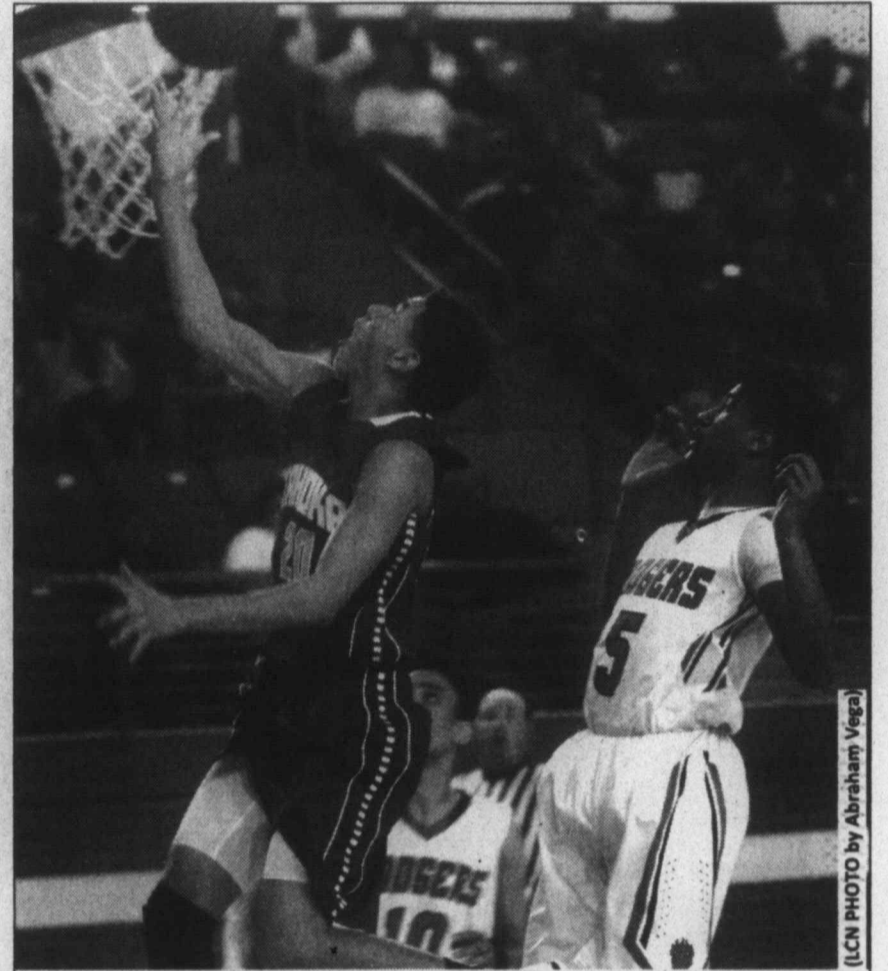
Law enforcement on campus in response to OISD threat

O'Donnell ISD had a statement on their website Tuesday morning about a possible threat to the school made by a secondary student. As a result of that threat, Lynn County Sheriff's department and the O'Donnell Police Chief Bill Achey were at the school grounds on Tuesday morning to help prevent any possible problems.

The statement on the O'Donnell ISD website was: "O'Donnell ISD Community: The O'Donnell ISD Administration is dedicated to keeping staff and students safe. To do this, I feel it is necessary to notify you that we have had a threat made by a secondary student toward the school. The student will not be allowed on campus until further notice. Both the O'Donnell Police Department and the Lynn County Sheriff's department will be present at school tomorrow. Any threat against our school must be taken seriously and

action must be decisive and swift. I believe that the steps we have taken will ensure the safety of everyone on both our campuses tomorrow morning and we look forward to seeing all students. By communicating and working together, we can make sure that we remain safe. Thank you for supporting our school and be confident that we are doing everything possible to keep our students and staff safe. Thank you, Dr. Cathy Palmer."

Chief Achey stated to *The News* that the threat is currently under investigation and that there did not seem to be any imminent threat at this time. O'Donnell ISD Superintendent Dr. Palmer also stated that both Lynn County Sheriff's office and the local police were pursuing the investigation. Since the threat allegedly involves a student no other information was available at this time.

