## Bulldogs bop Plains Cowboys 20-0 for homecoming win

Luke Fleenor ran for two touchdowns and Roman Parmer scored another last Friday as Tahoka pleased homecoming fans with a 20-0 win over Plains.

The win left the Bulldogs at 2-3 for the season. The team will enjoy an open date this week before Coach Brandon Hopper takes his team to Hale Center next week for the first of five district games.

Tahoka's defense shut down the winless Cowboys, who managed only 164 yards of total offense in the game, compared to 287 by the Bulldogs, mostly by rushing.

Fleenor led that rushing attack, gaining 139 yards on 18 carries, an average of 7.7 per carry. Dillon Trevino also went over the century mark, gaining 118 on 20 efforts, or 5.9 per carry.

After a scoreless first quarter, Fleenor ran 14 yards to score with just 1:31 left in the first half, and Ryan Mendez kicked the extra point. He scored again on a 29-yard run early in the fourth quarter, with Mendez again converting.

Tahoka's other score came late in the third period when Parmer went in from a yard out.

Parmer completed 5 of 8 passes for 16 yards.

## New Home's Kaylan Lehman crowned Queen at Saturday's Lynn County Harvest Festival

Saturday was a beautiful day for the 39th annual Lynn County Harvest Festival, which drew a good crowd for food, fun and entertainment at the courthouse square in Tahoka. New Home High School senior Kaylan Lehman, 17, was crowned Harvest Festival Queen from among a bevy of seven beautiful young ladies, and Tahoka fourth grader Makayla Moya was crowned Princess of the Harvest Festival, as leading ticket-seller in a group of 15 cute girls in the contest.

Kaylan, daughter of Terra and Todd Lehman, won a \$2500 scholarship as Queen. First runnerup was O'Donnell senior M'Kayla Motley, who won a \$1500 scholarship. She is the daughter of Dana and Bryan Brownlow, and Ronnie Motley. Second runnerup was Tahoka sophomore Selena Arroyo, daughter of Ginger and David Trevino, who won a \$1000 scholarship. The queen contestants also won cash prizes based on the number of tickets each sold.

In the Princess contest (for girls in second-fifth grade), the five top ticket sellers all won prize money, and every girl received \$100 cash for every 350 tickets she sold. Altogether, the 15 princess contestants raised \$8,276 for the Harvest Festival. Princess Makayla Moya, daughter of Jesse and Melanie Moya, won \$1000 cash as the winner. First runnerup was Miranda DeLeon, who won \$750 cash, daughter of Michael DeLeon and Kimberly Vega. Second runnerup was Malaysia Washington with a \$500 cash prize, daughter of Crystal Segovia and David Washington. Third runnerup was Alexia Saldana, daughter of Debbie Saldana

and Bibian Saldana Jr., with a \$350 cash prize; and fourth runnerup was Natalie Lopez, daughter of Cory and Anna Lopez, and Stephanie Munoz, also winning a \$350 cash prize.

The queen and princess candidates sold raffle tickets for 16 drawings worth \$3500 in cash prizes. Randy Tienert/Tienert Sheet Metal won the \$1000 Visa card grand prize, and Melanie Moya won the \$500 Visa card. The four \$250 Visa cards were won by Bayle Engle, J. Ferg Roofing, Lori Nicholson, and Gloria Perez. For the \$100 gift cards, there were supposed to have been 10 drawings, but actually 12 tickets were inadvertently drawn throughout the day, so all 12 won \$100 gift cards. Klyssa Woodley won the \$250 first place prize in Cow Patty Bingo, and Kim Hammonds won the \$100 second place prize.

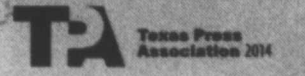

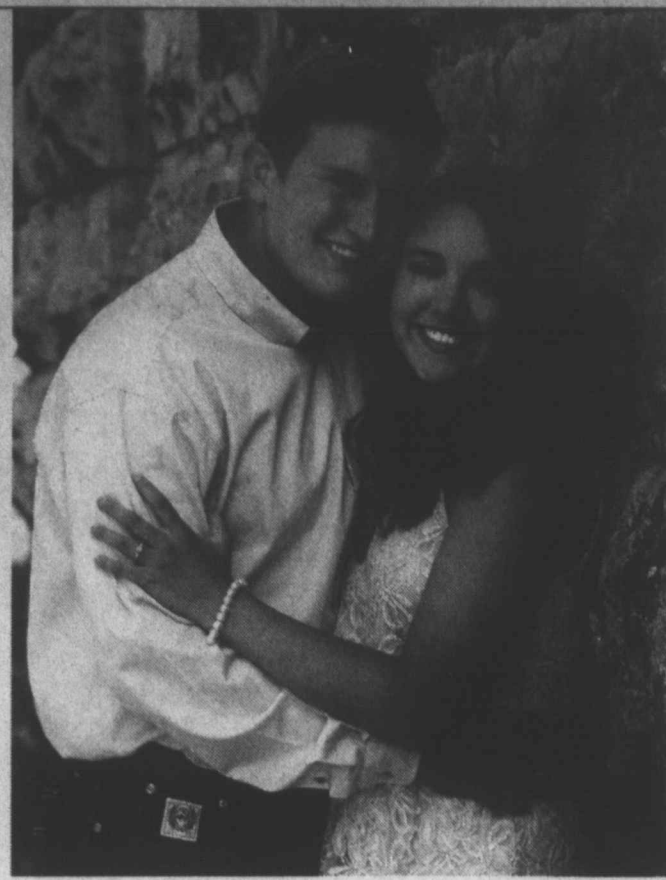
I have had family members living in the Tahoka area since 1916 - What a heritage!

