## GOOD NEWS: County to save \$152,600 with early payoff of bond

Lynn County and its citizens will save \$152,600 in interest fees by paying off a bond series six years earlier than the original terms of the bonds that were used to build the Lynn County Law Enforcement Center/Jail that opened in March of 2002.

The original bond was \$2,400,000, payable on a 20-year term that would end in the year 2022. However, during the past year Lynn County Commissioners had their first opportunity (due to the terms of the original note) to make additional payments and refinance the bond to pay off in 2019 instead of the original 2022 payoff term. In April 2015, commissioners voted to make an additional one-time payment of \$500,000, which left a note of \$700,000 plus interest due for the remainder of the term until 2019.

The county received unanticipated additional revenue of \$182,580 from wind energy tax abatement payments in 2015, and commissioners chose to add those funds to the Jail I&S fund (Interest and Sinking fund), and now are anticipating making a final payoff in March 2016.

"We make an annual principle payment, with some of the interest included, in February of each year, and make another interest payment in August each year. After we make our February 2016 payment, we anticipate

that we can pay off the note by March 2016 - and if we do that, we will have saved a total of \$152,600 in interest saved by paying off the note a full six years early," County Treasurer Amy Schuknecht explained.

Revenue for the Jail I&S fund comes from several sources, including revenue that comes from housing inmates here from other counties, and Lynn County Jail has provided this service since the doors opened in 2002. Prior to 2002, when Lynn County's jail was much smaller, Lynn County expended thousands of dollars each year to other counties that housed Lynn County's inmates, and that was one of the reasons that made sense in building the new jail.

After the bond note is paid off, revenue from housing other counties' inmates may be used to fund the jail in other areas, or as deemed appropriate by commissioners.

During their first regular session held on Monday, January 11, Lynn County Commissioners agreed they