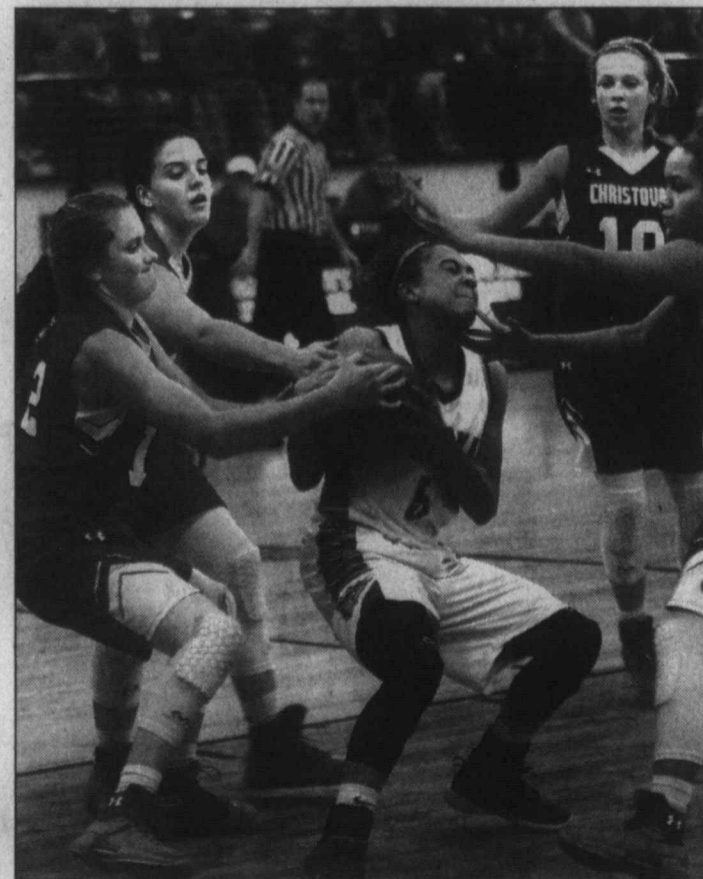


Jayton ousts New Home Lady Leopards in Area playoff match

New Home High School's Lady Leopards tied Jayton 33-33 to go into overtime at Friday night's Class 1A Area playoff game held at Slaton, but Jayton proved too much for the Lady Leopards, claiming the Area win 41-37. The loss ended the New Home girls' run for state playoffs.

The game was well-matched throughout, with a 12-12

tie at the end of the first period, and 20-19 in favor of New Home at the half. Jayton pulled ahead 27-22 by the end of the third period, but a rally by the Lady Leopards tied the game at 33-33 at the end of regulation play. In the four-minute OT, Jayton held the Lady Leopards to just 4 points, while adding 8 of their own for the win.



Tahoka girls end season in UIL Area playoffs

The Tahoka High School Lady Bulldogs dropped a 48-33 Class 2A Area playoff contest to Christoval. Tahoka's season ended Friday evening at Garden City with a hard fought game against the Christoval Lady Cougars.

The girls were evenly matched in the first half of the game which was tied at the half 23-23. The Lady Cougars then came back with a vengeance in the second half, holding the Tahoka girls to just 10 points while they went on to claim the 48-33 win and move on to the Class 2A quarterfinals in the playoffs.

THS Senior Natalie Stice was high point for the Lady Bulldogs with 22 points, Tamy Stroope added eight and Elisa Calzonciti had three. The Tahoka girls ended their season with a 5-7 district record.

Early Voting underway for primaries

Early voting for the March 6 Republican and Democratic Primaries is currently underway and will continue through Friday, March 2. Lynn County registered voters may vote early at the Lynn County Clerk's Office during regular business hours Monday-Friday (8:30-noon, and 1-5 p.m.).

The County Clerk's Office is located at 1627 Ave. K in Tahoka (formerly known as the Huffaker-Green law office).

Voters should bring a Driver's License or other form of identification, as well as their Voter Registration Card.

Both the Democratic and Republican ballots have several state positions, as well as several propositions to consider. Voters may choose only one Primary in which to vote, either Republican or Democrat.

Locally, there are three contested races in which to mark choices. All of the contested races in Lynn County are on the Republican Primary ballot, including (1) the 106th District Judge, with candidates W. Calloway Huffaker and Reed Filley seeking the position; (2) Lynn County Justice of Peace Pct 1, with candidates Christie Olivian, Brenda Dotson, and Deana Grissom seeking the position; and (3) Lynn County Justice of Peace Pct 4, with incumbent Ed L. Follis Jr. and candidate Della Swartz seeking the position.

