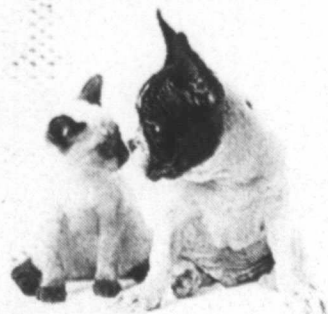

Wilson ISD Supt. John Horak resigns to accept Meridian job

The Wilson Independent School District Board of Trustees accepted the resignation of Superintendent John Horak during a special meeting held Wednesday, April 24 in the school library. Horak has been named the finalist for the superintendent position at Meridian ISD. He will continue to serve WISD through the end of the school year, with his resignation effective on May 31.

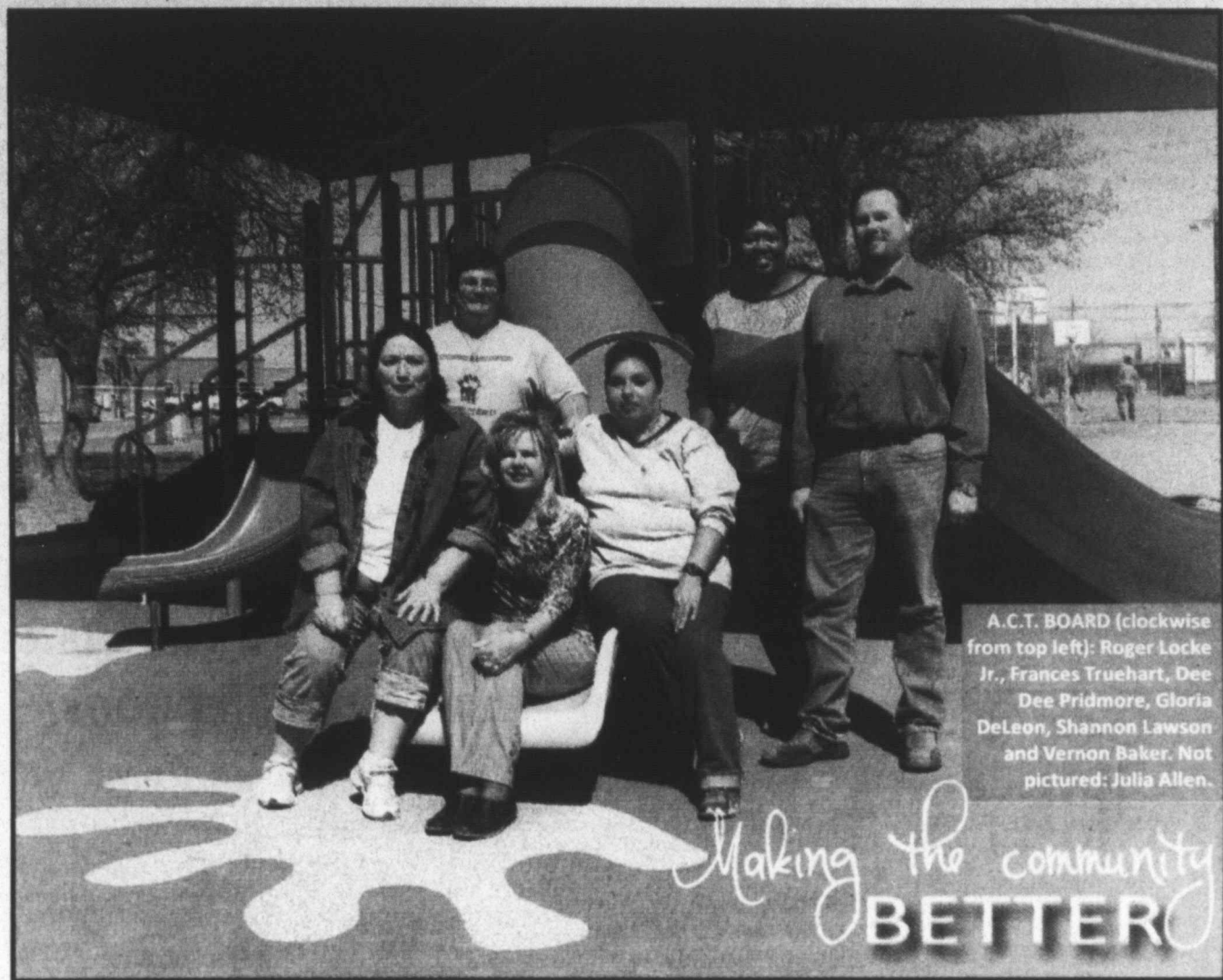
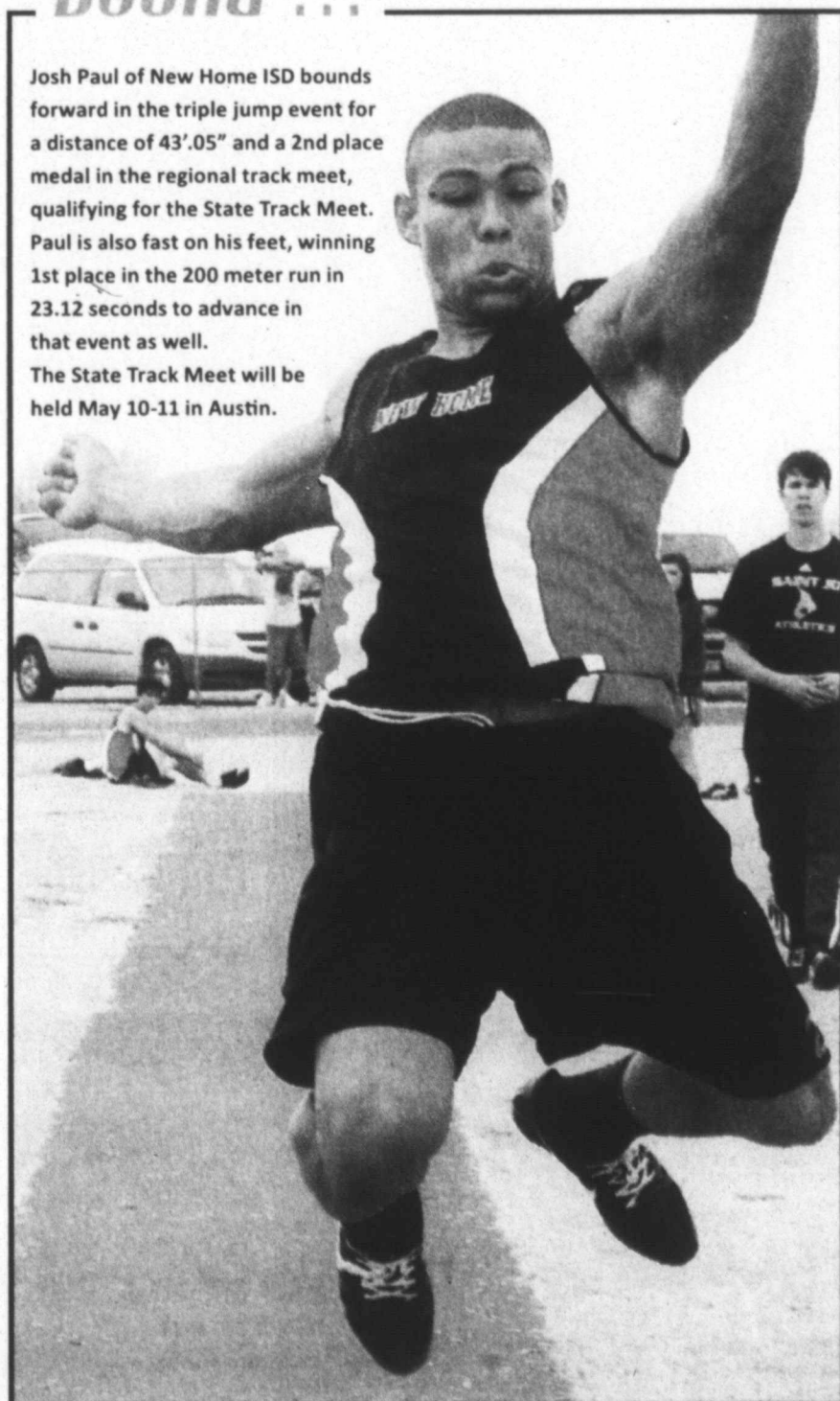
The board named Byron Shelley as interim superintendent and discussed options for beginning a formal search for a new superintendent.

