## Break-ins, one-vehicle accident, fires in law reports this week

Break-ins, fires, and a one-vehicle accident were in local and county law enforcement reports during the past week.

On Jan. 23 at 1:26 p.m., Vickie Sybert reported to Sheriff's officials that someone had shot off the lock to a gate on her rural property for access to a barn, but no items were reported missing.

A woman's vehicle ended up in the ditch last Tuesday, Jan. 23 as she was driving on FM 211, about 2 miles west of US 87, at 6:39 p.m. According to the Sheriff's Office call sheet report, Brenda Lee Elliott of Lovington, NM told officers she was having medical issues while driving, causing her to drive her 2015 Chrysler off the road and into a field. She was transported by Lynn County EMS for medical treatment at Lynn County Hospital ER.

Carolina Frausto reported a break-in at her home in Wilson at 6:14 p.m. last Thursday, Jan. 25. She told officers she had been gone for a few days

and upon returning home discovered her front door open, and she described an orange oily substance had been smeared in her bedroom and bathroom. No items were reported missing.

O'Donnell Volunteer Fire Dept. was called to Woolam Gin at 10:25 p.m. last Thursday, for cotton seed on fire.

Tahoka VFD was called to the scene of a grass fire at 5:39 p.m. Sunday evening, when fire was reported in a ditch at the intersection of County Road 30 and FM 179.

Tahoka Police arrested a 29-year-old Tahoka male Monday on warrant charges of assault causes bodily injury.

Lynn County Jail held 38 inmates during the past week, including 14 for Ector County, 3 for Dawson, and 21 for Lynn County. Local charges included one man for tamper/fabricate physical evidence, and one man for Failure To Appear on charges of Possession of Marijuana.

## City, School, Hospital Board elections slated for May 5

### Five candidates file during second week of filing period

Five candidates have signed up for places on the ballots for city, school board and hospital board elections. The filing period for the May 5 elections in Lynn County opened Wednesday, Jan. 17 and filing will continue through Feb. 16.

Lynn County Hospital District will have an election for three directors, all of whom will have three-year terms. City elections in Lynn County are for two-year terms, and school board trustees serve three-year terms (unless designated as an unexpired term).

Tahoka, O'Donnell and Wilson ISD will each have two trustee positions on the May ballot this year, and the New Home ISD Board election will have their election in November. The filing period for the November election will be held at a later date.

City elections in the county include four council seats in Tahoka, two council seats and a mayoral term in Wilson, three council seats and mayor in O'Donnell, and one council seat in New Home.

Following is a complete list of terms expiring in the upcoming May 5 elections, with names listed in *italics* for those who have filed, according to information from the respective entities.

**Lynn County Hospital District:** Three directors. Terms expiring: Jannis Childress, Robbie Autry, Della Swartz. *Filing: Robbie Autry.*

**City of Tahoka:** Four Council members. Terms expiring: Dist. 2 Ronny Jolly, Dist. 4 Jeff Martin, At-Large Dist. 5 Ray Box, all three-year terms; and Dist. 3 for a 1-year unexpired term, Casey McLelland. *Filing: Ronny Jolly, Dist. 2.*

**Tahoka ISD:** Two trustees, both At-Large. Terms expiring: Clay Taylor, Lisa Hawthorne. *Filing: Clay Taylor.*

**City of Wilson:** Two council seats and Mayor. Terms expiring: Mayor Donald Klaus, council members Clyde Wilke and David Maldonado.

**Wilson ISD:** Two trustees. Terms expiring: Bobby Miller, Michael Villarreal.

**City of New Home:** One Council member. Terms expiring: Ross

Fillingim.

**City of O'Donnell:** Three Council seats and Mayor. Terms expiring: Mayor Scott Martinez, council members Kim Parker, Toby Mires, John David Velas-

quez. *Filing: Kim Parker for Mayor; Nympha Renteria for Council.*

**O'Donnell ISD:** Two trustees. Terms expiring: Monty Hancock, Mandy Stidham.

## New Home undefeated in district play

The New Home Leopards boys basketball team is currently 6-0 in district, and 23-3 for the season, after gaining two more wins last week. They are ranked #5 in the state by TABC and #8 by Hoop Insider.

Last week, the Leopards beat Ropes 43-35 on Tuesday, and beat Southland 96-23 on Friday.