On Election Day, Tuesday, March 6, there will be four polling locations - one each in Tahoka, Wilson, O'Donnell and Wilson - for voting in the Republican Primary, but only one location for the Democratic Primary (which will be in Tahoka). Those polling locations will be printed in a later edition of *The News*.

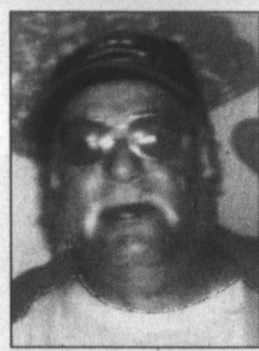

I SAW AN advertisement last week for a walk-in bathtub, one which has a door at the side so you can just open it up and walk in and out as needed, eliminating the danger of busting your butt trying to climb in and out of the tub.

Of course, this is meant to help out folks who have grown older and less able to climb in and out of the tub. I saw a picture of a guy stepping out of the tub through the open door in the side. (He had a robe on, which I guess was shown that way for propriety's sake, but my first thought was that he probably didn't get too clean wearing a robe while taking a bath).

I sort of wonder if a bathtub with a door on it would hold water. If I had one of those, it probably would leak water all over the floor next to the tub, then I would slip on the wet floor and break something, defeating the whole purpose of a bathtub with a door in it.

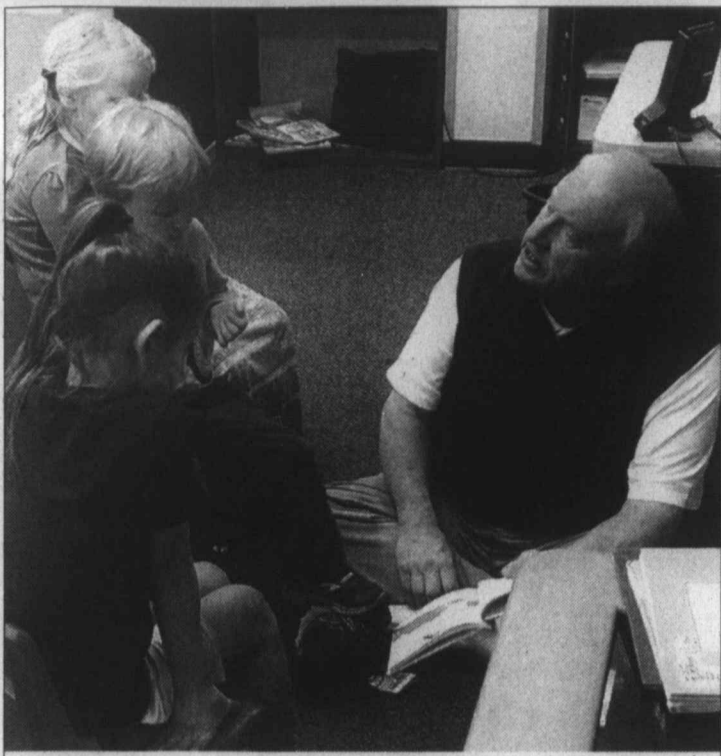

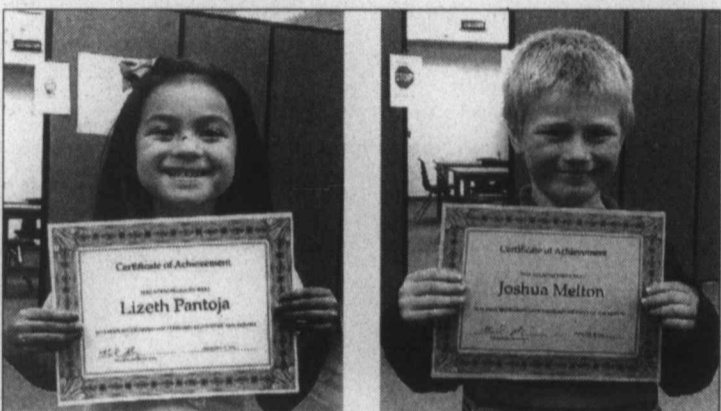

Cardiac rehab can be obtained in Tahoka

Lynn County Hospital District now offers Cardiac Rehab in Lynn County and the surrounding area for any patient who has had a serious cardiac event in the last year. A cardiac event can include heart attack (also called myocardial infarction), coronary artery bypass, heart valve replacement, coronary stents, and heart or lung transplants.