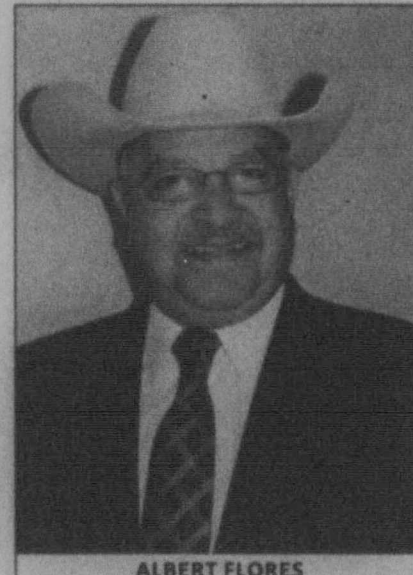

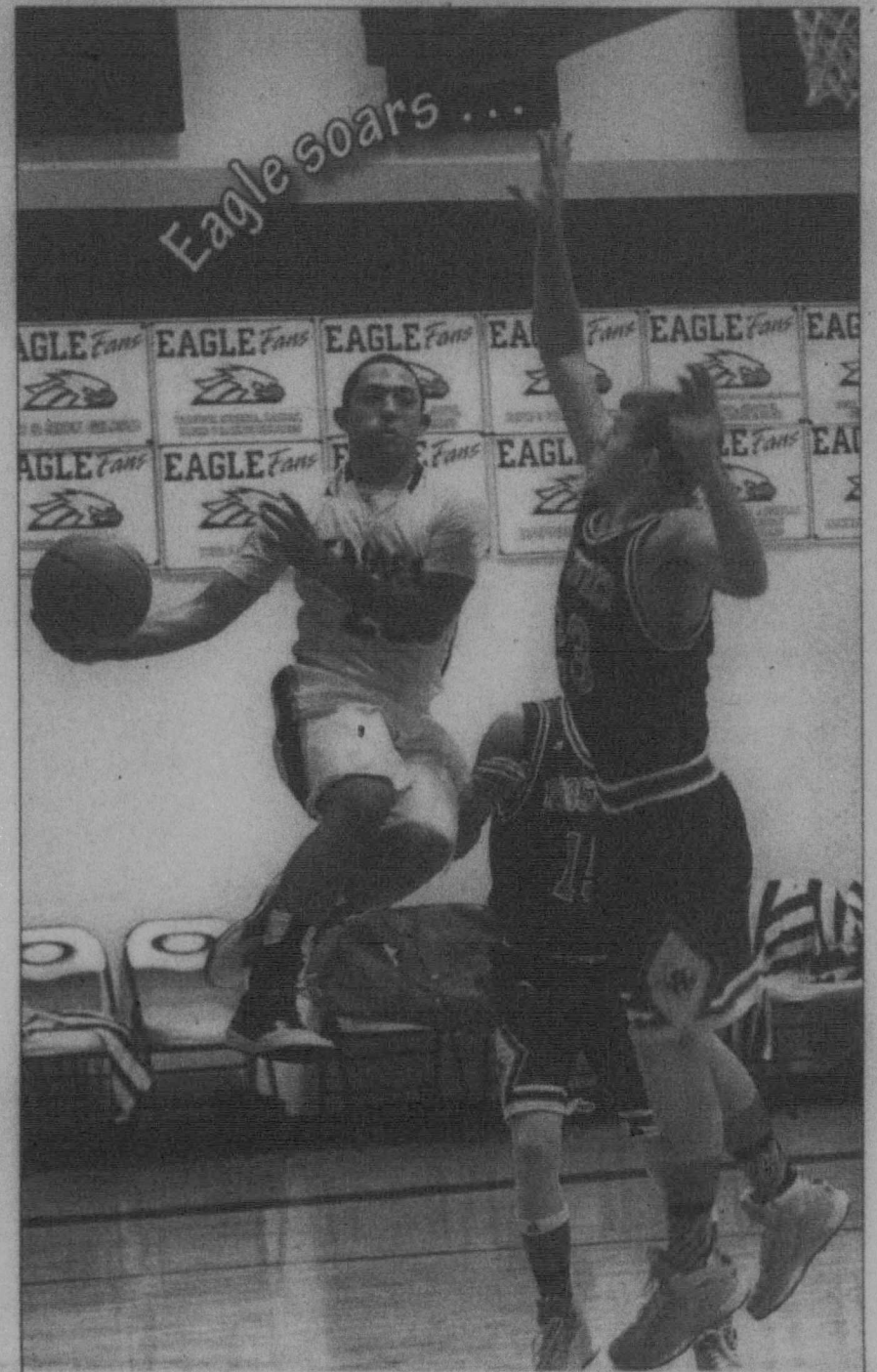

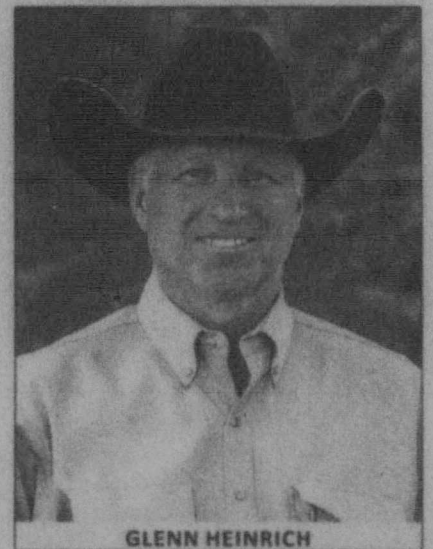
## Glenn Heinrich seeks Pct 1 Commissioner seat