Carter Abney led scoring with 16 points, 5 assists and 3 steals in the win over Ropes last Tuesday. Blaine Kirkland added 13 points and had 10 rebounds, Kaleb LeClair had 6 points, Blake Buckelew 3 points, Reed Bundy 3 points, 4 assists and 3 steals, and Bode Stewart added 3 points. This

win let New Home finish the first half of district undefeated.

Last Friday at Southland, the Leopards had four players scoring in double figures, in the 96-23 win. Abney had 28 points, 5 rebounds, 3 assists, and 5 steals; Blaine Kirkland had 23 pts, 9 rebounds, 4 assists, 8 steals, 2 blocks; LeClair 16 pts 8 assists 4 steals; Buckelew 11 pts.; Stewart 8 pts 6 reb 6 assists; Ethan Martinez 5 pts 4 assists; Keagen Grantham 4 pts; and Brayden Kirkland 1 pt.

New Home hosts Wellman-Union Tuesday and will host Wilson Friday in a game that will honor the Leopard seniors.

**Campaign signs must adhere to laws**

It's campaign season, and with that comes a host of campaign signs cropping up on residential lawns and near state and county roads. According to the Texas Ethics Commission, all campaign signs must adhere to location regulations as well as have specific language included on the campaign signs.

It is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500 per violation, to put a sign in the right-of-way of a state highway. Contact TxDOT for right-of-way requirements on state highways, or county officials for right-of-way requirements on county roads.

The Texas Highway Commission has authority to remove a sign placed in the right-of-way of a state highway. A sheriff or constable may remove a sign placed in a rural road right-of-way. Signs with a value less than \$25 may

be discarded without giving the owner any notice.

Additionally, all written political advertising that is meant to be seen from a road must carry a "right-of-way" notice. It is a criminal offense to omit the "right-of-way" notice. Any campaign sign that is placed on private property that is intended to be visible from a road or highway must meet certain size and material provisions and must include the following notice to be printed on each political advertising sign: "Notice: It is a violation of State Law (Chapters 392 and 393, Transportation Code), to place this sign in the right-of-way of a highway." This requirement includes yard signs on private property, if the signs are meant to be seen from any road.

There are also restrictions on the contents of political advertising. Political advertising may not misrepresent a person's identity

or official title. Any person who is not the incumbent must make it clear that they are seeking election rather than reelection by using the word "FOR" before the name of the title or office. The word "FOR" must be at least one-half the type size as the name of the office and should appear immediately before the name of the office (i.e. John Doe For Attorney General).

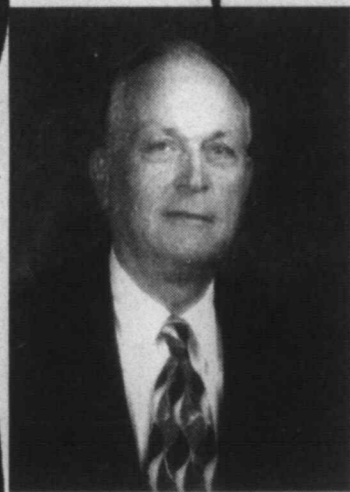
Political advertising (signs, etc.) must also include a disclosure statement stating the words "political advertising" or "Pol. Adv." and include either the name of the person who paid for the political advertising (the candidate or campaign treasurer), or the political committee authorizing the political advertising.

Over 60 years later their company grew from one store to its present size of 318 Allsup's Convenience Stores. Lonnie always had a passion for cutting horses which he was first introduced to by his father. In 1981, he began showing cutting horses being instructed by trainers like Pete Branch to train the mare which Lonnie rode to win the non-pro world championship. Lonnie continued to breed, train and show champion cutting horses for many years, owning two horses of the year awarded by the NCHA. Lonnie served a full term as president of National Cutting Horse Association.

He was a member of the Board of Directors of Affiliated Foods, Tri-State Bakery, Plains Dairy, and past president and lifetime director of NCHA.