**THE MAIL** last week brought me a letter asking for a donation to help wounded American veterans, unquestionably a worthy cause, as who wouldn't want to help these who are fighting for all of us.

If I knew for sure the funds would go where they should, I would gladly contribute, but there is a very good chance that appeals similar to this one are simply scams to enrich some unscrupulous persons.

There are people stealing money preying on sympathies of good people for good causes, and sometimes even the recognized charities pay their administrators far too much of what is taken in. One exception apparently is the Salvation Army, whose national leaders reportedly are paid only about \$14,000 a year.

Anyway, here's a message for all of you who live in New Home, O'Donnell, Wilson or Tahoka, or anywhere else in the county: You are lucky and blessed to live where you do.

The reason? Because you and your neighbors, most of whom you know, are the kindest people in the world, the most willing to help out someone who is in desperate need of good deeds, financial help or just kind words.

Every one of these communities has united at times to help out with such things as farmers gathering the crops for someone critically ill or injured or otherwise unable to do their own work, people giving blood or money to assist families with sick or endangered children, or whatever the obvious need is. Some have donated time, labor and funds to build or repair homes for persons who have suffered tragedies, just trying to show them that somebody cares.

There are many worthy causes promoted by mail appeals or television, and they deserve support, but when you send money, you may unknowingly be supporting some crook instead. But in small towns, help is freely offered when needed, because there's no question about who is getting the help. That's a great thing about rural living.

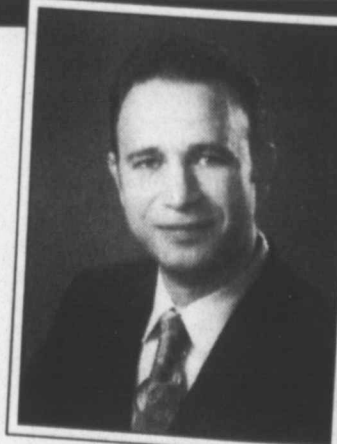

**Woman jailed on indictment for child abuse**

A Ralls woman this week was jailed in Lynn County on a recent grand jury indictment for continuous sexual abuse of a child under the age of 14.

Officials at the sheriff's office identified the suspect as Peggy Sue Martinez.

Tahoka Police Dept. this week investigated a traffic accident without injuries, two reports of criminal mischief and an incident of assault/family violence.

The minor collision was in the 1900-block of Ave. N near N. 2nd St. Friday morning. Involved were a 2013 Chevrolet Traverse van driven by Maria Magdalena Vitolas, 31, and a 1993 Cadillac driven by Eddie Wayne Black, 73. There were no injuries.

Genoveva Leija reported that someone broke out the rear window on her 2004 Dodge Caravan while it was parked at her residence on S. 2nd St. Saturday afternoon. Loss was not estimated.

Ashley Nicole Deleon told police last Wednesday that sometime after 9 p.m. Tuesday someone had punctured all four tires on her 2011 Kia Optima while it was parked at her residence on Ave. L. The damage was estimated at \$500.

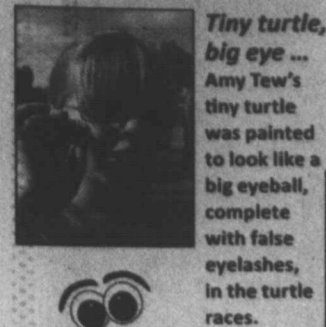

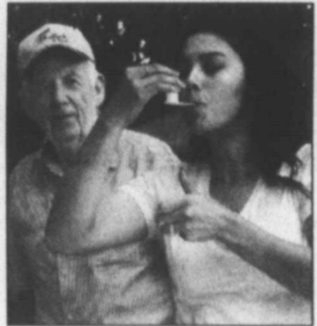
