

### Scam targets elderly Hispanics

In the last two weeks, at least two older Hispanic citizens of Tahoka have been bilked of money by someone phoning them from Mexico and claiming to be a relative needing money, Tahoka Police Dept. reported this week.

Police Lt. Hipolito Zuniga said he spoke Tuesday with a woman who said her uncle, a resident of Tahoka, had sent \$1,000 to an address in Mexico after talking with someone who claimed to be a nephew needing money. The name given to the uncle was the same as that of a relative, but a later call back to the phone number given by the caller showed no such number.

Lt. Zuniga also said that another Tahoka resident lost \$800 in the same way last week. "We would like to warn anybody receiving phone calls seeking money to be sent to relatives or anyone else, especially to Mexico, to be very careful," he said.

He also asked that anyone knowing of others here who have lost money to this scam call the Tahoka Police Dept.

Tahoka Police Monday also took a report of a burglary in the city. Clara Calvillo advised that an 'Apple iPad valued at \$375 had been stolen from the Calvillo home on N. 1st St. after entry was gained by breaking a window, with that damage estimated at \$150. Investigation is continuing.






"It was that money, from last year's auction, that jump started this remodeling project," Hol-land says, although he does admit that the project cost more than the \$30,000 raised at the 2012 auction. The hospital had previously purchased the building with intentions of repurposing it for the wellness clinic and fitness center, but the plans had not moved to the building stage. Holland took the project and ran with it, with the goal of not only serving the community's needs but have a project using auction nds that was tangible, and highly visible to local residents.

"It was really a blessing in that it just seemed the money was here to get the project going. Ten months later it is in the finishing stages with no money borrowed, and we are targeting the first weekend in March as move-in date for the wellness clinic, with the fitness/therapy center to move in a couple of weeks later," Holland says. "By the time of this year's auction, people will be able to see where the money raised last year was put to good

The remodeling project is a tangible way for local residents to see that their donations are coming back to serve the community in meaningful ways. This year, Holland is asking the community to begin thinking about the upcoming auction on April 27, and to consider the possibility of raising more than they have ever done before. "I'm not one to beg," says Hol-

land. "Look at what this money has already done for us! I want to say thank you and to let this community know that we at the hospital have devoted our lives to providing quality healthcare that the community deserves and wants. But this year I want to challenge the community

to help us with something we really, really need - a new telemetry system," he added.

Telemetry provides remote continuous monitoring of patients' blood pressure, heart rhythm, and other necessary vital signs to the nurses' station. Holland says the current telemetry system is worn out and so outdated that the company says they can no longer repair it due to the parts no longer being

"The hospital directors and I spent hours discussing the needs of the hospital and focusing on what would most improve the services here, and it became obvious that a new telemetry system is what we need. Unfortunately, the cost is about \$90,000 for the system that we need, which would work with our current electronic medical records system - which is another. improvement that the hospital finalized during the past year," he

It's an upgrade that may not be as readily visible to the public as the remodeling project, but Holland hopes that by letting the public know what the hospital needs,

even better than ever before. "Let me explain, also, another reason we need a new telemetry system for patients," said Holland. "We have hired a new physician, Dr. Bill Grant, who is an internal medicine physician, who we hope to have here by April. Dr. Grant is a very giving, very nurturing person, whose internal medicine focus will add to the care provided by our general physicians on staff," he

Holland hopes that by having an internal medicine physician on staff that patients needing such services will no longer be required to seek medical expertise in Lubbock or elsewhere, but can be admitted to the hospital here for care.

"Internal medicine is a different focus from general practice, with many of these patients requiring hospital care, that they could get here with an internal medicine physician. With that care, we are going to need the new telemetry system for the future success of our hospital," the administrator

"I want our hospital to not only be strong and successful, but to grow and prosper as we meet the needs of the community," said Holland. "I believe the community wants that as well, and believes in the hospital's future. I am incredibly excited about this year's fundraising auction," he added.

Holland credits the hospital staff with sharing the excitement about the hospital's future, and says many of them have gone above and beyond in their service to the hospital during the year he has been

"The staff has gotten excited about changes here - they want the hospital to improve, they've textured walls and made other improvements and suggestions. They seem to be excited about the hospital's prospects and they have shared their excitement with the community, and that in turn has brought growth in admissions and services to the hospital," he said.

"All of this just continues to reaffirm that this is the best place to live - the people are friendly and neighborly and not afraid to work hard. I believe that we can grow and prosper, and it is my goal to lead the hospital in that direction," said Holland.