During the regular meeting held Tuesday, April 9, the board approved teacher contracts for the 2013-2014 school year, approved strategic goals for the coming year and heard a review of the Texas Education Agency (TEA) Desk Audit of the Texas Title I Priority Schools (TTIPS) Grant, presented by Vanessa DeLeon, a professional service provider with the Texas Center for District and School Support through TEA Education Service Center Region 13.

The board's next regular meeting is set for 7 p.m., Tuesday, May 14 in the school library at 1411 Green Avenue. Official meeting notices are posted on the door of the school library, and on the district's website.

A.C.T. BOARD AT THE TAHOKA MINI-PARK PLAYGROUND

A.C.T. Board uses half-cent sales tax to improve city pool, parks, & more

For love of their community, the members of the A.C.T. Board in Tahoka undertake projects that improve the quality of life in Tahoka, spending many hours of their own time to research and find solutions that will stretch a limited amount of funding to provide a quality product for each project. It's a daunting task, but an enjoyable one for the seven volunteers, especially when an idea takes hold and becomes a reality.

Julia Allen. Gloria DeLeon served the first two years on the board but requested not to be reappointed for another two-year term, so the board is currently considering another citizen to fill the vacated position. Their recommendation will be presented to the Tahoka City Council, who appoints the board.

The A.C.T. Board's job is to consider economic development/community improvement projects within the state guidelines for expending the 4B sales tax funds. The Board then presents their project ideas to the City Council, who must approve the project before funds may be expended. Once approved by the council, the A.C.T. board then oversees the project to completion. The group meets monthly to discuss and plan projects.

To date, the A.C.T. Board has spent \$67,337.40 on several projects for the city swimming pool, mini-park, signage, and the downtown mural park. These projects are undertaken in phases, with continuing work done as funds become available for each phase.

Following is a general breakdown of how those funds were spent for the betterment of the community, and what future plans are being considered.

• City Pool

\$14,000 expended: Just over \$4,000 was spent on plumbing, electrical and other repairs at the city pool, and another \$10,000 towards the cost of a new filter system at the pool (the city ponied up another \$10,000+ for

It has been slightly more than two years since the A.C.T. (Advancing the Community of Tahoka) Board was formed to spearhead community improvement projects, targeting areas that get daily usage, such as the city mini-park and swimming pool, or that may visually impact the community. The seven members of the committee take their responsibility seriously, to judiciously expend the funds collected from a half-cent city sales tax approved by voters in an election held in 2010.

A total of \$138,110 has been collected since then, including \$26,612 in the latter part of 2010, approximately \$45,250 in sales tax collections in 2011, and \$51,500 in 2012. In the current year, slightly more than \$12,000 has been collected during the first quarter. Nearly half of that amount has been expended on several projects, totaling \$67,337, with a current balance of \$70,773 remaining.

Vernon Baker is chairman of the A.C.T. Board, with members including Dee Dee Pridmore, Shannon Lawson, Frances Truehart, Roger Locke Jr. and

Early voting continues for three area elections

Early voting for three area elections began Monday, April 29 and continues through May 7, at locations in Tahoka and O'Donnell. City/hospital/school board elections slated for May 11 include the City Council Precinct 1 election for the City of Tahoka, and city and school board elections in O'Donnell. All other elections that had originally been scheduled for May 11 were canceled due to unopposed candidates, including the Lynn County Hospital District Board, and other city and school elections in Tahoka, Wilson and New Home.