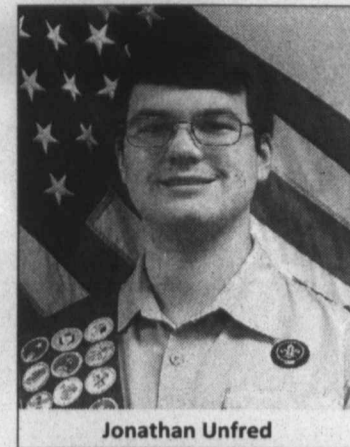
The medically supervised program also offers Cardiac Telehealth where area patients can receive information from their current out-of-town cardiologist in a Telehealth meeting with the local LCHD Cardiac Rehab and Fitness specialists.

"This service allows for us to help with patient care and in so doing our local patients to not have to drive into Lubbock multiple times a week to receive care they need in order to get back on

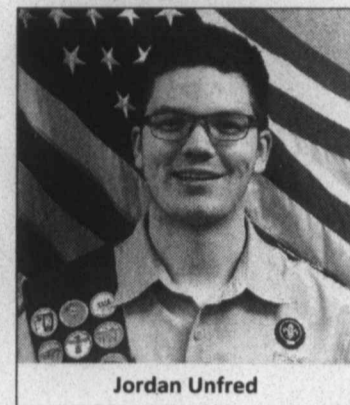
their feet," stated Seth Manly, Director of the LCHD Cardiac Rehab program.

The program is designed for patients that have had a fairly recent serious cardiac event who need a specialized and closely monitored exercise prescription in order to help them recover.

"We want to expedite recovery in any way we can for our patients so that they can return to the things they love to do in life as quickly as possible," added Manly. "We have a cardiac monitor in the facility so that we can watch the activity of a patient's heart in real time to make sure we are not stressing it to a point where we cause more harm than good. This is just another way that we here at LCHD are striving to provide the best health care we can for our community," Manly concluded.

