

Stairway to heaven?

Not quite, but the scaffolding and ladderwork outside the Lynn County Courthouse ascends into the sky, as workers prepare for extensive exterior restoration work on the brick and masonry on the courthouse. Inside the building. abatement crews are working to remove asbestos from all four levels. from underneath tile on the first floor and basement levels, and from plaster and wall coverings on the second and third floor areas. Work crews are also removing ceilings, beginning electrical and plumbing work, taking window frames out, removing door hardware, and other interior work. 

Wilson VFD responds to house fire; tires slashed on five vehicles here

A house fire and reports of criminal mischief were among reports from the Lynn County Sheriff's Office this week, and Tahoka Police are investigating several incidents of tire slash-

Wilson Volunteer Fire Dept. was paged out to a fire at a home at 1206 E. Studeman in Wilson last Friday at 1:35 a.m., after the homeowner called 9-1-1 to report a bathroom was filled with smoke. EMS was also dispatched, and reportedly transported one patient for breathing difficulty due to smoke. No report was available as to the condition of the home.

Criminal mischief was reported at 12:20 p.m. last Tuesday. A homeowner reported that someone had run over a chain link fence on their property on the east side of US 87 just south of the cemetery overpass.

A tandem fell off a tractor in the south-bound lane of US 87, 11 miles north of Tahoka last Thursday about

1:20 in the afternoon, which required traffic to be detoured while it was removed. Trespassing was reported on the Wilson city farm last Thursday at 8:30 a.m., with vehicles "mudding" in the ditches, and a Wilson resident reported that an I-phone was stolen Sunday night.

Tahoka Police are investigating several incidents of tire slashing that occurred last Wednesday night/Thursday morning in the northwest section of Tahoka. Tires on five vehicles in that area were slashed, all belonging to different owners, including a white Tahoe, a white Ford pickup, a maroon Ford Explorer, a blue Dodge pickup, and a silver Pontiac Firebird. Police Chief Miguel Reyna said they have good leads to pursue in this case.

Police arrested a 33-year-old Lubbock woman on charges of Driving While Intoxicated, after investigating a call reporting a reckless driver coming into Tahoka at 11:45 p.m.

School districts set public meetings for proposed tax rates/budgets

Three school districts in Lynn County have scheduled public meetings to discuss budgets and proposed tax rates, according to notices printed in this week's Lynn County News.

Tahoka, New Home and O'Donnell school districts are publishing notices that indicate the proposed tax rates that will be considered for adoption. Wilson ISD has not yet released that information to The News. The following information was taken from the notices being published.

Tahoka ISD proposal is 14.5-cent increase

Tahoka ISD is proposing a total tax rate of \$1.60 per \$100 of property value, which would include \$1.17 in Maintenance & Operations (M&O) and 0.43173-cents per \$100 of property value in the Interest & Sinking (I&S) Fund. The total tax rate is 14.5cent higher than last year's total tax rate, which had an M&O at \$1.17, and an I&S rate of 0.28600-cents, for a total tax rate last year of \$1.456.

TISD has a debt obligation of \$8,110,000 that I&S funds will be used to pay.

Average market value of residences within the TISD has increased, from \$55,955 last year to \$56,034 this year, and the taxes due on an average residence would increase by \$63.07


this year. The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is \$1.60.

A public hearing will be held at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 31 in the TISD Administration/Harvick Building in Tahoka.

> O'Donnell ISD proposal is 1-cent decrease

O'Donnell ISD is proposing a total tax rate of \$1.49 per \$100 of property value, which would include \$1.11 in Maintenance & Operations (M&O) and 0.38-cents per \$100 of property value in the Interest & Sinking (I&S) Fund. The total tax rate is 1-cent lower than last year's total tax rate, although the M&O for last year was higher by 0.06-cents at \$1.17, but the I&S rate was lower, at 0.33-cents, for a total tax rate last year of \$1.50.

E ALL HAVE heard the advice, "Don't sweat the small stuff," and preachers and others are always urging us to keep our sights set on the really important things in life, higher goals and all that. But that doesn't keep most of us from getting all bent out of shape over things which really don't matter much.

For example, I still get bothered by people who install toilet paper so that it feeds from the bottom of the roll instead of the top. I even wrote a column about this once.

Then they go off muttering things like "that old guy has a college degree and he can't even flush a commode."

There are many little things which bother people, and none of them matter much in the long run.

So I am going to try to ignore all those little things I don't like and concentrate on things I do like. As soon as I can come up with any.

AMONG THE THINGS I can't help being bothered by is the high cost of everything, like the water bill I received from the city of Tahoka last week. It was easily the highest one I ever got. I noticed there was a statement stamped on the bill which advised that "Swimming pool opens June 3." I guess they must have filled it with water channeled through my meter.


