-year extension on contract with \$1,500 raise, to \$53,500; Elementary Principal James Baker, one-year extension on contract with \$1,200 raise, to \$64,700; Elementary Assistant Principal Alecia Hancock, contract changed from a probationary contract to a two-year term contract with a \$1,200 raise, to \$50,700; Middle School Principal Tom Thomas, contract changed from a probationary to a two-year term contract with a \$1,500 raise, to \$59,500; and Curriculum Director/Testing Coordinator Jenni McLelland, one-year extension on contract with \$1,500 raise, to \$54,500. All motions were approved unanimously by the seven trustees, except in the motion for Jenni McLelland, when trustee Frank McLelland abstained from voting, and that motion carried 6-0.

Trustees retired to closed session for two hours prior to proposing administrative contracts.

An election for the purpose of electing trustees for three places, Precinct 1, 2 and 5, was set for May 12, with Jackie Stephens appointed as election

judge, Connie Hallmark as alternate judge, and Susan Tipton as early voting judge. The seats are currently held by Joe Calvillo (Pct. 1), Carmen Chapa (Pct. 2) and Kent Kahl (Pct. 5). All are single-member districts, which means only those voters residing in those designated precincts may vote. Candidates for those positions, however, are not required to live in the designated precinct, as long as they reside within the school district. The election will be held at the Life Enrichment Center. Candidates may apply at the school business office, at the Harvick Educational Center on Main Street. Filing deadline is March 12.

In other business, trustees selected the construction management method as the best value for the renovation of the middle school and high school science labs, and named Grimes and Associates as the construction managers for the project.

Trustees designated that the proposed 2007-08 school calendar be placed in *The Lynn County News* for a two-week

period to allow public consideration of the calendar, and trustees plan to adopt a calendar at their March 8 meeting. The proposed calendar has students beginning on Aug. 27, Christmas break from Dec. 24-Jan. 4, Spring Break on March 17-21, and the final day of school on May 29, with commencement on May 30, 2008. Homecoming is designated for Sept. 21, 2007.

Trustees gave approval for the district to apply for a waiver to modify school schedules on TAKS testing days, and to apply for a waiver that allows three staff development days in lieu of instruction. The 2007-08 Head Start contract was also approved. A resolution for the district to join the Texas Building and Procurement Commission was adopted unanimously.

Present at the meeting were Board President Math Bartley and trustees Carmen Chapa, Jimmy Dorman, Kent Kahl, Joe Calvillo, Valton Stephens and Frank McLelland, Superintendent Jimmy Parker, and other administrative staff.