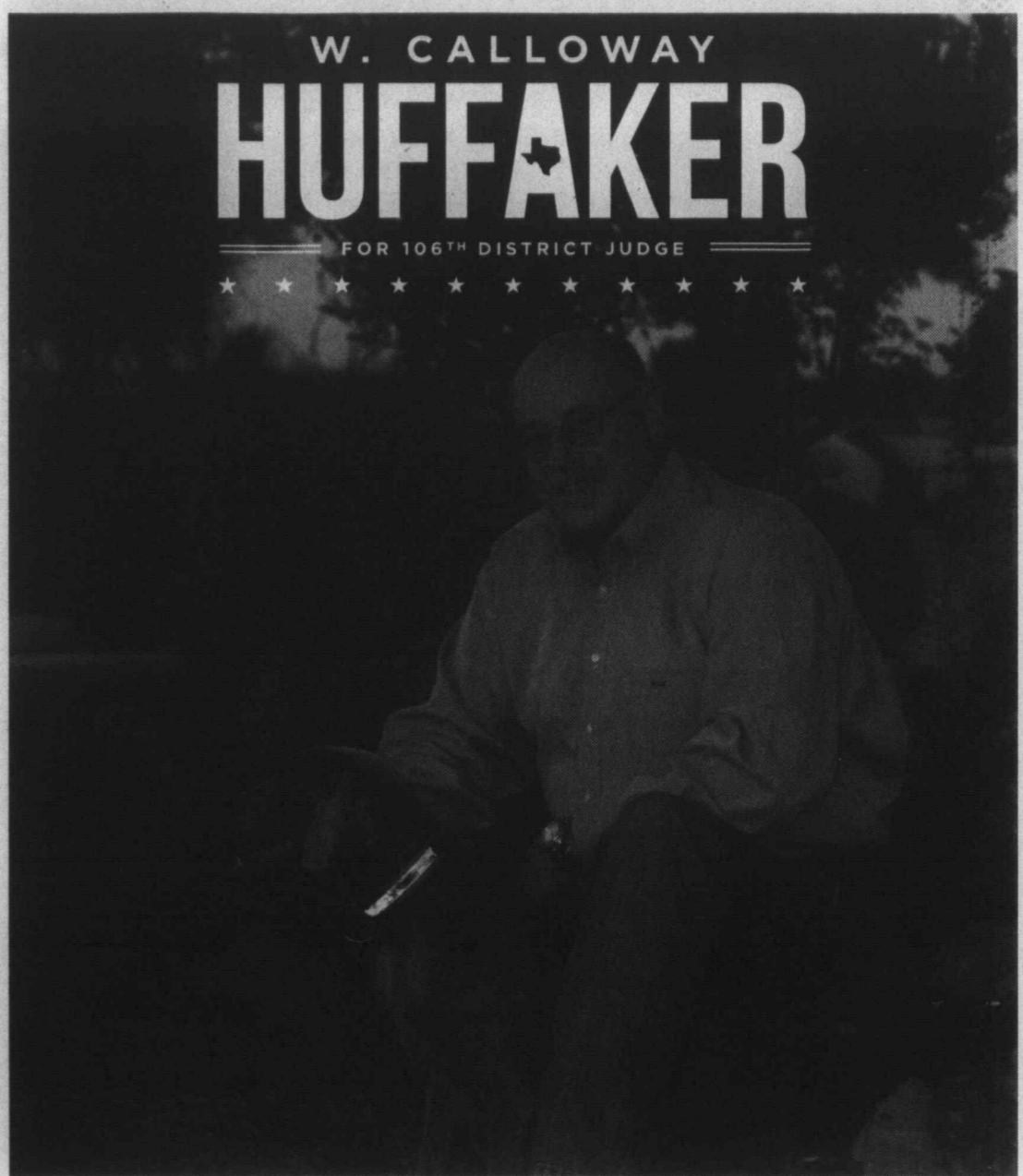

New statewide cotton pest management guide available

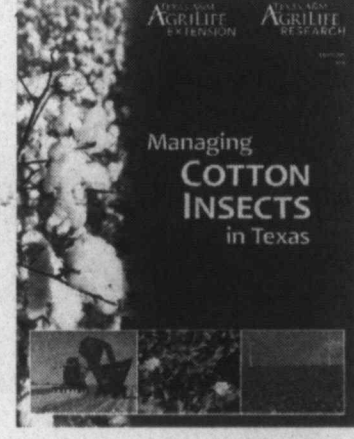
Entomologists with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service have just released a new statewide guide on managing cotton insect pests, said one of its authors.

crop growth stages, then to describe the various sampling methods for these pests, and finally, to list the action thresholds and management tools for controlling each pest.

"The guide comes complete with updated information on Bt traits available on the market, their relative efficacy, and the list of suggested insecticides for each pest," Vyavhare said. "It's the most up-to-date, objective and comprehensive guide now available to Texas cotton farmers."

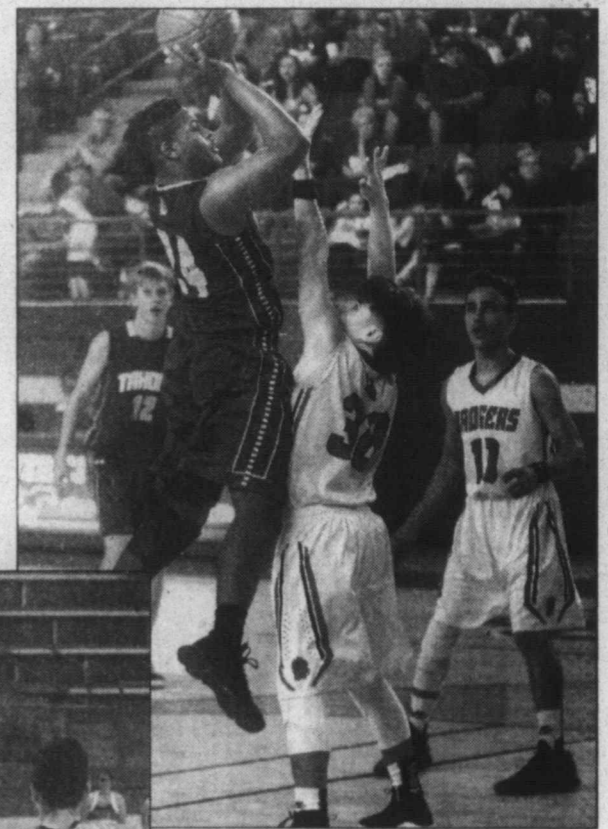
Grand Re-Opening...