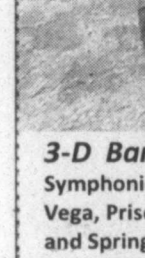

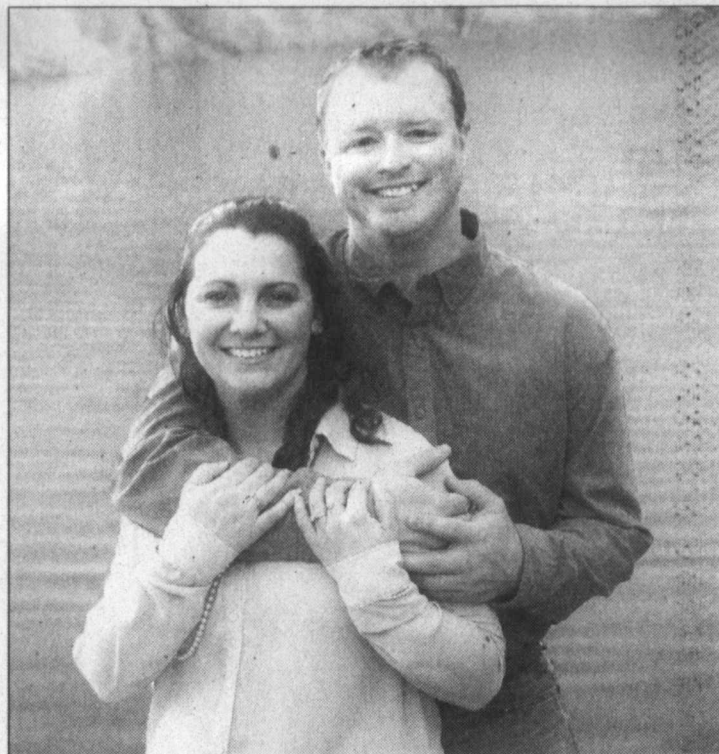
### 3-D Band members perform with Region/Honor bands

Rabies vaccines will be available for \$7, and other vaccines will be available as well, according to the S.P. Vet Clinic staff.

**USDA announces a near-record year for farm loans**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) today announced another year of high activity in its farm loan programs. Hard-working farm families across the country accessed nearly \$6 billion in new credit, either directly or guaranteed through commercial lenders in 2017. At year end, FSA was assisting more than 120,000 family farmers with loans totaling just over \$25 billion. "FSA loan funds have been in high demand the last few years," said Dr. Robert Johanson, Acting Deputy Under Secretary for the Farm Production and Conservation mission area. "We provide opportunities to

qualified small, beginning and underserved farmers who are unable to obtain commercial credit, to help them get started, gain access to land and grow their operations. Family farmers across America also come to us for credit when they face challenges to stay in business. We're proud to support rural prosperity by providing credit to those who need it most." FSA provides a variety of loan assistance, including direct and guaranteed farm ownership loans, operating loans and even direct Microloans up to \$50,000 and EZ Guarantees up to \$100,000 with streamlined application processes. More than 25,000 direct and

guaranteed FSA loans went to beginning or underserved farmers and ranchers. Over 4,200 beginning farmers received direct farm ownership loans from FSA to make their first land purchase. And of the approximately 6,500 Microloans made in the last fiscal year, three-quarters (almost 4,900) went to beginning farmers, 1,000 went to women and 400 to veterans. FSA's direct farm loans are unique in that the agency provides technical assistance in addition to credit. Consistent with efforts to continually improve technical assistance, today FSA announced the publication of two booklets that will serve as important informational tools and resources for existing and prospective farm loan borrowers.

Your FSA Farm Loan Compass booklet was recently developed specifically for farmers and ranchers who have an existing farm loan with FSA. It provides detailed guidance outlining borrower responsibilities and the servicing options that FSA offers. It also addresses common questions borrowers may have as they navigate through loan program requirements and the financial concepts involved. Originally published in 2012, Your Guide to FSA Farm Loans was designed for new loan customers. It provides information about the various types of farm loans available and guides new borrowers through the application process. The revised version addresses program changes and includes new loan offerings, like the popular Microloan program that was rolled out after the publication of the original Guide.