## 241 animals entered in County Stock Show

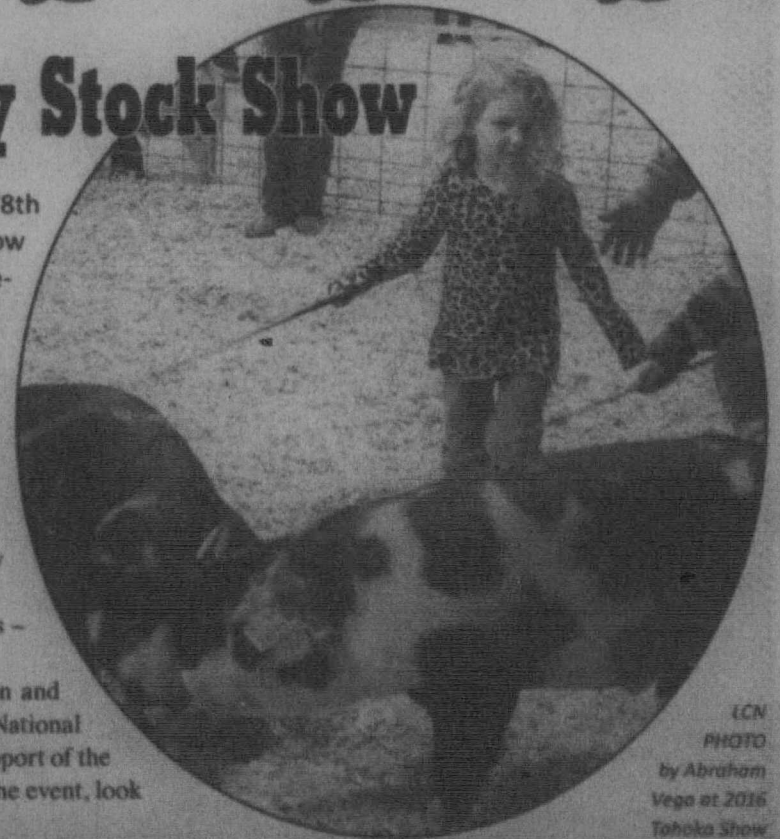
Lynn County 4-H and FFA members are making last-minute preparations for the 78th Lynn County Stock Show, which begins today (Thursday) at the county show barn. In this year's show, 116 exhibitors have entered 241 animals in the three-day event, including 137 barrows, 24 lambs, 34 steers, and 46 goats.

The show barn opened Wednesday for the weighing of steers, goats, and lambs. Thursday events begin at 9:00 a.m. with the weighing of barrows. Steer judging begins at 5:00 p.m., starting with the Miniature Hereford Show, followed by the Steer Show. After the steer show, the Pee Wee Goat Show will be followed by the Wether Goat Show, and concluding with lamb judging.

Barrow judging begins at 9:00 a.m. Friday. All entries for baked goods must be in place from 9:00-10:00 a.m. Friday, with judging scheduled for 10:00 a.m. The Pee Wee Barrow Show will begin after the barrow judging is concluded.

Judges for this year's show include: Steers - Ky Kennedy from Muleshoe; Lambs and Goats - Jay Waller from Ira; and Barrows - Todd Byers of Abernathy.