Early voting for the City of Tahoka District 1 election will be held at the County Clerk's office in the Lynn County Courthouse, during regular business hours. Two 12-hour early voting days will be held April 29 and May 7, when polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. Two candidates are vying for the Dist. 1 seat on the City Council, including incumbent Rudy Fuentes and challenger Justin Antu. Voters must reside within the district location to be eligible to vote (map available at Tahoka City Hall and courthouse).

In O'Donnell, early voting for the OISD Board of Trustees election will be held during regular business hours at the

O'Donnell ISD Administrative Office, at 501 5th St. Eight candidates have filed for three seats on the board, including the three incumbents, Billy Edwards, Jerry Castro and Mark Roye, as well as challengers Landon Mires, Linda Vargas, Rosa Lee Rosales, Melissa Pedroza and Linda Rosales.

There are five candidates in the City of O'Donnell election for three city council members. Early voting will be conducted at O'Donnell City Hall, 615 8th St., during regular business hours, with two 12-hour days scheduled for May 2-3, when the polling location will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. Incumbent Wayne Mott and candidates Spencer Arthur, Kyle Pyron, Martin Casarez and Liz Luera are vying for the council seats.

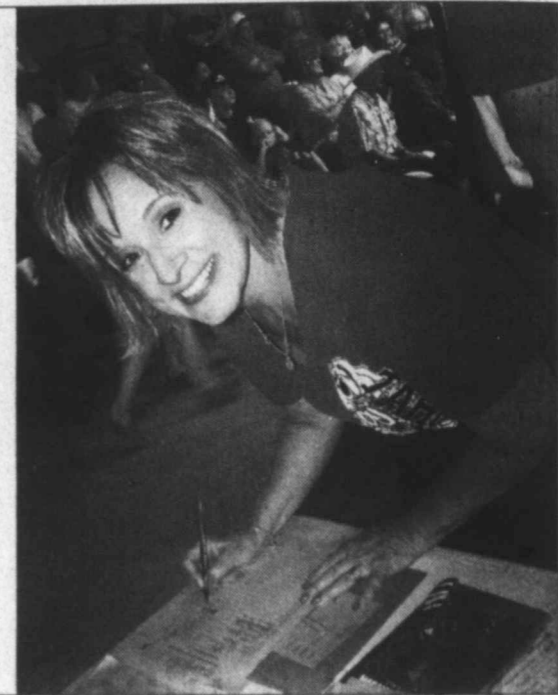

the filter). ACT member Vernon Baker is chairman of the pool project.

• Welcome Signage

\$1,082 was spent on advertising and creative 'branding' solutions to unify signage that will be completed in stages. Currently, the ACT Board is waiting on completion of a new Tahoka sign and lighting for the TxDOT triangle at the northern entry to the city, and working with state agencies for highway signage designating exits for the hospital, restaurants, etc. Other signage for all entries into Tahoka is planned, and digital signage at the intersection of Hwy. 380/U.S. 87 is also in the planning stages. ACT member Frances Truehart is chairman of the signage project.

• Mini-Park

\$48,532 has been spent at the Tahoka Mini-Park playground area, for concrete work and child-friendly soft rubberized material over the concrete, beneath the playground area. A special weather-resistant awning was also custom made for shading the playground area. New benches, picnic tables and

trash cans have been purchased and will soon be placed in the park.

A multi-phase plan for the park includes a lighted, paved walking path, landscaping and underground sprinkler systems, a water feature, removal of the old tennis courts, a new basketball court, and updated gazebo, as funds become available in the future. ACT member Julia Allen is chairman of the mini-park project.

• Downtown Mural Park

\$1902 spent on priming and painting walls, painting over the murals that were painted nearly 20 years ago that have since succumbed to the weather. After painting the exterior walls surrounding the grassy area, plans are to hang metal panels featuring artwork from the area for an artistic and interesting feature. The benches will be restored and painted, and landscaping maintenance may be privatized. ACT member Dee Dee Pridmore is chairman of the mural park project.

