Tahoka Man's Arrest Part **Of Major Drug Ring Bust**

TAHOKA, LYNN COUNTY, TEXAS

Three alleged members of a major cocaine trafficking organization operating in the area were arrested Thursday morning by federal, state and local law enforcement officers, including the Lynn County sheriff's department and Tahoka Police Dept. along with several other agencies.

One of the three, Wovencelado Tijerina, 60, was arrested in Tahoka. The others arrested last week were Alex Romo Rios, 47 of Lubbock and Noel Peralez Tijerina, 41, Lubbock. Officers here said the younger Tijerina was the son of the man arrested in

U.S. Atty. Richard B. Roper of the Northern District of Texas said the arrests were the culmination of a threeyear investigation. Those arrested were three of six defendants charged in an 18-count federal indictment returned in Lubbock last month and unsealed last week. All six, two of whom are still at large, are charged with conspiracy to distribute and possess withintent to distribute five kilograms or more of cocaine. If convicted, each defendant faces a maximum statutory sentence of life in prison and a fine of up to \$4 million.

During the last week, Tahoka Police arrested a 46-year-old man for allegedly striking a 46-year-old Tahoka



woman in a domestic violence incident and were called to the scene of a dispute between neighbors in which a woman reportedly shot at a man with a BB gun and he sprayed her with a water hose. No charges were filed in the incident at a north Tahoka location.

Lynn County jail was overrun with prisoners after 11 persons were jailed last weekend, bringing the total Monday to 57, with 35 of these being Lynn County inmates, "The jail is not supposed to hold more than 54 prisoners on an extended basis," said Sheriff Jerry D. Franklin Monday, "but we can take care of more than that on a temporary basis." He said some of those arrested over the weekend likely would be bonded out Monday or Tuesday, alleviating the crowded conditions.

Of the 57 in jail Monday, 13 were held for Garza County, four for Lubbock, three for Gaines and two for Dawson County.

Those most recently jailed were arrested on these charges: grand jury indictment for fabricating physical evidence, Dawson County warrant, application to revoke probation on conviction of burglary of a habitation, possession of marijuana (four persons), driving while license invalid (two persons), and driving while intoxicated/second

Area producers are gearing up for the 2007 cotton crop with more optimism than last year. Over six inches of rain have fallen for 2007 compared to 2.43 inches for the same time in 2006. "As we head towards planting, it is certainly beneficial to have the soil moisture profile full," said Bryan Reynolds, County Extension Agent for Lynn County.

"Our chances of getting the crop off to a better start are much better with the current moisture levels as compared to last year," said Reynolds. "November and December of 2006 saw over twoinches of rain so that helped get us going and with the amount of rain we have seen this Spring, our chances look so much better than this time last year,"

Another benefit of the rain is that producers have had to do very little prewatering with irrigation systems which in turn can save them a tremendous amount of money before they plant a

"With the ever increasing cost of production, anytime our growers can save money, it only helps them out in the end," said Reynolds.

Area cotton growers will start planting cotton around the first of May and continue until mid-June. Soil temperatures are currently at 58°F for the 10-day minimum average at the 8-inch

"We saw soil temperatures warming rapidly through March and early April until the Easter cold spell dropped them back into the upper 40 range," said Reynolds. Ideally, cotton (See COTTON, page 2)

Early Voting Starts Monday For May 12 Elections Here

Proceeds will go toward training of volunteers; purchase of

Early voting for the May 12 elections begins Monday, April 30 and continues through May 8 at various locations in Lynn County. A special Constitutional Amendment Election is being held statewide, with only one amendment on the ballot, regarding reduction of property taxes on homesteads of elderly/disabled whose taxes were frozen at a higher rate than the 2006-07 tax years. Early voting for the Constitutional Amendment election will be held at the Lynn County Clerk's office, located on the first floor of the county courthouse.

Additionally, four local entities have scheduled elections for trustees or council members, including Tahoka ISD, Wilson ISD, and O'Donnell city and school district.

Early voting for the Tahoka ISD election will be conducted at the Lynn County Clerk's Office during regular business hours (8 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday). The Tahoka ISD election is for the Precinct 2 seat, with only those registered voters residing within the Precinct 2 area eligible to vote in the election (a precinct map is available at the TISD business office at the Harvick Building on Main Street, or at the early voting site). Two candidates are seeking the term, including incumbent Joe Calvillo and challenger Carlos

Early voting for Wilson ISD election will be conducted at the Wilson ISD Business Office, from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. on regular business days. Four trustee positions are on the ballot, including three regular-term positions, and a one-year unexpired term. Candidates for the full terms include incumbent Janie Rios, Casey Donald, Cody Donald, and write-in candidate Israel Ramirez. A write-in candidate, Danny Mendez, has also filed for the one-year unexpired term.