The annual barbecue lunch will begin at 11:30 a.m. on Saturday. The awards presentation and auction will start at 1 p.m. Lynn County Livestock Show officials express their thanks to First National Bank of Tahoka, First Bank & Trust, and Ag Texas Farm Credit Services for their continued support of the show. 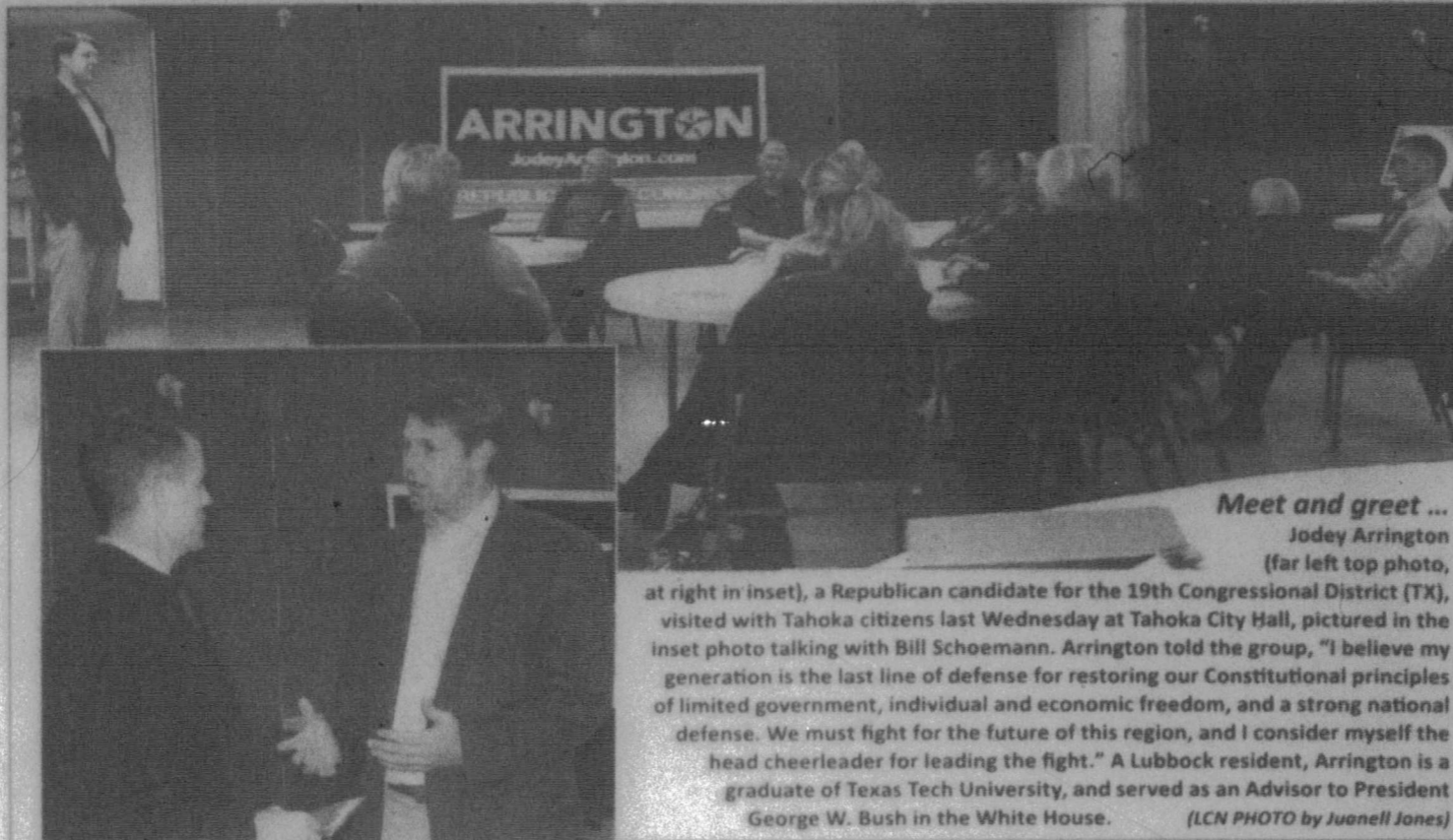

**Tahoka City Council sets May 7 election**

Tahoka City Council ordered a General Election for May 7, 2016, for the purpose of electing three council members on the five-member board, in action taken at Monday night's council meeting. Council members whose terms expire this year include Johnny Rosas (District 2), Jeff Martin (District 4), and Ray Box (District 5 At-Large). All are two-year terms. The council appointed County Clerk Susan Tipton as the Early Voting Judge and authorized her to appoint the voting judges for the general election.

In other business, council members authorized City Administrator Jerry Webster to purchase four new police cars for the Tahoka Police Dept., through the "buy board" available to municipalities. Webster

said that the city had received two quotes for purchasing four new Dodge Chargers, and he was authorized to order the vehicles at a quote of \$95,000 for all four. Once ordered, the new vehicles will take 90 days to arrive, he said.

"All of our police fleet vehicles, except for the pickup, are just completely worn out. We plan to purchase four new vehicles, and then begin a fleet rotation to replace them at intervals instead of having to replace all four at the same time," Webster told The News.

Council members discussed the open carry law with City Attorney W. Calloway Huffaker, and approved posting of signage prohibiting handguns at City Hall.

The council also approved a \$3,000 expenditure for the

A.C.T. Board (Advancing the Community of Tahoka) to add two more of the large framed photos at the Main Street city park, for future displays. Monthly bills were approved, and approved an ordinance to update employee service credits for the Texas Municipal Retirement System. Reports from department heads, and the Caring Hearts Organization, were heard as well.

Tahoka Lady Bulldogs increased their record to 10-8 and 3-1 in District play, with a 65-58 win over Smyer on Friday, Jan. 8. Natalie Stice led the Lady Bulldogs with 30 points, and also scoring in double figures were Maci Dimak with 14 points, and Hannah Hammonds with 10 points.