"Our main goal right now is to clean up the area before the Harvest Festival in October," said Pridmore.

• Administrative Fees

\$1,984 was spent for initial administrative fees involved in organizing the A.C.T., such as attorney fees for paperwork meeting the legal requirements of the state and records management, which is scrutinized by the state. ACT chairman Vernon Baker is responsible for overseeing these expenditures and compliance issues with the state.

POSSIBLE FUTURE PROJECTS

The ACT committee also has other projects under consideration, for which no funding has been expended to date. These possible future projects include the following (subject to change):

• Media in Life Enrichment Center

A new media system for the LEC is being considered, to accommodate media displays, visual and audio capabilities for presentations. ACT member Vernon Baker is heading this project.

• Economic Development

• Brochures promoting Tahoka activities, housing, businesses, etc. ACT member Shannon Lawson is heading this project.

• Shop Local promotion/advertising

• SBA Workshops and consulting

• Advocates for businesses

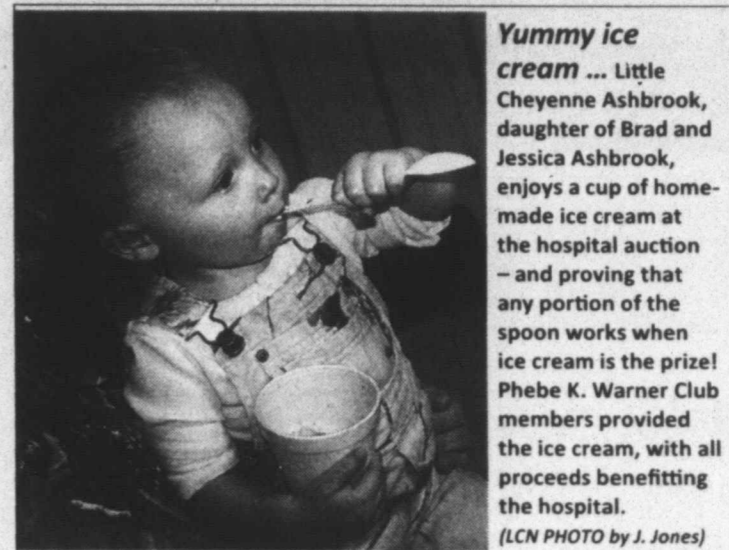

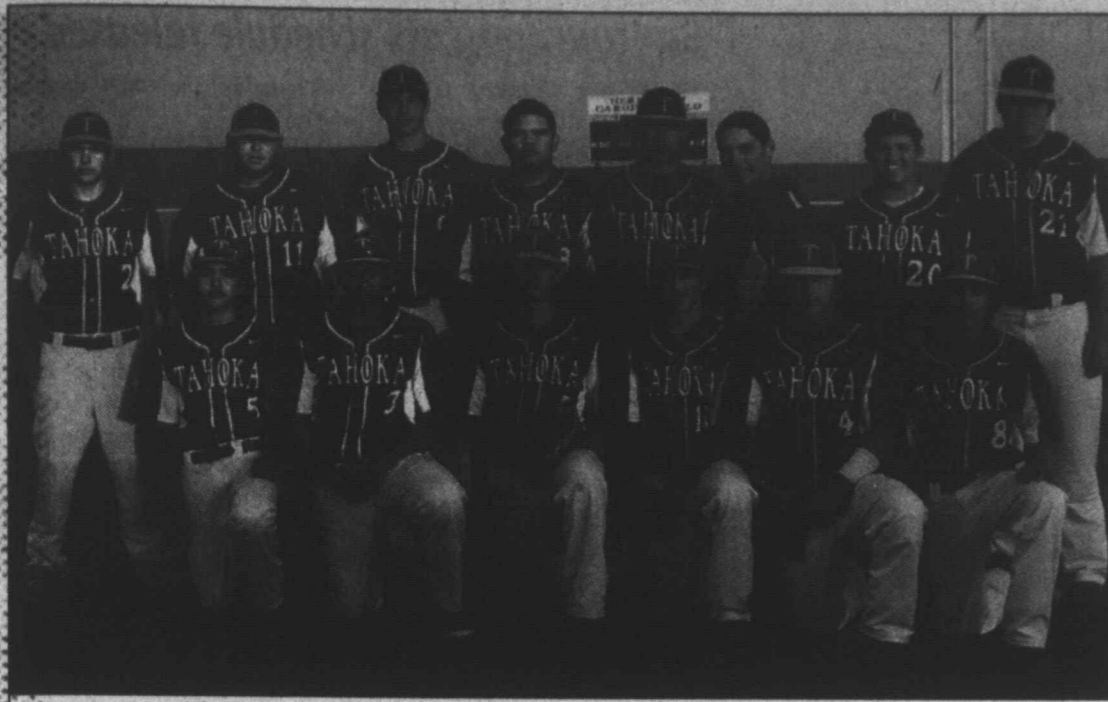

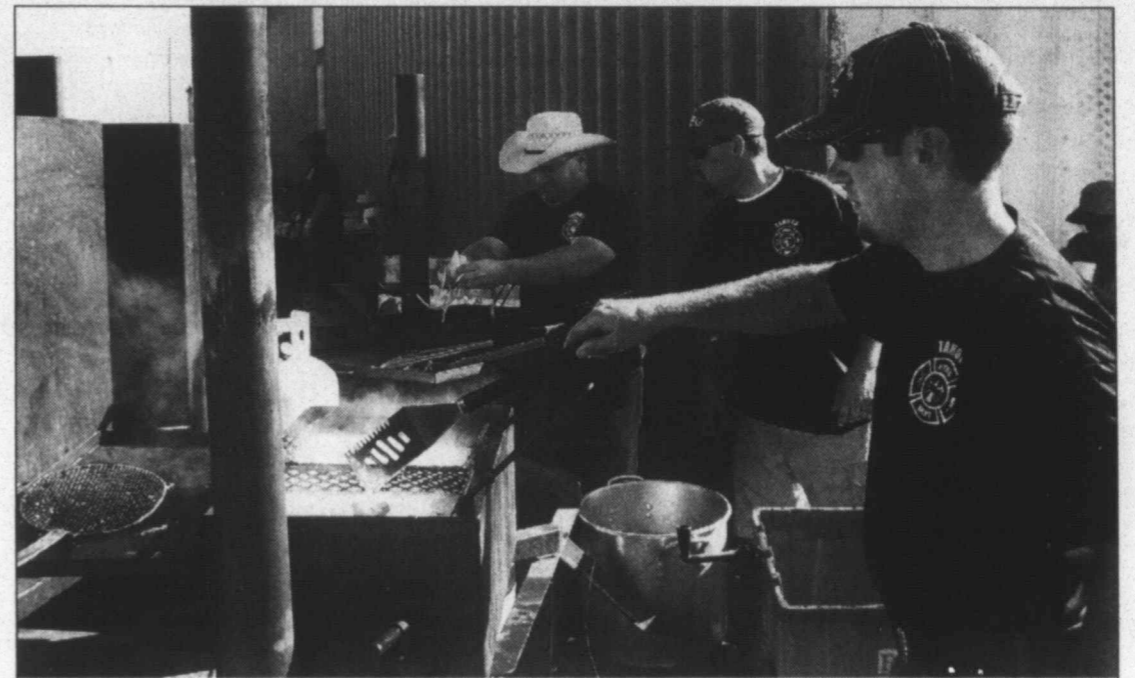
Herrera hits 3 home runs in win against Claude