In O'Donnell, early voting for the city election will be held at O'Donnell City Hall, from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. on Monday-Friday, and the city office will remain open late on a couple of days to allow early voting to be conducted in the evening hours. On May 3 and May 8, the city office will remain open until 8 p.m. for early voting, according to city officials. Five candidates have filed for three city council seats, including incumbents Wayne Mott, Willie Luera and Roger Doss, and challengers Jesse Ray Perez and Paul Houston.

O'Donnell ISD will conduct early voting at the OISD Administration Office, from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. weekdays. Five candidates have filed for three regular terms as school trustees, including three incumbents, Mark Roye, Ben Franklin and Kirby Williams, and challengers Cody Furlow and Liz Luera.

seeds germinate best when the 10 day minimum average gets. above 60°F.

With the increased interest in alternative fuels and higher grain prices, some producers may be looking at grain sorghum instead of cotton for 2007. Wheat, corn. and grain sorghum prices are as high as they have been in a number of years, so that may attract a few growers to look at alterna-

"Lynn County will not see a huge shift in the number of acres from cotton to grains because cotton has been proven to work best here," said Reynolds. "However, I do hear more interest in producers wanting to set up some rotational systems of wheat, grain sorghum and cot-

ton," Reynolds added. Prospects look better at getting the '07 crop going, but producers are also watching the scene in Washington D.C. where legislators are working on a new farm bill.

'Most farmers in this area like the system we have and would be in favor of extending the current farm bill" said Reynolds.

Growers will keep a watchful eye on this as the summary progresses to see what impact any new legislation will have on their operations.


Bryan Nelson Campbell





SWING BED PROGRAM AT LCHD

What is Swing Bed? It is a sub-acute program for Medicare patients who have been in the hospital for at least 3 days, and are ready for discharge under Medicare criteria but need a little extra care before they go home. Swing stay? The patient's length of stay Bed is the name for sub-acute care started by Medicare in 1969.

paid for by Medicare part A for patients who meet certain criteria. The physician and the Swing Bed coordinator carefully screen patients to insure their appropriateness for the program. The patient is responsible for their deductible. Medicare pays for reasonable and customary daily expenses. Each Medicare patient has 20 days that are fully reimbursed, and 80 days that are partially reimbursed. If the patient's stay should continue past the 20th day, he/she would be responsible for a portion of the charges. The 100 days start over if the patient is not admitted to the hospital for the next 60 days.

What is "sub-acute" care? The Swing Bed patient is stable, and does not require the same in-

tense attention as he/she did in the acute care settings. The patient's physician writes orders, and the patient will receive the same quality care as before; however, the physician is not required to make

What is the average length of depends on his/her needs. The minimum stay is 5 days. Each Who pays for it? Swing Bed is week an interdisciplinary team meets to discuss each patient's plan of care, progress, future needs and what can be done to ensure each patient returns to optimal health. The average length of stay is 2-6 weeks.

What services are available in Swing Bed? The patient's physician may order any or all of the following services: Physical therapy, Occupational therapy, Speech therapy, nursing, social services, nutritional assessment, and activities.

Discharge Planning A discharge planner is utilized to plan and prepare for the patient's needs once he/she is discharged home. For Further Information contact



O'Donnell Independent School District Board of Trustees met in regular session last Tuesday, April 17, but the meeting included an unusual agenda item, which was the conduction of a non-renewal hearing for a member of the teaching staff there. The hearing, which lasted about five hours, was conducted in the elementary school commons area, after which trustees reconvened in the boardroom and unanimously voted to nonrenew the term contract of Julie Heathington, who teaches. home economics. The. nonrenewal is effective at the end of this school year.

During open forum at the beginning of the regular board meeting, Mr. Dusty Palmer spoke on behalf of a fellow professional to the board of trustees, according to the report from Superintendent Rodney Schneider.

The Board recognized several students in the Celebration of Excellence recognition, for their exemplary work in qualifying for the state science fair last month. The students included Andy Miers, Caleb Schneider, Tabitha Escobedo, Hayden Popnoe, Bailey Brewer and Lauren Botkin.

The school district's depository contract with State National Bank of O'Donnell was extended for two years, to encompass the 2007-09 school years, by unanimous decision of the board.

Supt. Schneider informed trustees that he was seeking estimates for possibly constructing a cover for several buses, and that work has begun on one of the school-owned houses that was recently vacated. He also informed the board of the resignation of Ms. Susan Roberts and Ms. Karen Dillman, effective at the end of this school. Both of these teachers will be joining another school system, and the superintendent expressed the board's appreciation for their years of service to the students of O'Donnell.

Financial and enrollment reports were given, and Supt. Schneider informed trustees of upcoming board training opportunities. He also told trustees that as a result of the diligence of high school principal Clay Burns the district has received a \$47,670 amendment award to their Cycle 3 CSR - High School Initiative Continuation Grant. The amended amount brings the total award of this grant to \$152,670. The CSR grant was originally approved (\$105,000) for the 2004-05 school year, and is aimed at improving instructional opportunities for high school

Campus principals Clay Burns and Penny Forbes also presented information on current activities.

The next board meeting was set for Tuesday, May 24.