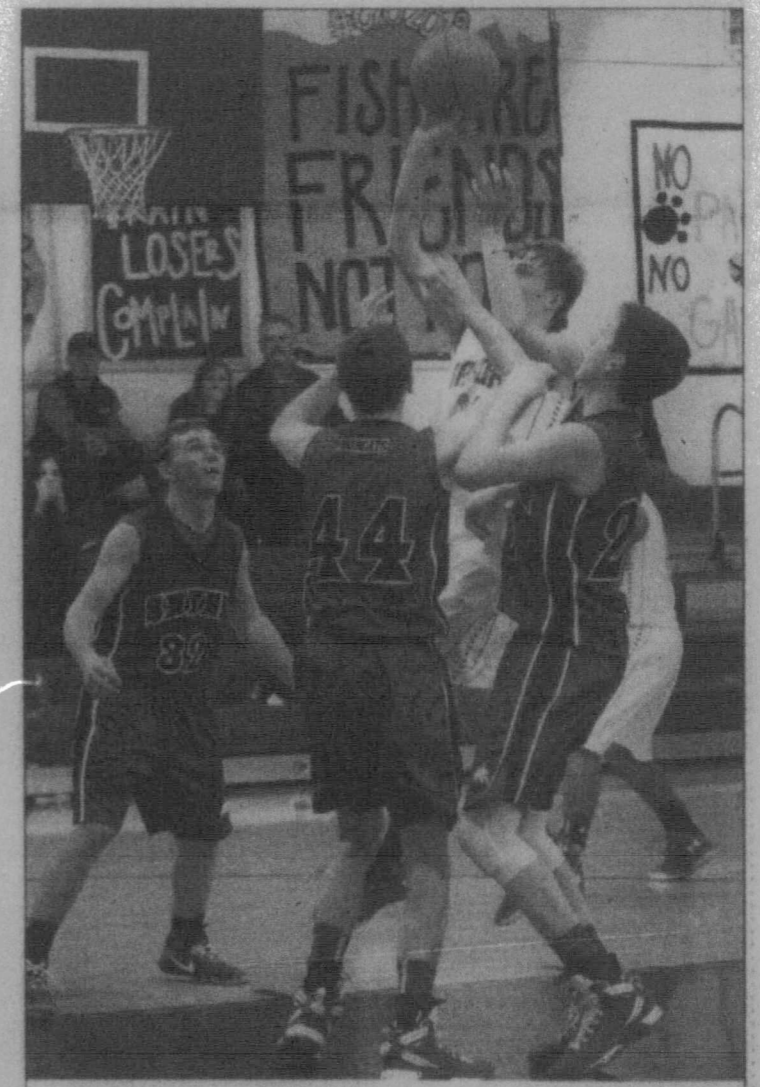
Smyer got off to an early lead, ahead 23-13 after the first period, and Tahoka gained a bit in the second quarter but still trailed 33-26 at the half. The third quarter, however, was the turning period for the Tahoka squad, as they added 21 points while holding Smyer to only 9 points, and led by 47-42 going into the final period. The fourth also belonged to the Lady Bulldogs, who outscored their oppo-

nents 18-16 to win by a 7-point margin at the final buzzer.

Also scoring for Tahoka were Clarissa Lopez with 7, and Miranda Deleon with 4 points.

In last Tuesday night's game, Sundown handed Tahoka a loss, winning 64-51. Stice led scoring in that game as well, with 27 points, followed by Maci Dimak with 8, Miranda Deleon 7, Hannah Hammonds 4, Olivia Hammonds 3, and Andrea Garcez 2.

Sundown led at the end of the first quarter 16-12, and gained a bigger margin by the half, leading 40-24, and 56-33 going into the final period. In the fourth, Tahoka's Lady Bulldogs made a big effort, outscoring Sundown 18-8, but it was not enough to overcome the earlier deficit, and lost 64-51.

