


# Sammy McCrary Announces **Candidacy For District Attorney**







### SIDE EFFECTS OF COLD MEDICINES For the past week you may have

heard stories in the news warning you not to give your babies and toddlers over-the-counter cough and cold medicines. The Food and Drug Administration still hasn't decided if the remedies are appropriate for older children to continue using them, but they've decided that they're definitely too risky for our

Word is that parents should not give OTC cough and cold medicines for children under age 2 "because serious and potentially life-threatening side effects can occur." Many people don't consider an OTC medicine as a danger or a medicine that could pose a problem, especially if they've used it with an older child who seemed to get better. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention reported more than 1,500 babies and toddlers visited emergency rooms over a 2 year period due to suffering from serious side effects associated with OTC medications. And to top that off, some studies suggest that there is no evidence that these oral drugs actually ease cold symptoms in children so young, while other studies suggest they do no good at all

The greatest danger seen is unintentional overdoses. For example, the same decongestants, cough suppressants and antihistamines are in multiple products, so using more than one to address different symp-

toms, or having multiple caregivers administer doses, can quickly add up. Also, children's medicines are supposed to be measured with the dropper or measuring cap that comes with each product, not an inaccurate kitchen teaspoon.

Now, many of us with grown children who gave our children OTC medicines and managed to raise them without them growing three green heads may be asking why is this is an issue now? We had common sense about how we gave the medicine, parents of today should too. Child versions of cold remedies were allowed on the market decades ago, when scientists thought that what worked in adults would automatically work in children. Scientists today know that is not always the case. We know chil-

dren are not little adults. The FDA is also asking an even bigger question: Are OTC cold remedies safe and effective for children under 12? They haven't reached a consensus about children ages 2 to 11 years old yet, but the goal is a spring announcement

In the meantime, for older children the FDA recommends carefully following the label's directions, being very careful if you give more than I product to a child. If you give 2 medicines, check the ingredients to avoid an unintentional overdose. Understand that these medications only treat the symptoms. Colds are viruses and the drugs will not make them go away.





# NAP Insurance **Closing Date**

Set March 15

Producers in need of insurance coverage for Spring and Fall annually planted crops under the Noninsured Crop Assistance Program (NAP) have until March 25, 2008 to apply for coverage on certain crops for which the catastrophic level of insurance is not regularly available, said Rodney Schoppa Name,) Executive Director for the Lynn County Farm Service Agency (FSA).

"Crop insurance is an important risk management tool for producers, but it's not available for all crops. That's why NAP is so important," said Schoppa.

NAP is a federally funded program that provides financial assistance to producers of noninsurable crops when low yields, loss of inventory or prevented planting occurs because of natural disasters.

"Producers must apply for coverage before disaster strikes," said Schoppa "Like regular crop insurance, once an application period closes, the opportunity to obtain coverage is gone."

NAP applications for coverage on the following crops must be filed and service fees paid, by March 15, 2008, the

NAP coverage requires a service fee of \$100 per crop, per producer with a \$300 cap per county. Out-of-pocket expenses will not exceed \$900 for any producer, even if production occurs in multiple counties. Service fees may be waived for eligible limited resource producers.

Crops eligible for NAP coverage are those for which standard crop insurance is not Ricky Meeks and Leonard available, and include fruits and Nettles. Meeks began working vegetables, aquaculture, pecans, turfgrass and forage crops.





Board President Clyde Wilke led the meeting, with trustee Ricky Cross absent.