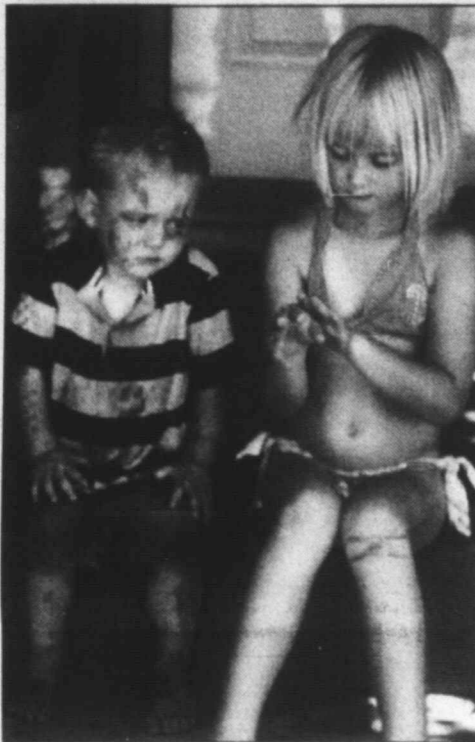

Pages from the Past

The following excerpts were taken from past issues of THE LYNN COUNTY NEWS.

Three killed in Lynn County Tornado
Draw Community is scene of disaster

Three people are dead and more than a score of others were injured by a tornado which swept across the northern portion of Dawson County and the southeastern portion of Lynn County about six o'clock Tuesday afternoon. The dead all resided in the vicinity of Draw in Lynn County about 18 miles southeast of Tahoka. A number of those who were severely injured also resided in that community. Scenes of horror marked the path of the tornado, which made its approach undetected by its

victims until it was hard upon them. Houses were reduced to splinters, automobiles were torn to pieces and scattered over the landscape or were twisted into almost unrecognizable masses, while some of the injured were hurled high into the air and carried many feet from the place where they were picked up by the terrific twister. Apparently the twister first struck in the OK community or a few miles west of that place in northern Dawson County, eight or ten miles southwest of O'Donnell. The store at OK was demolished and a number of houses destroyed. It moved in a northeasterly direction, passing within two miles southeast of O'Donnell, a residence about two miles south of O'Donnell being destroyed and some of the inmates injured. Little damage was done in the Joe Bailey Community except the destruction of outhouses and feed stacks, but the tornado struck again with full force just west of Draw.

The first residence struck and demolished was that of Allen Moore, but the family had fled from the house and were scurrying to the storm cellar when the house crashed. There were seven persons in the McKay house when the storm struck. Mrs. McKay, it is said, ran from the house toward a storm cellar with her twins in her arms, but she was thrown down. The babies were torn from her clasp and one of them was very seriously injured. The other miraculously escaped serious injury. ... April 29, 1938

Excerpts from a follow-up story on the same tornado...
...A half-mile east of the Gary house was the four-room residence of E. Vandivere. His roof was gone and walls of the house so badly damaged that they planned to rebuild the entire structure. Mr. Vandivere said his wife kept telling him to look at the terrible storm cloud approaching, "but there wasn't any use to look," he said facetiously, "for we had no storm cellar." Finally, he ran out to cut of the windmill and as he turned back toward the house he was compelled to see the storm - a black wall of sand hard upon them. "Before I got to the house, car sheds and chicken houses were passing me but I managed to dodge them," he said. "I met my boy coming out the door to see about Daddy. I grabbed him and hurried into the house. My wife grabbed my hand. I think it was the first time we had held hands in 30 years. She was praying while I was holding the front door, which didn't need holding. And then two or three windows blew in and the roof went, and there we were. But luckily none of us were hurt. The main part of the twister was to the north of us." ... May 6, 1938

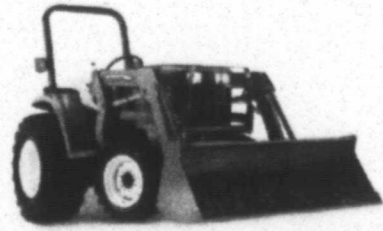

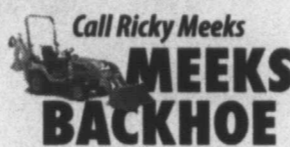

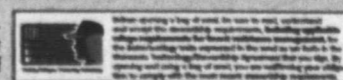