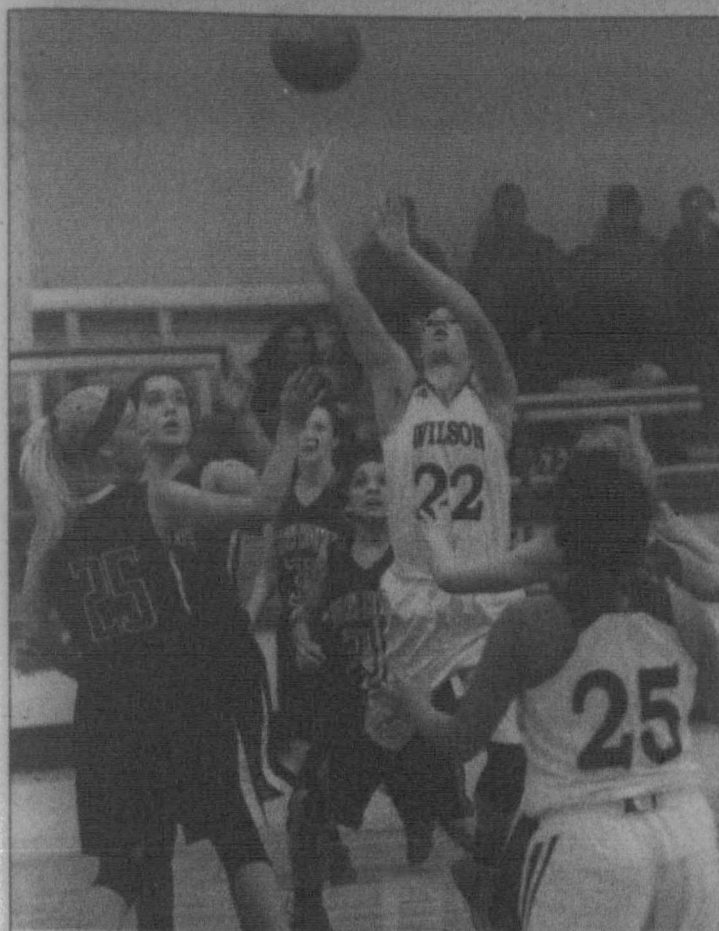

are anxious to pay off the bond in March, and anticipate that it will be a good milestone for county finances.

Monday's meeting began at 9:00 a.m. in the basement courtroom of the Lynn County Courthouse, with Commissioners Keith Wied, John Hawthorne, Don Blair and Larry Durham present and County Judge Mike Braddock presiding.

Matt Dorsett, NRCS District Conservationist, presented an annual report on conservation practices and other issues involving NRCS, and introduced Kent Kahl, Ray Mason, Randy Cook and Leland White as board members for the Lynn County Soil and Water Conservation District. Helen Saldana, District Secretary, gave an additional report regarding Lynn County.

In other business, after some initial discussion, commissioners moved to table any action regarding a resolution that would

lay out ground rules for handguns, whether concealed or unconcealed, to be allowed inside certain areas of the courthouse.

"I don't want to infringe on anyone's rights, and the Attorney General's opinions on this issue have been a little vague, so I propose that we wait to see how this issue plays out, and get more information before we consider a resolution addressing this issue for Lynn County," Judge Braddock told commissioners, and they agreed to table the issue for later consideration.

Commissioners approved three resolutions to submit three separate grant applications through the Governor's office, Criminal Justice Division, including one for the Lynn County Juvenile Probation Department for funding psychological evaluations; one for the Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. for equipment; and one for the Lynn County Victim's Assistance office for their annual funding of that office.

**Burglary suspect had permission to be in house, but officers arrest him anyway, on drug charges**

Lynn County Sheriff's officers arrested a 33-year-old O'Donnell man on possession of a controlled substance and drug paraphernalia, after investigating what was called in as a possible burglary at a residence in the 500 block of 12th Street in O'Donnell Sunday night. The call came in at 9:18 p.m. Upon arrival, officers discovered that the man had permission to be at the residence, but during the routine investigation found the drugs and paraphernalia and arrested him on those charges.

Also in O'Donnell Sunday night, Sheriff's officers arrested a 30-year-old Lubbock woman at a residence in O'Donnell on charges of public intoxication, after being called to investigate a domestic disturbance.

A man in the 2500 block of N. 2nd Street reported to Tahoka Police that someone had taken several pinion wood

logs from a rack against his rear fence recently, estimating the value of the loss at \$100 in a report on Dec. 28. Police also responded to a domestic violence call on Jan. 9.

Lynn County Jail held 42 inmates during the past week, including 18 for Lynn County, 22 for Ector County, and two for Dawson County. Local charges included an arrest of Jacob Jared Leesley, 28, of Lynn County, on a grand jury indictment for unauthorized use of a vehicle, from a case involving theft of a pickup about a year ago; one for public intoxication, one for assault on a family member, one on failure to appear on charges of unlawful possession of marijuana, and one for expired driver's license.