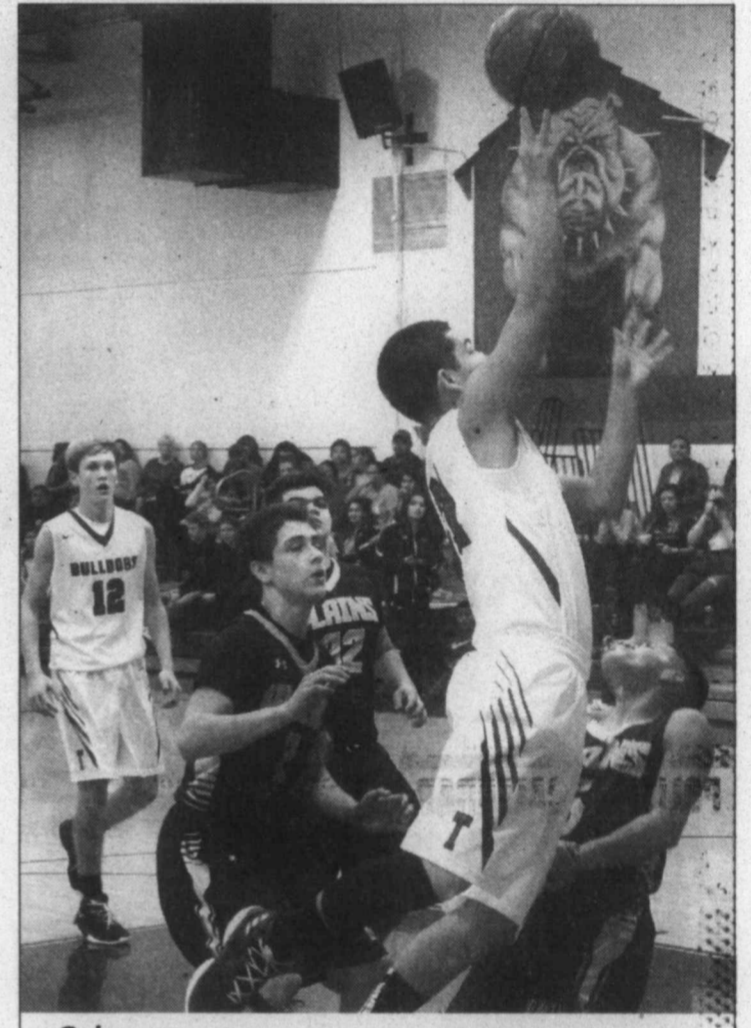
**Private Applicator License training set here Feb. 7**

**Did you know? ... about TEXAS**

- Texas's state flower is the bluebonnet. Named for its color and resemblance of a woman's sunbonnet, the flower blooms in early spring.
- The mockingbird is the state bird, known to have the "prettiest song of any bird in North America". The song of the bird is a medley of the calls of many other birds, thus nicknamed the "mocker".
- Pecan trees are the official state trees of Texas. Native pecan trees have shown to be an estimated 150 years old and can grow an average of 70-100 feet tall.
- Texas blue topaz was chosen as the state gemstone. Its crystal-like appearance occurs in many natural colors including blue, orange, brown, green, pink, beige and red.
- Texas's state insect is the monarch butterfly. This type of butterfly is special because it is the only species of butterfly that does not hibernate, but migrates in changing seasons. Three to four generations of these gorgeous black and orange butterflies are produced each year.
- A seashell called a lightning whelk is the state shell, named for its colored stripes. Only found along the Gulf Coast, it is unique because it is one of few shells that open on the left side.
- The state pepper is the jalapeño.
- The state motto is "friendship".
- The state vegetable is the 1015 sweet onion and the state fruit is the Texas red grapefruit.
- The official dish of Texas is chili.
- Texas's official dance is the square dance.
- The Armor-plated armadillo is the official state small mammal and the Guadalupe bass is the state fish.
- Texas's official flying mammal is the Mexican Free-tailed Bat.
- The state large mammal is the Longhorn.
- Several different flags have flown over Texas during its history. Spain, France, Mexico, the Confederacy, and the Republic of Texas all claimed Texas as its own throughout the years.
- Texas remained a republic for almost 10 years until it became part of the United States in 1845. The Texas flag is the official symbol of the "Lone Star State" because of its single bright star gracing the red, white and blue banner. The colors in the flag symbolize bravery (red), purity and liberty (white), and loyalty (blue).

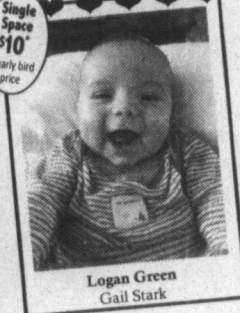

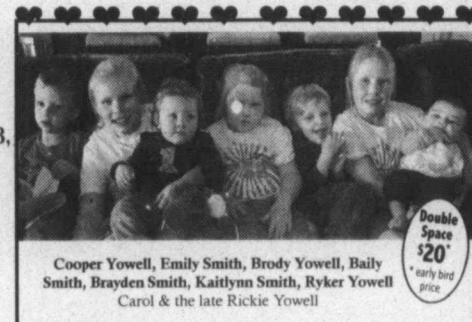