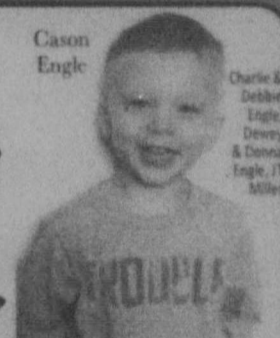

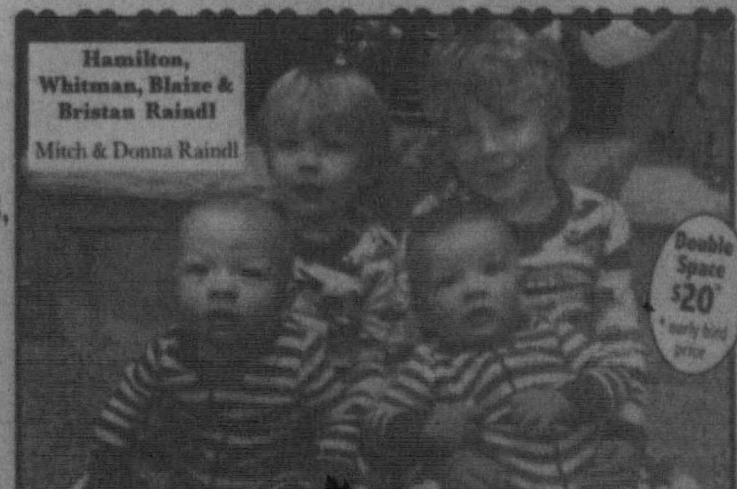

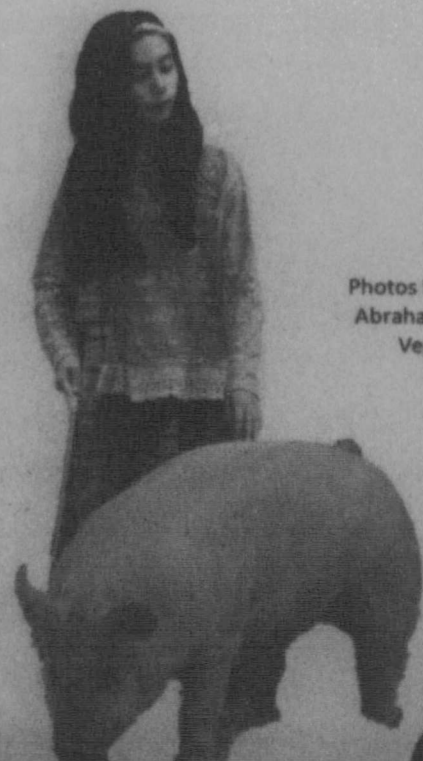

**Water line project update:** We have received information from the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) that includes an updated timeline for our water line replacement project. With some additional documentation the TWDB is requiring from the city on the financing of the project, the projected date for the bond sale has been tentatively scheduled for April. We should be able to close on our grant in late May. We are trying to get everything set so that as soon as we close we will have a contractor, and be able to start the project. We are continuing the research on the different SMART meters out there so we choose the one that meets the city's needs. We appreciate all of our citizens' support for this project,

and your patience while we have been working with the TWDB to bring this project to reality. **Canadian River Municipal Water Authority...** Many of you may have seen on the news the problems with the water transmission line from the well fields to the reservoir. Just when the leak repairs were completed there was another "blow out" on the transmission line. It is estimated the repairs will take at least one week. We will turn our wells on as needed and should not have any problems keeping the storage facilities full. However, we are encouraging everyone to conserve water during this time. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. The deadline to submit public comments is 30 days after newspaper notice is published.

The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or ask questions about the application. A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

If only comments are received on the application, the response to comments, along with notice of the executive director's action on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application.

The executive director will complete the technical review, issue a preliminary decision on the application, and a Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the final deadline for submitting public comments. If a hearing request is timely filed in Response to this Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Air Permit, the time period for requesting a contested case hearing will be extended to thirty days after the mailing of the executive director's response to comments.

After the final deadline for public comments following the Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or is on a mailing list for this application.

If the request is made by a group or an association, one or more members who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests which the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for contested case hearing to the Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material air quality concerns submitted during the comment period.
